## Analysis of 2022 Fall Survey of Calgarians Data

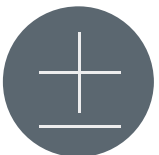

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**Telephone survey conducted** with a randomly-selected sample of 2,501 Calgarians aged 18 years and older between August 15th and September 2nd, 2022.

- Both cell phone (60%) and landline (40%) sample were used.
- The average interview length was 32 minutes.



The margin of error (MOE) for the total sample of 2,501 is  $\pm 2.0$  percentage points, 19 times out of 20. The margin of error for the 18-24 Year Old sub-group of 148 is  $\pm 8.5$  percentage points, 19 times out of 20, and the margin of error for the 25 Years Old or Older sub-group of 2,303 is  $\pm 2.04$  percentage points, 19 times out of 20. The margin of error of each question will vary slightly depending on the total number of respondents who answered the question.



Final data were weighted to ensure the overall sample's quadrant, ward, and age/gender composition reflects that of the actual Calgary population aged 18 or older according to 2019 Municipal and 2021 Federal Census data.



Results are compared between the young adults group (18 to 24 years old) and older adults (25 years old or older).

- Significant differences are an indication that a difference is not due to chance. A mathematical formula is used to calculate each difference independently. Whether or not a difference is considered significant depends on a few factors including the total sample size and the variability of responses. Larger sample sizes mean that smaller differences are significant. Additionally, variability of responses means that the more alike the responses are the more significant a change will be.
- Statistically significant differences are noted:
  - ↑ indicates number is significantly higher than the other group.
  - ↓ indicates number is significantly lower than the other group.
  - Some results in this report are subject to rounding adjustments.

## Key Findings: Young Adults

### **Overall, quality of life is relatively consistent across age groups with some differences.**

- About four-in-five (80%) Calgarians, regardless of age, report having a 'good' quality of life (83% 18-24 years old vs. 81% 25 years old or older).
- Young adults are more likely than their older counterparts to indicate the quality of life in Calgary has either improved in the past three years (22% 18-24 years old vs. 12% 25 years old or older) or stayed the same (49% vs. 39%) and are less likely to report that it has worsened (29% vs. 49%).
- Although young adults and older adults agree Calgary is a great place to make a life at about the same rate (74% 18-24 years old vs. 80% 25 years old or older), young adults are less likely to believe Calgary is a great place to make a living (64% vs. 76%).
- Young adults are more likely than older adults to agree Calgary is on the right track to be a better city 10 years from now (83% 18-24 years old vs. 76% 25 years old or older) but agree that Calgary is moving in the right direction to ensure a high quality of life for future generations about equally (55% vs. 52%).

### **Similarly, overall satisfaction with City programs and services is equal across age groups.**

- There is no statistically significant difference in overall satisfaction with City programs and services between Calgarians 18-24 years old (66%) and those 25 years old or older (67%).
- Although Infrastructure remains the top issue for all ages (27% 18-24 years old vs. 31% 25 years old or older), younger adults are more likely than older Calgarians to indicate that Transit is an important issue facing their community (25% vs. 17%) and less likely to mention Crime (15% vs. 28%), Taxes (2% vs. 9%), or Growth and Planning (2% vs. 8%).

### **Young adults and older adults have similar views on how proud they are of their city and how inclusive it is.**

- There is no statistically significant difference across age groups in agreement they are proud to be Calgarian (79% 18-24 years old vs. 82% 25 years old or older) or proud to live in their neighbourhood (76% vs. 82%).
- Younger adults and older adults agree The City fosters a city that is inclusive and accepting of all (69% 18-24 years old vs. 71% 25 years or older) and that The City delivers programs and services that remove barriers for those who need it the most (53% vs. 52%) at about the same rate.

## Key Findings: Young Adults

### **Young adults are more likely than older adults to view climate change as a threat but are equally satisfied with The City's environmental protections.**

- Calgarians 18-24 years old are much more likely than those 25 or older to agree we need to act now to address climate change (83% vs. 62%). They are also significantly more likely to 'completely agree' (44% vs. 30%).
- There are no significant differences in satisfaction with the job The City is doing to protect the environment (74% 18-24 years old vs. 79% 25 years old or older) or in agreement that The City has programs and services aimed at helping Calgarians reduce their environmental impact (51% vs. 51%) across age groups.

### **Feelings of safety in Calgary are about equal regardless of age group.**

- About half of Calgarians agree Calgary is safe for all residents and visitors (55% 18-24 years old vs. 51% 25 years old or older).
- There is no statistically significant difference across age groups in those who indicate Calgary is 'safe' (78% 18-24 years old vs. 78% 25 years old or older) or those that feel safe walking in their neighbourhood after dark (78% vs. 79%).
- In comparison to older adults, Calgarians between the ages of 18-24 are more likely to report that crime in their neighbourhood has remained about the same over the last three years (58% 18-24 years old vs. 48% 25 years old or older) and less likely to indicate it has increased (31% vs. 46%).

### **Younger Calgarians are more amenable than older Calgarians to an increase in taxes to expand services, but rate the current value they receive from their tax dollars about equally.**

- Young adults are more likely than older adults to want The City to increase taxes at or beyond inflation to maintain or expand services (65% 18-24 years old vs. 53% 25 years old or older) and less likely to want to cut services to maintain the current tax level or reduce taxes (31% vs. 40%).
- Both younger and older adults rate the value they receive from their municipal tax dollars as 'good' equally (51% 18-24 years old vs. 57% 25 years old or older).

## Key Findings: Young Adults

**Overall, younger adults have a more favorable view of communication from The City when compared to older adults.**

- Young adults are more likely to rate communication from The City in the past six months as 'good' compared to older adults (82% 18-24 years old vs. 68% 25 years old or older).
- About four-in-five Calgarians, regardless of age, agree The City meets their customer service expectations (79% 18-24 years old vs. 81% 25 years old or older).

**Young adults are more satisfied than older adults with The City, including Council and Administration, as a whole.**

- Younger adults are more likely to be satisfied with The City, including Council and Administration as a whole, when compared to older adults (81% 18-24 vs. 70% 25 years old or older). They are also more likely to be satisfied with Council (78% vs. 61%) but are satisfied with Administration at about the same rate (82% vs. 77%).
- When compared with older adults, younger adults are more likely to believe that Council and Administration work collaboratively (77% 18-24 years old vs. 65% 25 years old or older).
- Slightly less than half of Calgarians, regardless of age group, indicate they trust The City (48% 18-24 years old vs. 49% 25 years old or older).

**In general, younger adults are more likely than older adults to view the citizen input process at The City positively.**

- Young adults are more likely than older adults to agree The City practices open and accessible government (78% 18-24 years old vs. 66% 25 years old or older).
- Young adults are also more likely to agree The City allows citizens to have meaningful input into decision-making (69% 18-24 years old vs. 58% 25 years old or older), that Calgarians have enough opportunities to provide input (69% vs. 60%), and that they are confident The City is working to improve how it includes citizen input (76% vs. 65%).

**Younger adults are less likely than their counterparts to agree The city is working to build meaningful relationships with Indigenous partners.**

- In comparison to older Calgarians, younger Calgarians are less likely to agree (75% 18-24 years old vs. 82% 25 years old or older) and more likely to disagree (25% vs. 18%) that The City is working to building meaningful relationships with Indigenous partners. However, they agree The City is working with local Indigenous communities when discussing downtown revitalization (70% vs. 71%) equally.

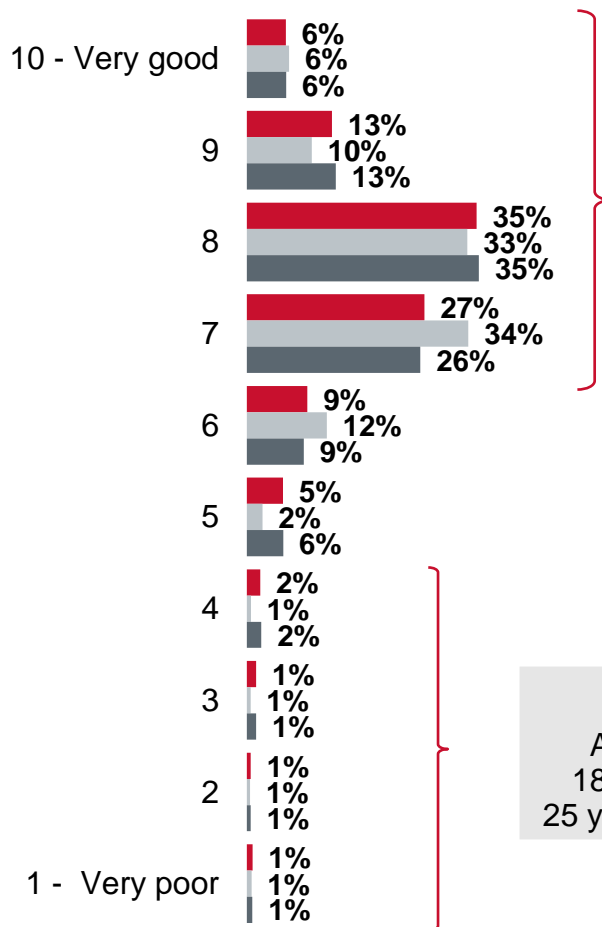
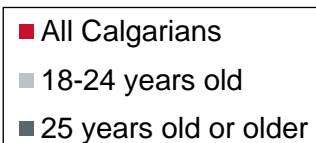

# Overall Quality of Life in Calgary

Overall quality of life is consistent across age groups with four-fifths of all Calgarians (80%) reporting a 'good' quality of life (83% 18-24 years old vs. 81% 25 years old or older).

