Equity-Deserving Communities 2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians

Analysis of 2022 Fall Survey of Calgarians Data
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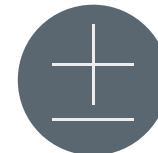


Telephone survey conducted with a randomly-selected sample of 2,501 Calgarians aged 18 years and older between August 15th and September 2nd, 2022.

- Both cell phone (60%) and landline (40%) sample were used.
- The average interview length was 32 minutes.



Final data were weighted to ensure the overall sample's quadrant, ward, and age/gender composition reflects that of the actual Calgary population aged 18 or older according to 2019 Municipal and 2021 Federal Census data.



The margin of error (MOE) for the total sample of 2,501 is ± 2.0 percentage points, 19 times out of 20. The margin of error for the 2SLGBTQIA+ sub-group of 131 is ± 8.6 percentage points, 19 times out of 20, and the margin of error for the Non-2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians sub-group of 2,336 is ± 2.03 percentage points, 19 times out of 20. The margin of error of each question will vary slightly depending on the total number of respondents who answered the question.



Not all questions asked within the Fall Survey of Calgarians are represented within this report. Results are compared between 2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians and Non-2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians. Statistically significant differences are noted throughout the report:

- \uparrow indicates number is significantly higher than the other group.
- \downarrow indicates number is significantly lower than the other group.
- Some results in this report are subject to rounding adjustments.

Significant differences are an indication that a difference is not due to chance. A mathematical formula is used to calculate each difference independently. Whether or not a difference is considered significant depends on a few factors including the total sample size and the variability of responses. Larger sample sizes mean that smaller differences are significant. Additionally, variability of responses means that the more alike the responses are the more significant a change will be.

Equity-Deserving Communities

Calgary's Equity-Deserving Communities (EDCs) are defined as groups of people who generally have less access to opportunities, resources, and systems of power because of their actual or perceived identity or identities. EDCs often experience social and financial disadvantages because of systems of oppression, which takes many forms including, but not limited to, racism, sexism, and ableism. The City would like to better understand the perspective of equity-deserving communities through the lens of the annual Spring and Fall Surveys of Calgarians. The data in this report are from the most recent (2022) Fall Survey of Calgarians, focusing on demographics of interest, specifically those that differentiate equity-deserving communities. Both seasonal surveys are conducted in English to manage time and cost restraints. The City acknowledges the ability to speak English may be a barrier for potential participants. Inclusion in all EDC groups is based on self-reported demographic data captured within the general population survey.

This is one report in an overall set of eight reports on Equity-Deserving Communities. Each report focuses on a different EDC. The EDCs, and the demographic variables used to categorize EDCs, are as follows, with the EDC category noted in bold text:

Gender:

- Male
- **Female**

Note: self-reported (i.e., not inferred by the interviewer); the number of respondents who identified with another category is too small to report separately

Age:

- 18 to 64 years
- **65 years or older**

Note: self reported.

2SLGBTQIA+:

Note: self-reported. "Yes" includes respondents with a disability as well as respondents who have a family member with a disability; respondents were not asked to identify the specific disability/disabilities

Racialized People:

Note: self-reported racialized status.

Born in Canada:

Note: self reported. foreign-born respondents were not asked for their specific country of origin

Indigenous:

Key Findings



Key Findings: 2SLGBTQIA+

Calgarians who identify as 2SLGBTQIA+ report a lower overall quality of life in Calgary when compared with Non-2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians.

- 2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians are significantly less likely than Non-2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians to rate the overall quality of life in the city of Calgary today as 'good' (73% vs. 81%).

2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians consider The City less inclusive than Non-2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians.

- In comparison with Non-2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians, 2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians are less likely to agree The City fosters a city that is inclusive and accepting of all (61% vs. 71%) and more likely to disagree (18% vs. 8%).
- Just over two-in-five 2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians (43%) agree The City delivers programs and services that remove barriers to participation for Calgarians who need it the most, which is significantly less than Non-2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians (53%).

In general, 2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians view The City's citizen input opportunities positively.

- 2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians are more likely than Non-2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians to agree The City allows citizens to have meaningful input into decision-making (69% vs. 58%) and are less likely to disagree (31% vs. 42%).
- Similarly, 2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians are more likely to indicate they are confident The City is working to improve how it includes citizen input into important decisions when compared with Non-2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians (75% vs. 66%).

2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians and Non-2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians trust The City about equally.

- Slightly under half of all Calgarians (49%) indicate they trust The City, (46% 2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians vs. 49% Non-2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians)

Key Findings: 2SLGBTQIA+

Calgarians who identify as 2SLGBTQIA+ are more satisfied with The City as a whole and with Council when compared to Non-2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians.

- When compared to Non-2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians, 2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians are more likely to be satisfied with The City of Calgary, including Council and Administration as a whole (81% vs. 70%) and less likely to be dissatisfied (19% vs. 30%).
- 2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians are also more likely than Non-2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians to be satisfied with City Council (74% vs. 61%) and are significantly less likely to be dissatisfied (26% vs. 39%).
- However, there is no significant difference in satisfaction with City Administration between 2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians and Non-2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians (84% vs. 78%).

2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians place a higher importance on the environment than Non-2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians and are also more critical of The City when it comes to the environment.

- 2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians are significantly less likely than Non-2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians to be satisfied with The City's performance to protect the environment (66% vs. 79%) and are more likely to be dissatisfied (34% vs. 21%).
- Calgarians who identify as 2SLGBTQIA+ are also significantly more likely to agree we need to act now to address climate change when compared to Non-2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians (86% vs. 63%). They are also much less likely to disagree (7% vs. 22%).
- However, 2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians are much less likely than Non-2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians to agree The City has programs and services aimed at helping Calgarians reduce their environmental impact (42% vs. 52%).

In general, 2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians view The City's performance on Council focus areas more negatively than Non-2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians.

- 2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians are less likely to agree The City is doing a good job working to build meaningful relationships with Indigenous partners when compared with Non-2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians (66% vs. 83%) and much more likely to disagree (34% vs. 17%).
- Similarly, 2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians (57%) are much less likely than Non-2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians (72%) to agree The City is doing a good job working with local Indigenous communities when discussing downtown revitalization.
- 2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians are less likely to agree The City is doing a good job working with other levels of government to address social issues such as mental health, when compared to Non-2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians (54% vs. 64%).

Key Findings: 2SLGBTQIA+

Overall, 2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians and Non-2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians are satisfied about equally with the services and programs provided by The City with a few key exceptions.

- Satisfaction with the overall level and quality of services and programs provided by The City is consistent across all Calgarians with two-thirds (66%) reporting they are satisfied (64% 2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians vs. 67% Non-2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians).
- 2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians are less likely than Non-2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians to be satisfied with protection from river flooding (87% vs. 94%), the Calgary Police Service (66% vs. 83%), 911 (73% vs. 83%), Calgary Transit (55% vs. 73%), and affordable housing for low-income families (32% vs. 56%).
- Conversely, 2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians are more likely than Non-2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians to be satisfied with animal control services (99% vs. 91%) and property tax assessment (89% vs. 72%).

Reflecting their satisfaction scores, 2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians and Non-2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians are similar in their opinions about service investment, with some notable exceptions.

- In comparison with Non-2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians, 2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians are more likely to want The City to 'invest more' in affordable housing for low-income families (92% vs. 73%), Calgary Transit (86% vs. 59%), and residential Blue Cart recycling (30% vs. 18%) and less likely to want to 'invest more' in the Calgary Police Service (40% vs. 54%).
- Similarly 2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians are more likely than Non-2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians to indicate The City should 'invest less' in the Calgary Police Service (32% vs. 8%) and spring road cleaning (12% vs. 5%) and are less likely to want to 'invest less' in on-street bikeways (15% vs. 36%).

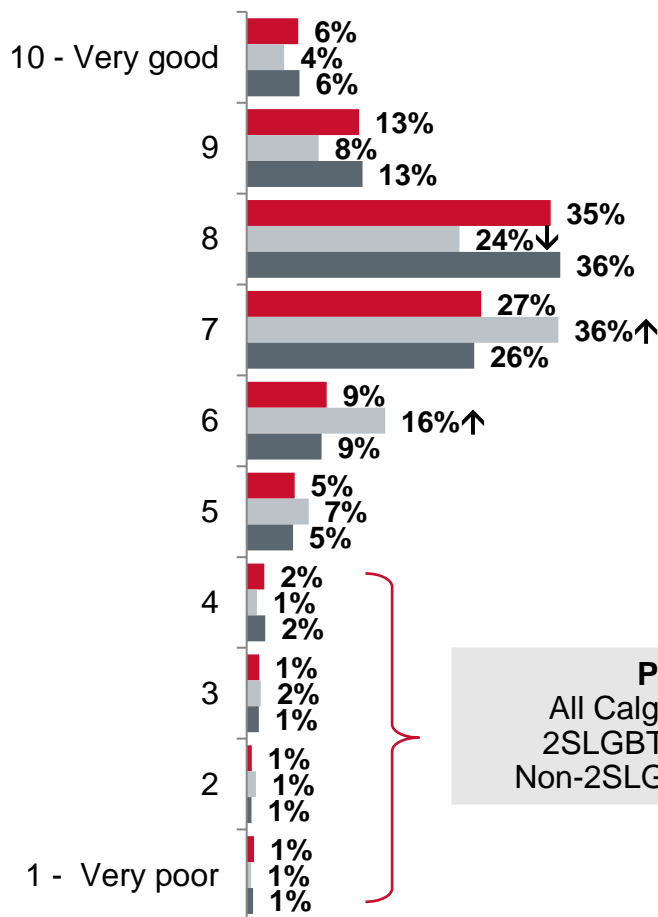
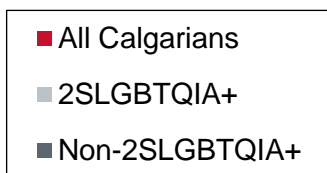

