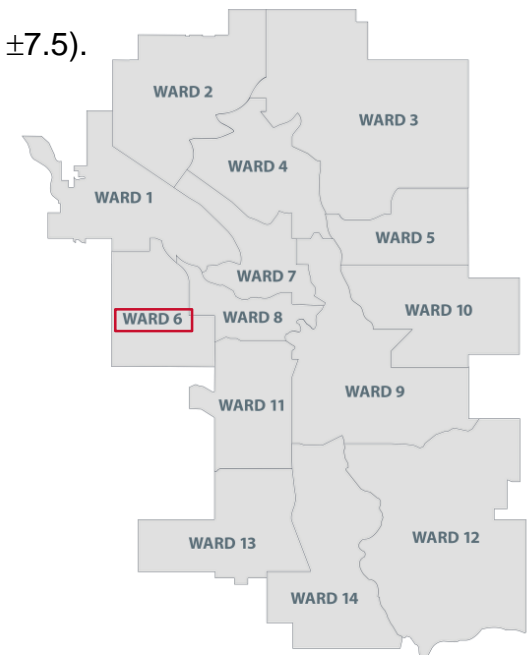

- ❖ Telephone survey conducted with a randomly selected sample of 2,500 Calgarians aged 18 years and older between August 18th and September 6th, 2016.
 - Both landline (70%) and cell phone (30%) sample were used.
 - The average interview length was 31 minutes.
- ❖ Final data were weighted to ensure the overall sample's quadrant, ward and age/gender composition reflects that of the actual Calgary population aged 18 or older according to 2011 Federal Census data.
- ❖ The margin of error (MOE) for the total sample of 2,500 is ± 2.0 percentage points, 19 times out of 20.
 - A total of 175 interviews were conducted with residents of Ward 6 (MOE ± 7.5).
- ❖ Research Note on significant differences:
 - Throughout, City Wide results are compared to results from Ward 6.
 - ↑ indicates a number is significantly higher than City Wide.
 - ↓ indicates a number is significantly lower than City Wide.
- ❖ Where possible, 2016 results for Ward 6 are compared to those from 2015.
 - Only significant differences are shown.





Summary of Key Findings



- ❖ The last twelve months have proven to be difficult for our city, with the impacts of a slowed economy being felt more acutely than in 2015. With Calgary's unemployment rate climbing from 6.8% in 2015 to 8.6% in 2016, downtown office vacancy rates at near record levels, and the value of building permits forecasted to be significantly lower than 2015, speculation continues about whether we will see an upswing as we move into 2017.
- ❖ Despite facing challenging times, many Calgarians as a whole remain resilient. A number of surveys, including this one, report that people have a generally optimistic view about the future, and perceptions of their overall quality of life is still quite strong.
- ❖ Our research suggests that Calgarians are looking to government – Federal, Provincial, and Municipal – for leadership and sound investment to strengthen and diversify our economy moving forward. However, Calgarians are also looking to government to be more watchful and aware of how their tax dollars are being spent.
- ❖ This year's Citizen Satisfaction Survey presents a narrative that highlights some **shifts in perceptions that can likely be attributed to the economic downturn**. It is an important editorial note for those reviewing this year's survey.

Key Findings

The Ward 6 issue agenda is very similar to the City Wide issue agenda.

- ❖ The top two issues of importance to Ward 6 residents are the same as City Wide, namely “*infrastructure, traffic and roads*” (37%) and “*transit*” (19%).
- ❖ The third biggest City Wide issue of “*crime, safety and policing*” is much lower on the Ward 6 issue agenda (7% vs. 15% City Wide).
- ❖ The “*economy*” is an issue on the rise for Ward 6 residents (9% vs. 3% in 2015).

Quality of life is good for Ward 6 residents but worsened impressions are on the rise.

- ❖ Most (86%) Ward 6 residents say the overall quality of life is ‘good’ in the city of Calgary today.
- ❖ However, more than one-third (36%) of residents say they feel that quality of life has ‘worsened’ in the past three years. This is an 11 percentage point jump in ‘worsened’ impressions from 2015 (was 25%) and a 21 percentage point jump from 2014 (was 15%). And compared to last year, fewer Ward 6 residents ‘agree’ that ‘Calgary is a great place to make a living’ (66% vs. 80% in 2015).
- ❖ Suggestions for actions The City of Calgary could take to improve the quality of life have shifted from 2015. There are now more mentions of “*reduce taxes*” (14% vs. 5% in 2015) and “*improve job creation/employment*” (10% vs. 1% in 2015). In contrast, there are fewer mentions of “*transportation*” (26% vs. 39% in 2015) and “*building of community centres/recreation facilities*” (2% vs. 7% in 2015).

Key Findings

On-street bikeways and several other City programs and services have increased in importance for Ward 6 residents.

- ❖ Six-in-ten (61%) Ward 6 residents say that 'on-street bikeways' are an important ('very' or 'somewhat') program or service provided to them by The City of Calgary. This is an increase of 18 percentage points from 2015 (was 43%).
- ❖ Other issues increasing in importance ('very' or 'somewhat') include 'animal control services for stray animals and pet licensing' (82% vs. 70% in 2015), 'affordable housing for low-income families' (94% vs. 87% in 2015) and 'social services for individuals such as seniors or youth' (98% vs. 92% in 2015).
- ❖ Ward 6 residents place less personal importance ('very' or 'somewhat') on 'community services such as support for community associations and not for profit groups' (80% vs. 88% City Wide) and on 'City operated recreation programs' (79% vs. 86% City Wide).

Key Findings

Overall satisfaction with City programs and services is strong, but shifts have occurred in roads, traffic and property taxes.

- ❖ Eight-in-ten (81%) Ward 6 residents say they are 'satisfied' with the overall level and quality of services and programs provided by The City of Calgary.
- ❖ Some satisfaction ('very' or 'somewhat') scores have improved this year, especially for 'City operated roads and infrastructure' (89% vs. 77% in 2015) and for 'traffic flow management' (73% vs. 61% in 2015). Smaller satisfaction increases are noted for 'City operated recreation facilities' (98% vs. 93% in 2015) and 'Calgary Fire Department' (100% vs. 97% in 2015).
- ❖ The biggest shift in 2015 is a downward movement in 'satisfaction' with 'property tax assessment' (67% vs. 81% in 2015).
- ❖ Ward 6 residents are more satisfied than City Wide with 'animal control services for stray animals and pet licensing' (97% vs. 93% City Wide) and 'City operated recreation facilities' (98% vs. 93% City Wide).

Key Findings

Ward 6 residents are less likely than City Wide to want The City to increase investment in several programs and services.

- ❖ Ward 6 residents are less supportive than City Wide residents of increased City investment in many programs and services. The gap is widest on services such as ‘community services such as support for community associations & not for profit groups’ (17% vs. 29% City Wide), ‘snow removal’ (38% vs. 49% City Wide), ‘the quality of drinking water’ (20% vs. 31% City Wide) and ‘9-1-1’ (25% vs. 35% City Wide).
- ❖ Compared to 2015, Ward 6 residents are more likely to say they want The City to increase investment in ‘disaster planning and response’ (32% vs. 22% in 2015), as well as the ‘City of Calgary website’ (17% vs. 9% in 2015).

Other notable differences/changes for Ward 6 residents include the following:

- ❖ Ward 6 residents are more likely than City Wide to say they feel ‘very safe’ walking alone in their neighbourhood after dark (53% vs. 42% City Wide).
- ❖ Ward 6 residents are more likely to agree (‘strongly’ or ‘somewhat’) than in 2015 that ‘The City of Calgary makes customer service a priority’ (89% vs. 80% in 2015).

Ward 6 residents are consistent with City Wide and 2015 responses in terms of environmental performance, taxation, contact with The City and City communications.

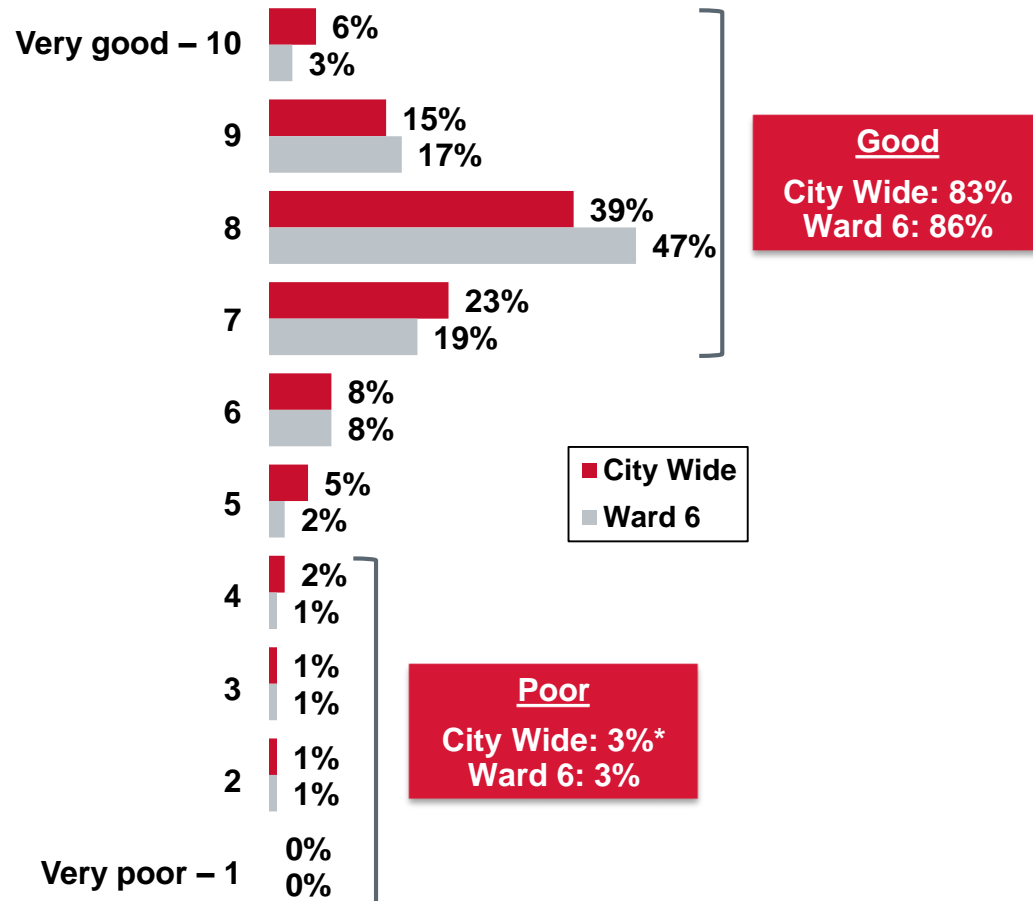

Overall Quality of Life in Calgary

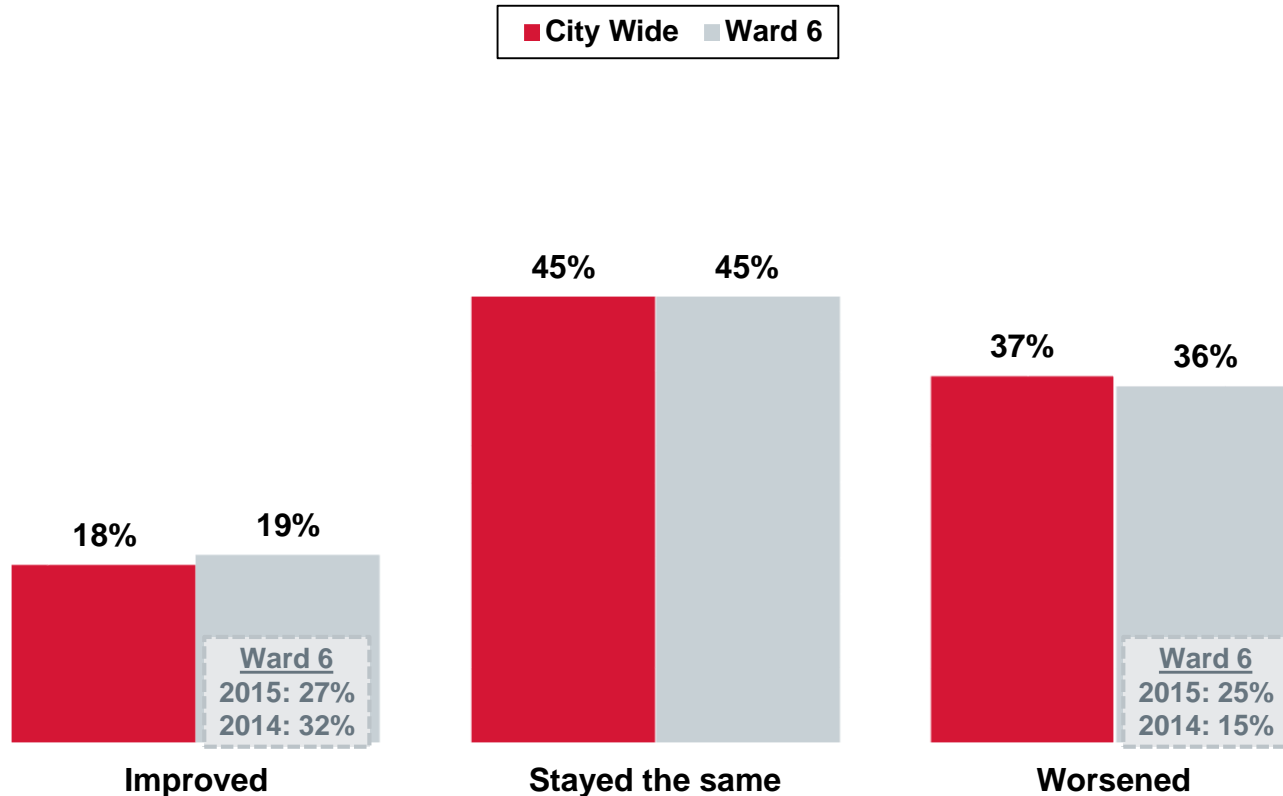

And, do you feel that the quality of life in the city of Calgary in the past three years has ...?