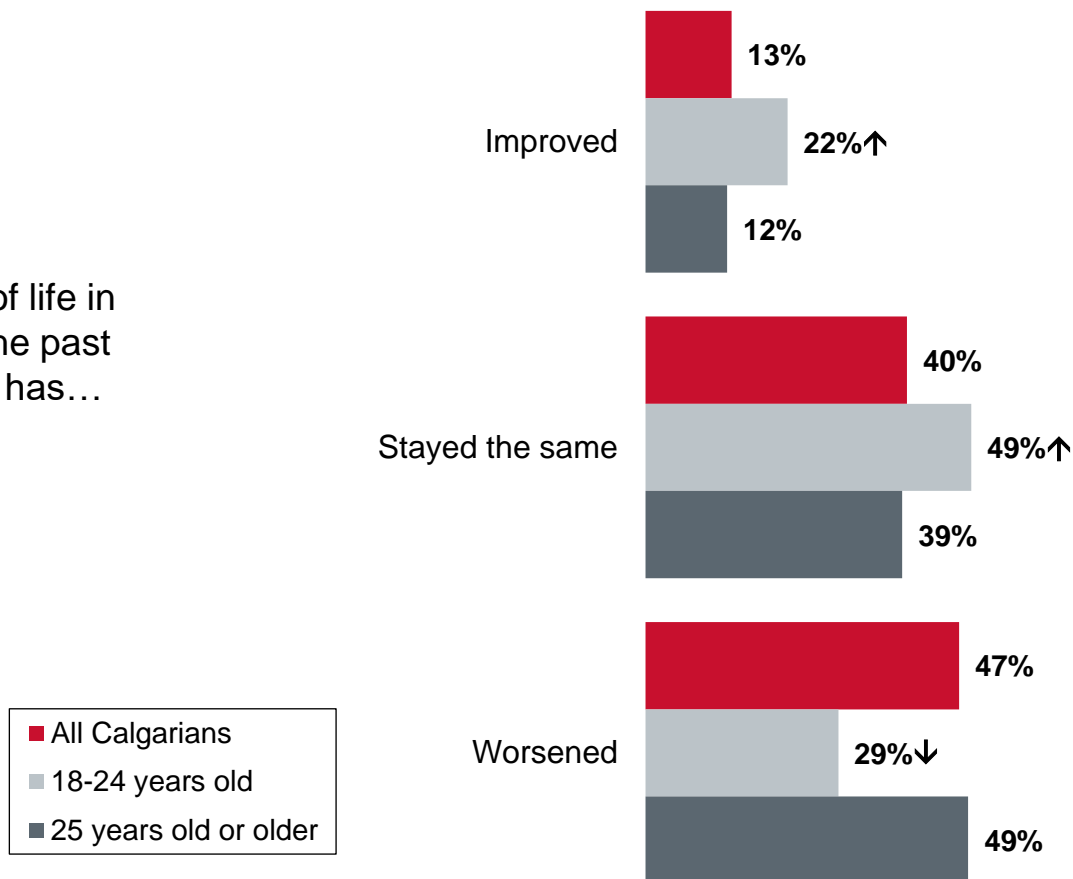

# Perceived Change in the Quality of Life

Calgarians between the ages of 18 and 24 are more likely than those 25 or older to report the quality of life in Calgary has either improved (22% vs. 12%) or stayed the same (49% vs. 39%) and are significantly less likely to report it has worsened (29% vs. 49%).

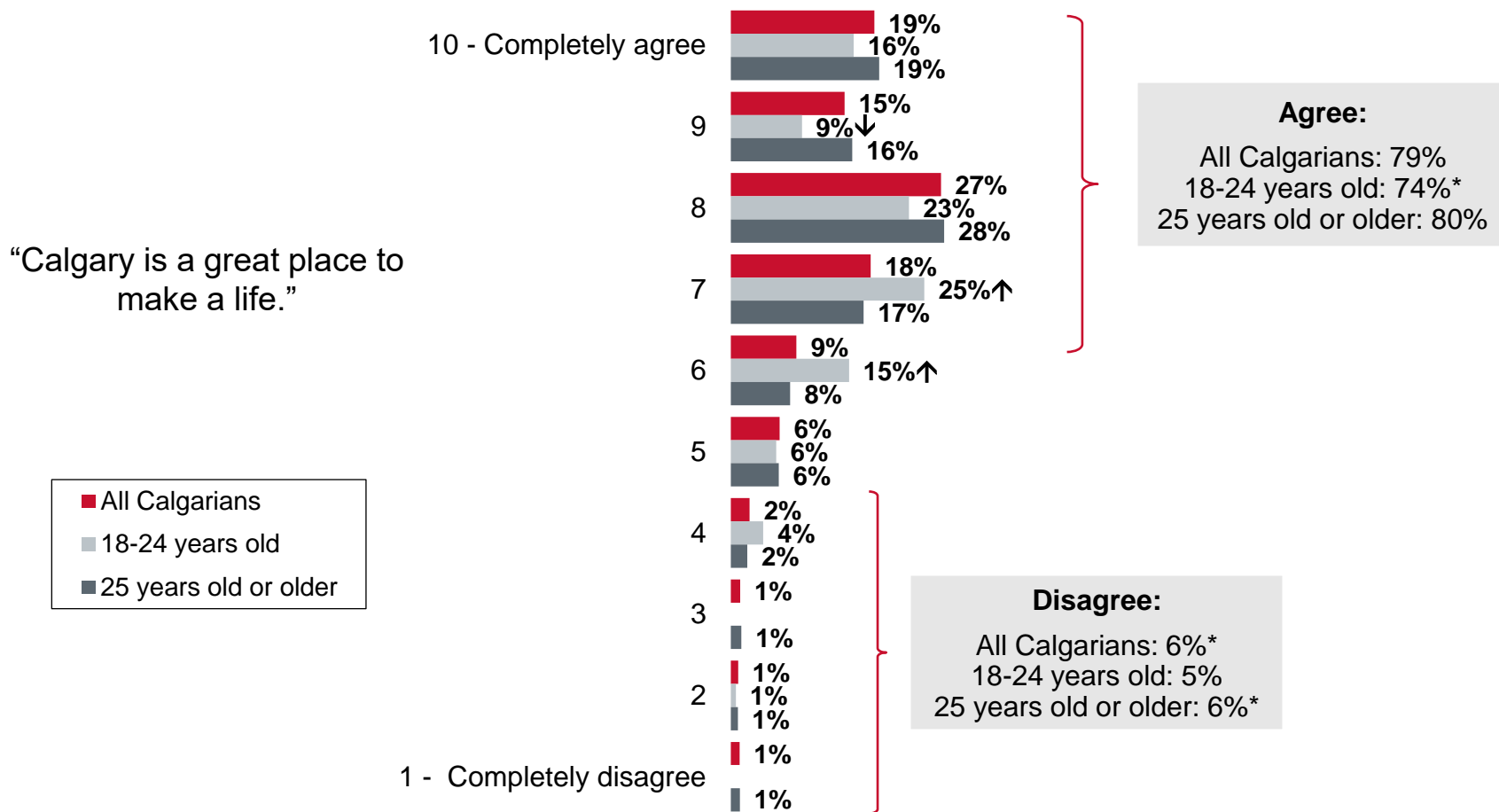
The quality of life in Calgary in the past three years has...