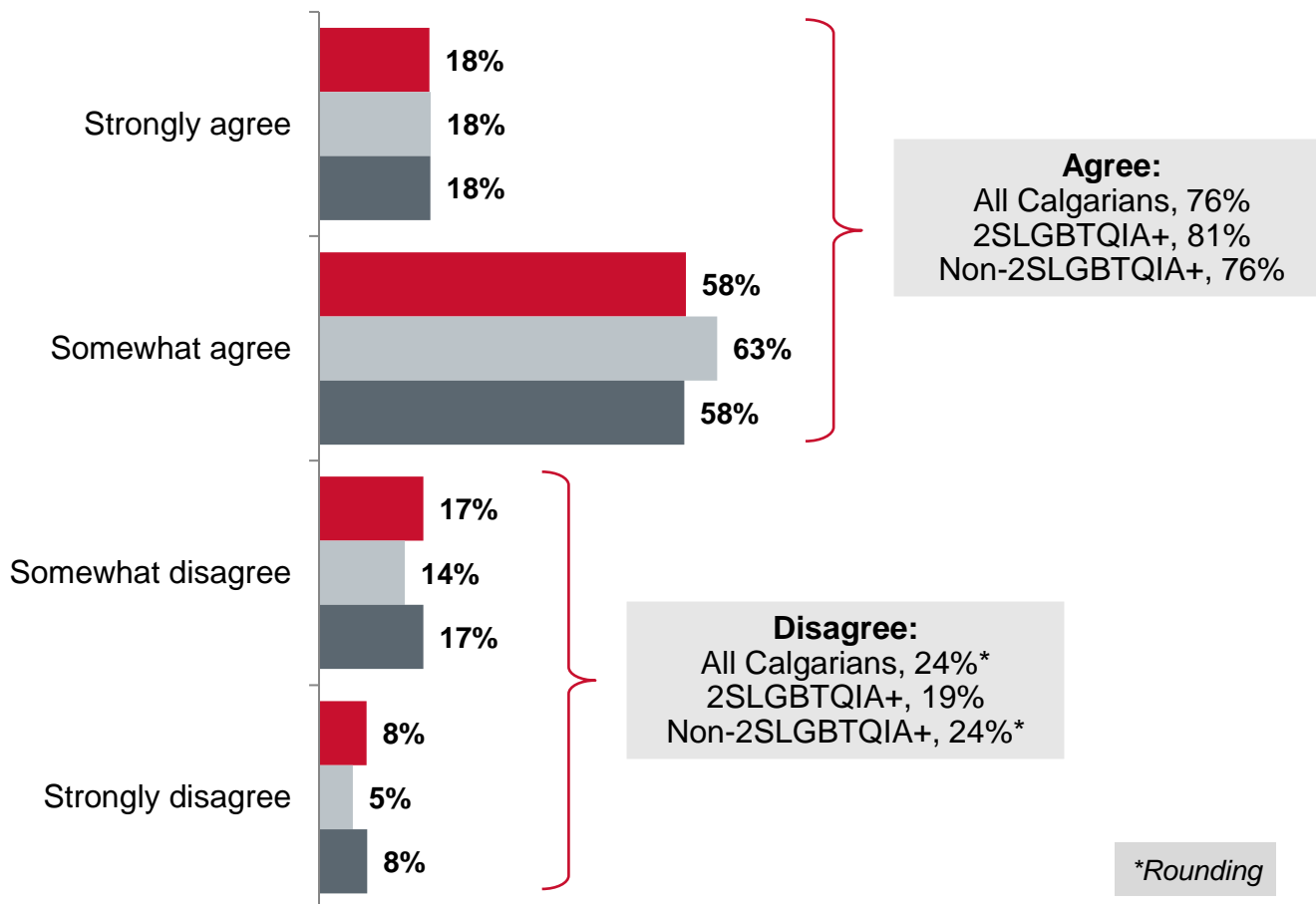
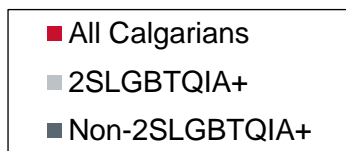

Calgary – Right Track to Being a Better City: 2SLGBTQIA+

About three-quarters (76%) of Calgarians agree Calgary is on the right track to be a better city 10 years from now, with no significant differences between 2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians (81%) and Non-2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians (76%).

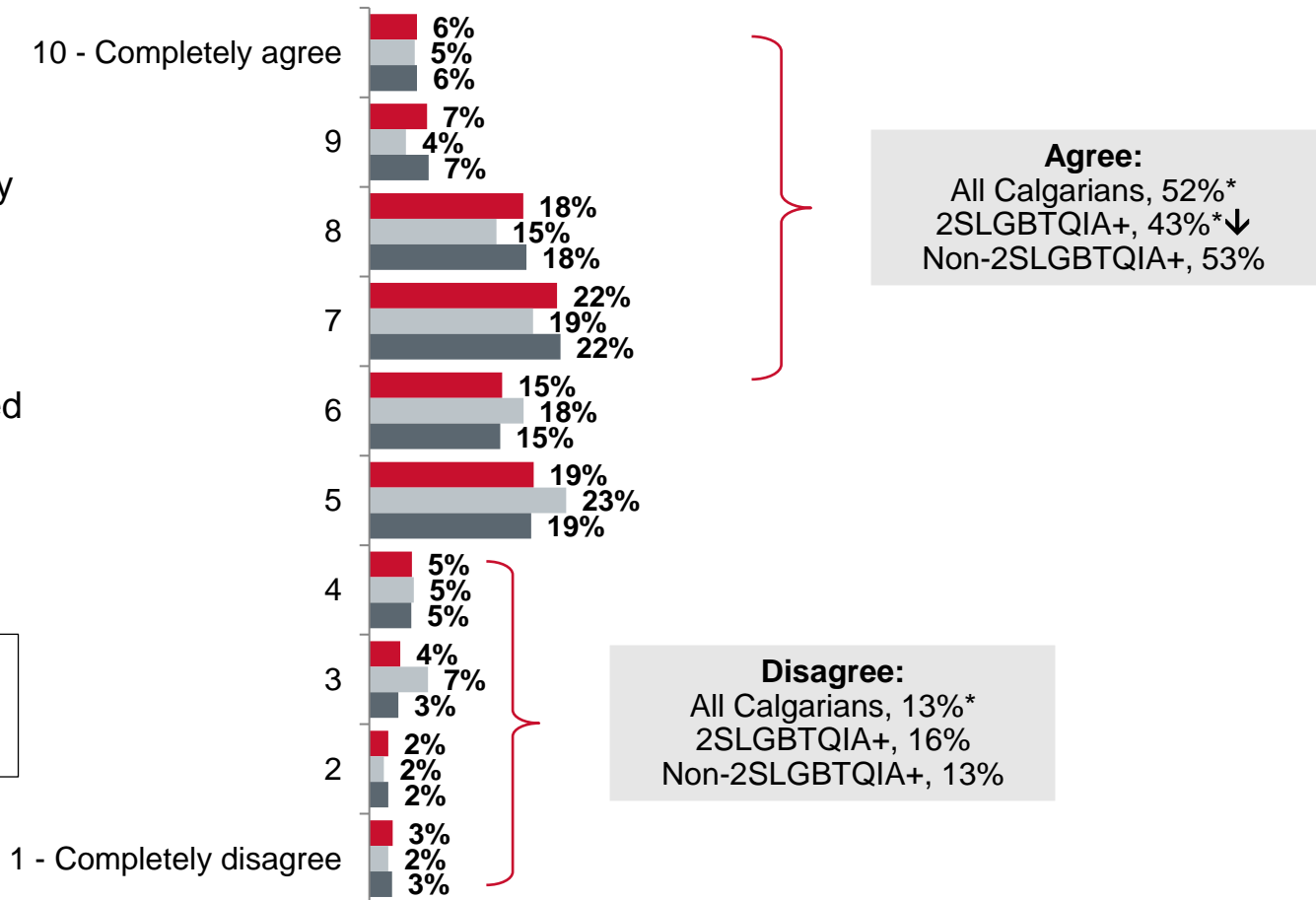
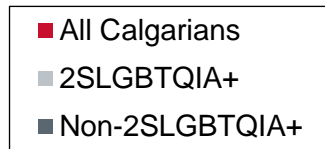