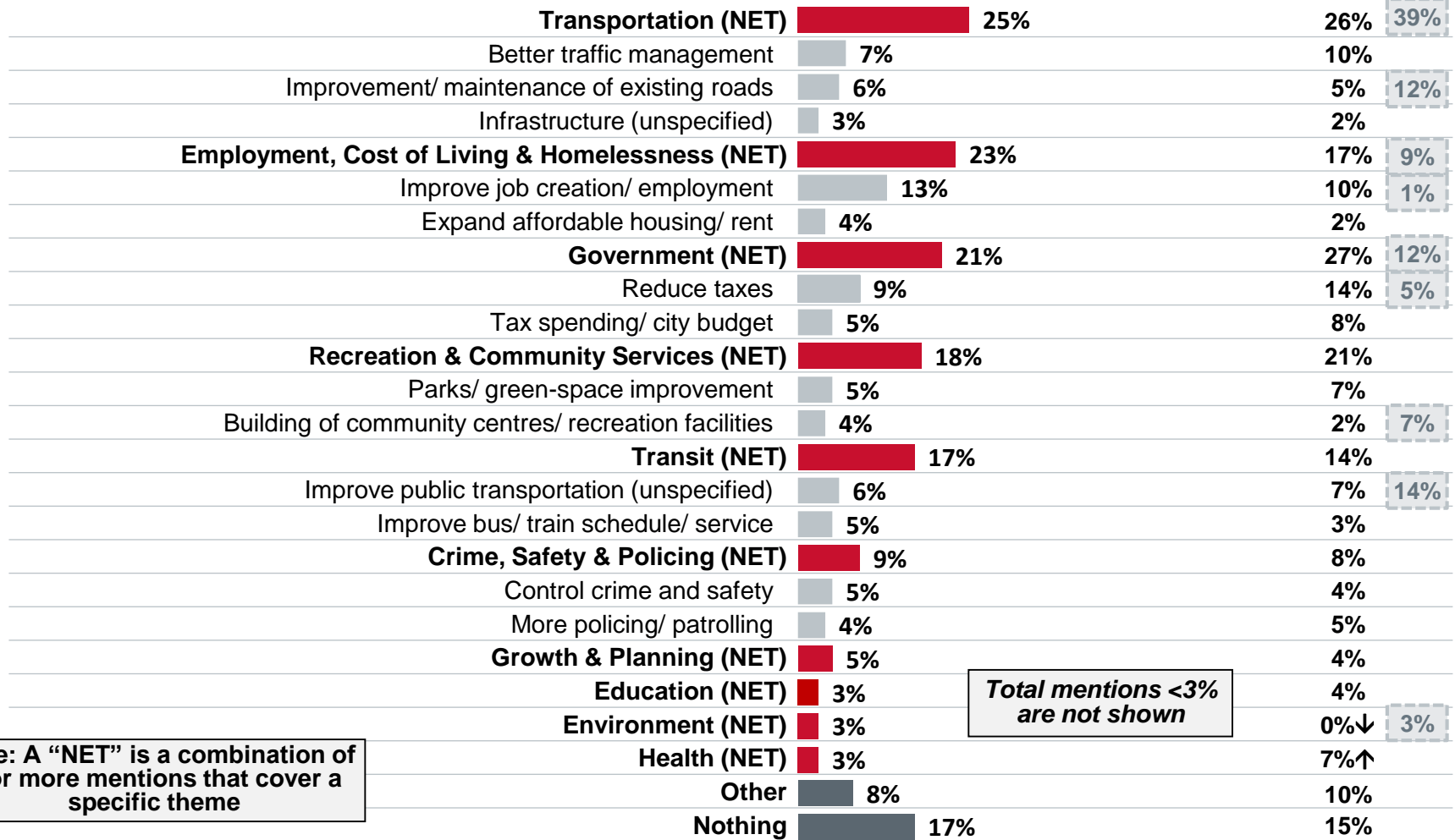

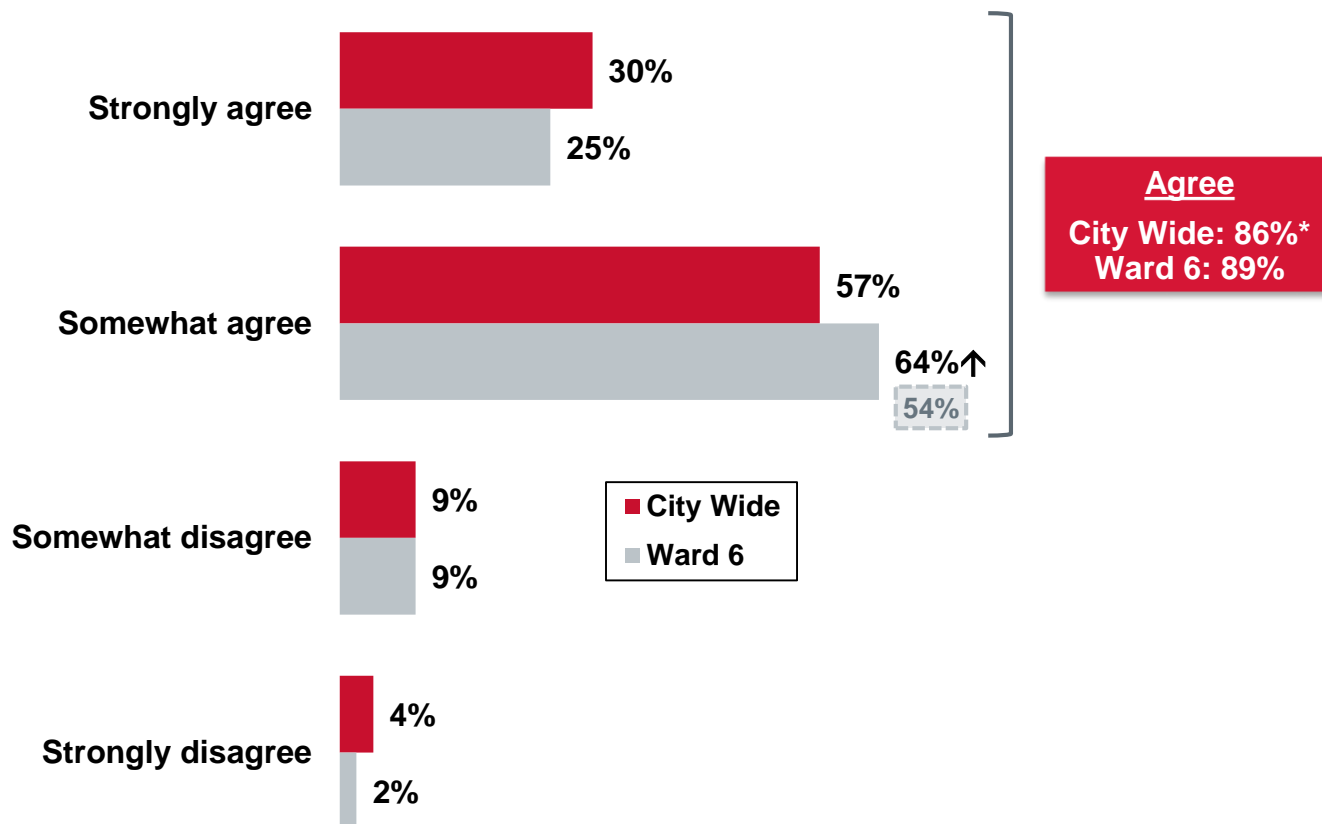

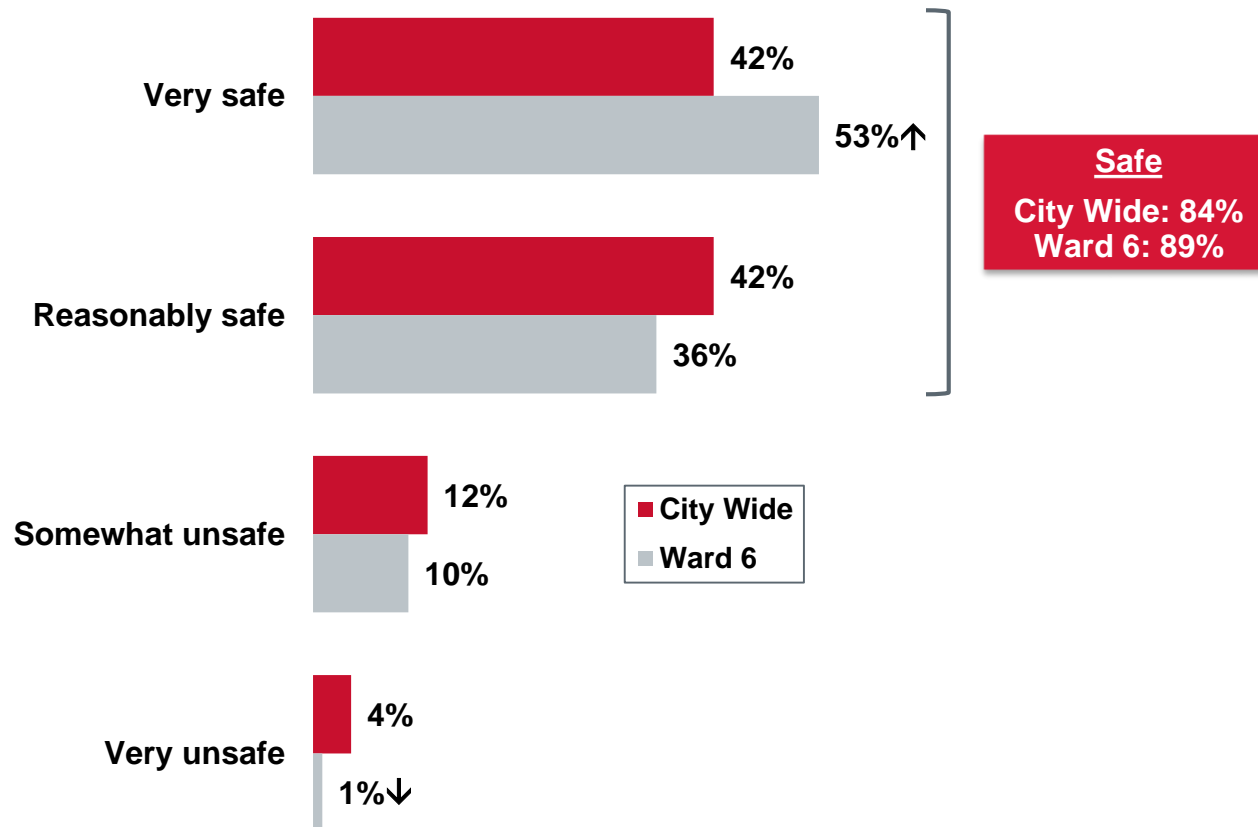

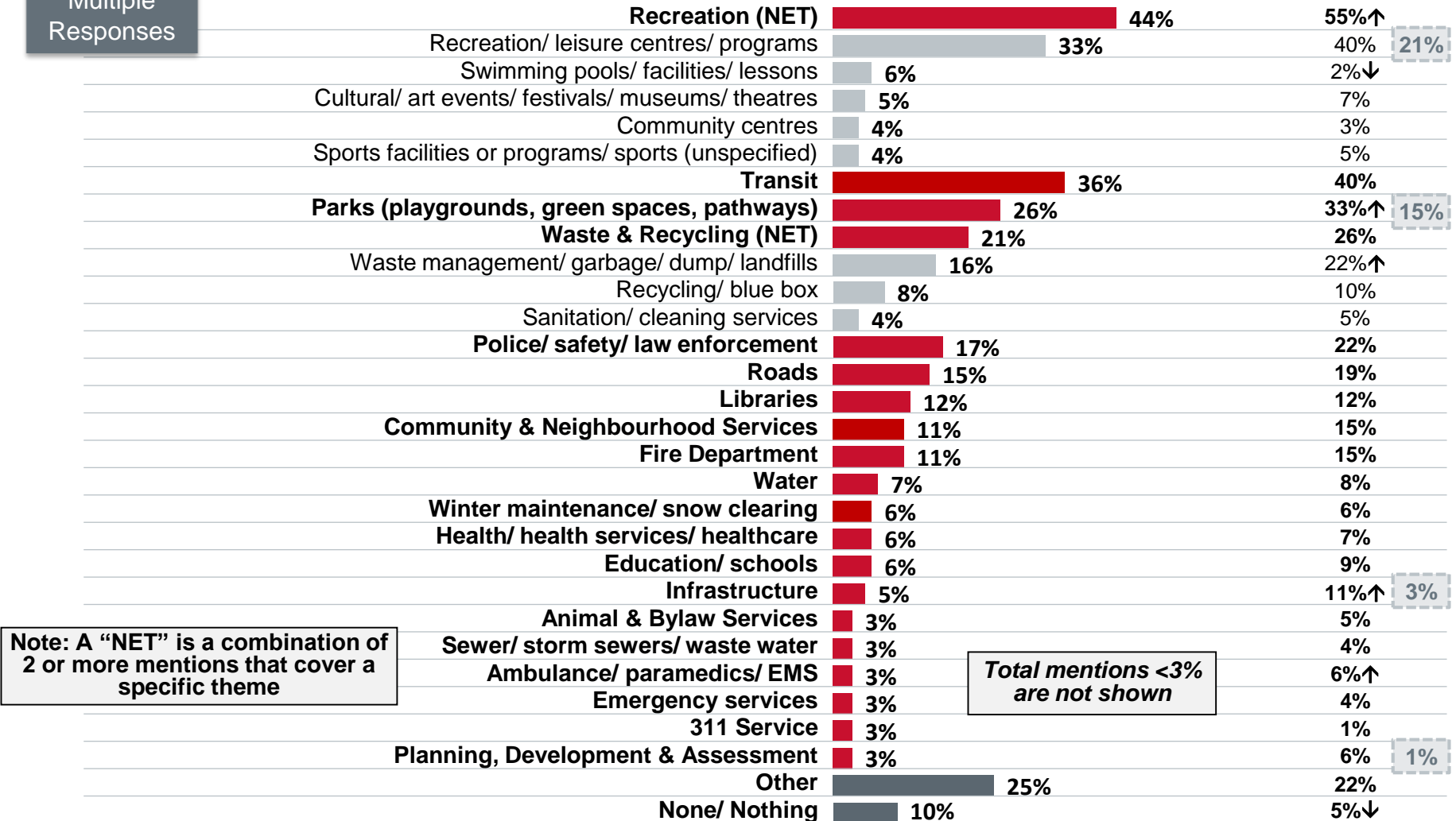

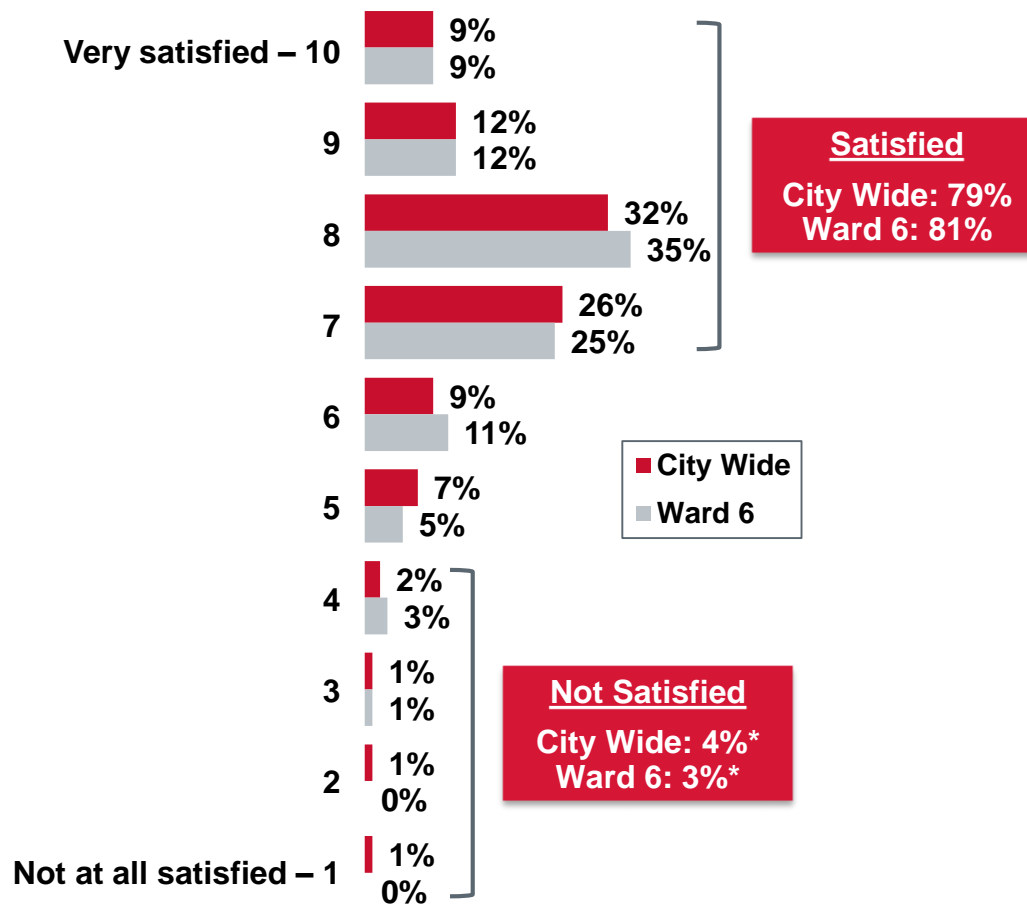

Overall Satisfaction with the Level and Quality of City Services and Programs