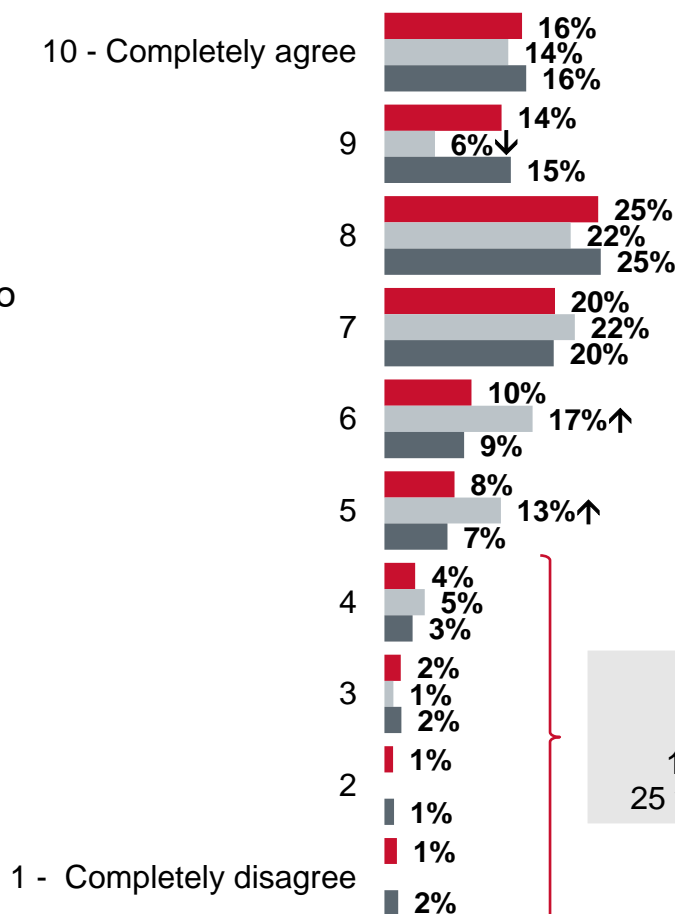


# Great Place to Make a Living

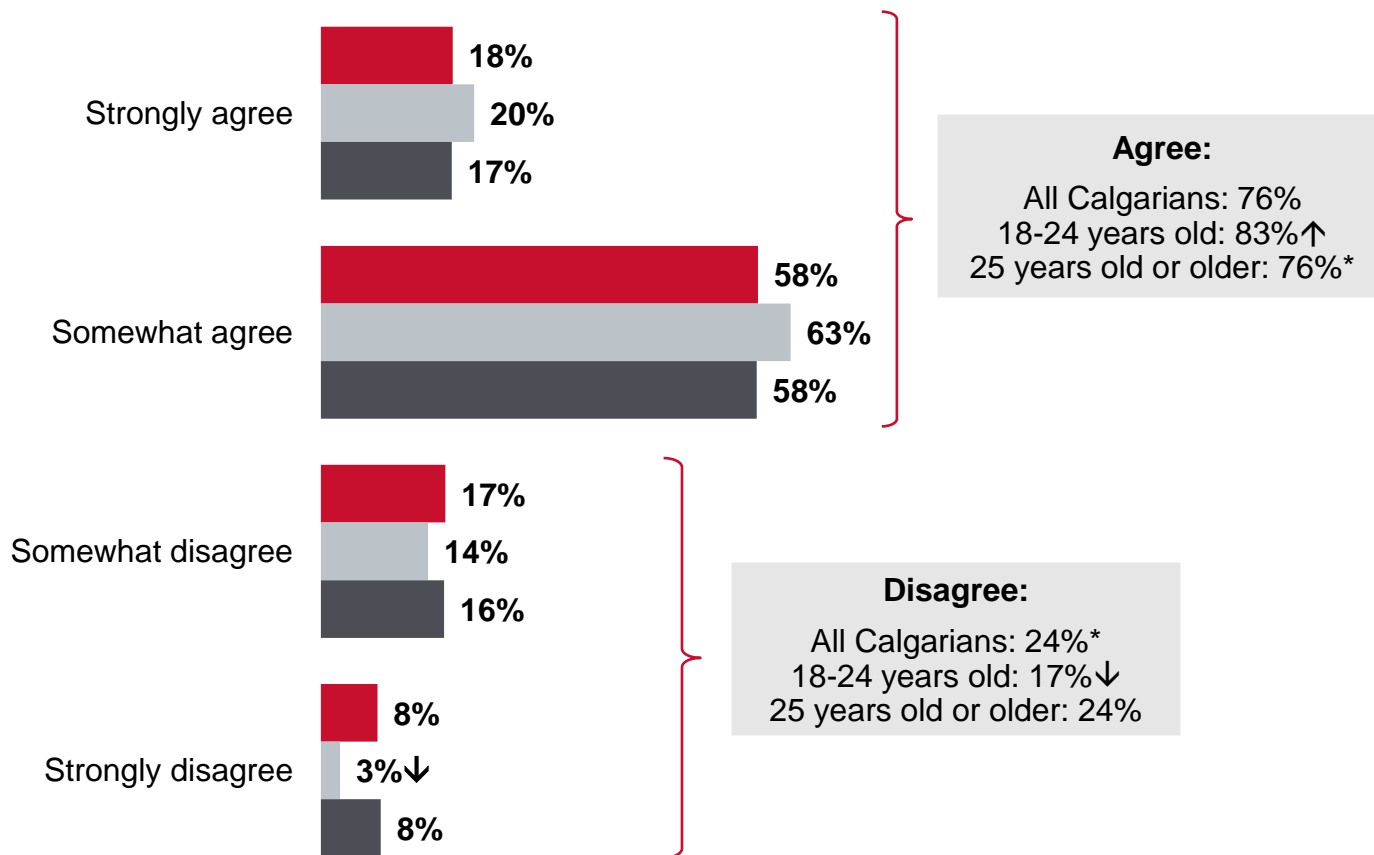
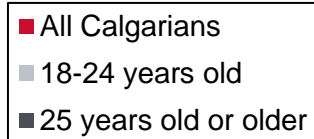

# On the Right Track to Be a Better City

In comparison with older Calgarians, younger adults are more optimistic about Calgary's future, with four-in-five (83% 18-24 years old) who indicate that Calgary is on the right track to be a better city in 10 years compared to three-quarters of those over 25 (76%).

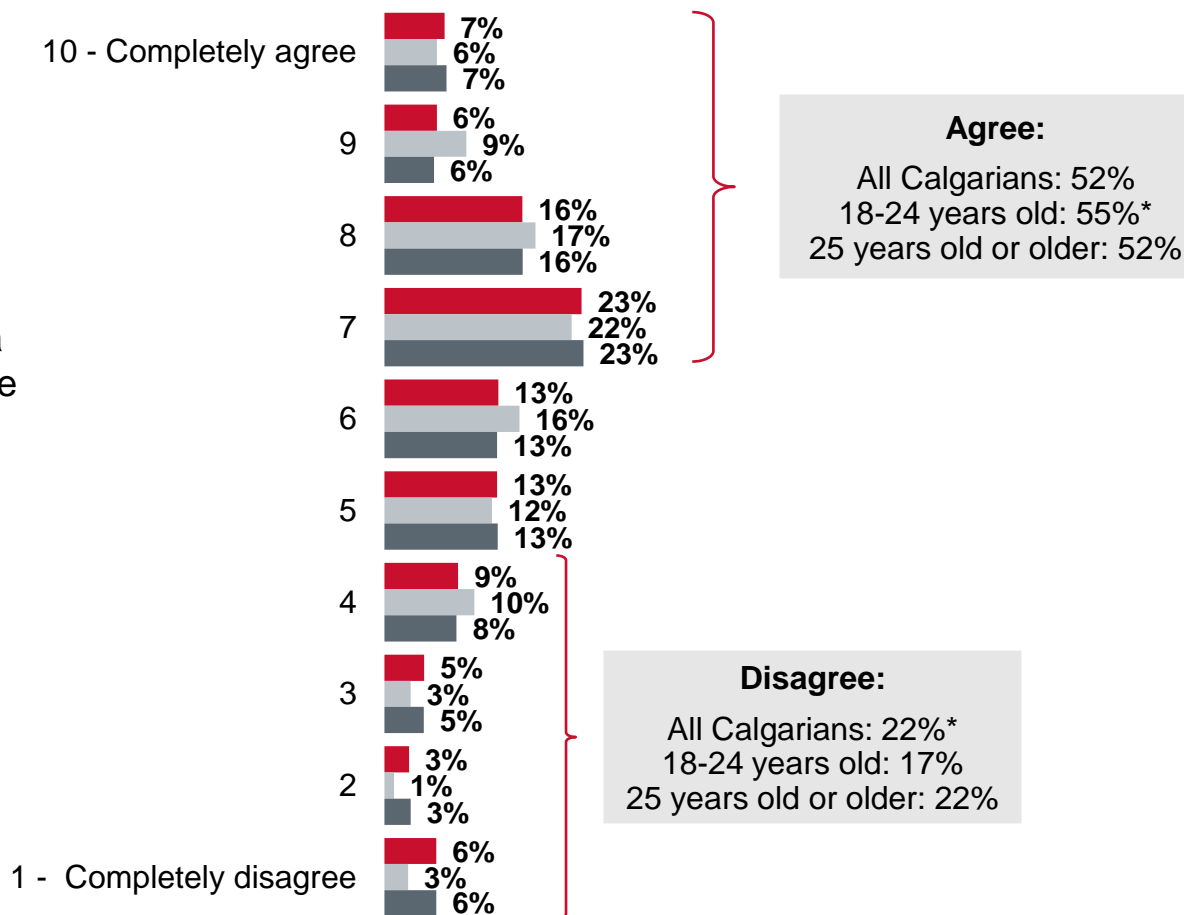

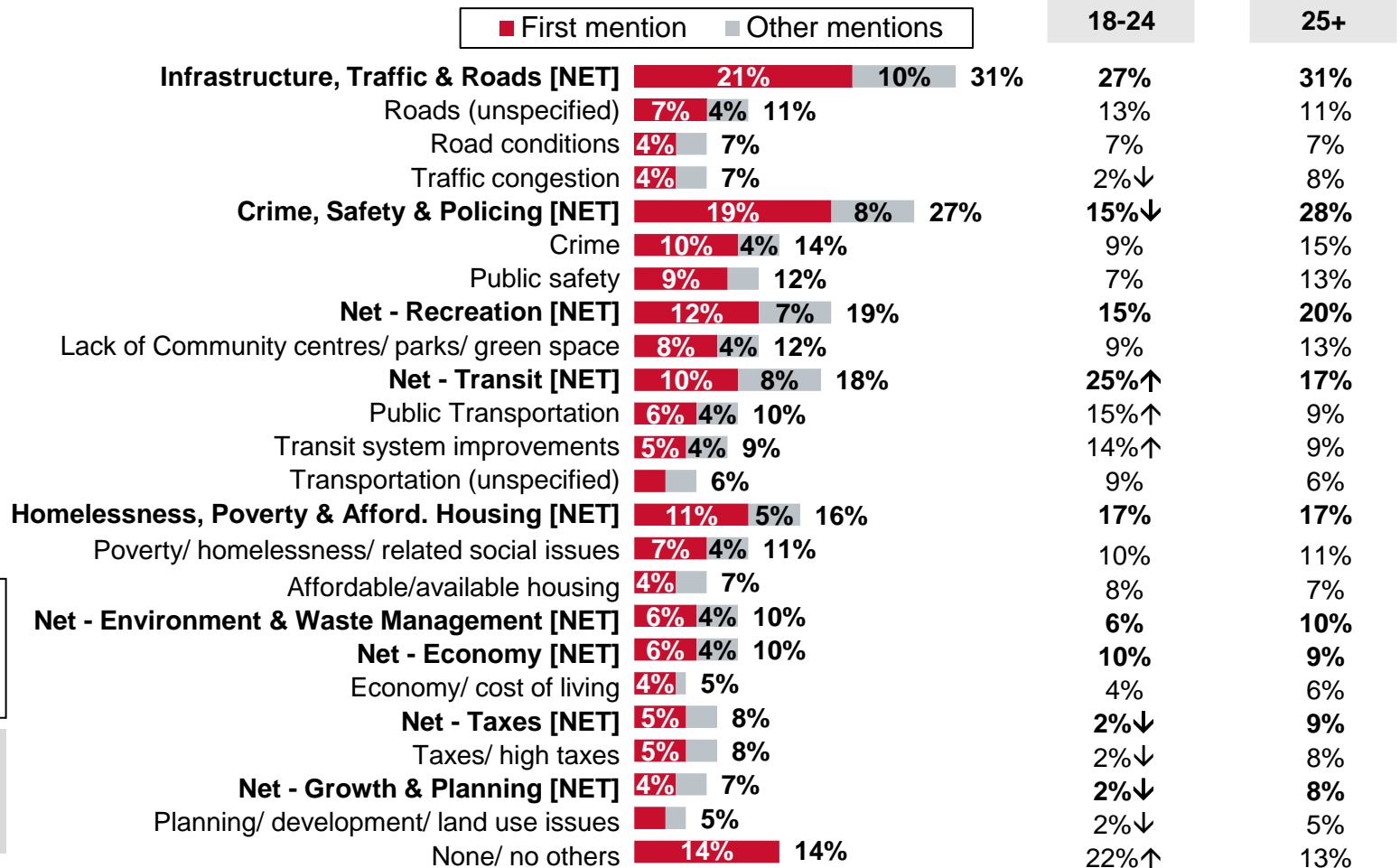

# Issue Agenda

Although Infrastructure remains the top issue for all age groups, Calgarians ages 18-24 are more likely than those 25 or older to mention Transit (25% vs. 17%) and less likely to mention Crime, Safety, & Policing (15% vs 28%), Taxes (2% vs. 9%) or Growth & Planning (2% vs. 8%).