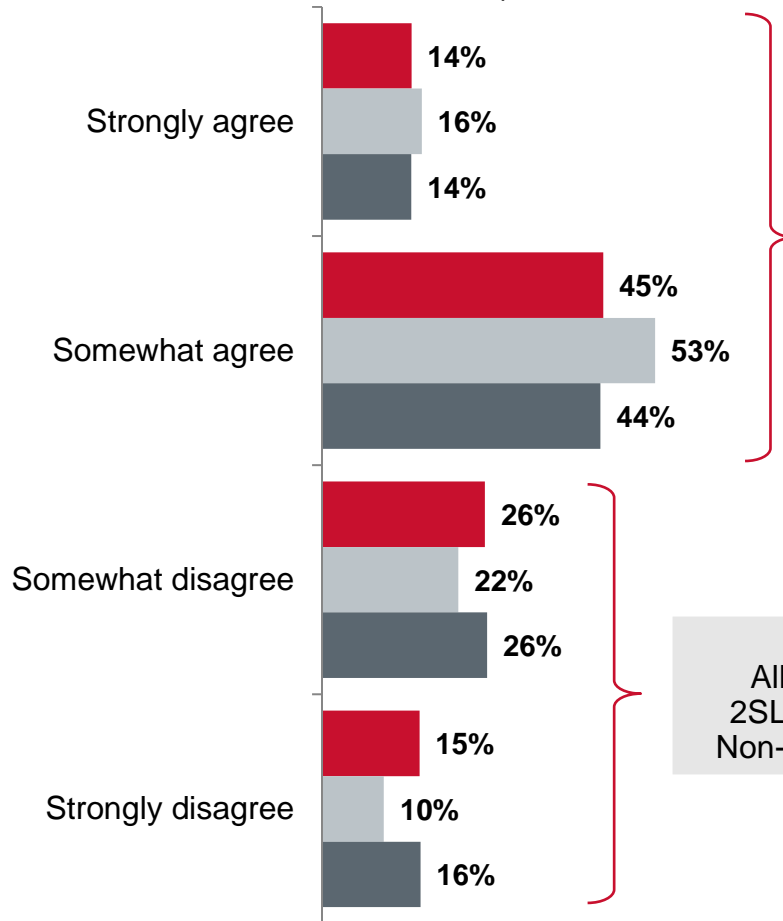
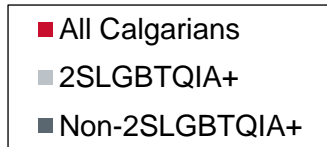




Perceptions of Citizen Input – Opportunities: 2SLGBTQIA+

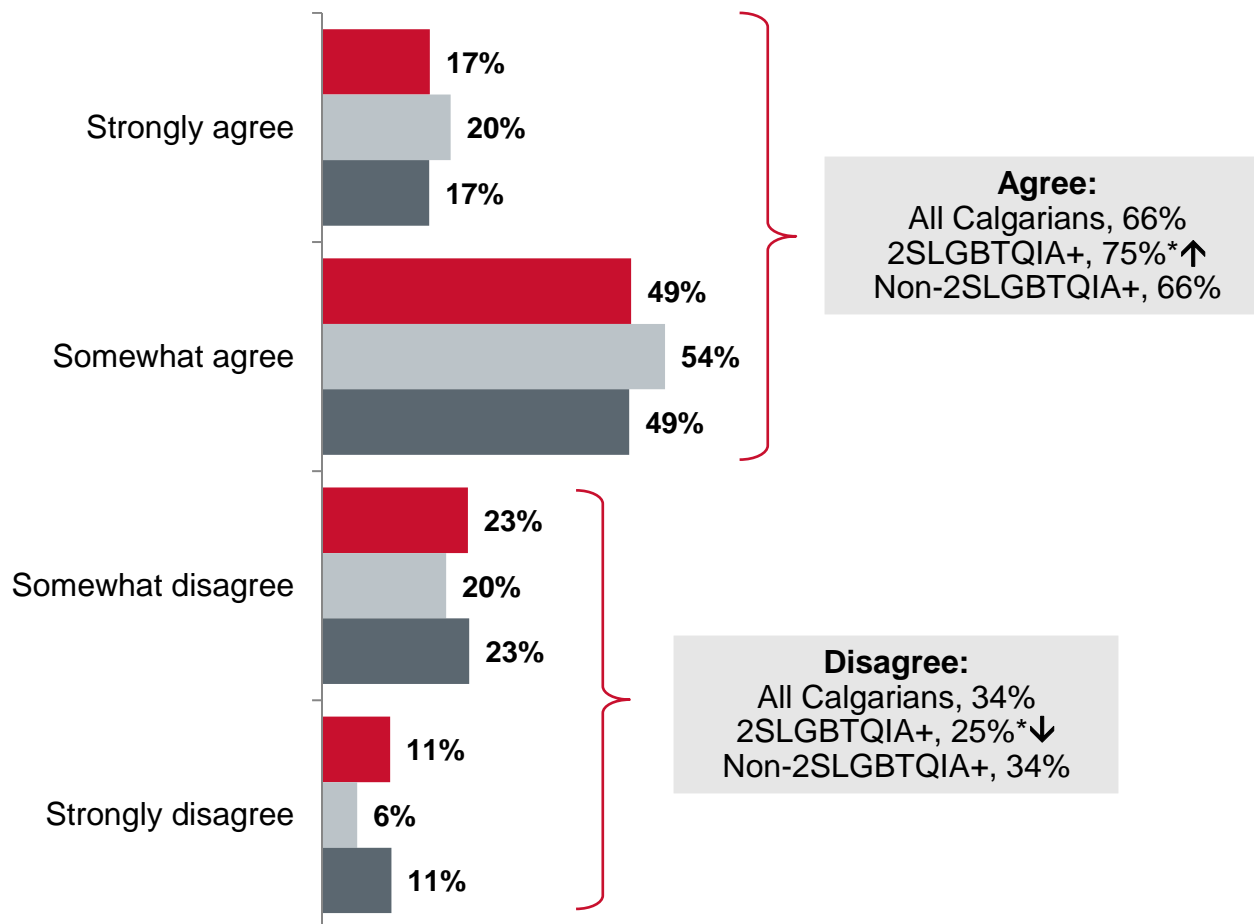

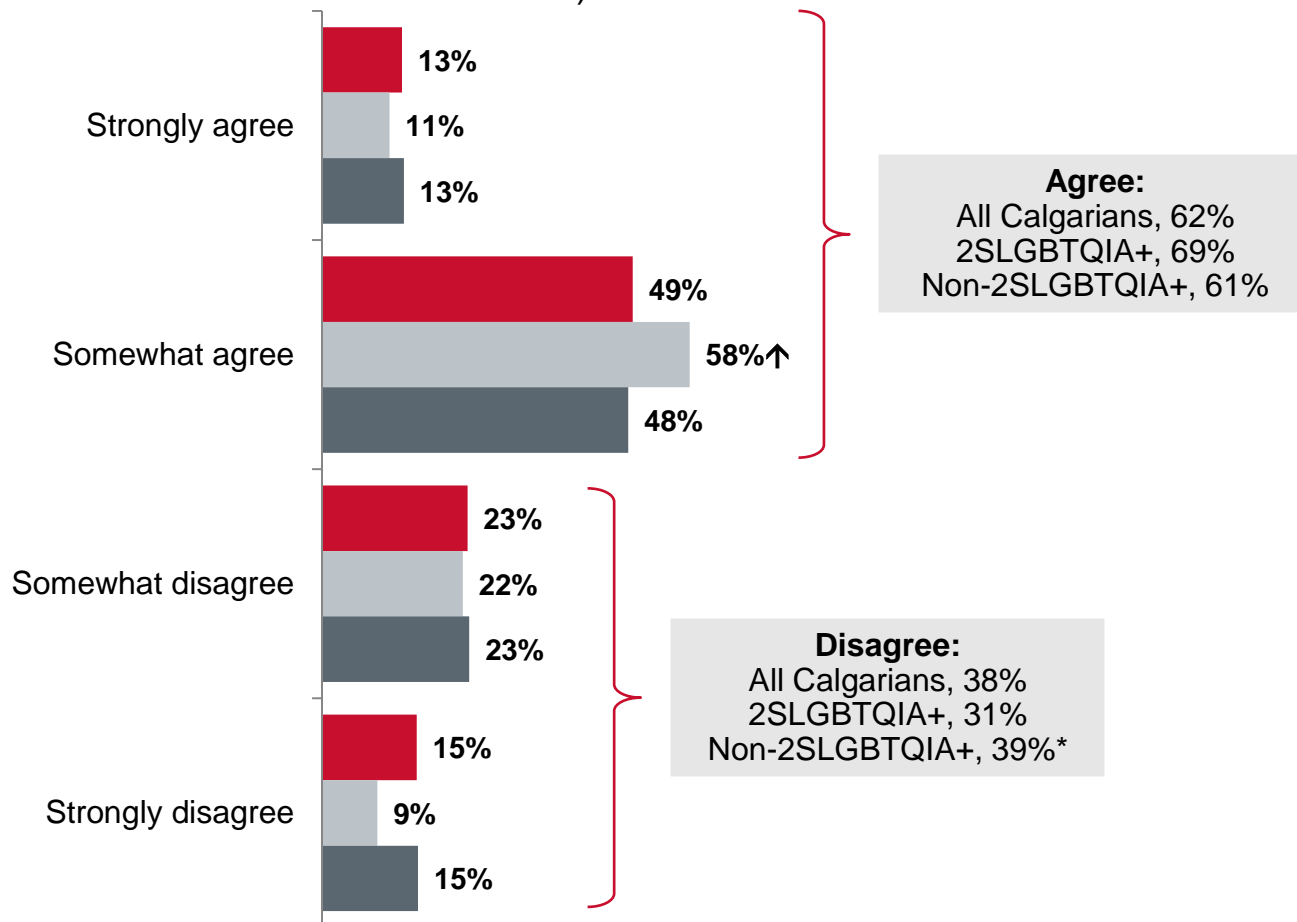
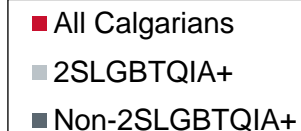