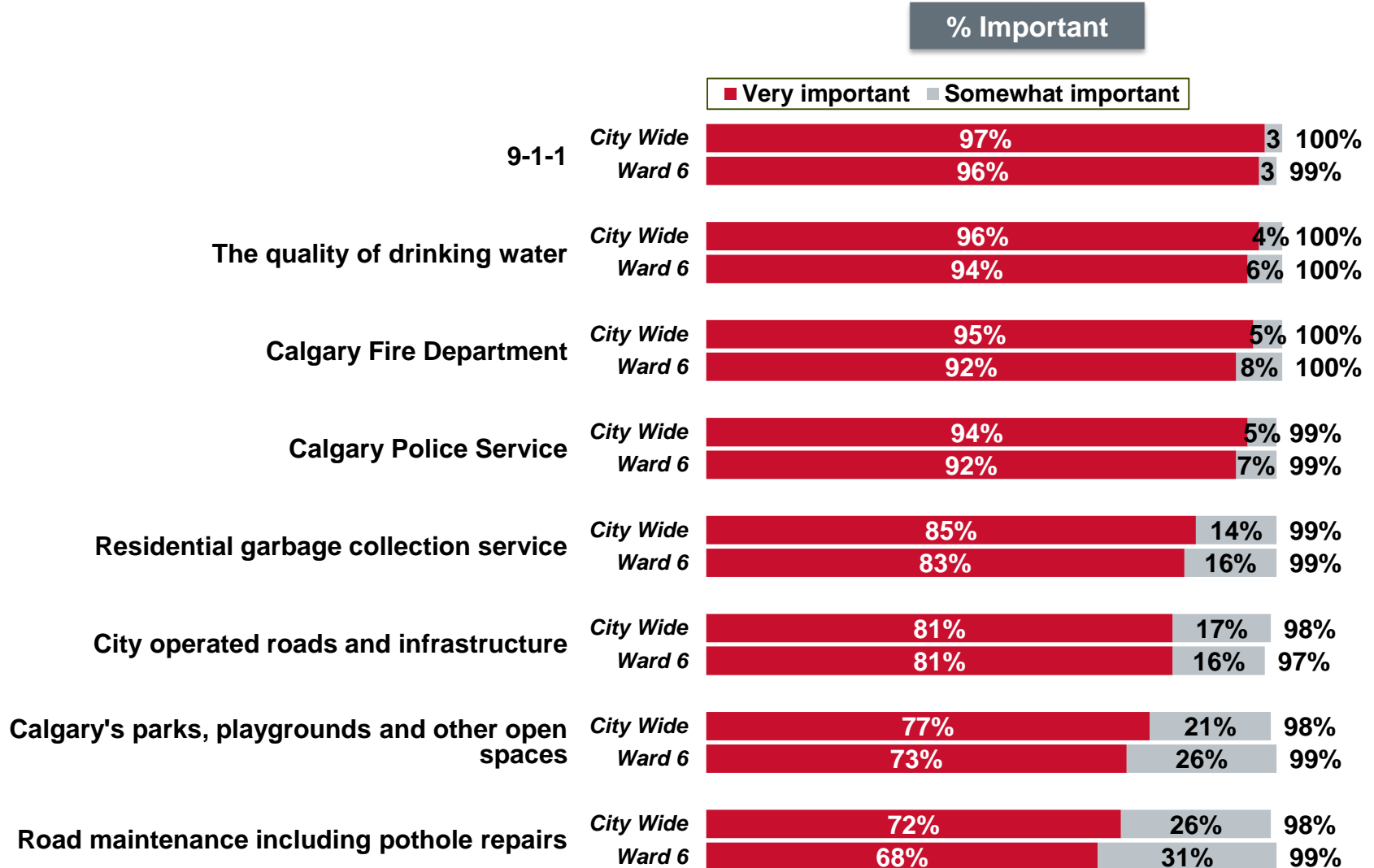

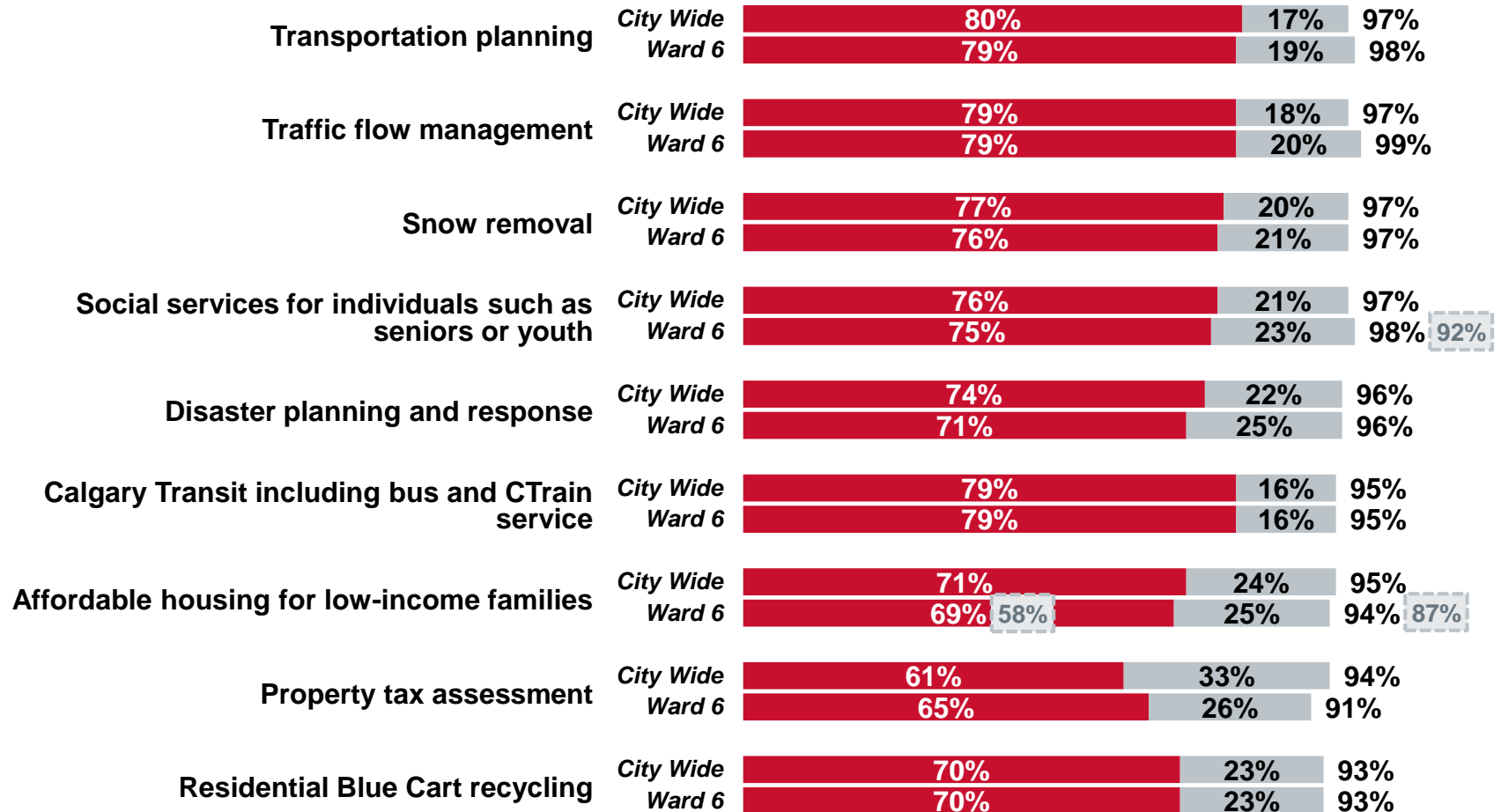

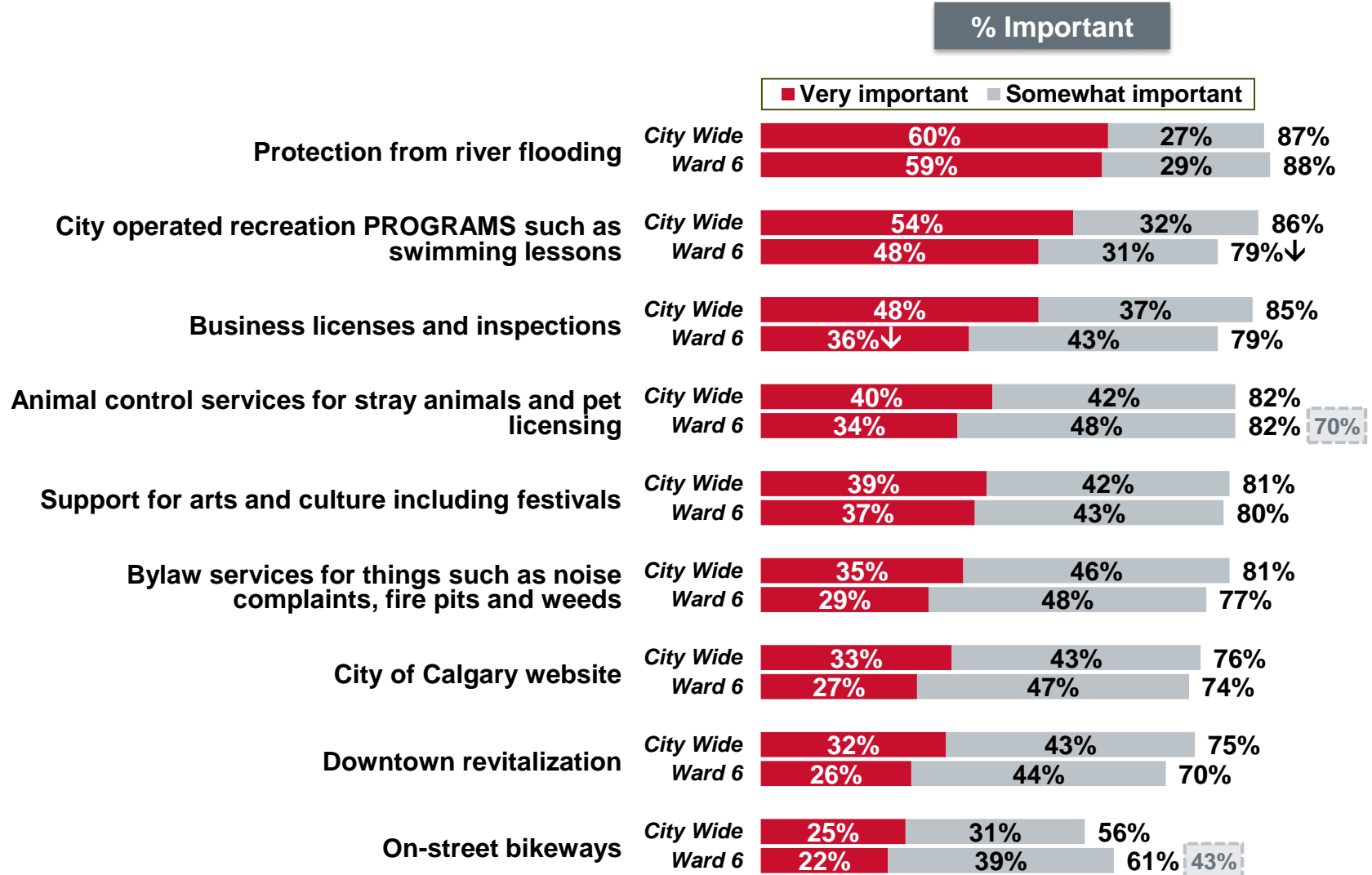

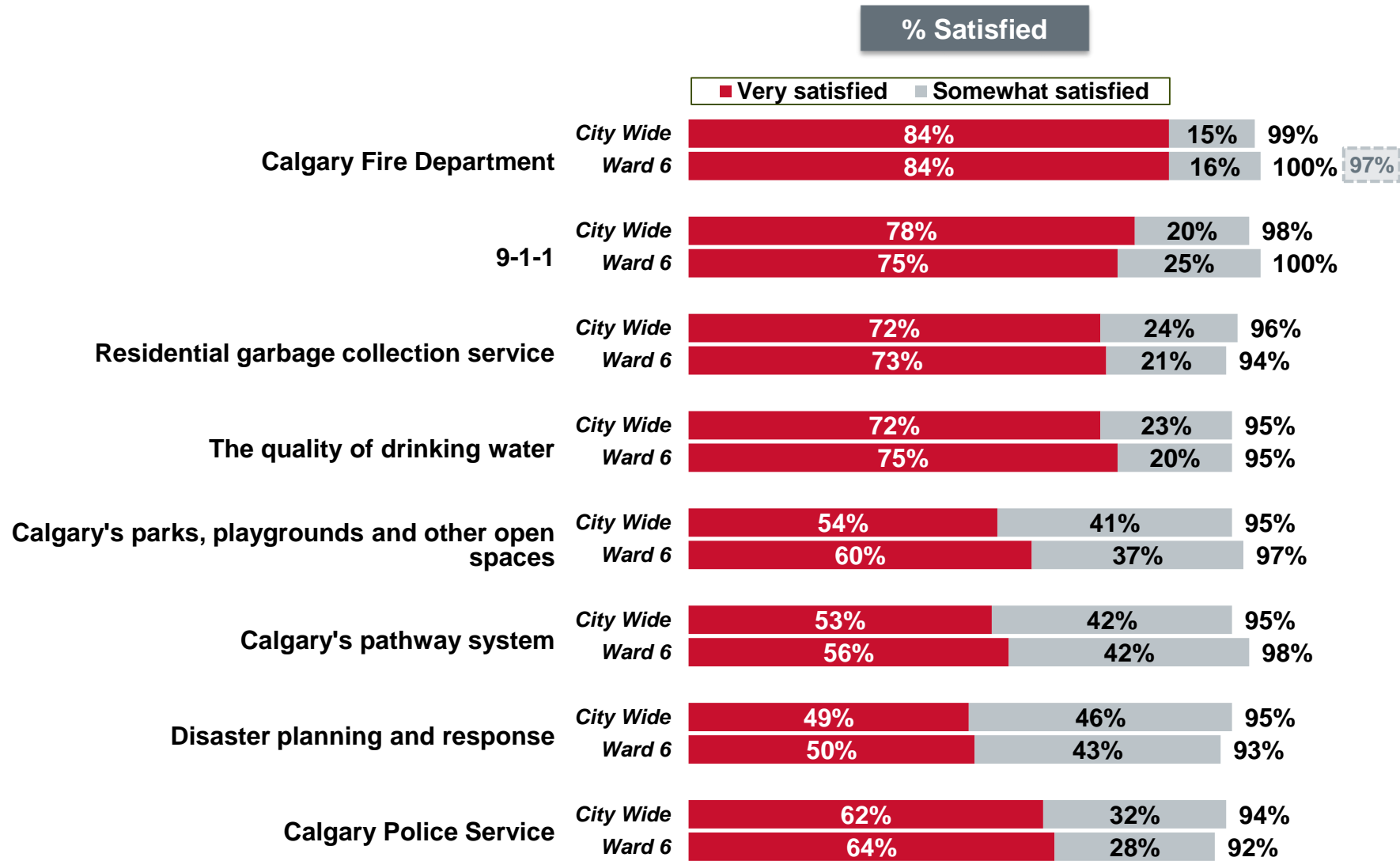

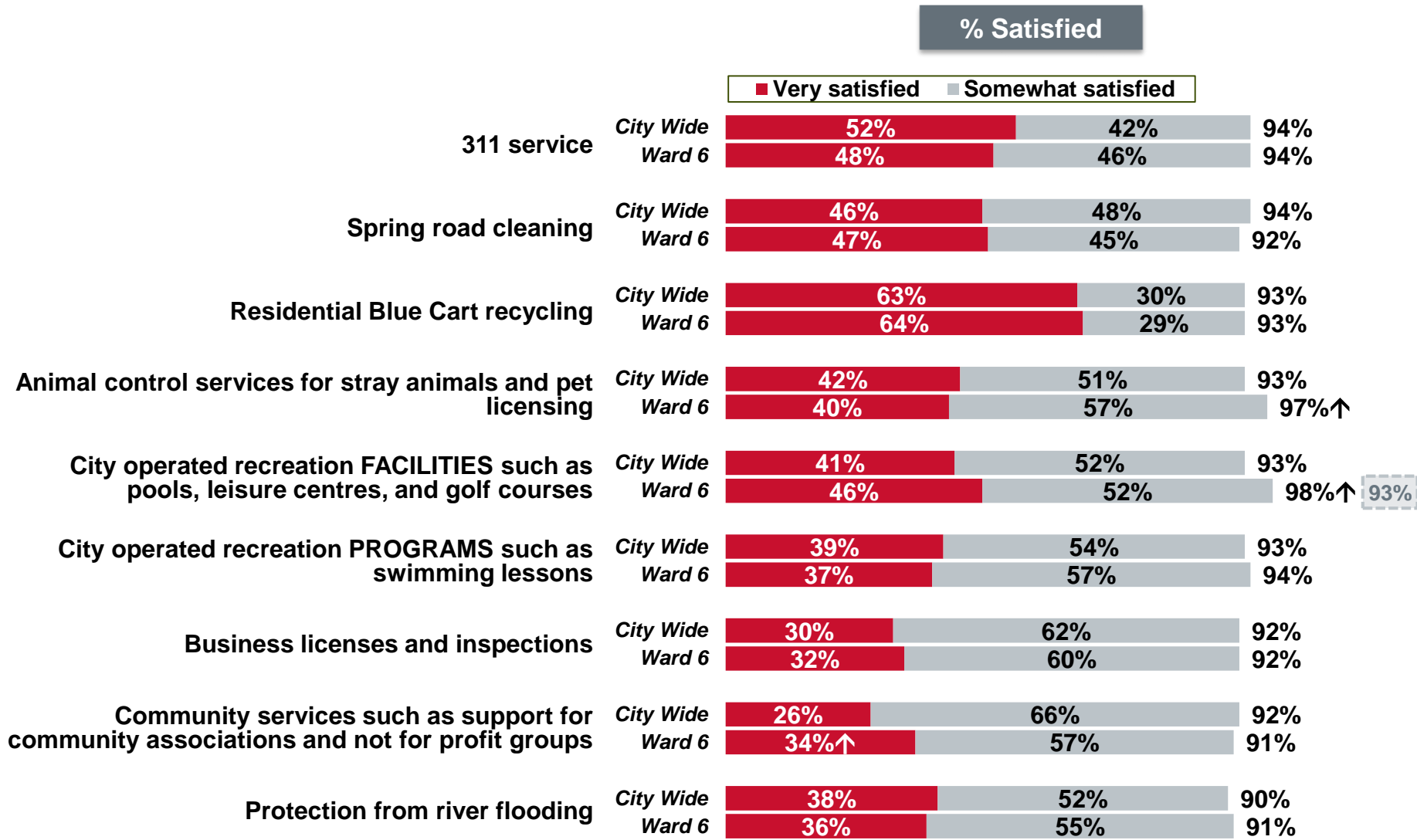
Satisfaction with City Programs and Services