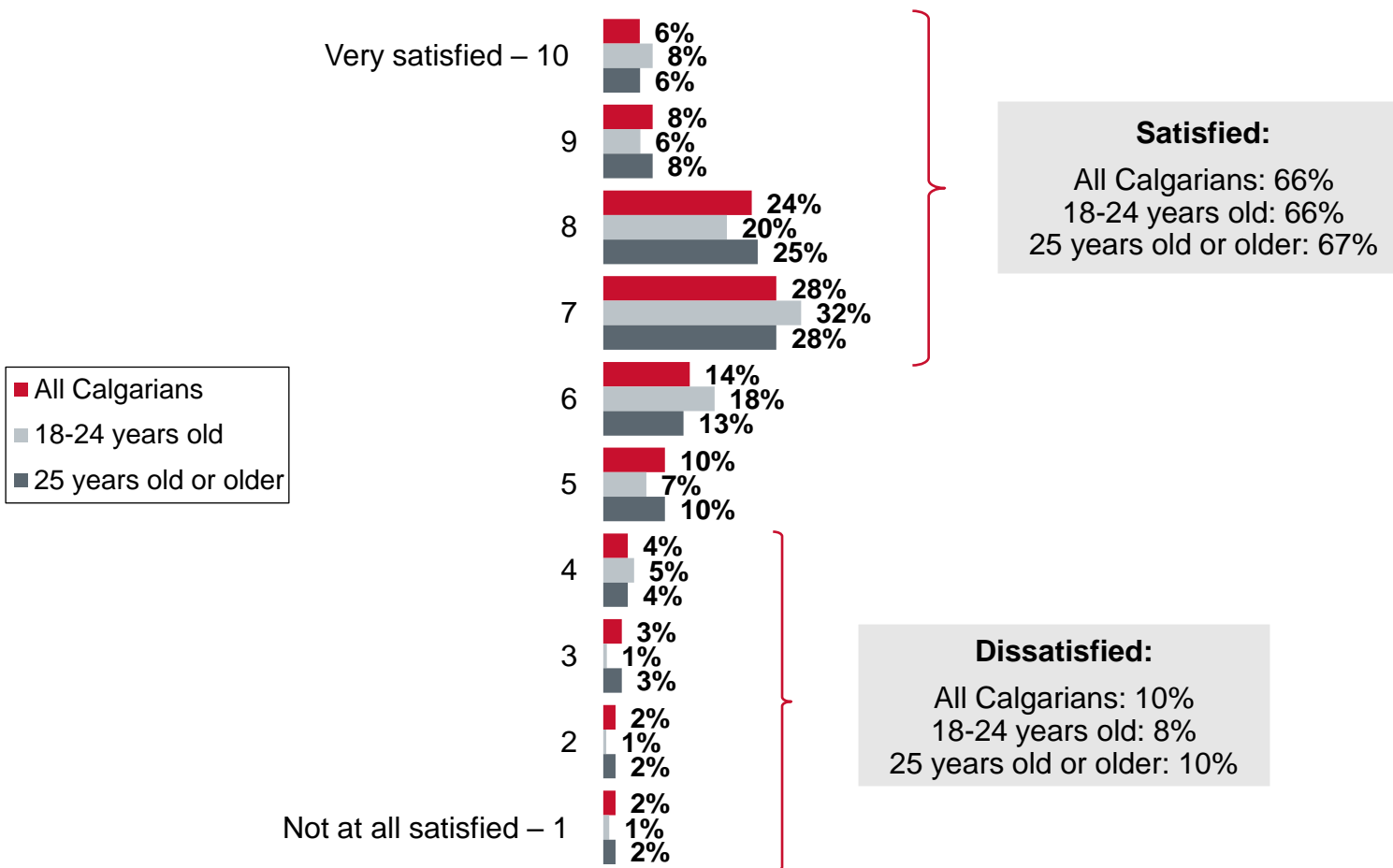

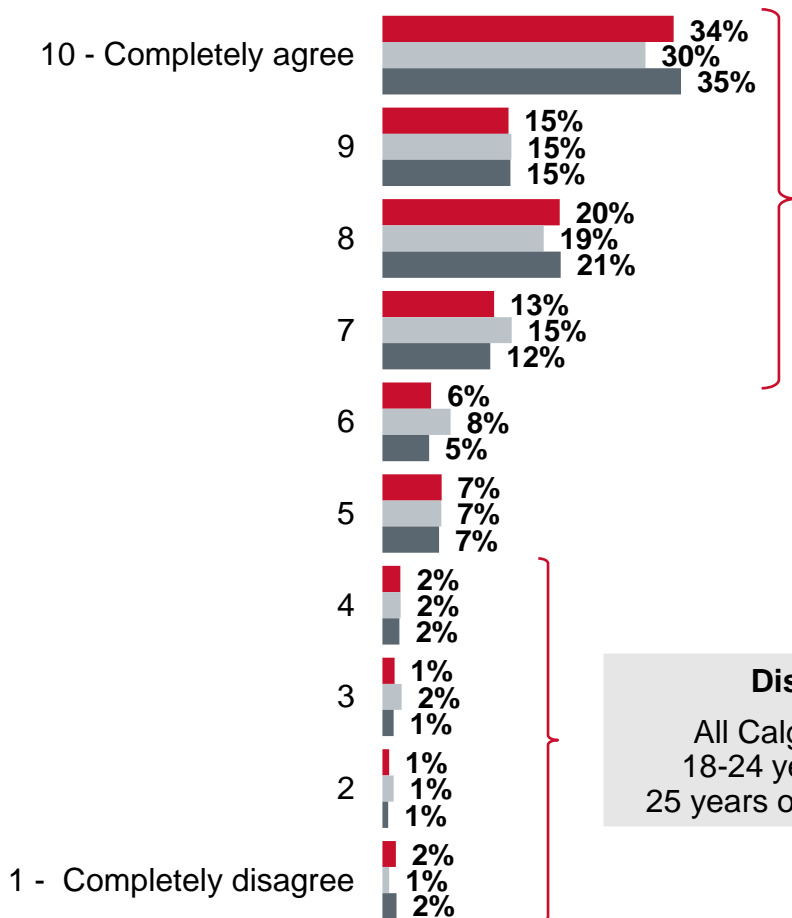


# Proud to be Calgarian

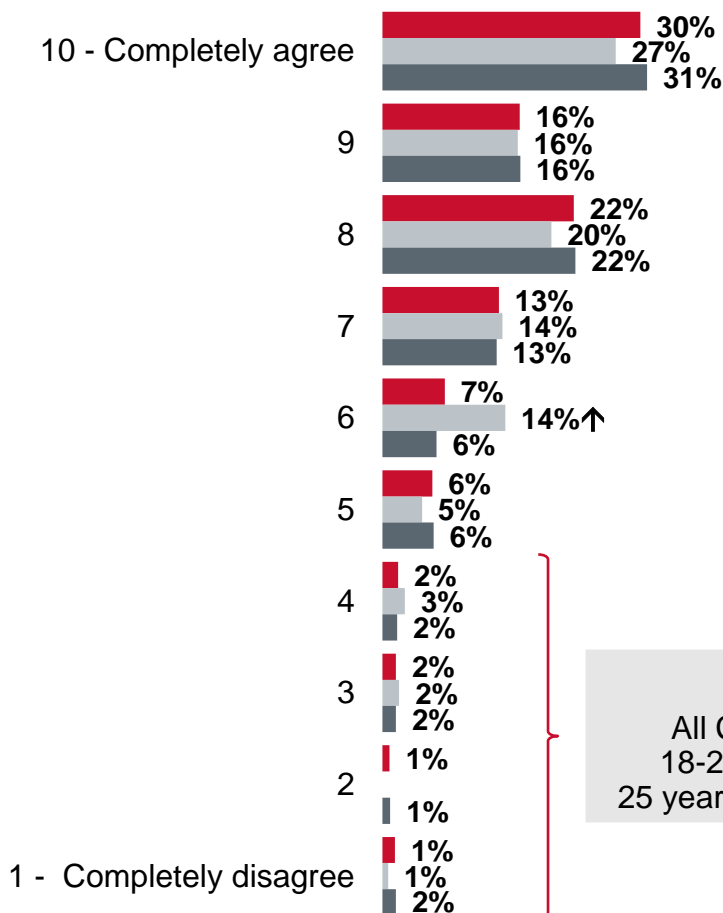

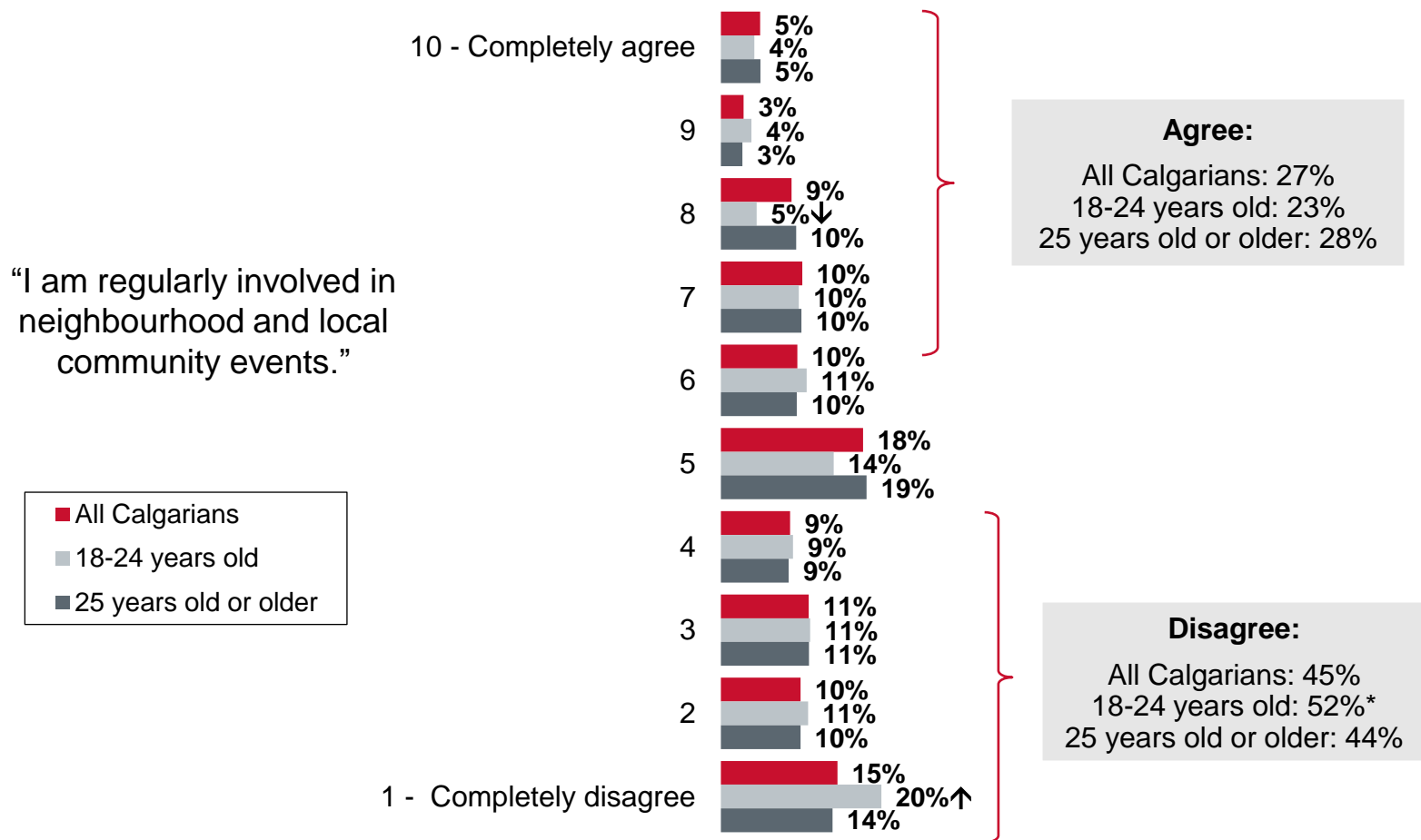

How satisfied are you with the job The City is doing to protect the environment?



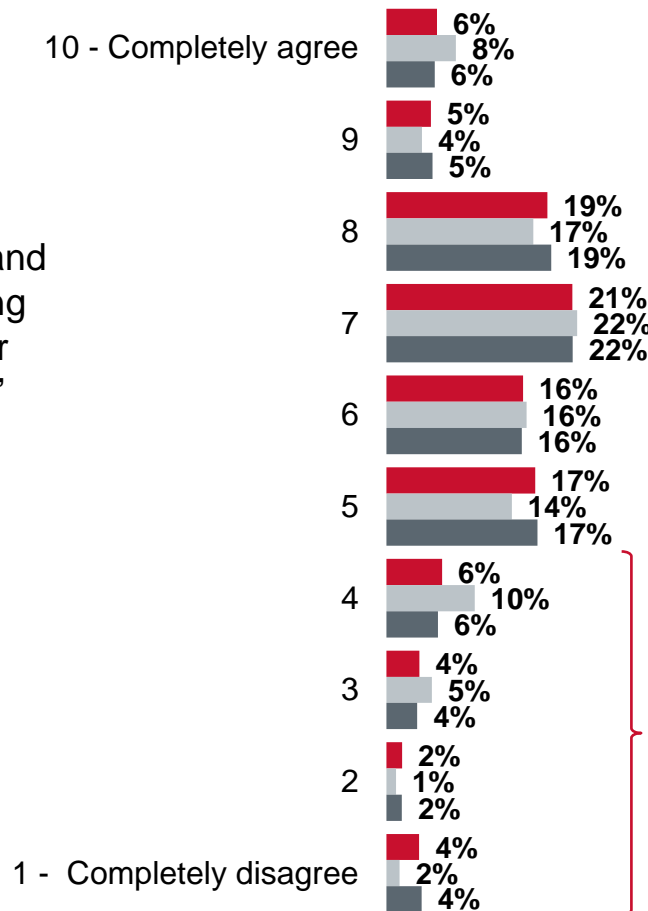
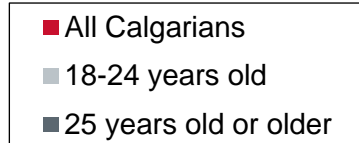