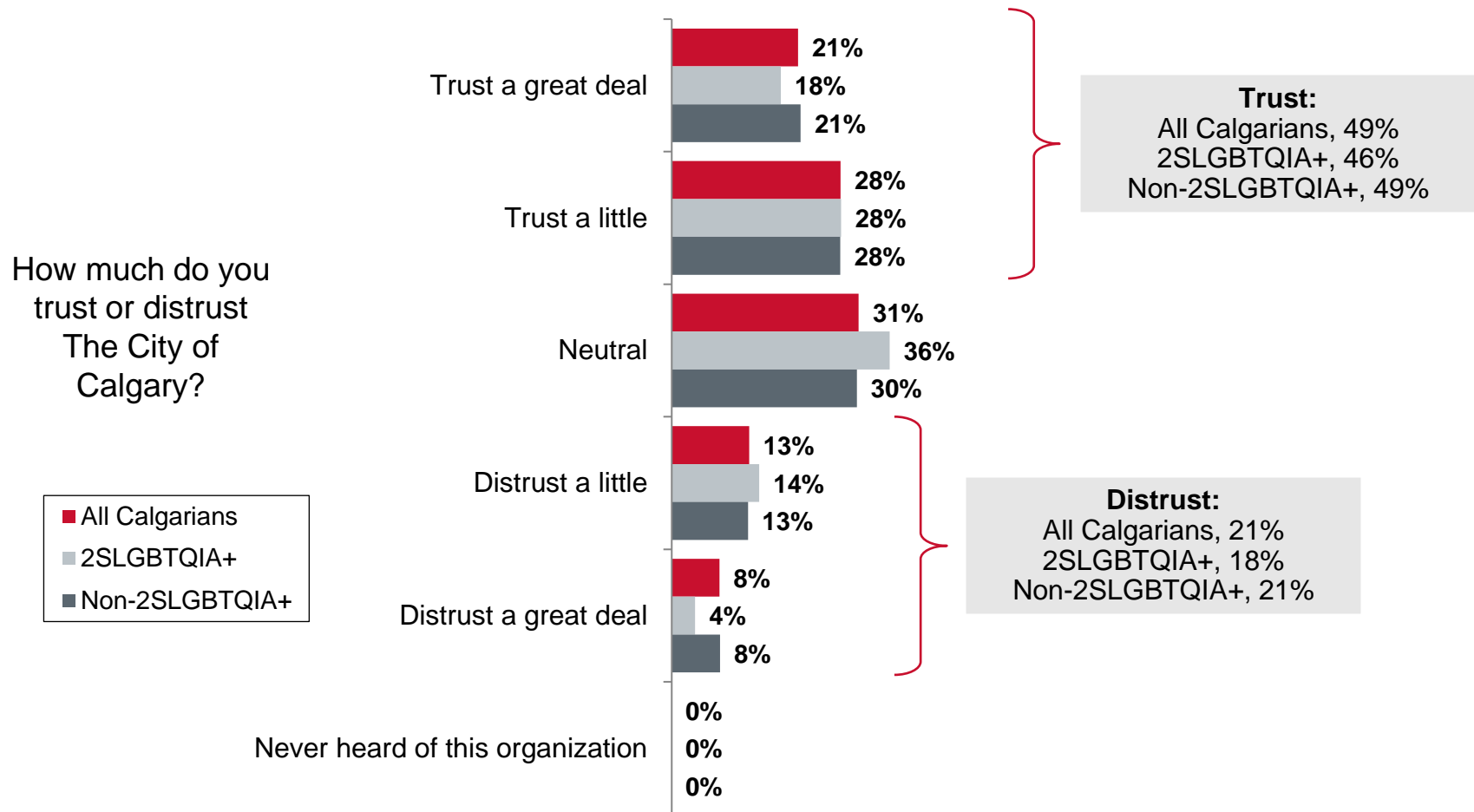


City Reputation and Performance

Both 2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians and Non-2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians trust The City at about the same rate (46% vs. 49%).



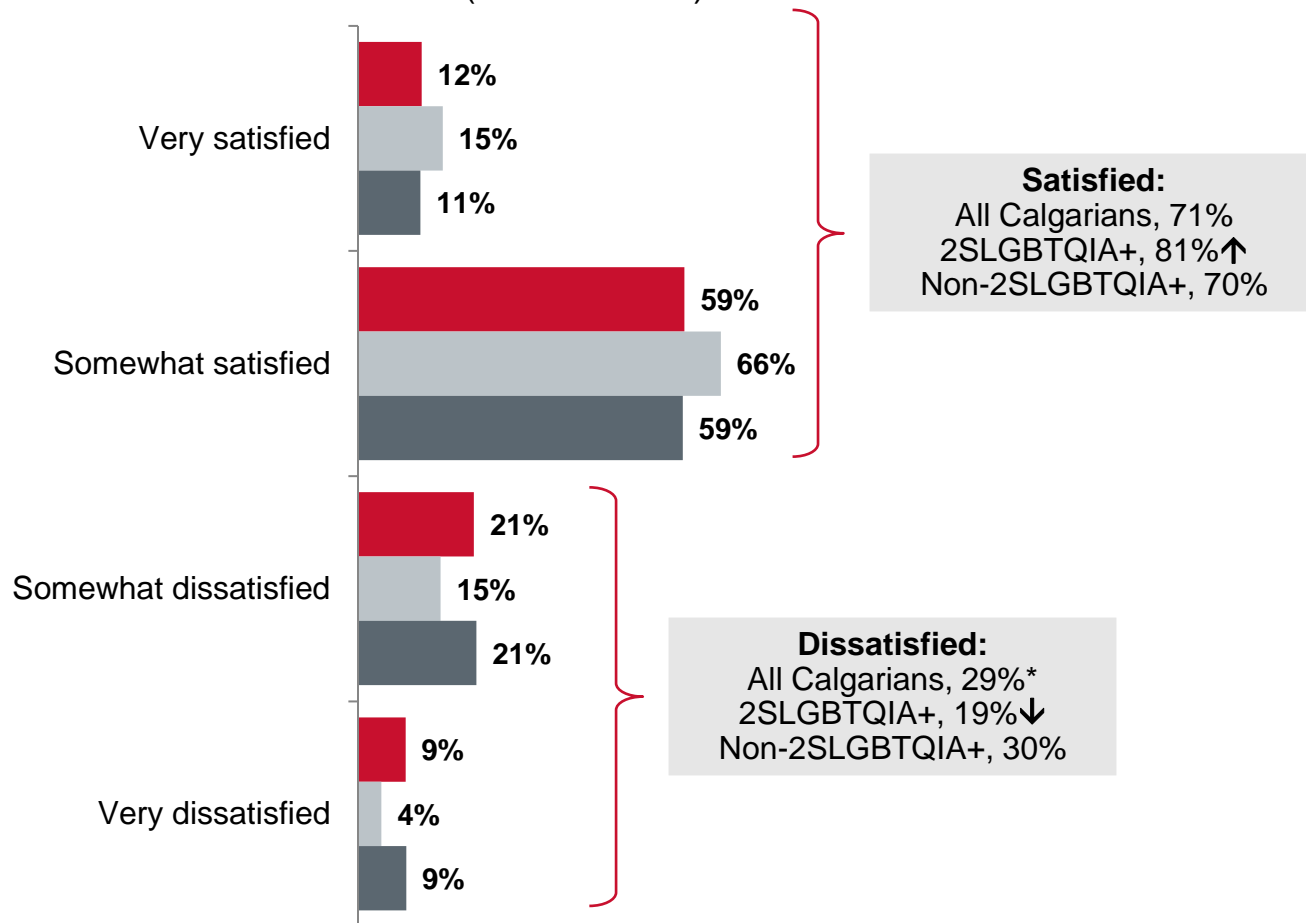
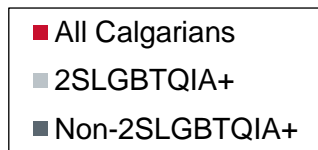
Taking into account all of the things which you think are important, how much do you trust or distrust The City of Calgary?