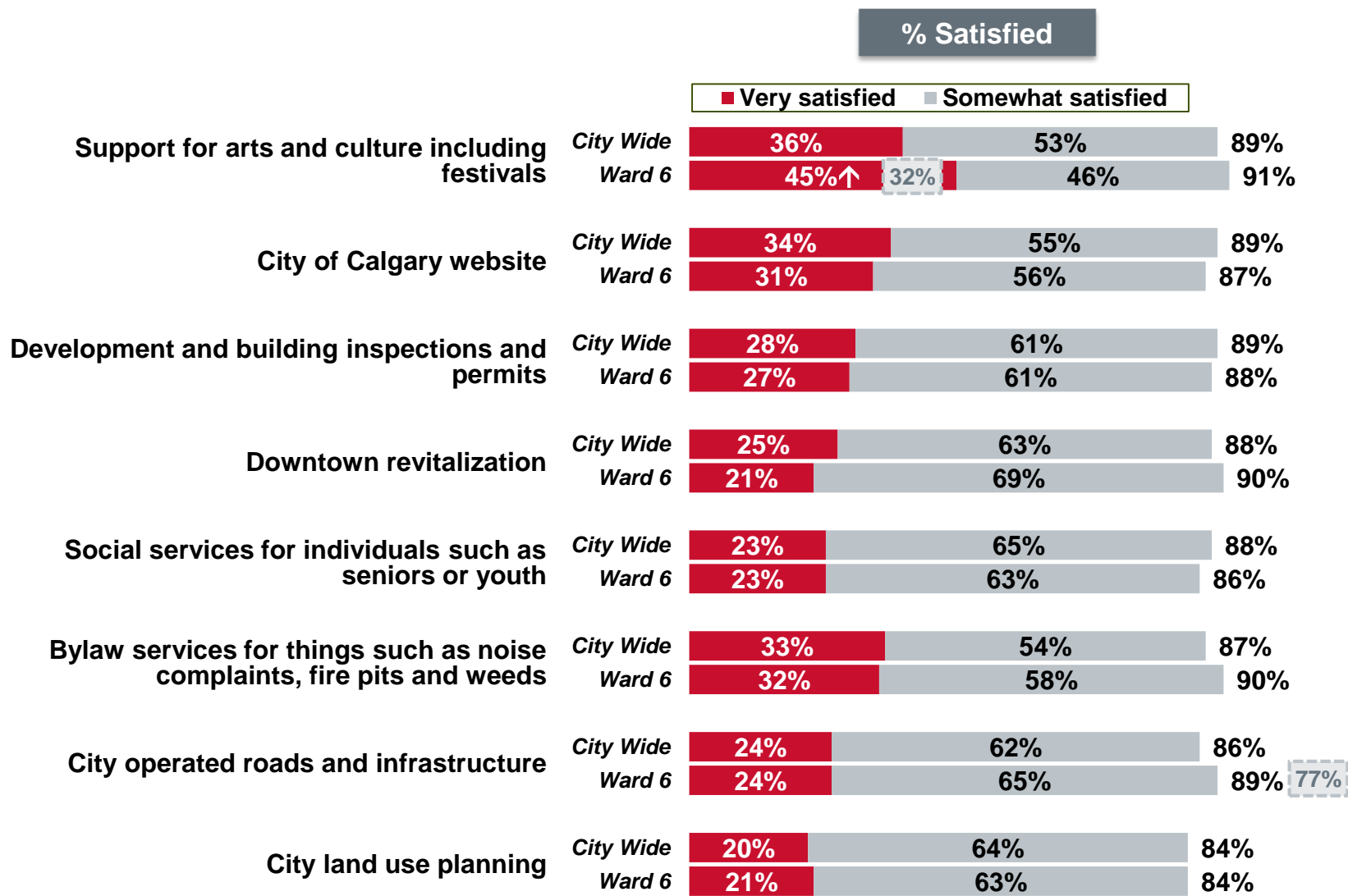

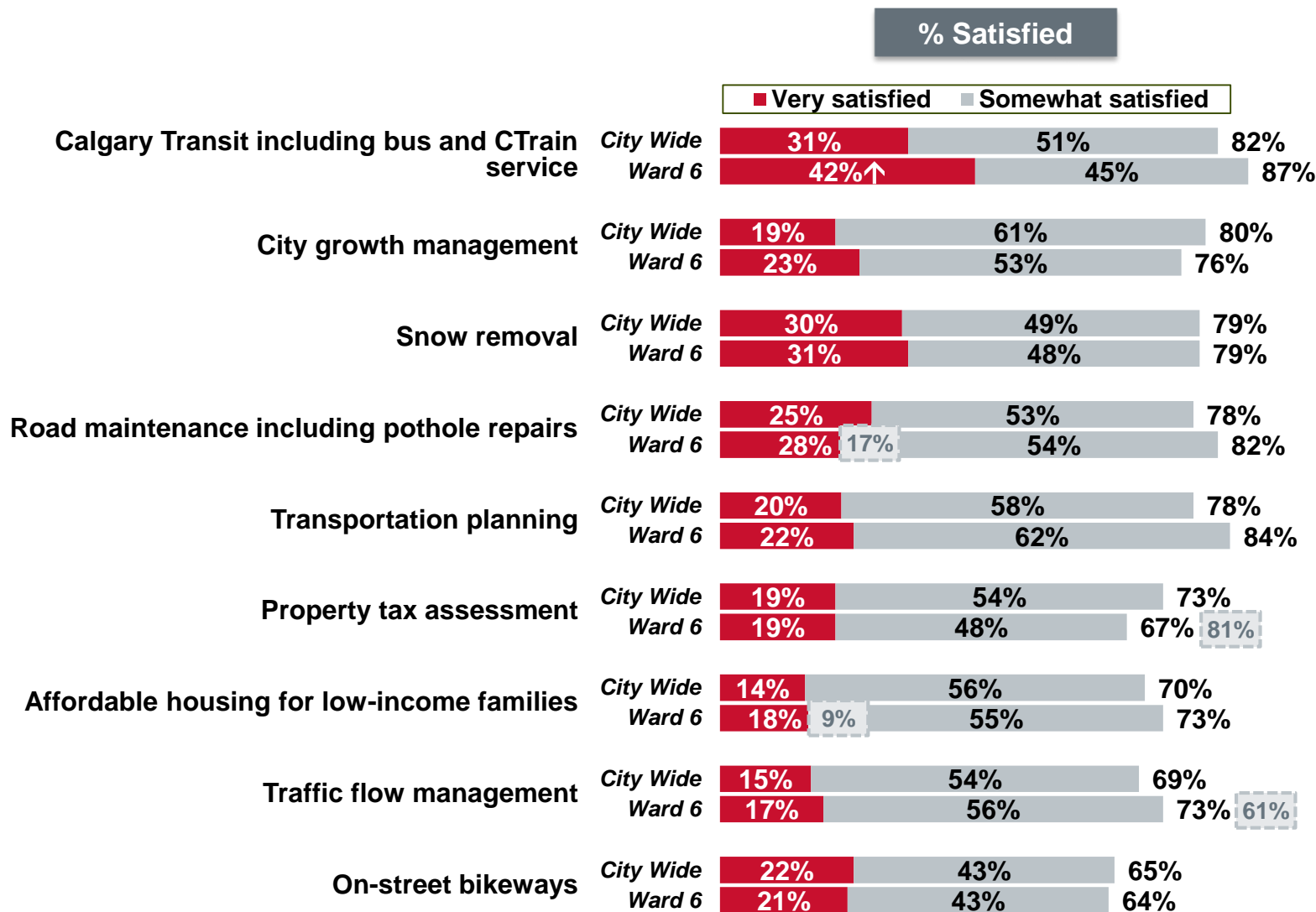

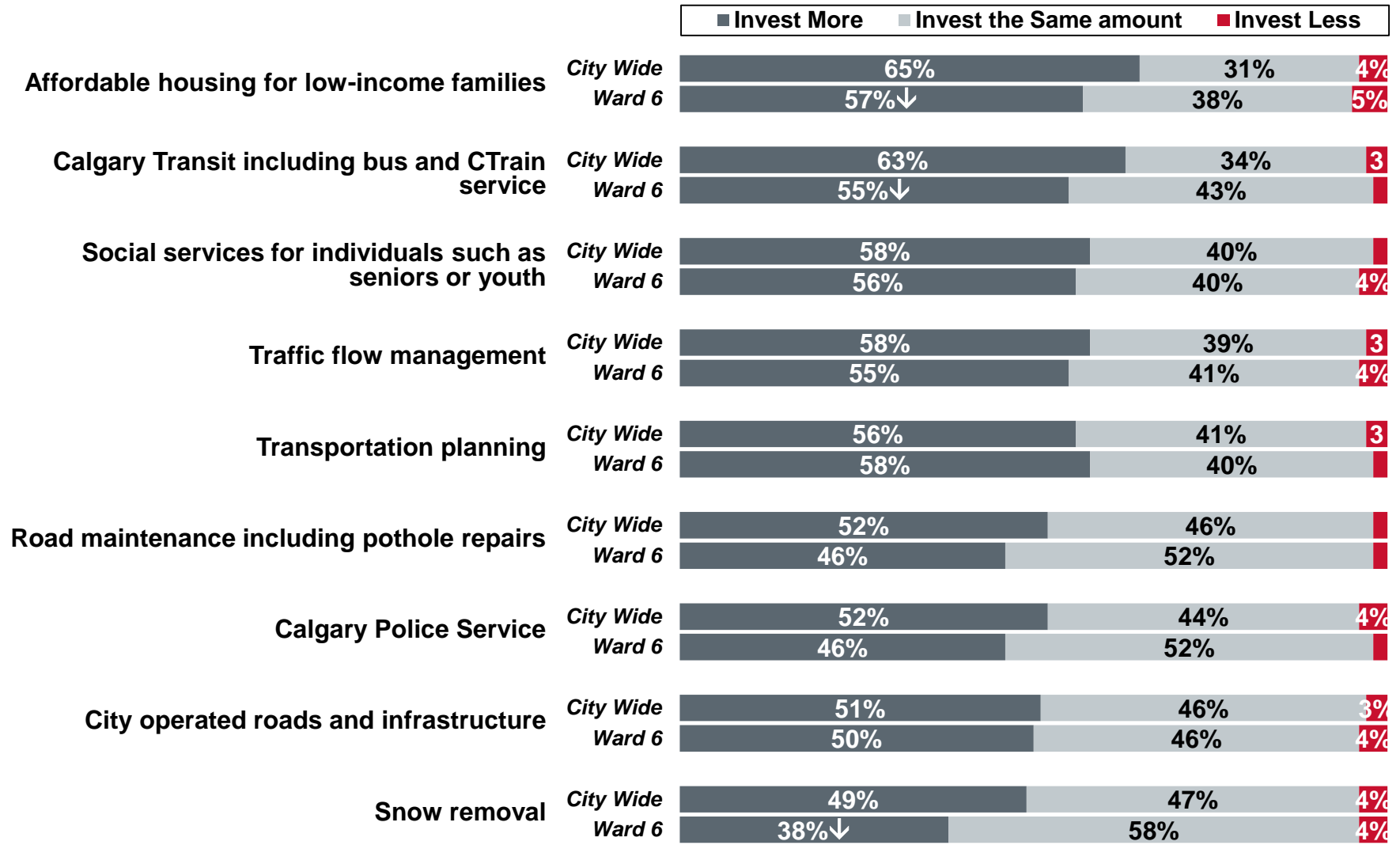

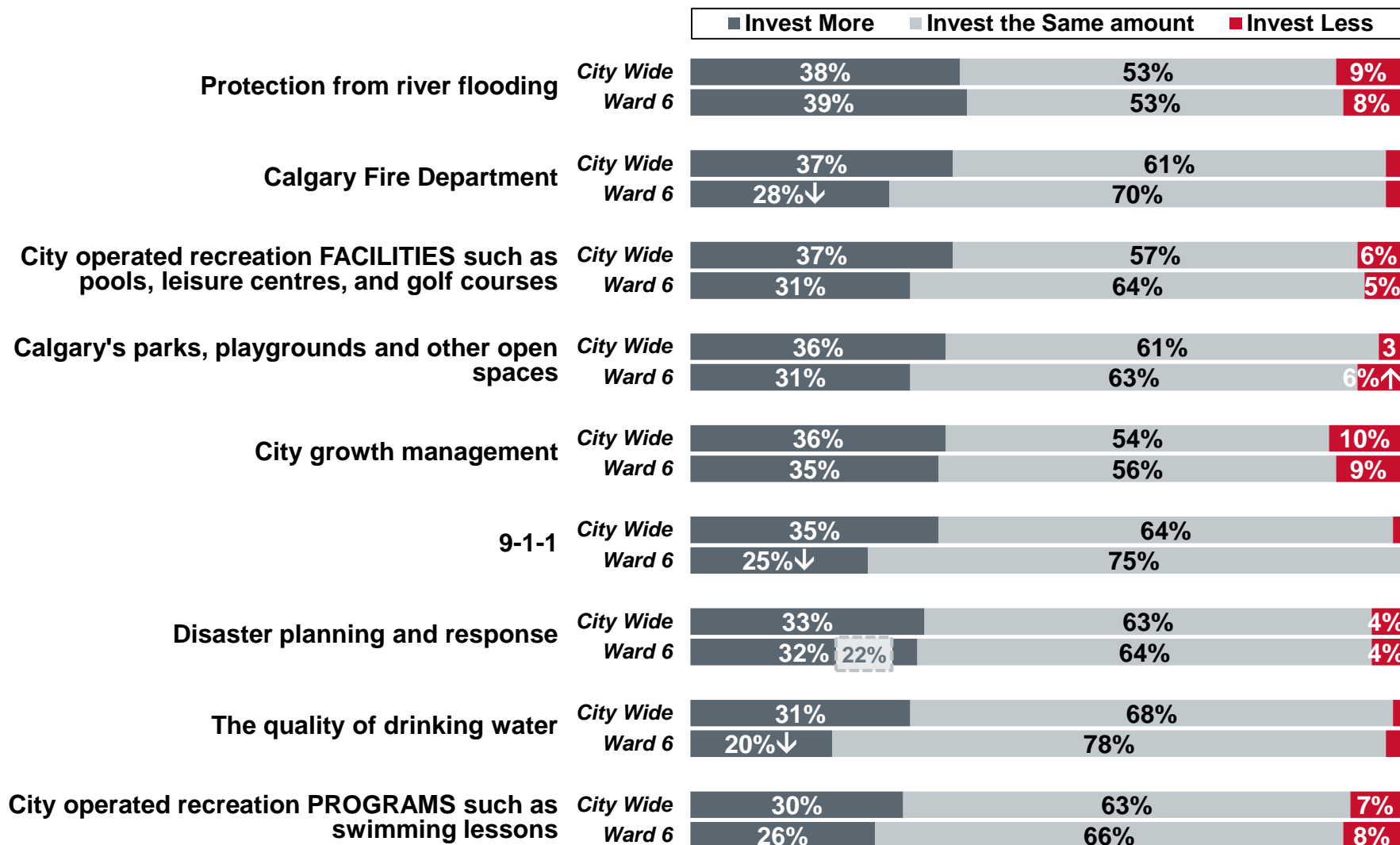
Investment in City Programs and Services