How satisfied are you with the job The City of Calgary is currently doing to protect the environment? Are you...?

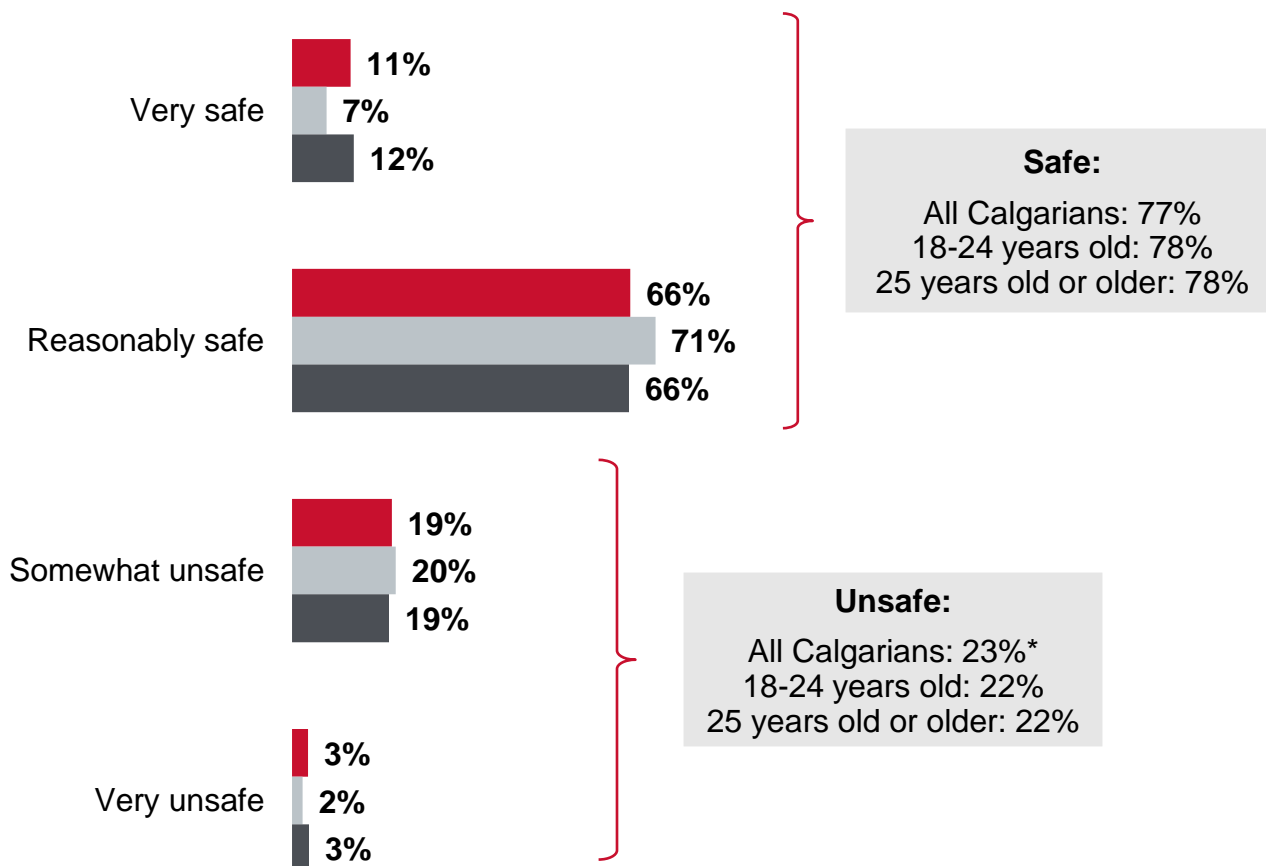
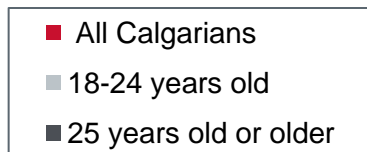

How safe or unsafe do you think Calgary is overall?



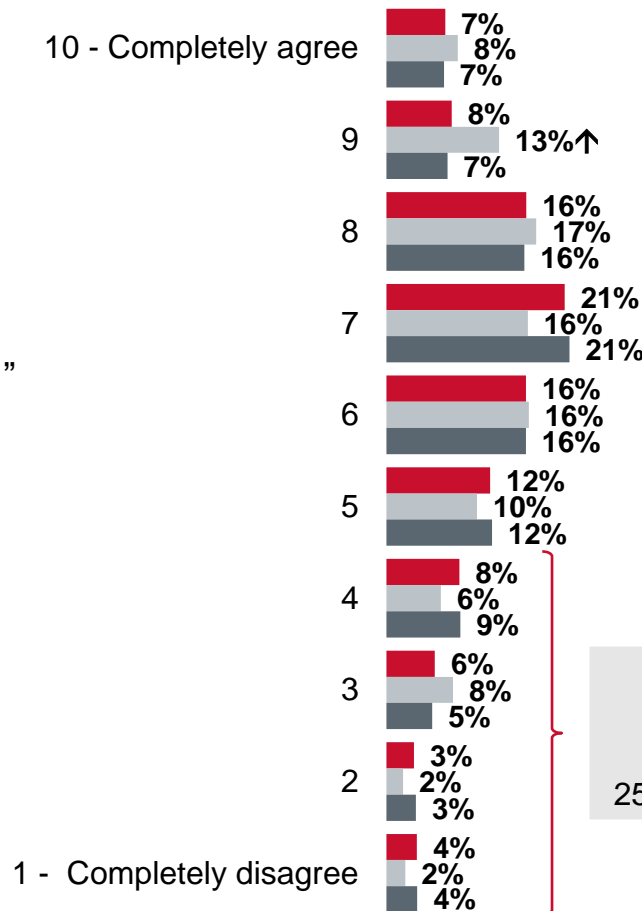
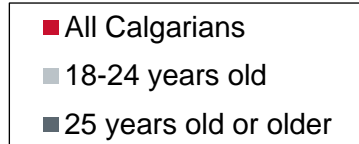
How safe or unsafe do you think Calgary is overall?