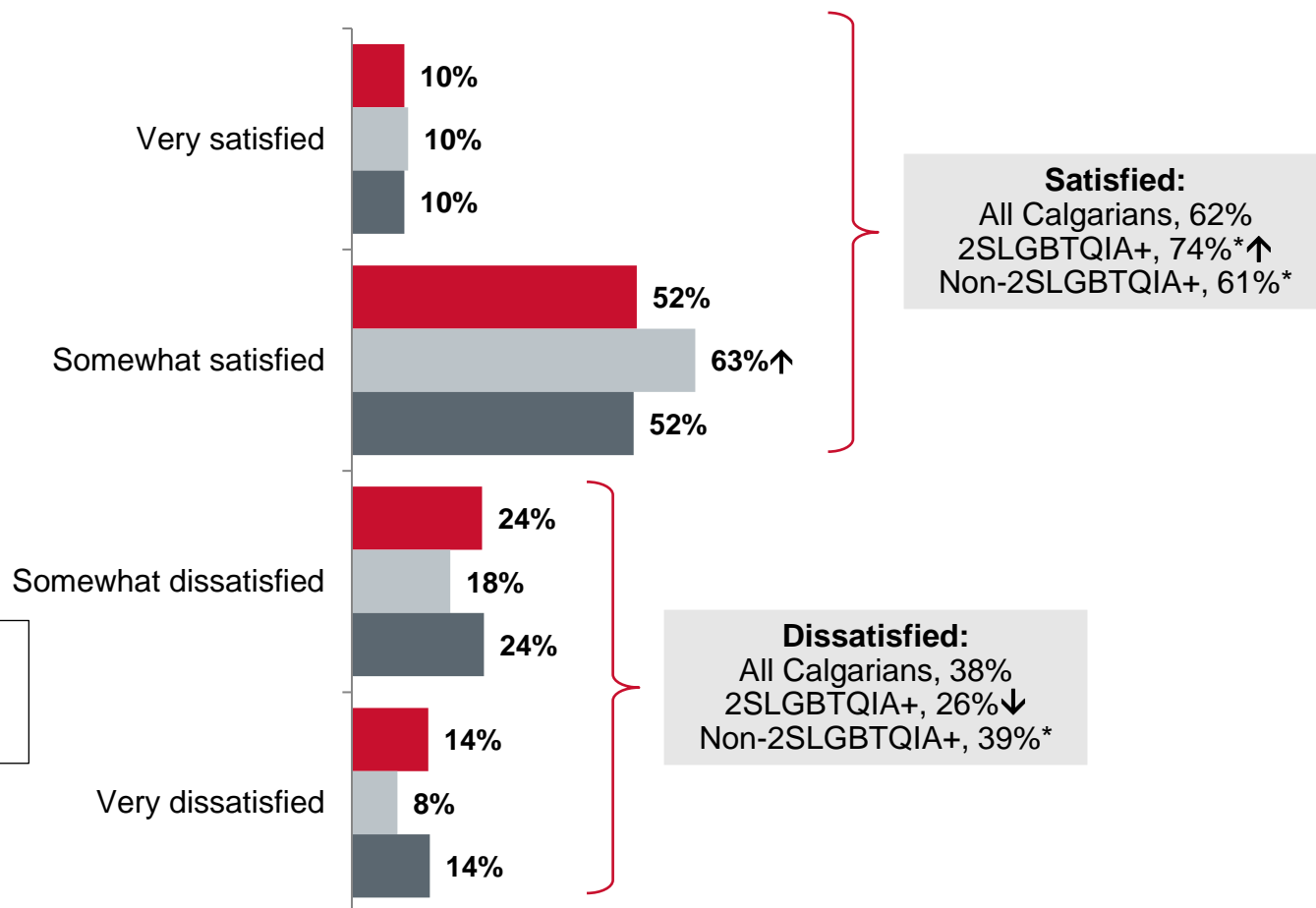
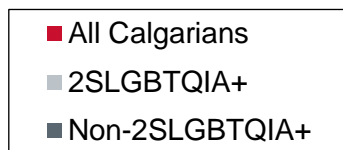

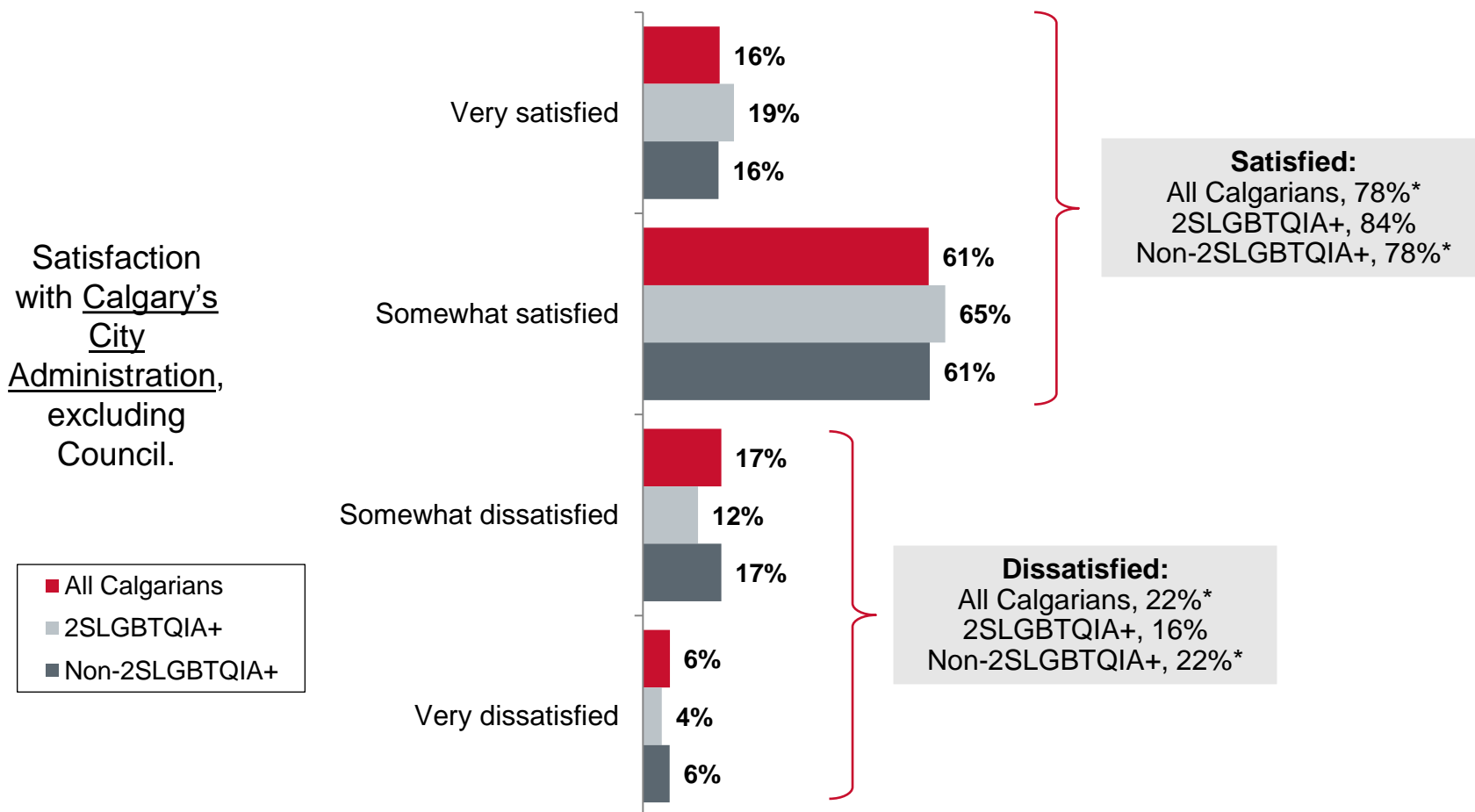
Thinking about Calgary's City Council, EXCLUDING City Administration, how satisfied or dissatisfied are you with the way City Council is going about running our City?

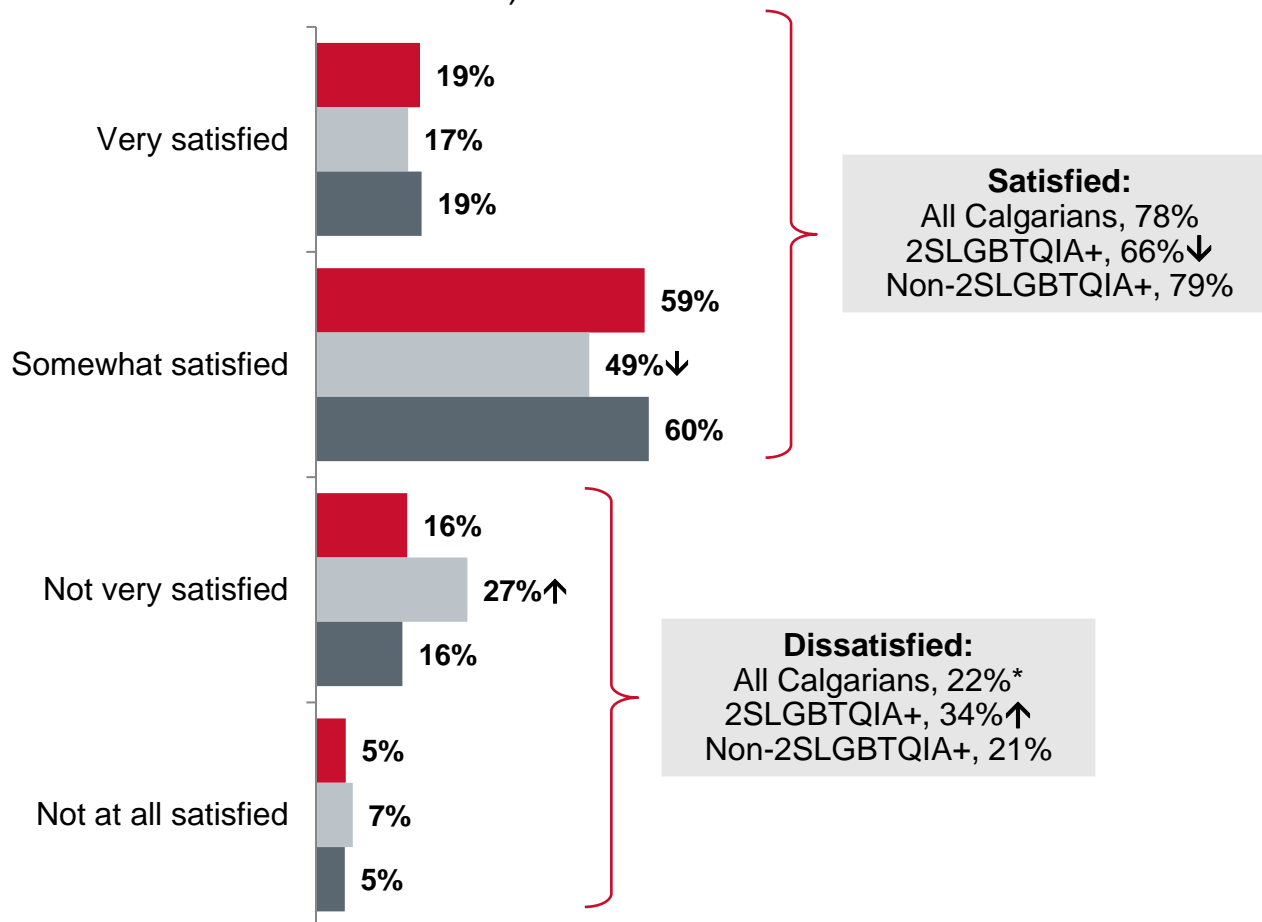
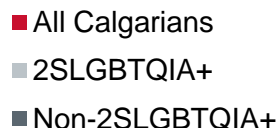

How satisfied are you with the job The City of Calgary is currently doing to protect the environment? Are you...?