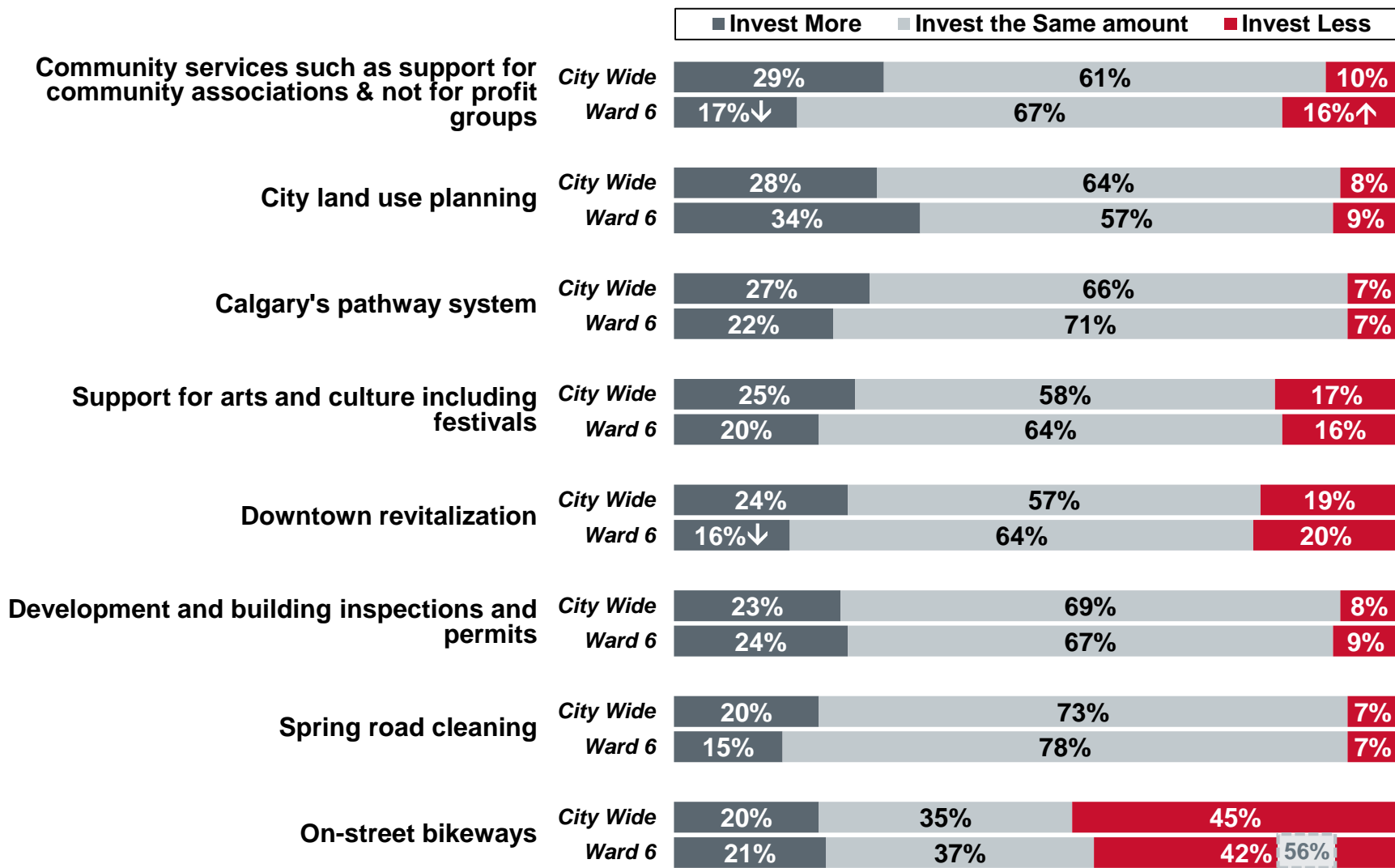

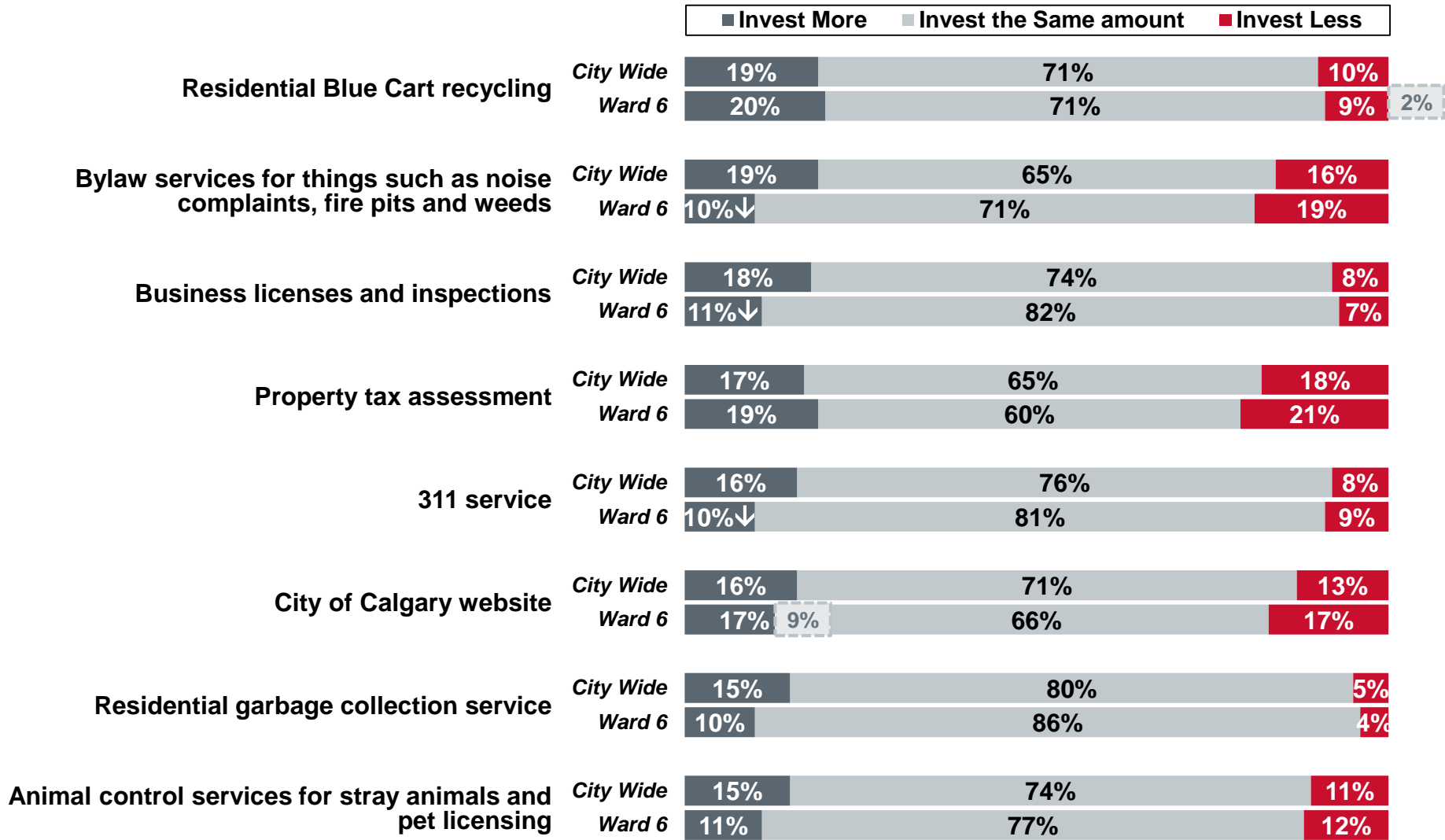

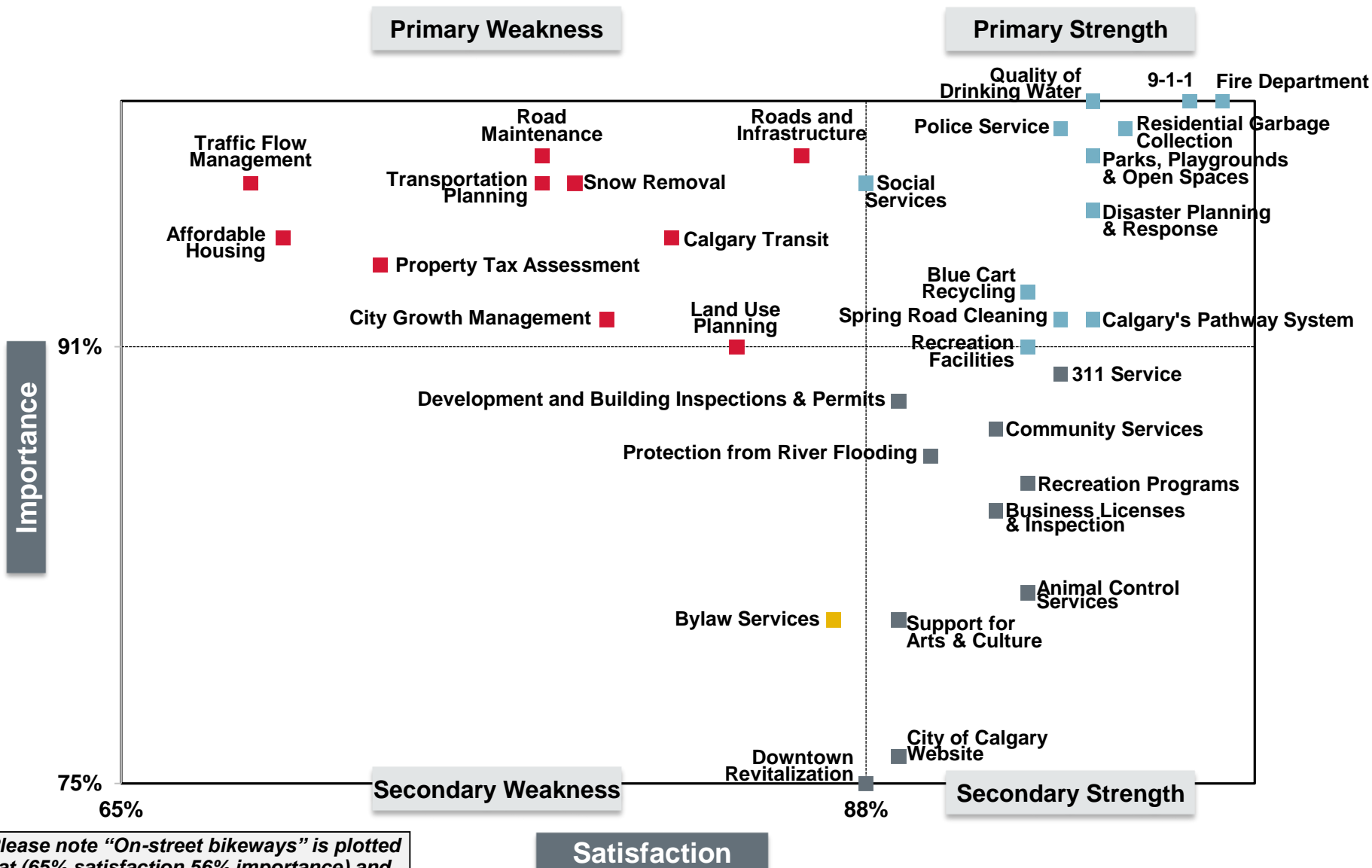

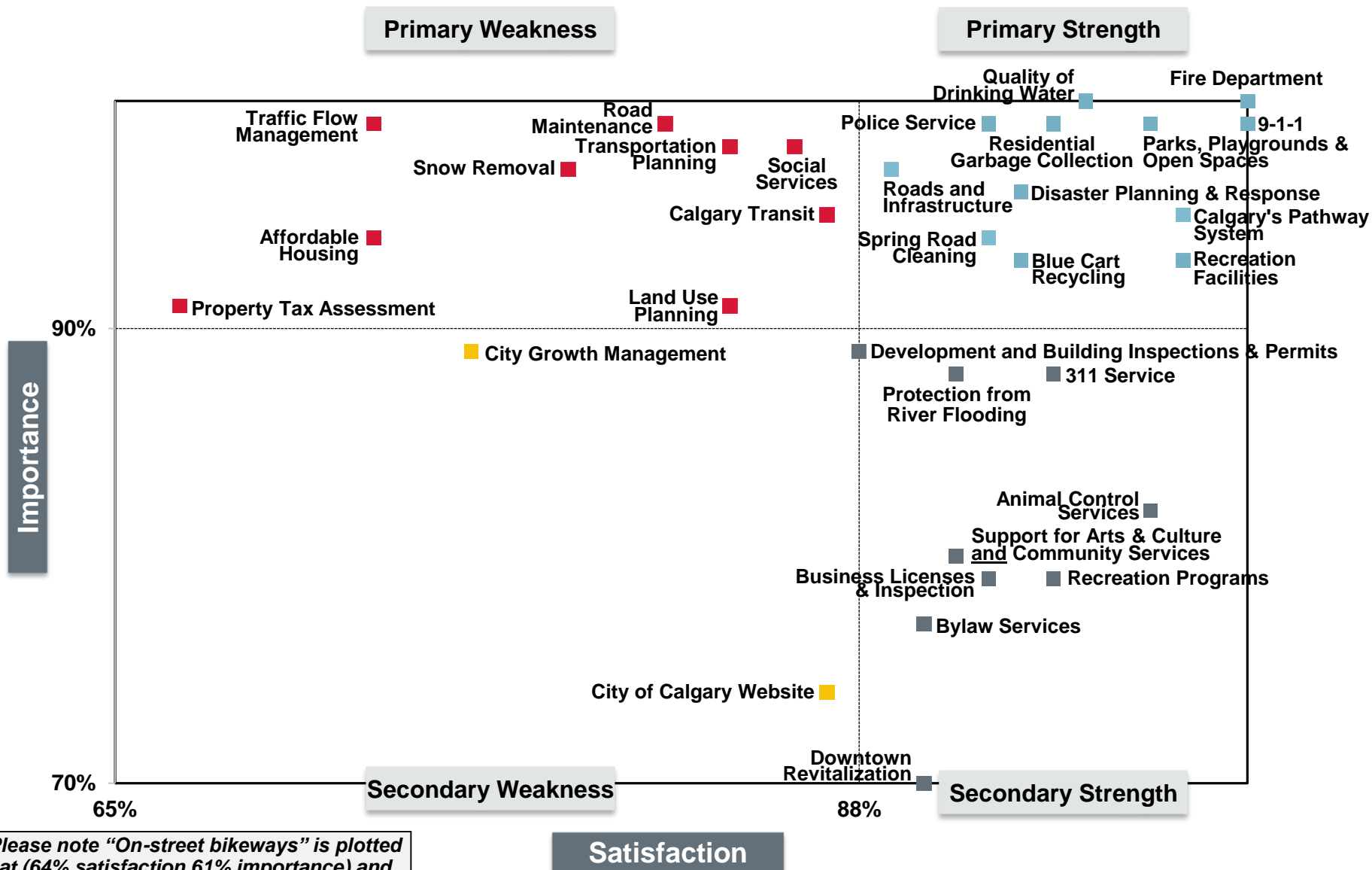

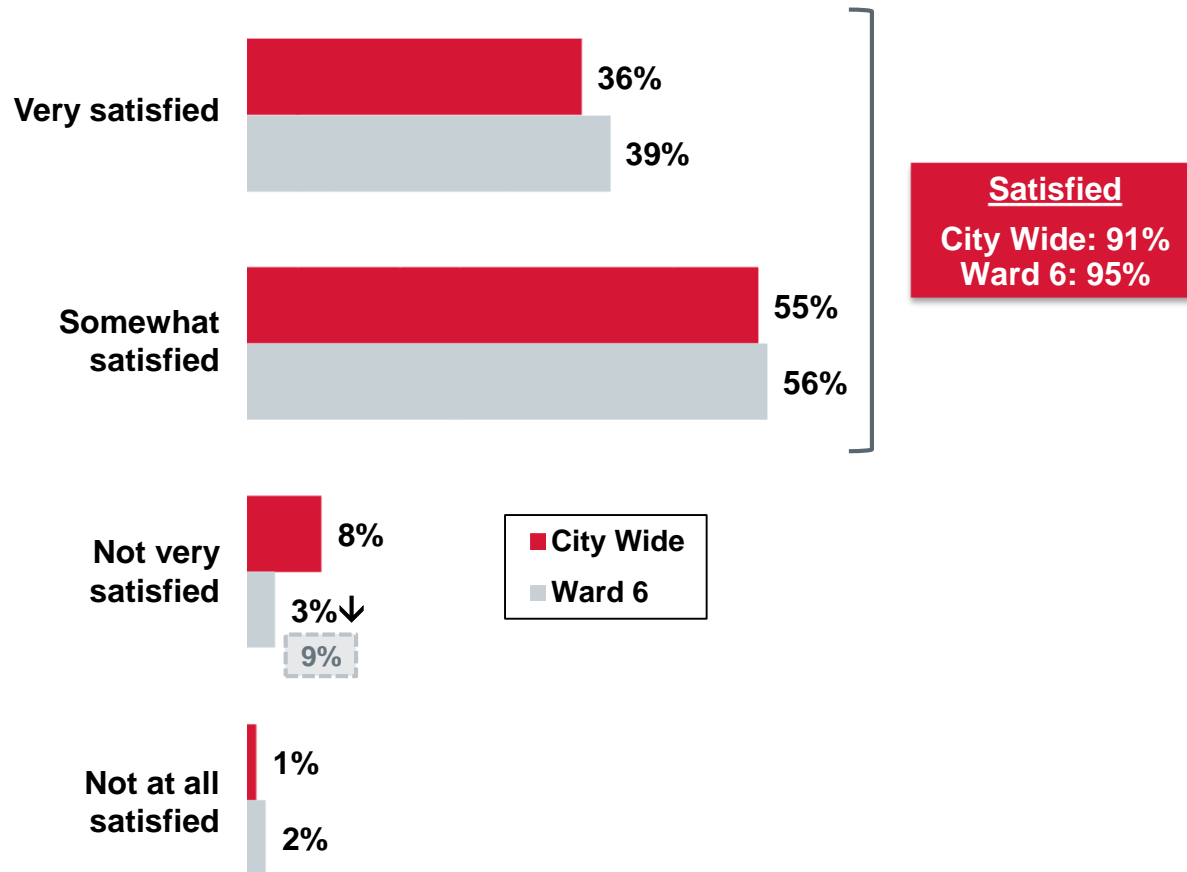
Perceptions About Overall State of Calgary's Environment

Satisfaction with The City's Environmental Performance

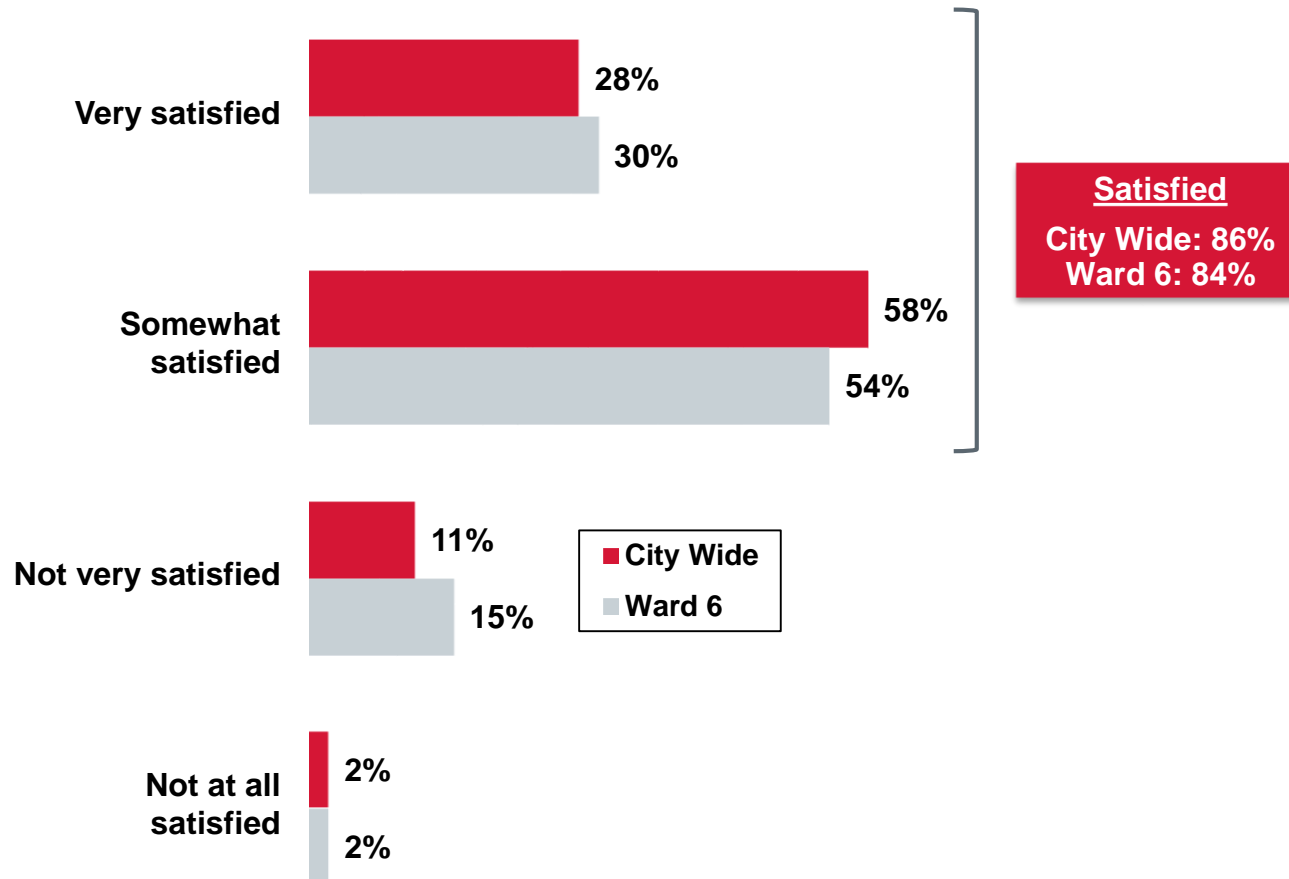


How satisfied are you with the job The City of Calgary is currently doing to protect the environment?

Satisfaction with The City's Environmental Programs and Services



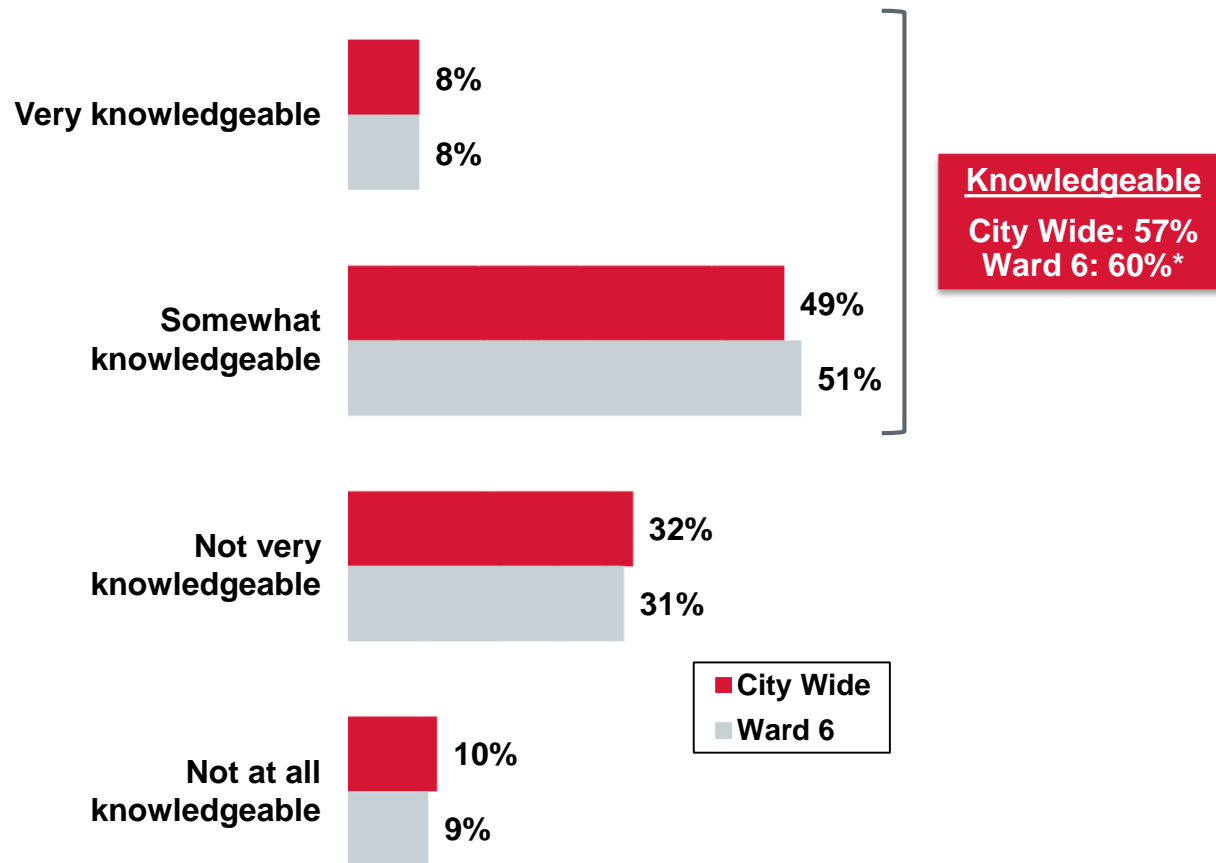
How satisfied are you with The City of Calgary's programs and services aimed at helping Calgarians reduce their environmental impact?