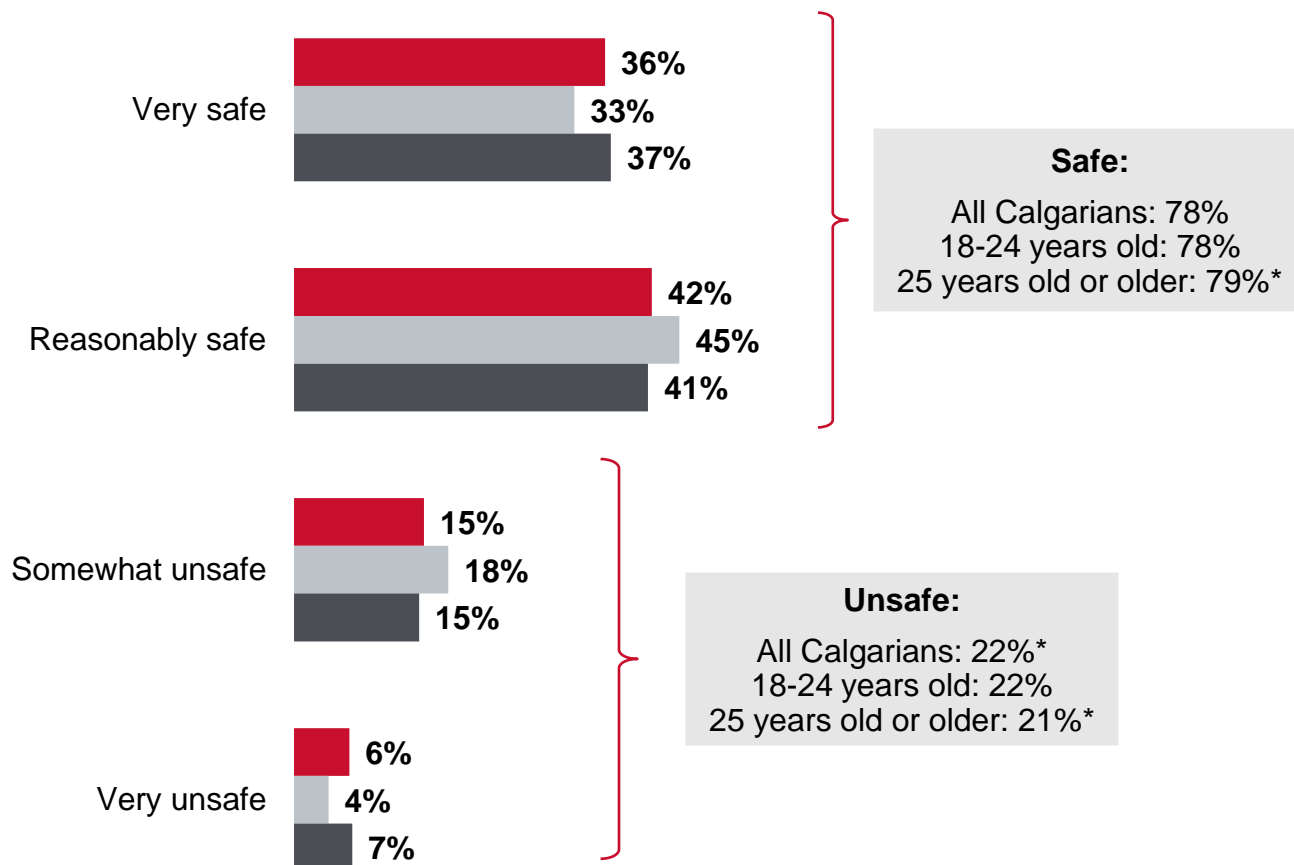
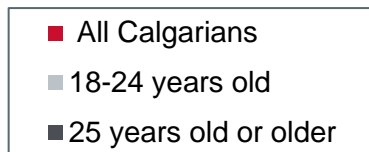

How safe do you feel walking alone in your neighbourhood after dark?



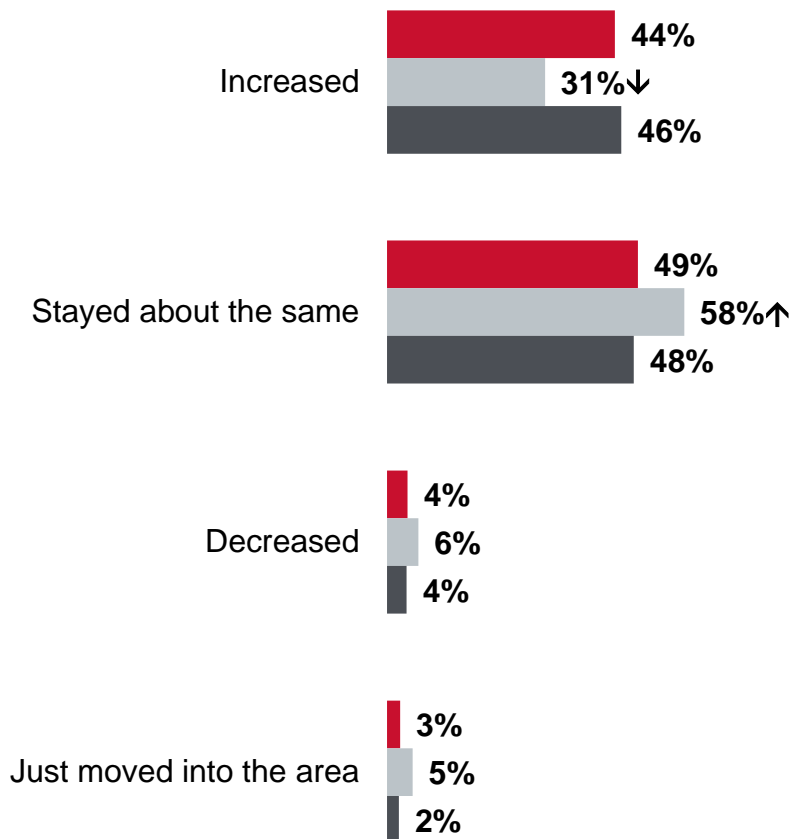
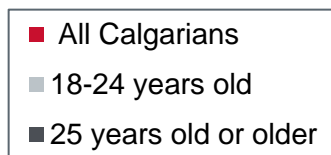
How safe do you feel or would you feel walking alone in your neighbourhood after dark?

# Perceived Change in Neighbourhood Crime

When compared to Calgarians 25 years old or older, 18-24 year olds are more likely to report that crime in their neighbourhood has stayed about the same (58% vs. 48%) and less likely to indicate it has increased (31% vs. 46%).