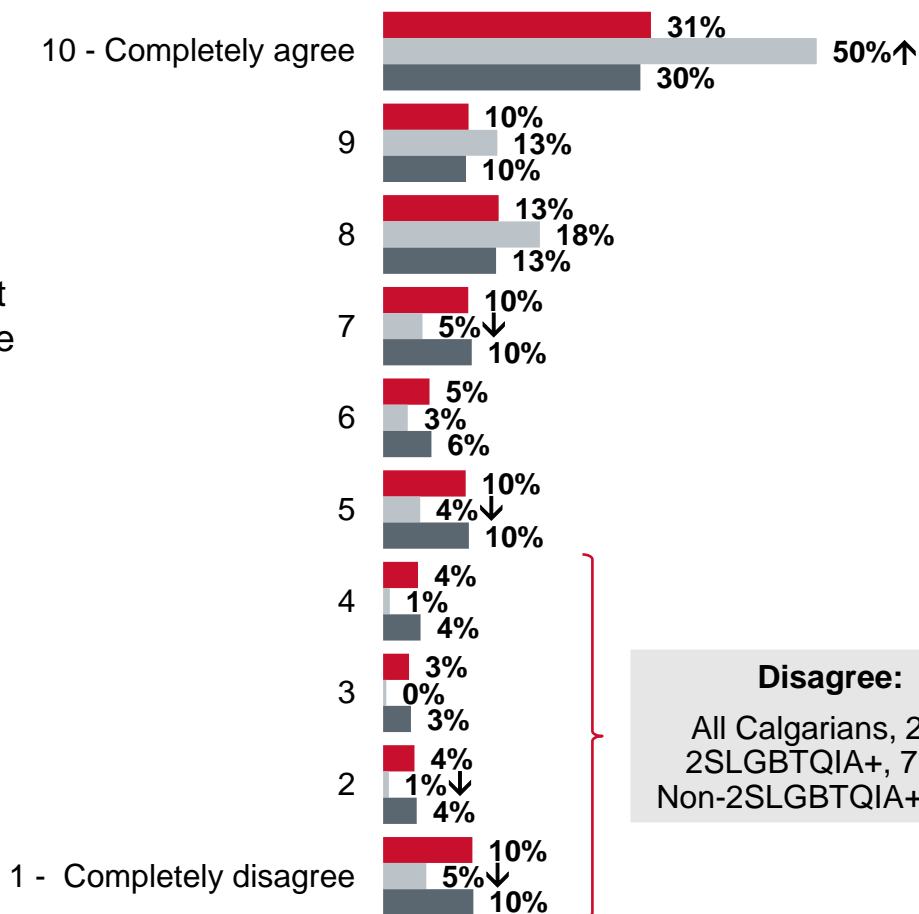
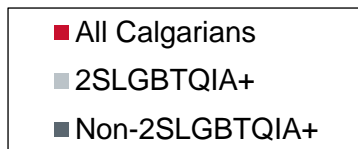

We Need to Act Now to Address Climate Change: 2SLGBTQIA+

Calgarians who identify as 2SLGBTQIA+ are significantly more likely to agree we need to act now to address climate change when compared to Non-2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians (86% vs. 63%). They are also much less likely to disagree (7% vs. 22%).