Knowledge Levels of Tax Dollar Spending

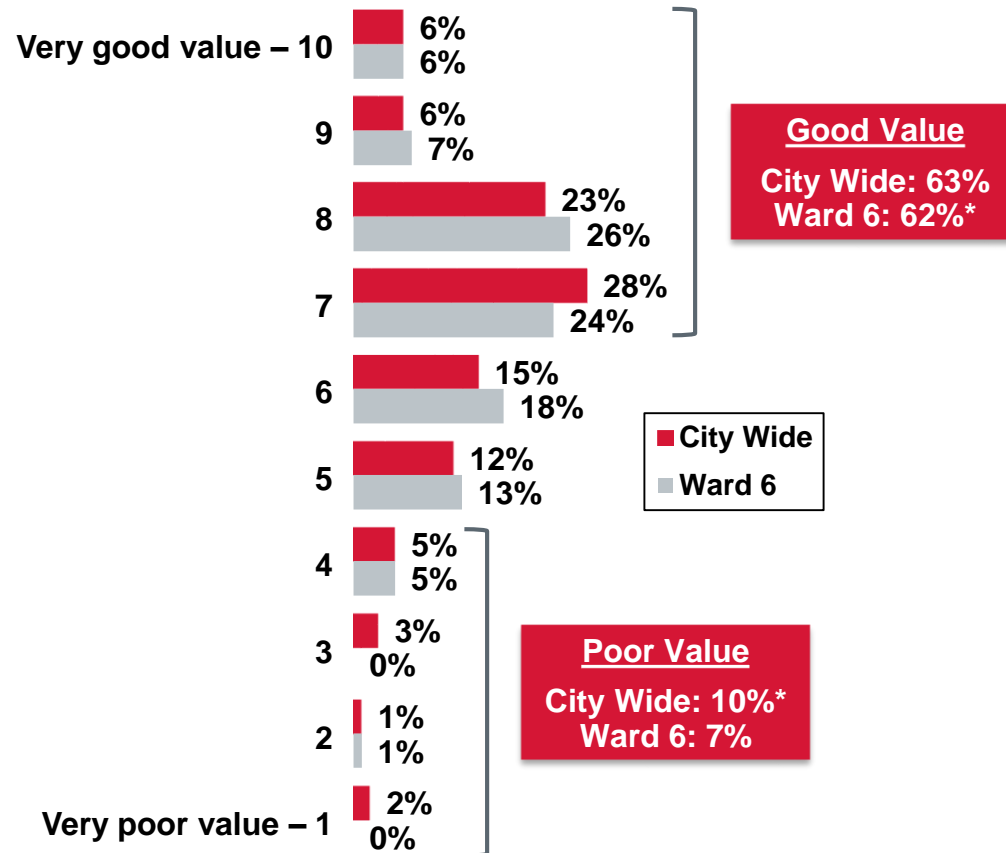

Perceived Value of Property Taxes

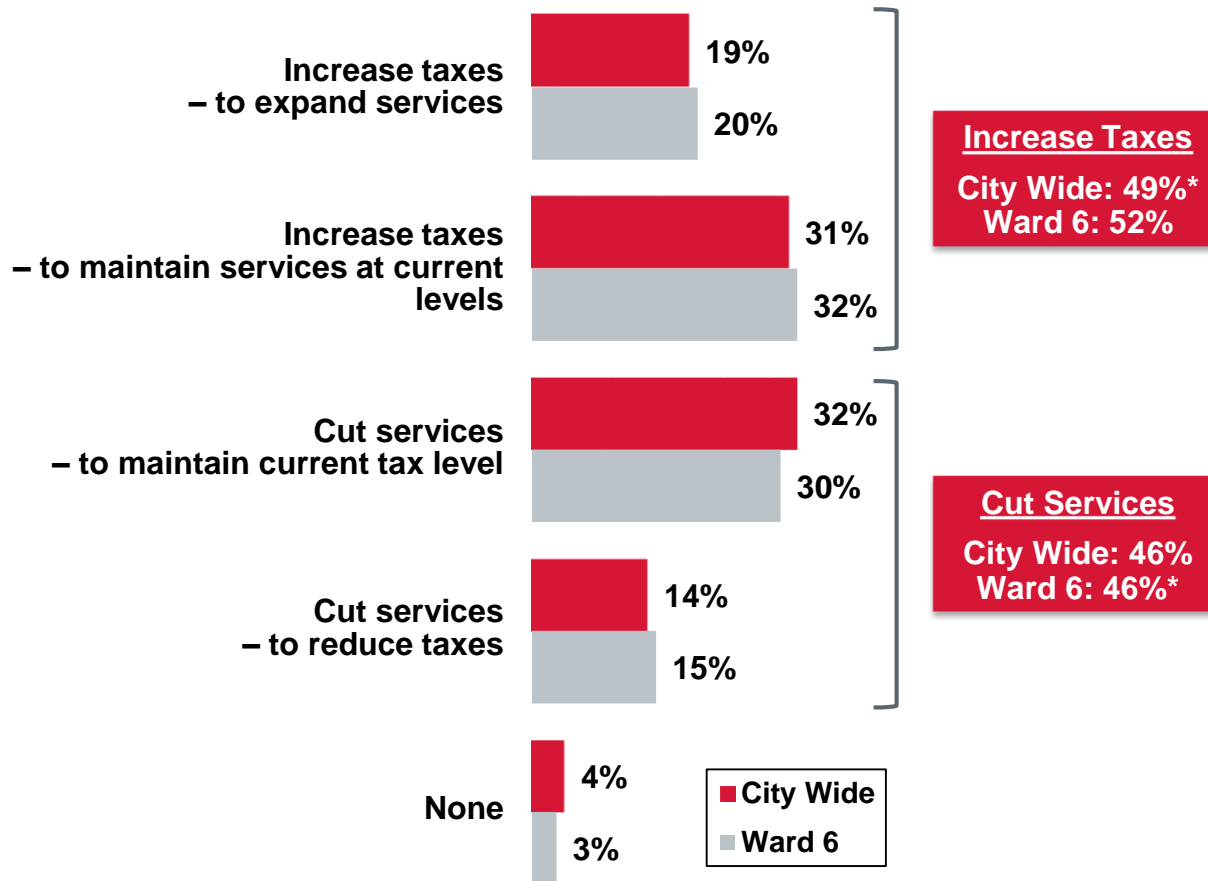

Balancing Taxation and Service Delivery Levels

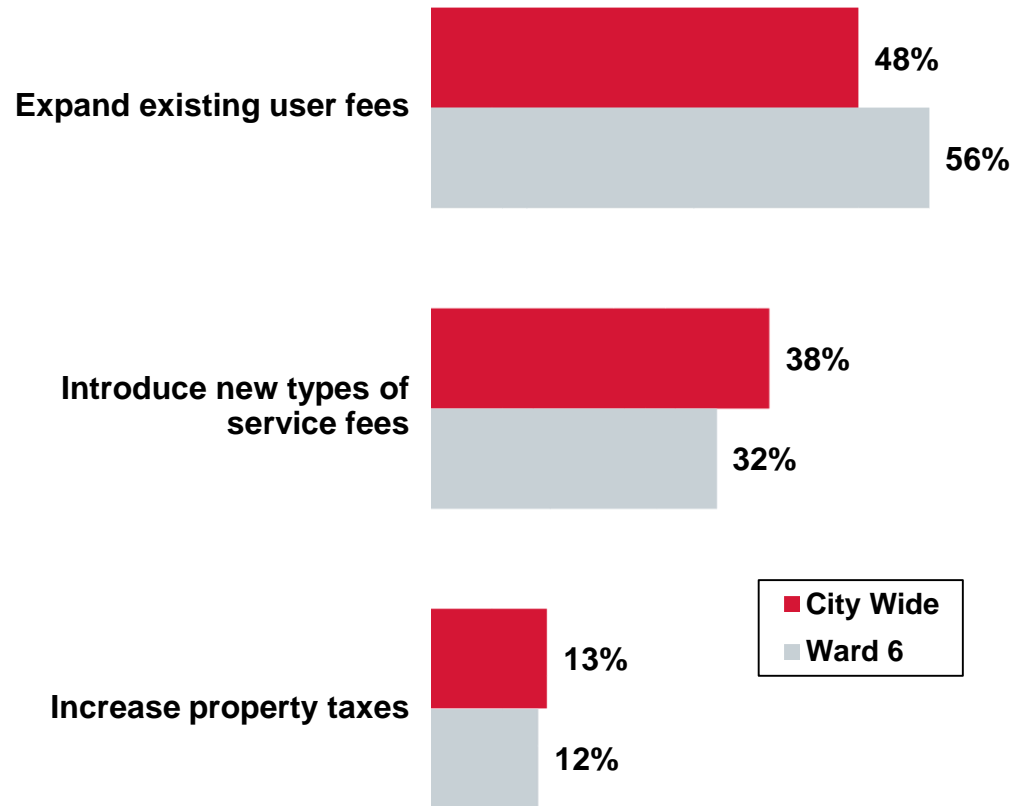

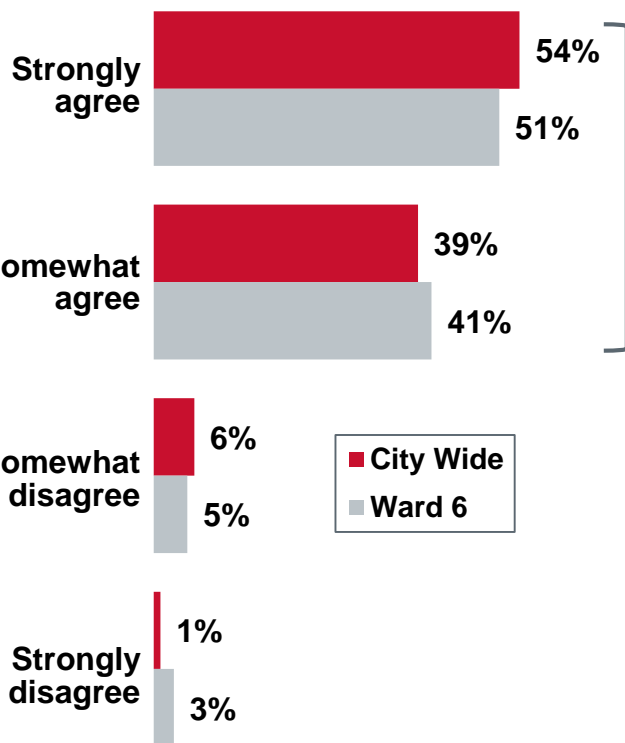
Should The City need to increase the amount of revenue it collects from citizens for new or emerging services, would you prefer The City to ...?