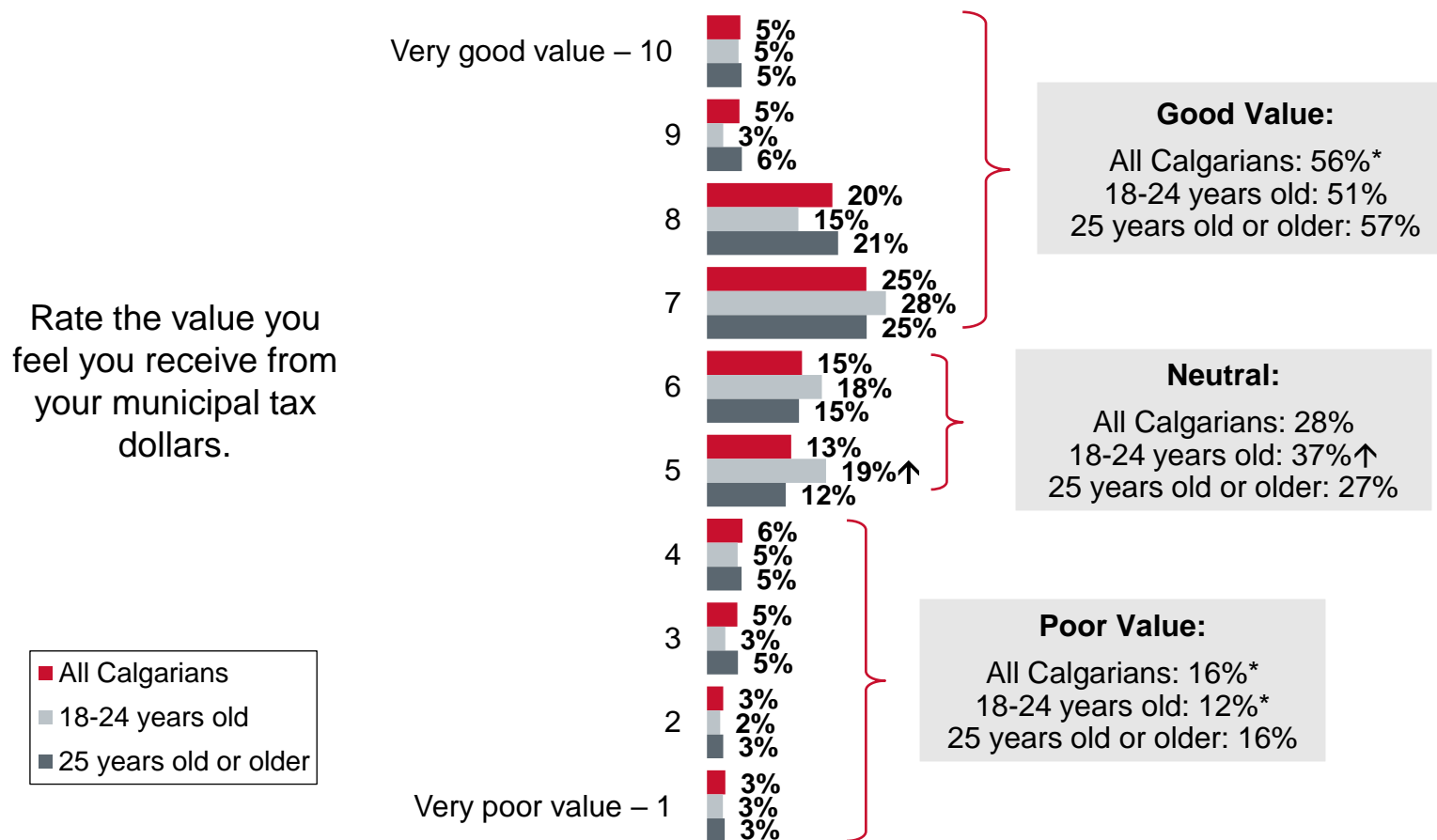

# Perceived Value of Property Taxes

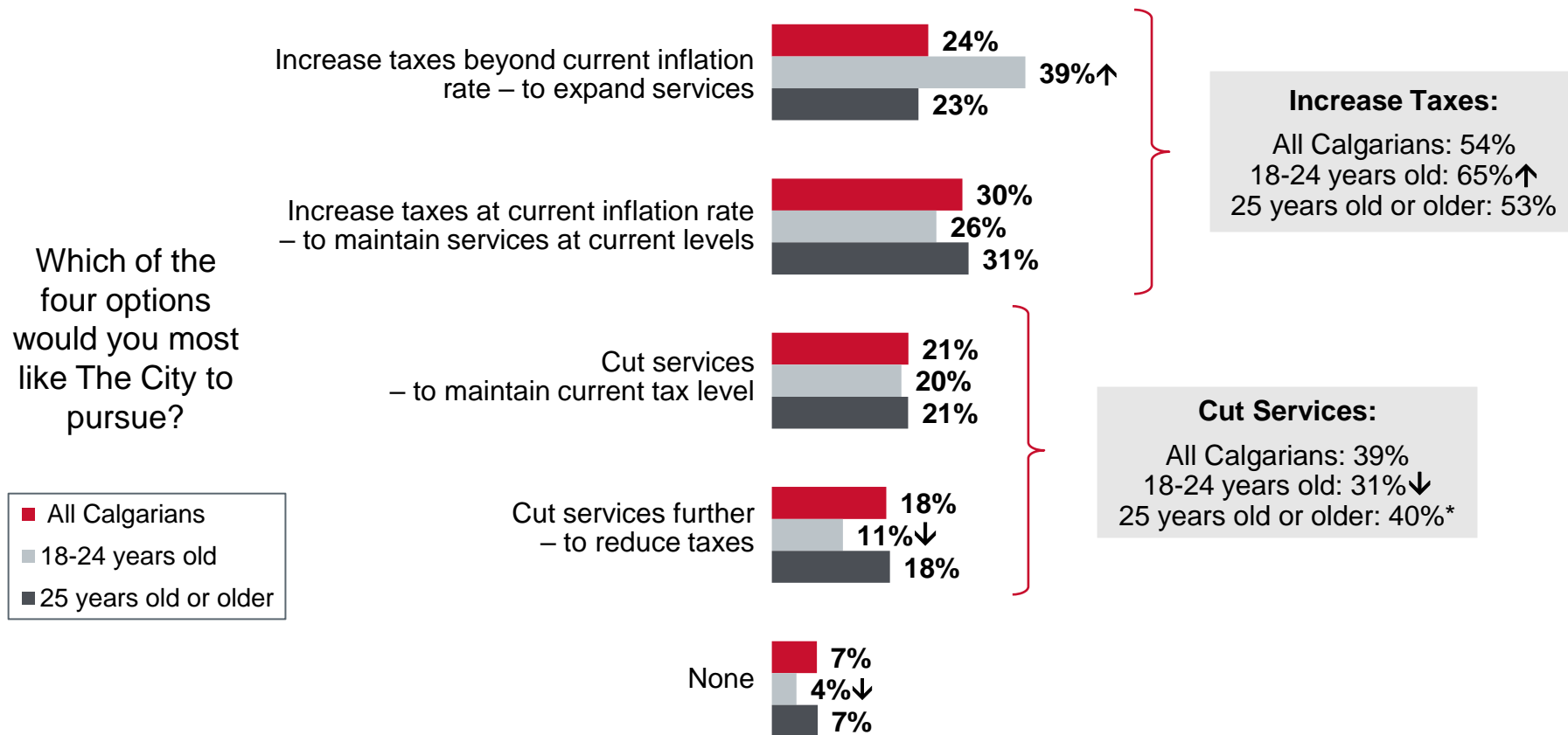
Younger Calgarians are more likely than older Calgarians to rate the value they receive from their municipal tax dollars as 'neutral' (37% 18-24 years old vs. 27% 25 years old or older). Both groups report 'good value' at about the same rate (51% vs. 57%)

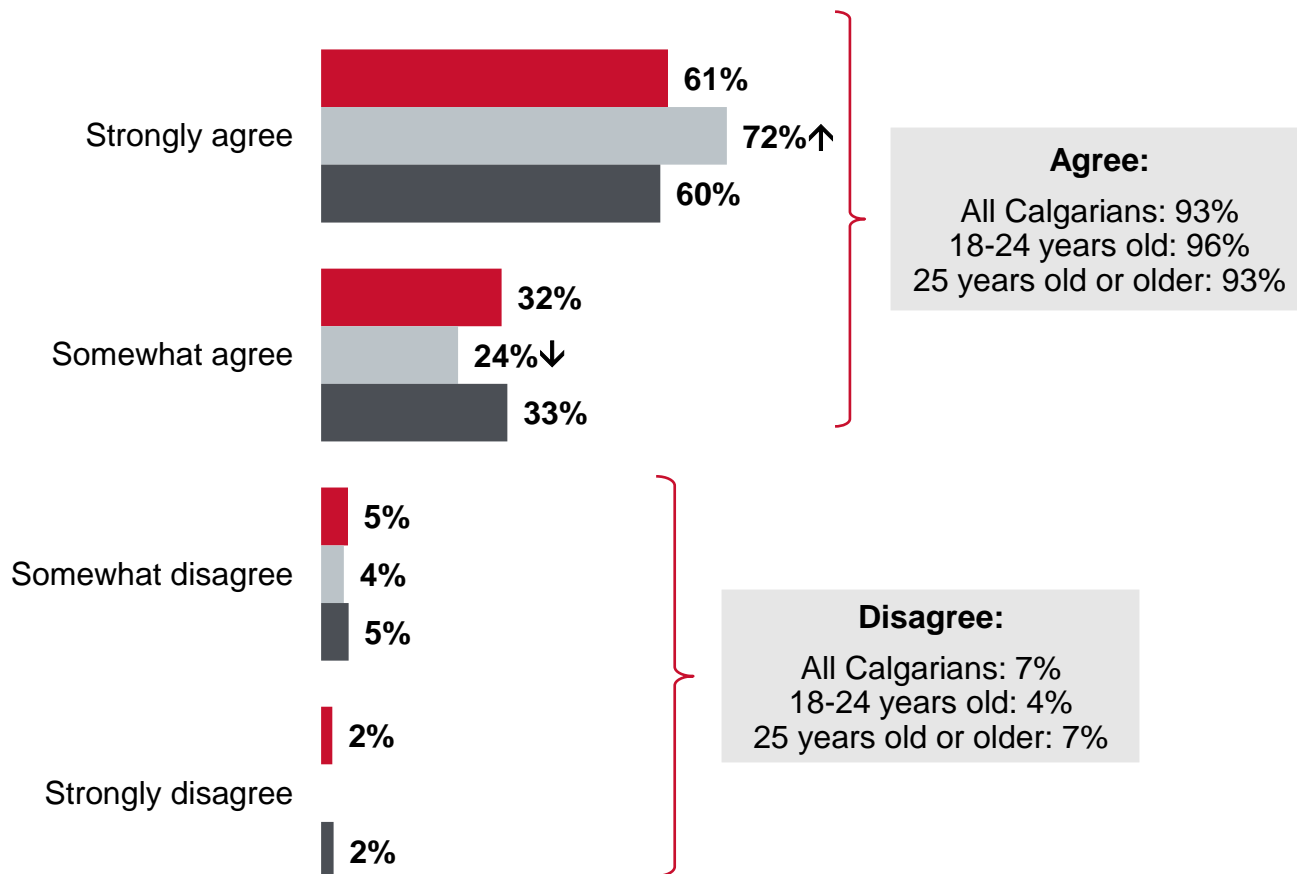
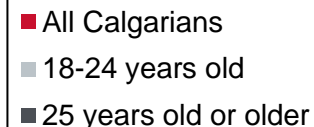

# Property Tax Dollar Investment

Younger Calgarians are more likely than older Calgarians to 'strongly agree' they are interested in how their property tax dollars are invested in City Services (72% 18-24 years old vs. 60% 25 years old or older), although they agree overall (strongly + somewhat) at about the same rate (96% vs. 93%).