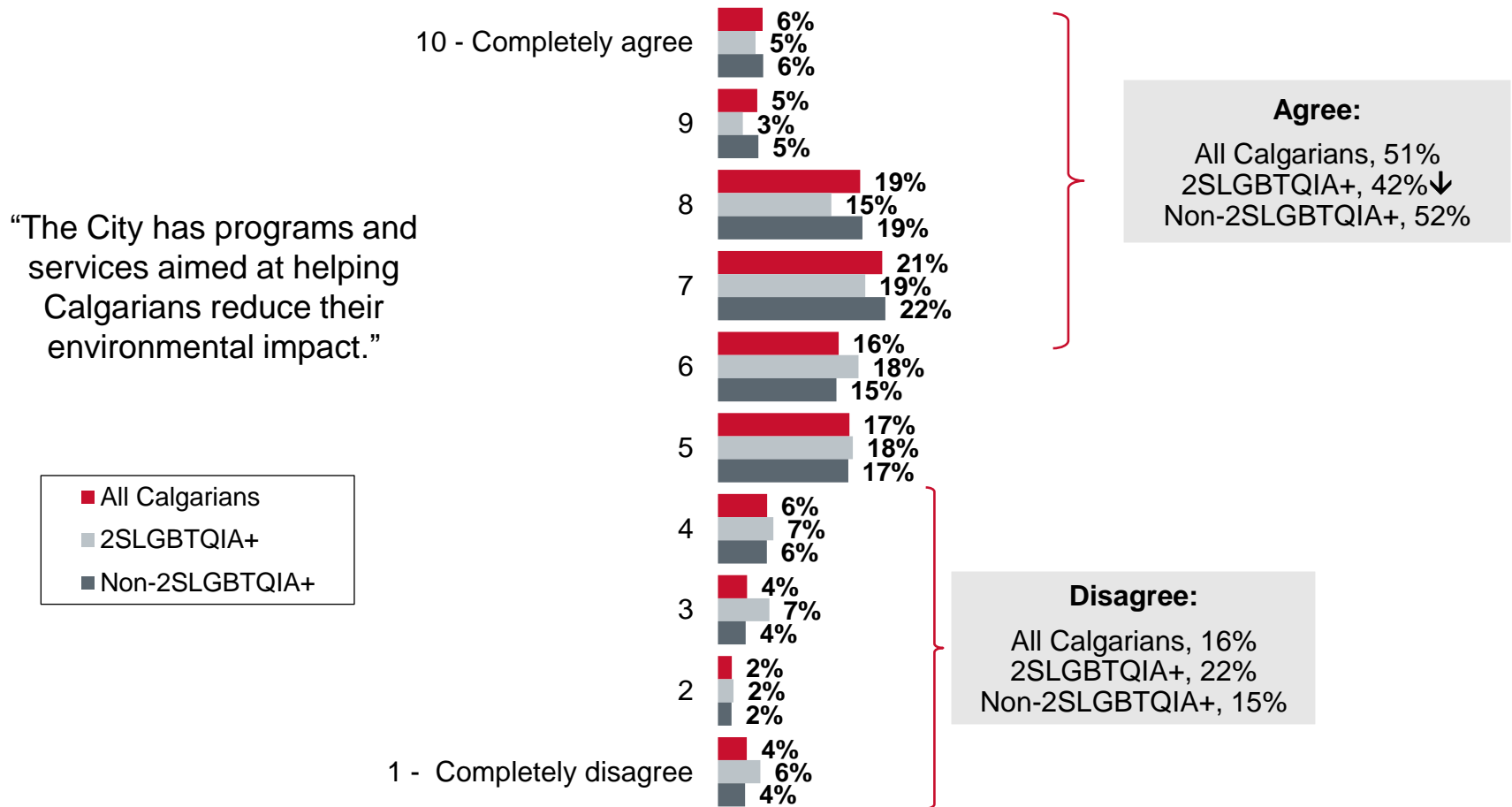

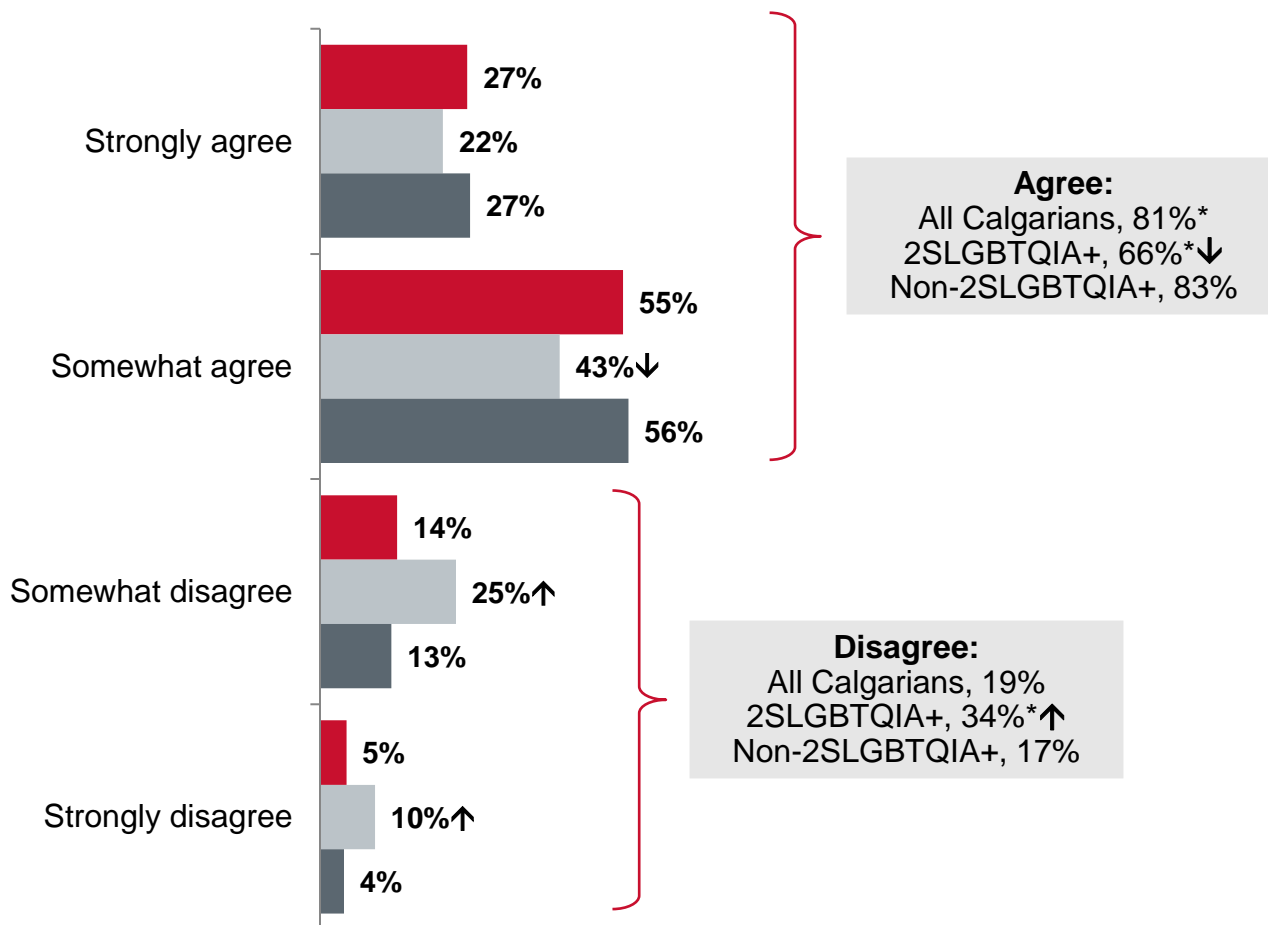

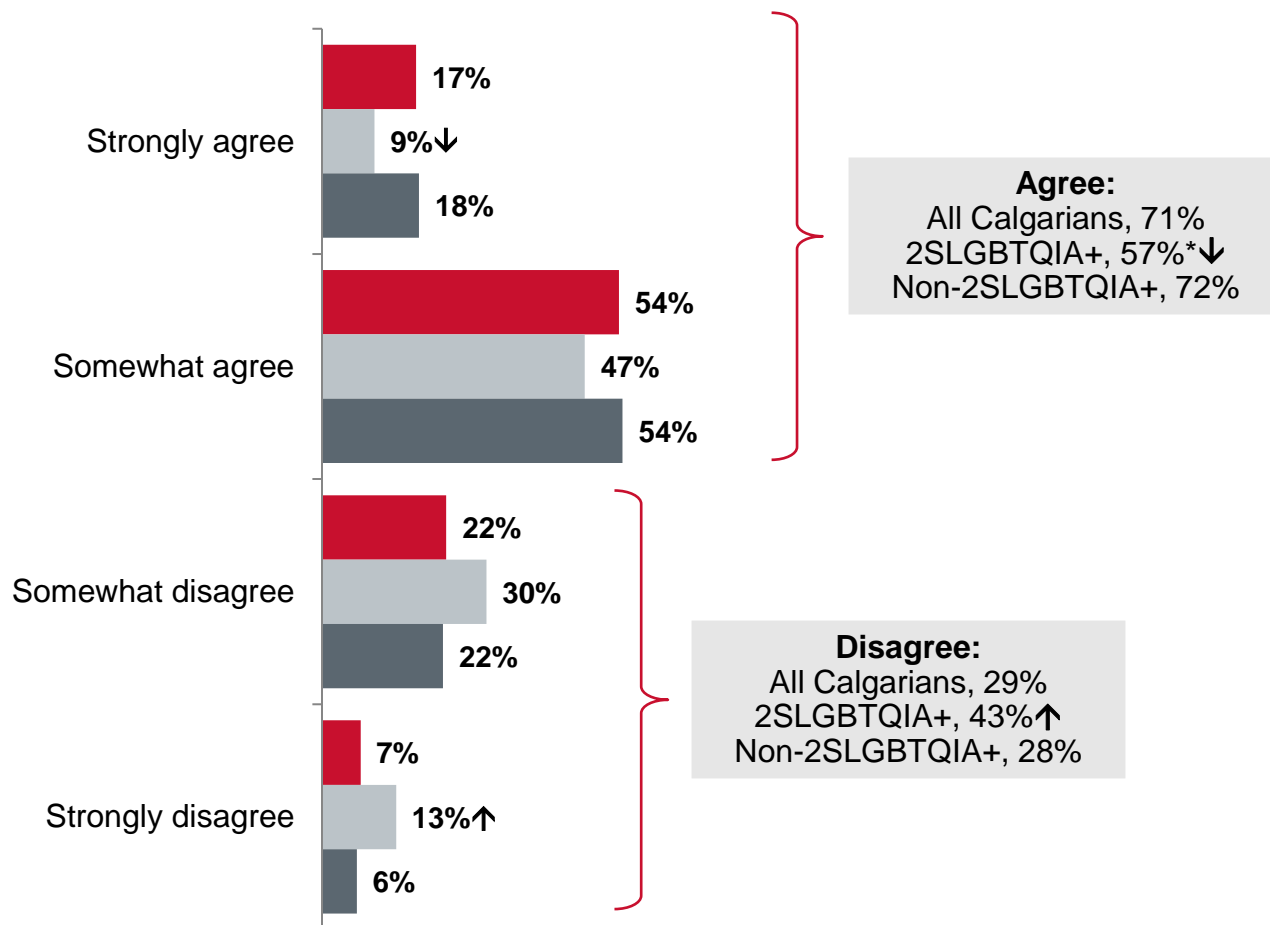
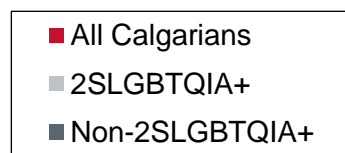

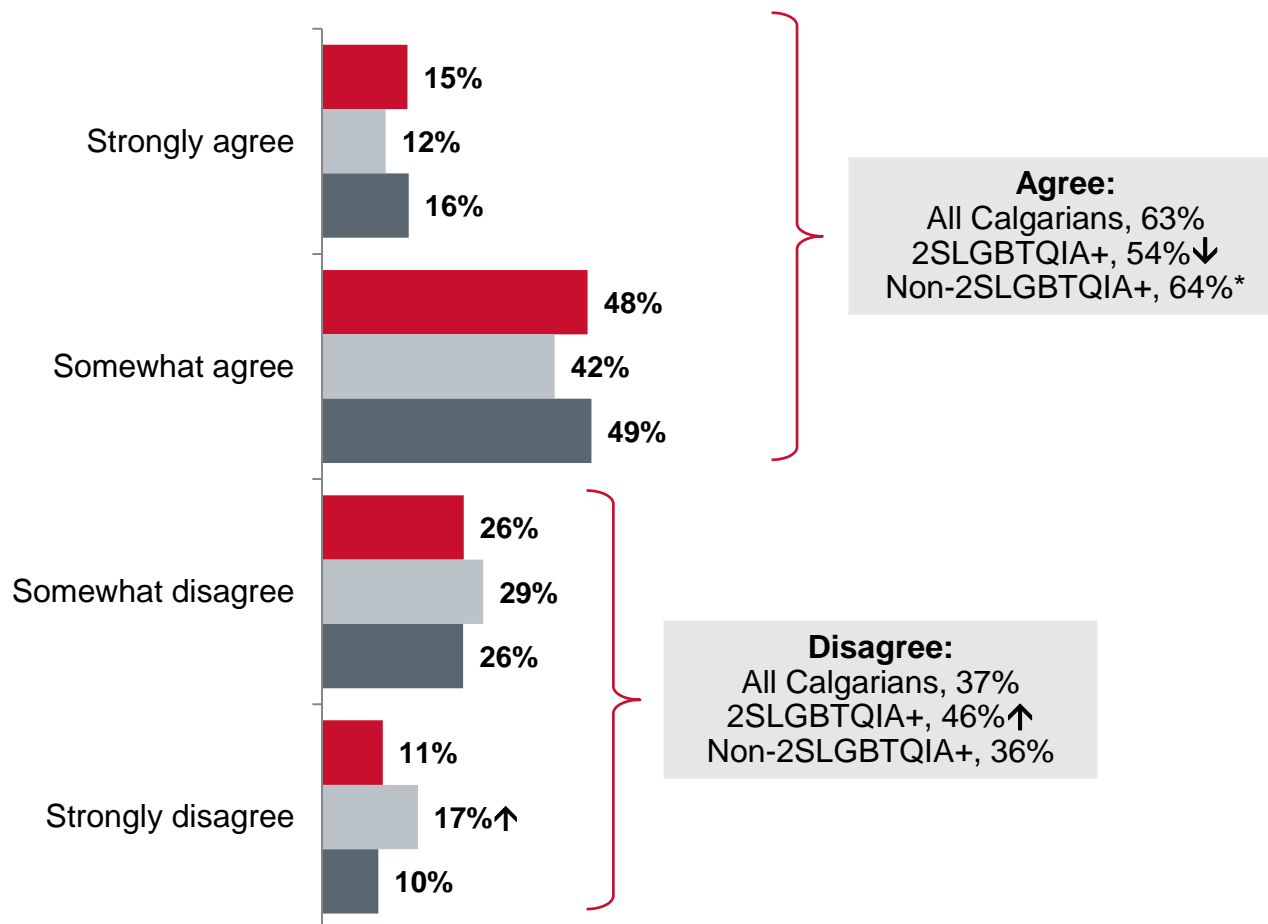
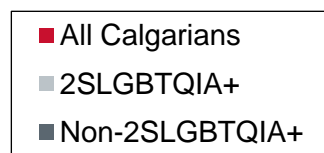