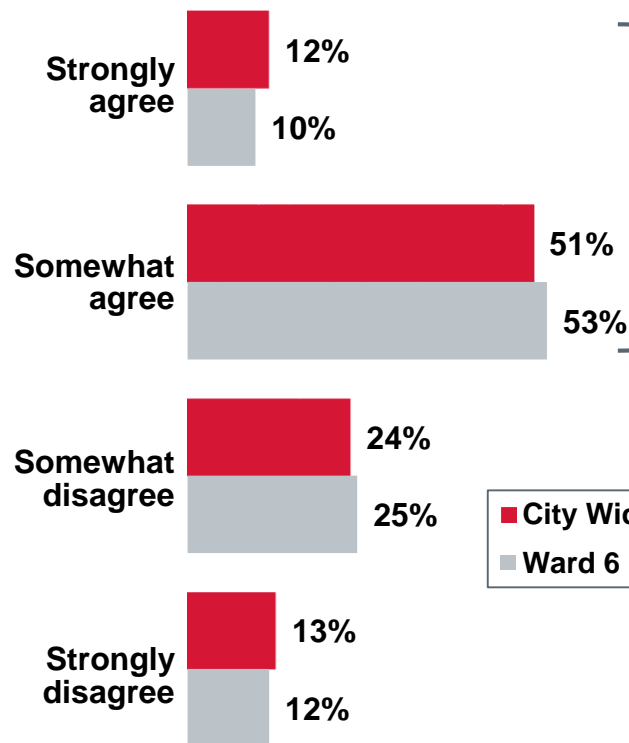

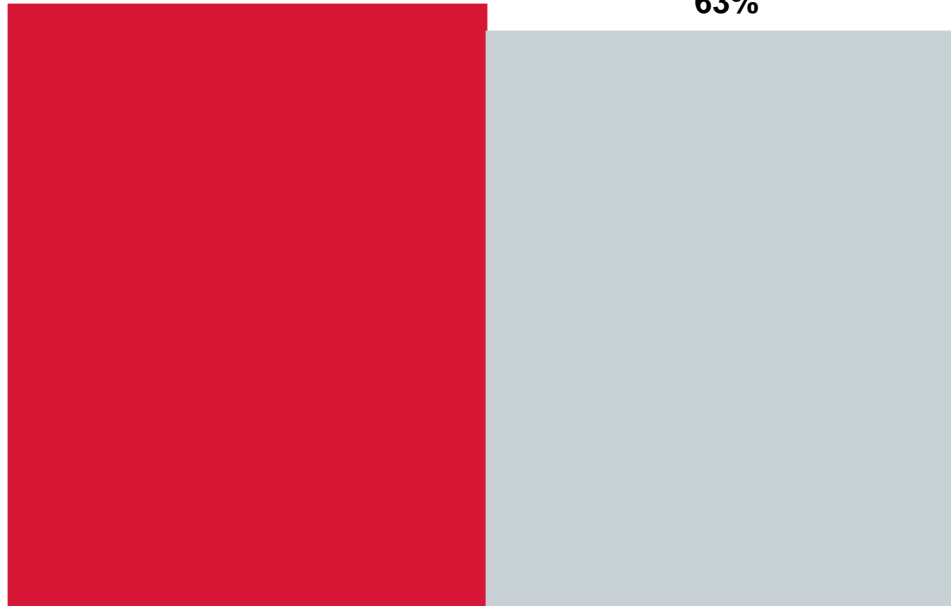

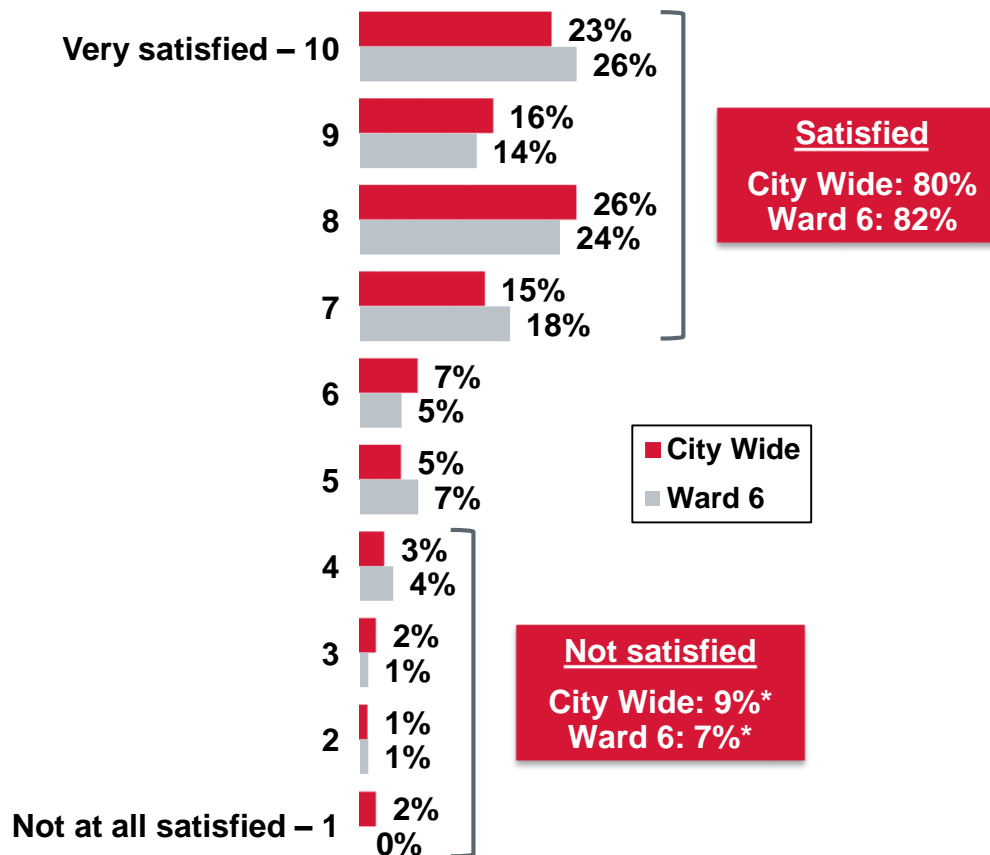

Satisfaction with the Overall Level and Quality of Customer Service

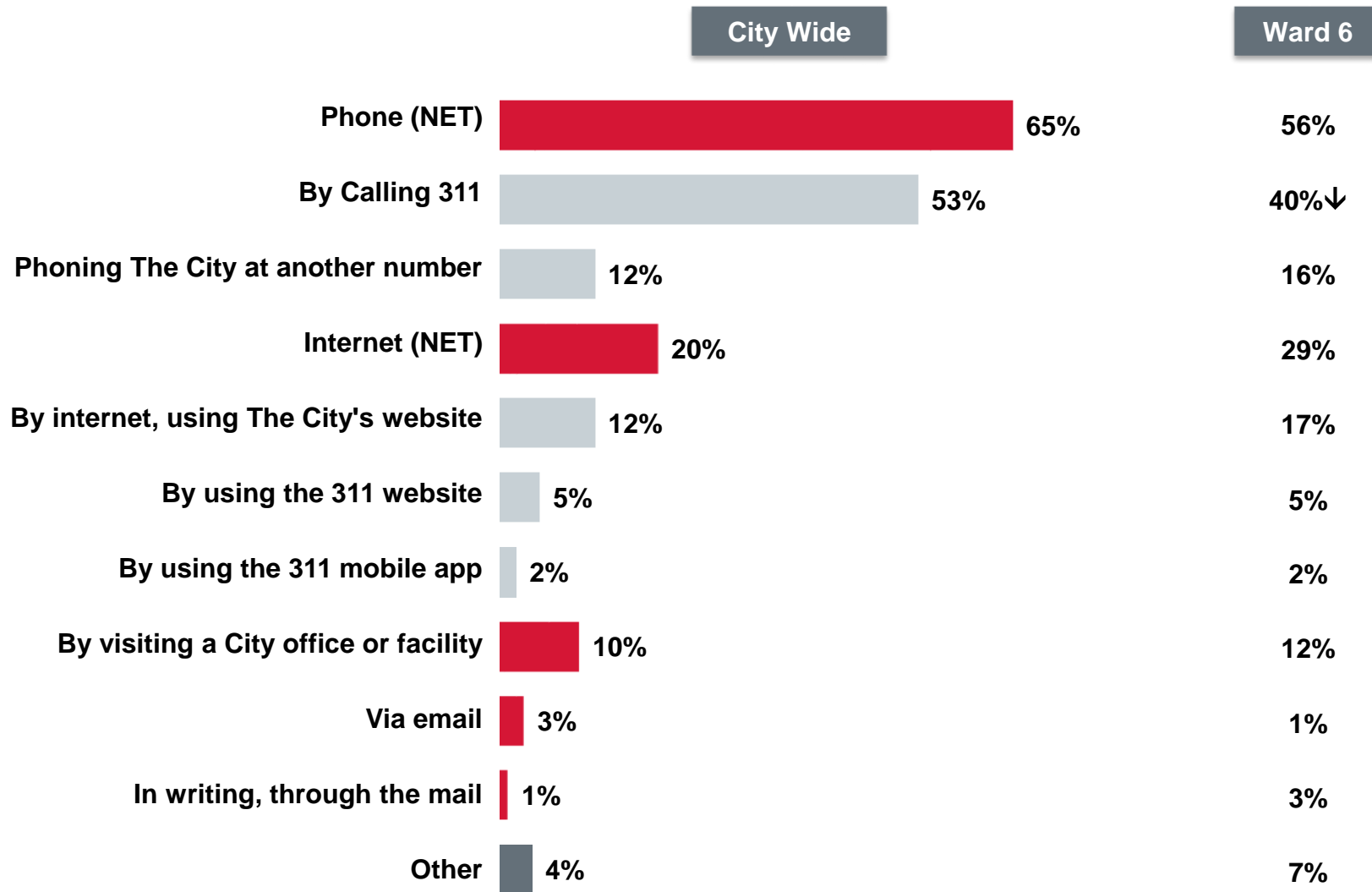

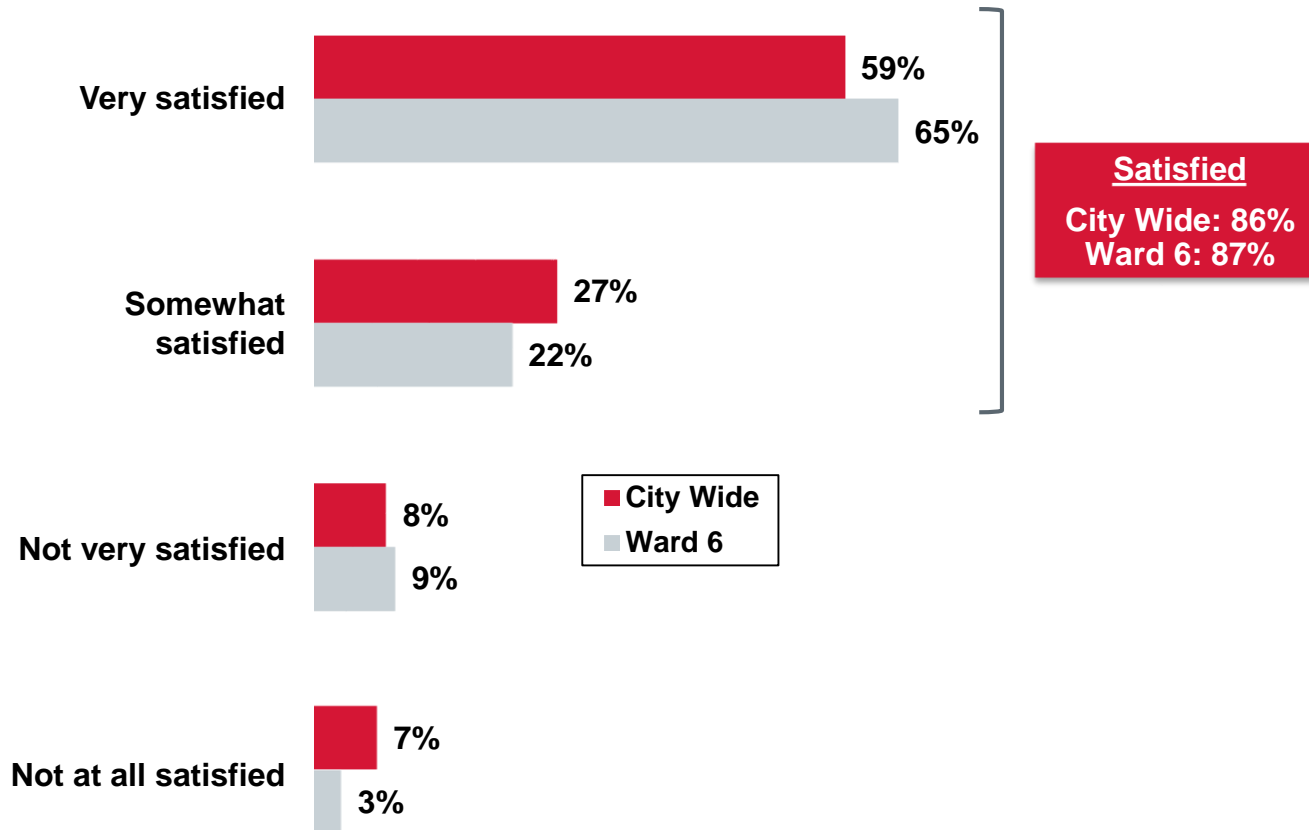
Type of Contact

Satisfaction with Most Recent City Contact



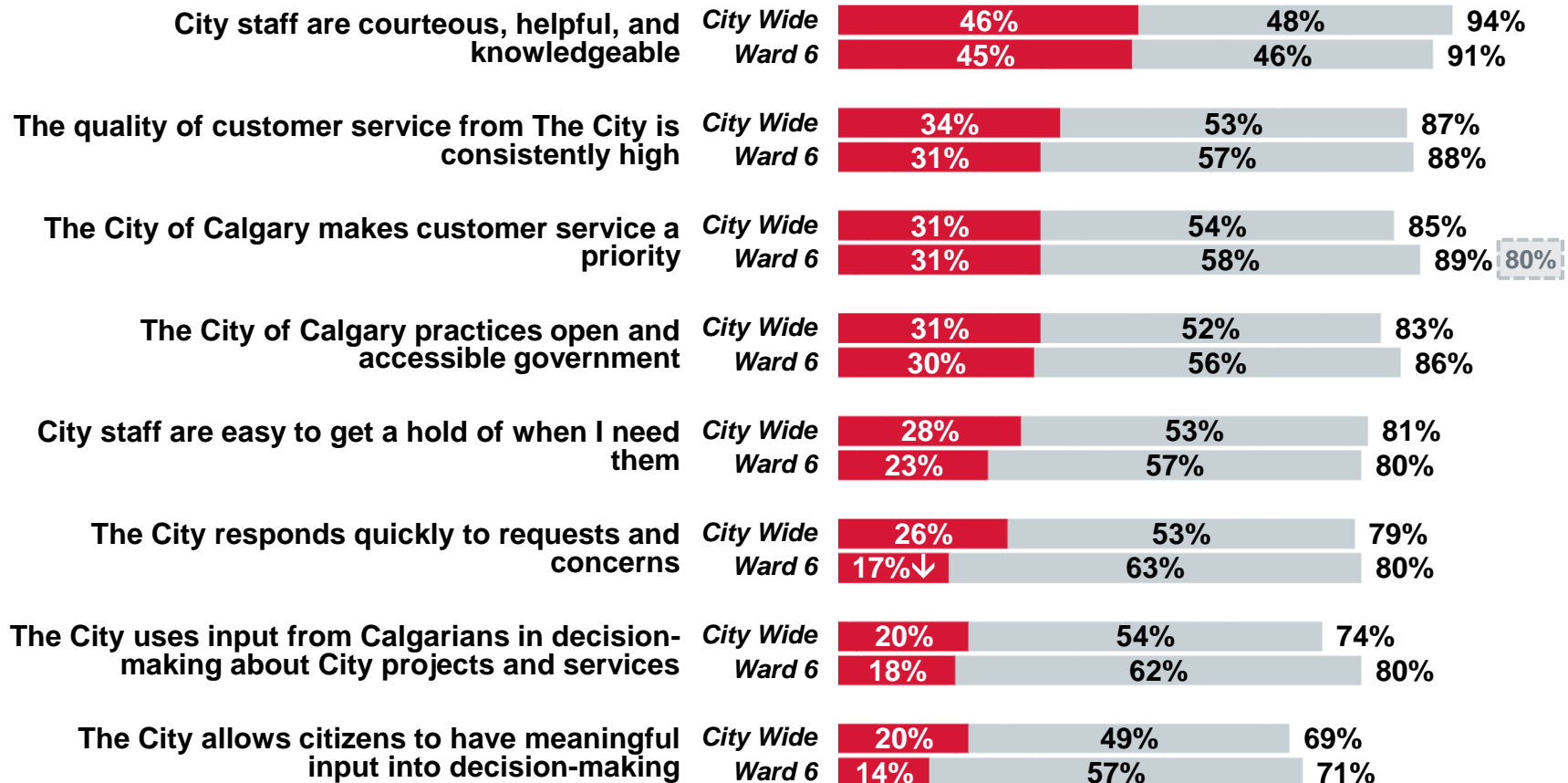
How satisfied were you with your most recent contact with The City?

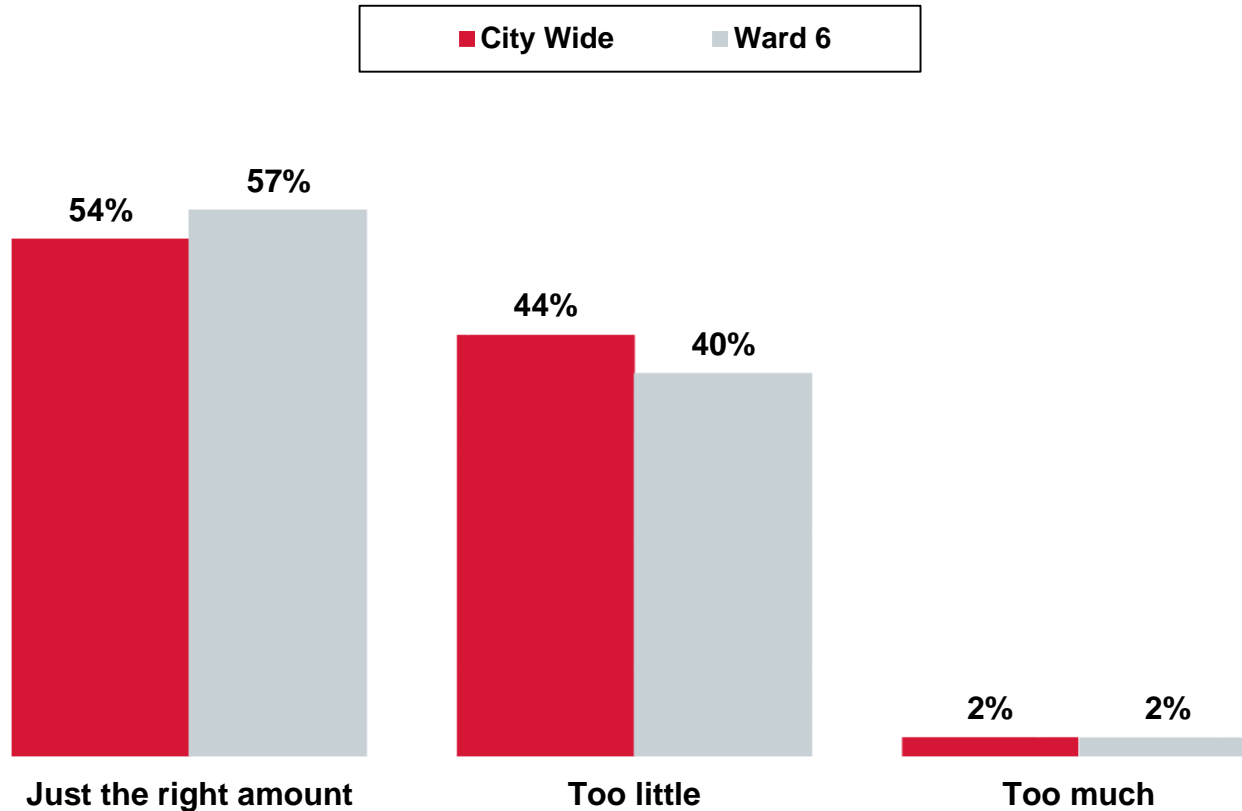

In your opinion, do you currently receive too much, too little, or just the right amount of information from The City?

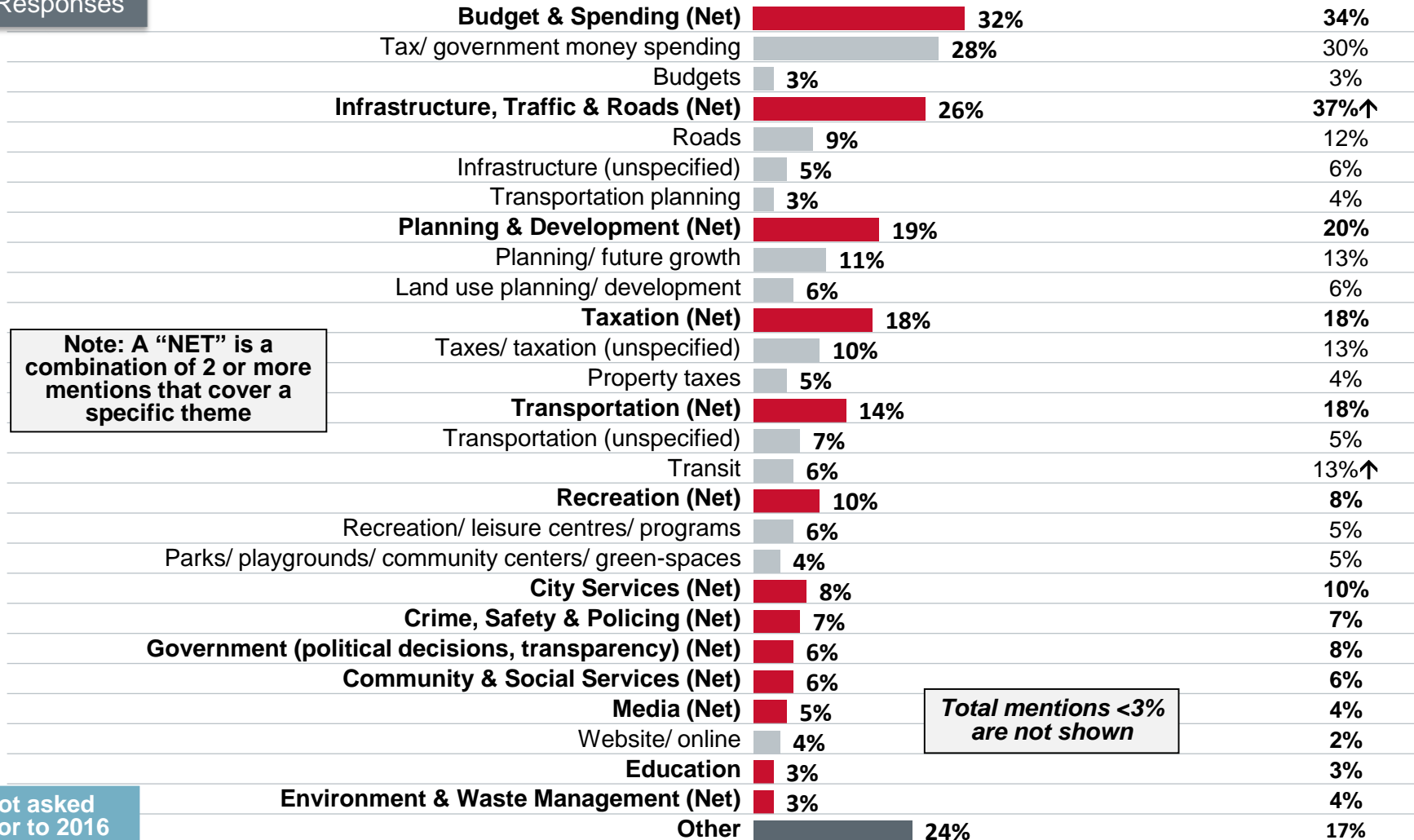

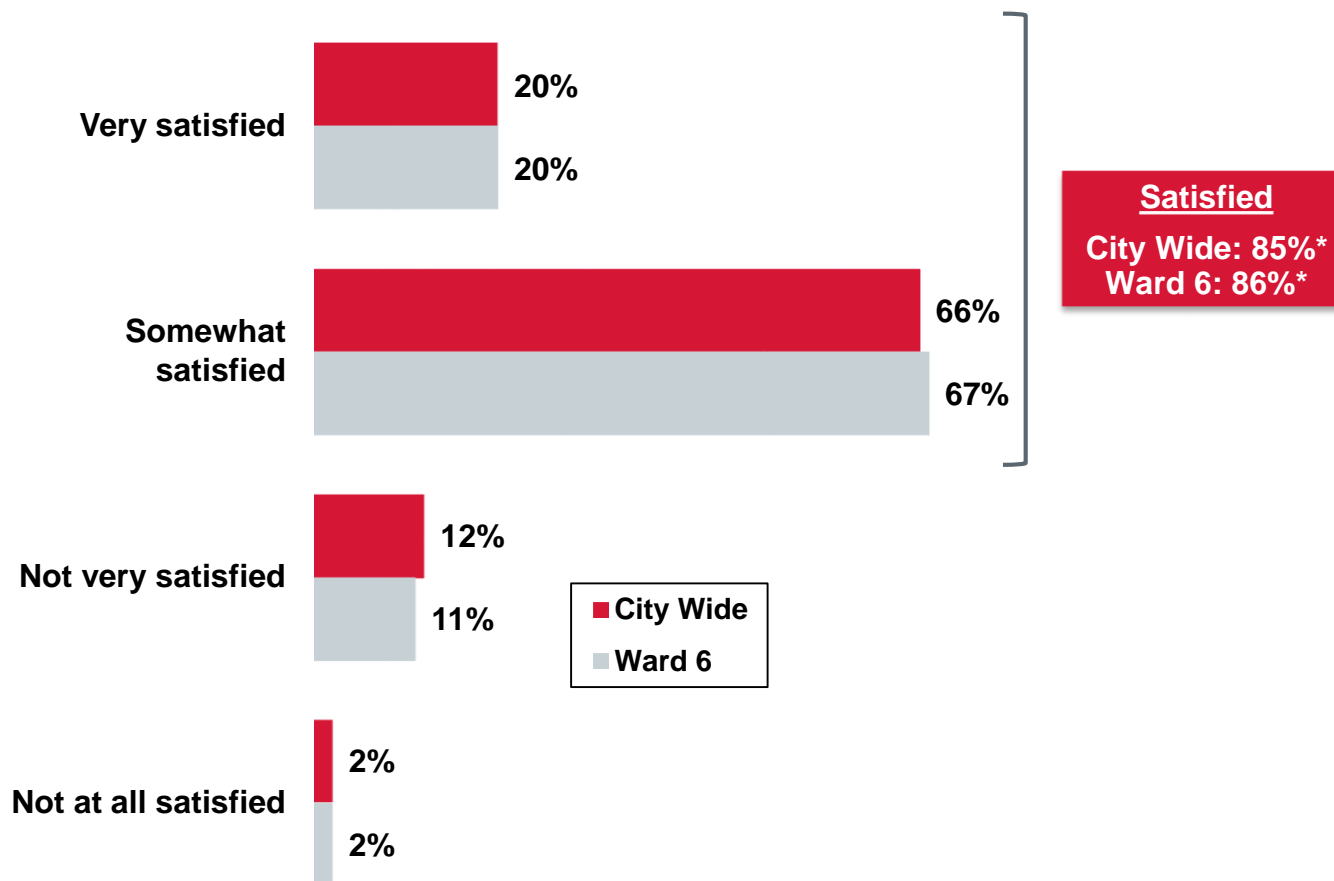