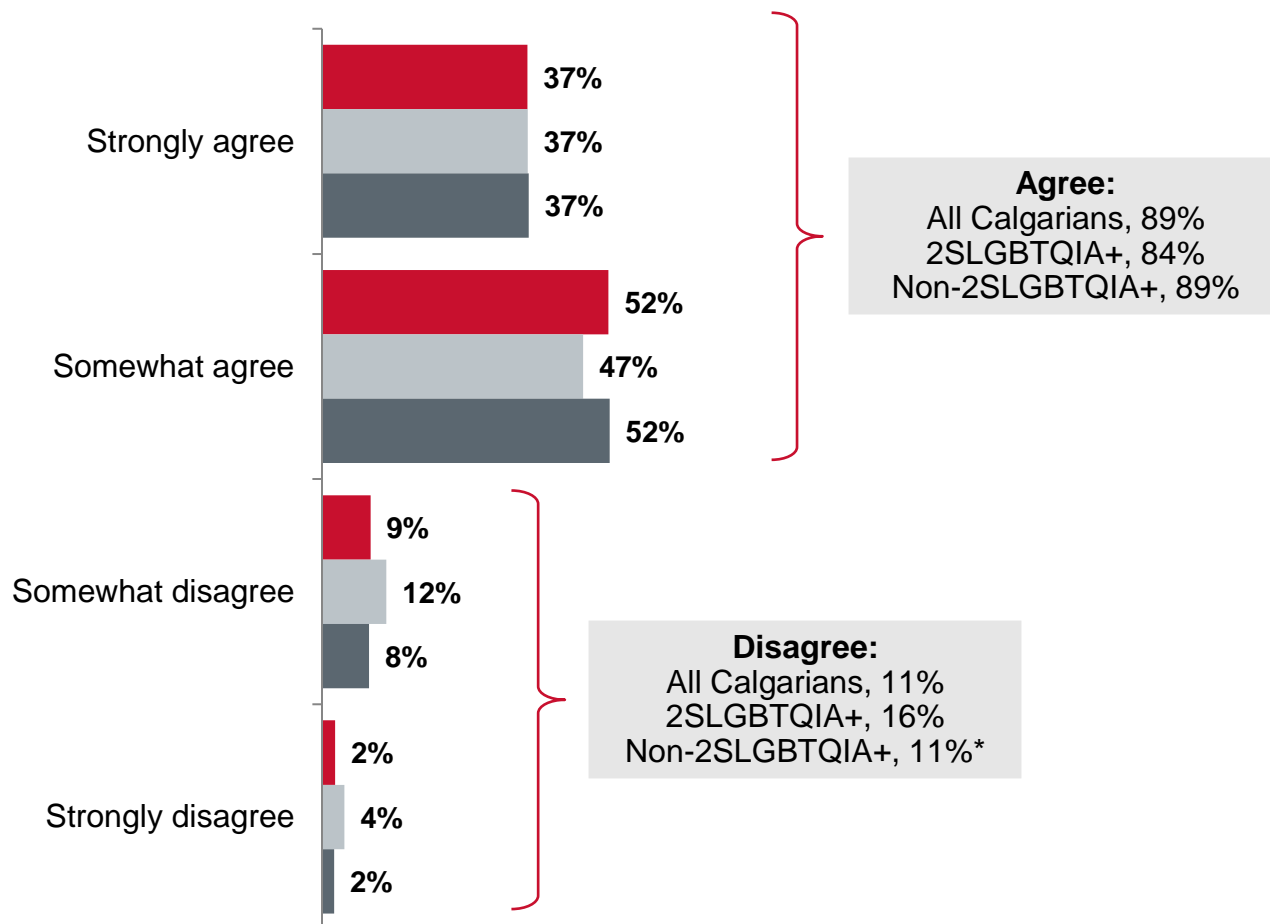
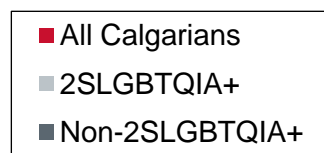

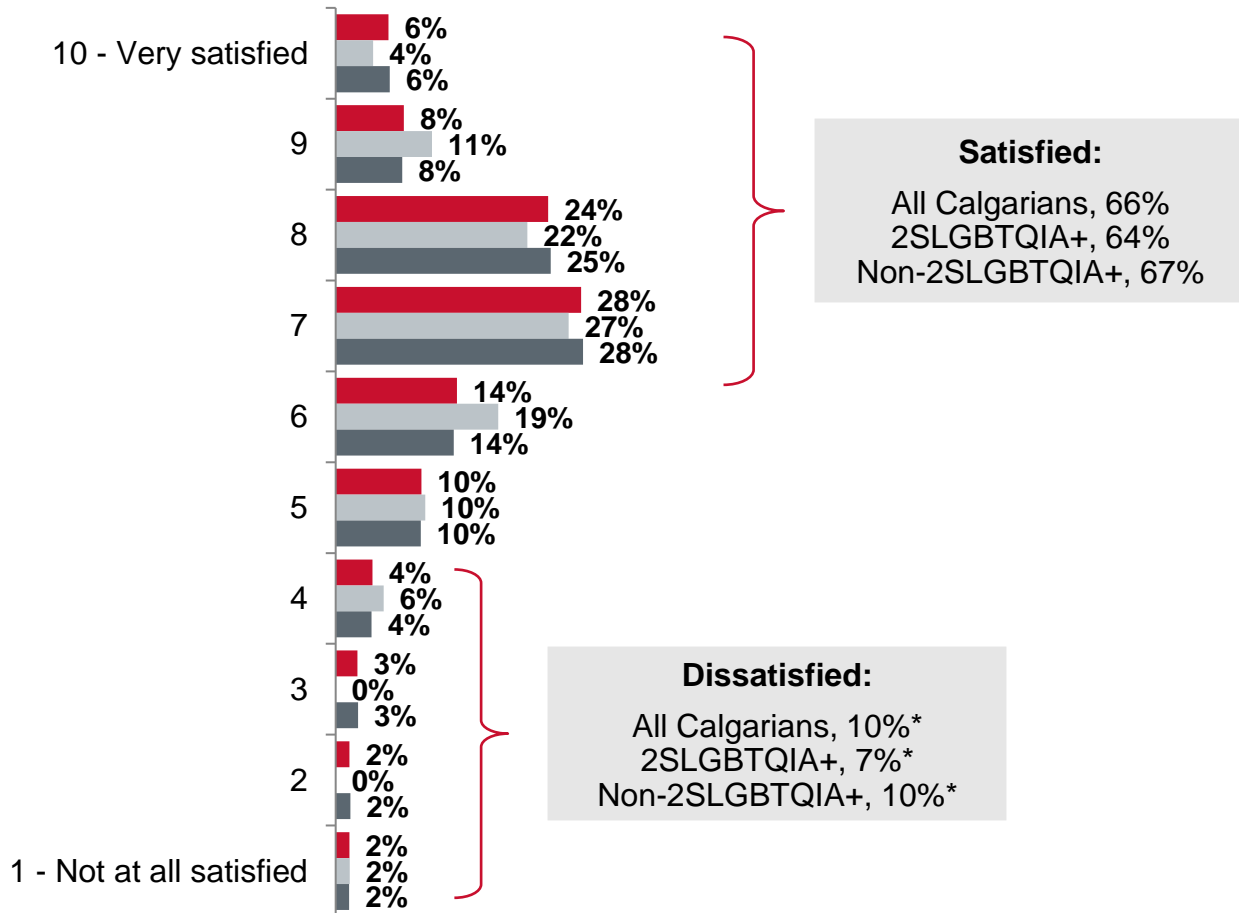
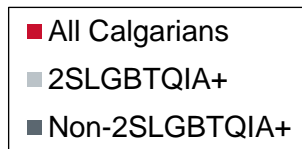




Satisfaction with the Overall Level and Quality of City Services and Programs: 2SLGBTQIA+

Satisfaction with City Programs and Services: 2SLGBTQIA+

2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians are less likely than Non-2SLGBTQIA+ Calgarians to be satisfied with protection from river flooding (87% vs. 94%) but more likely to be satisfied with animal control services for stray animals and pet licensing (99% vs. 91%).