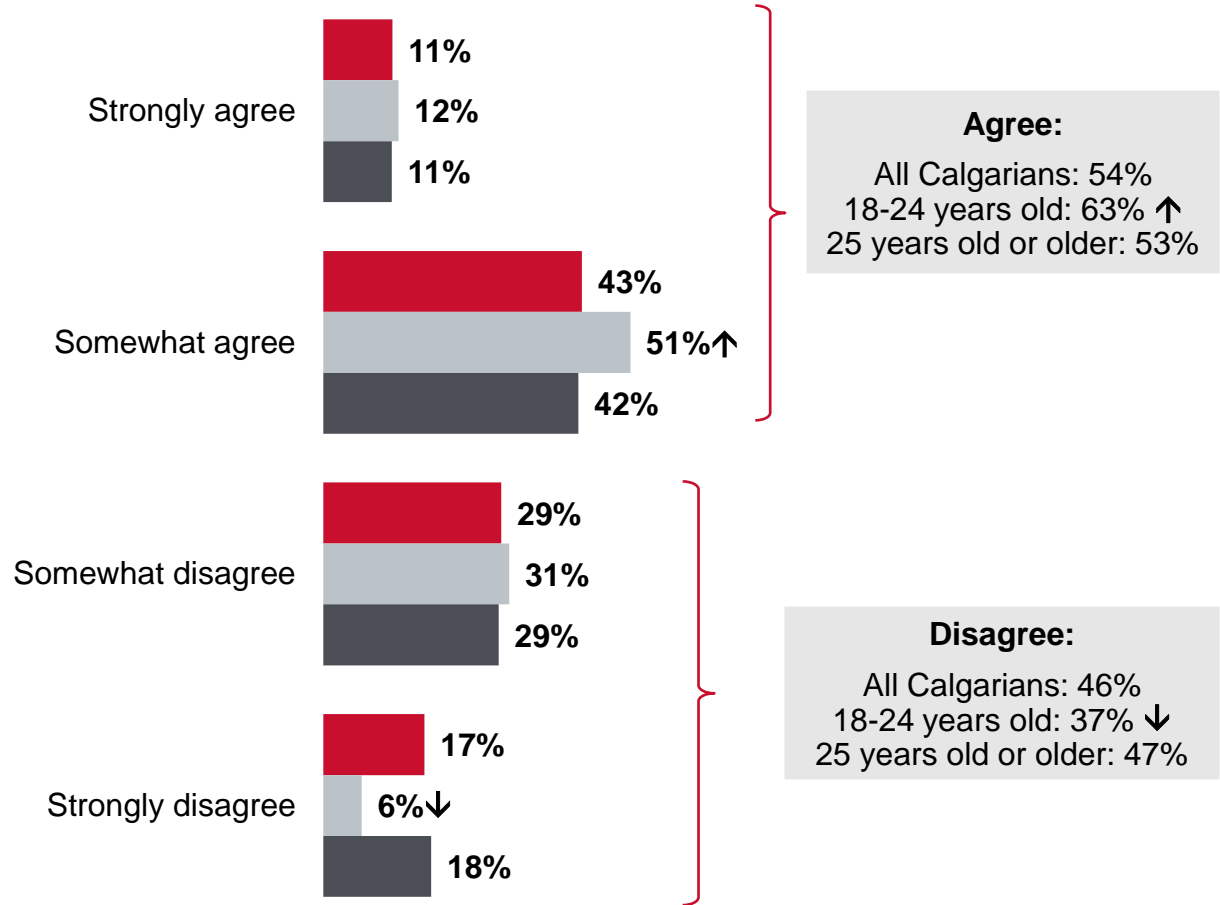

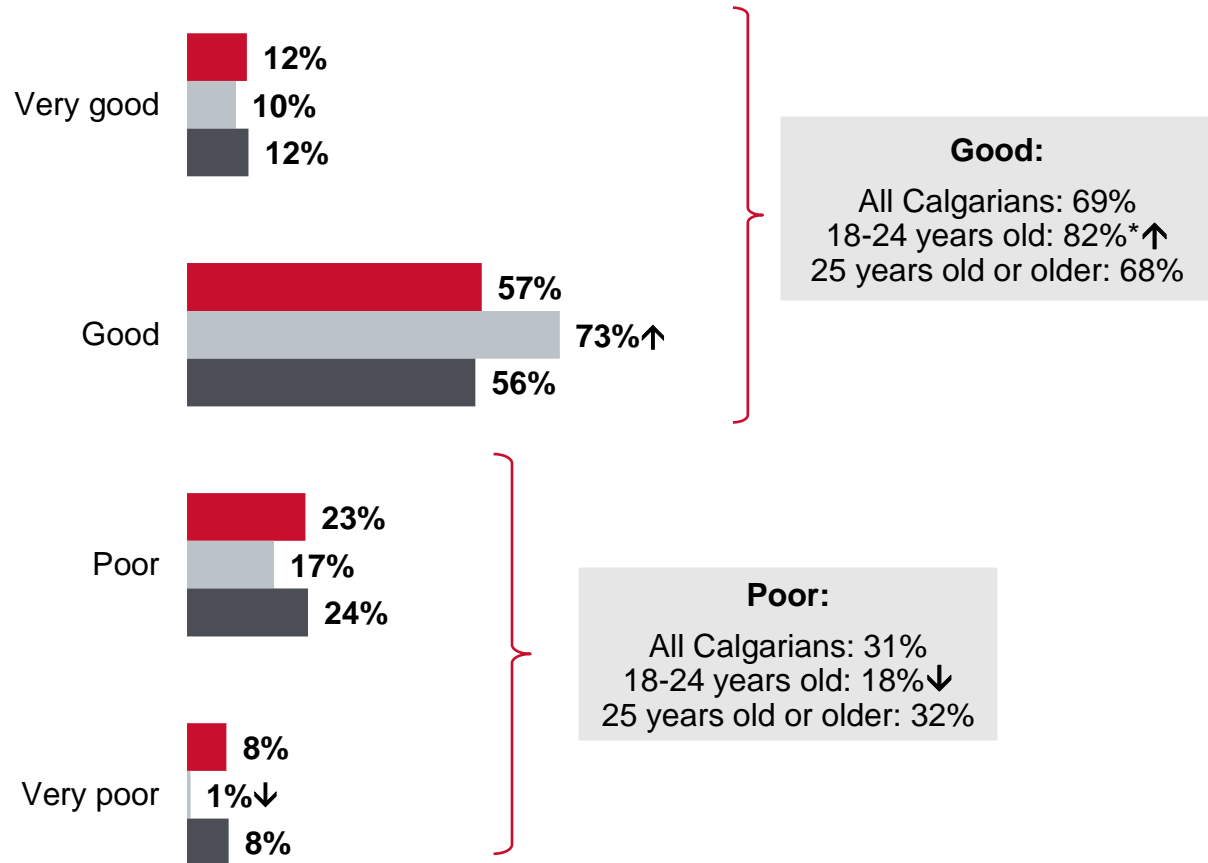
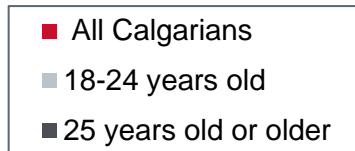

Overall, how would you rate The City of Calgary in terms of how well it communicates with citizens about its services, programs, policies and plans in the past 6 months?

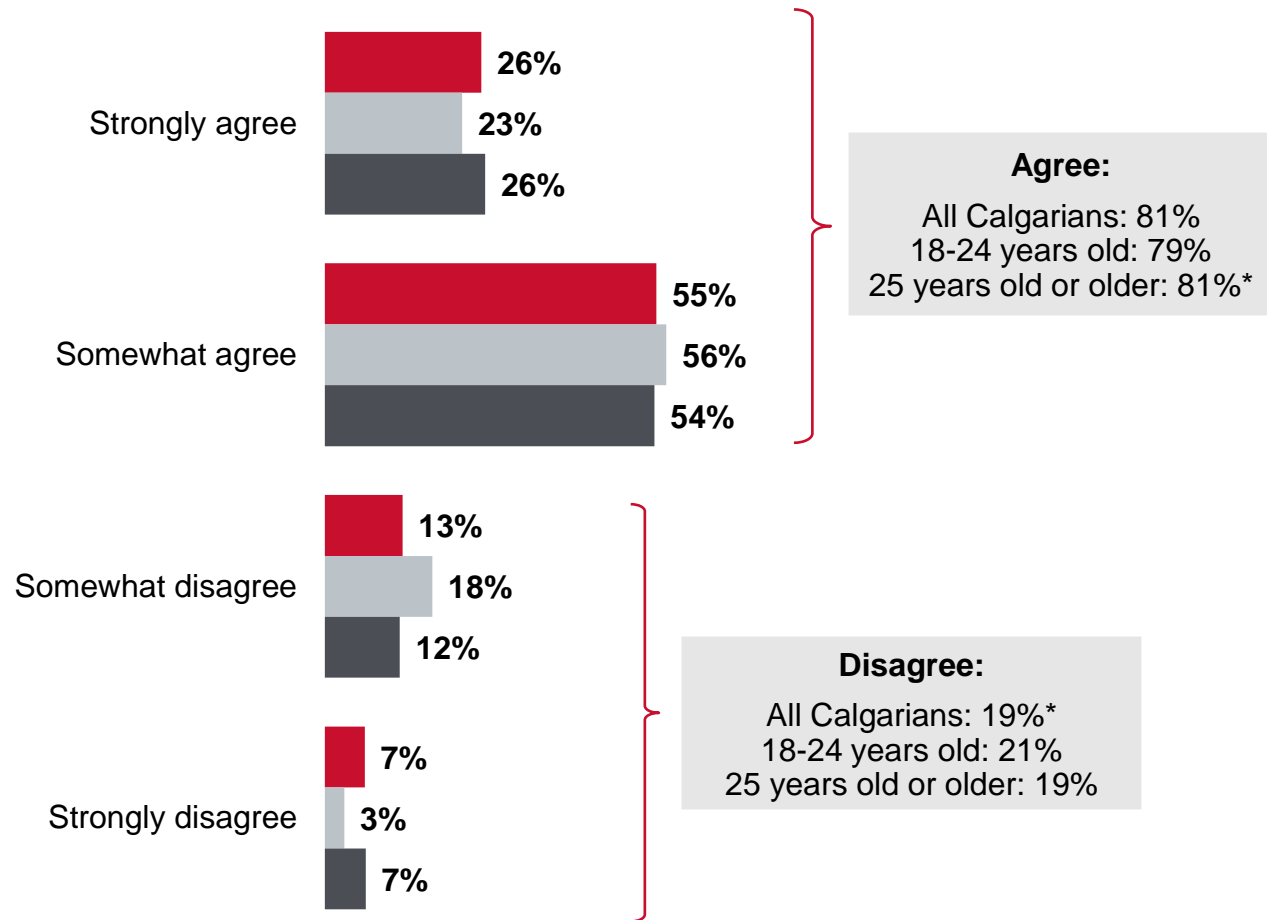
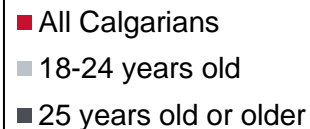

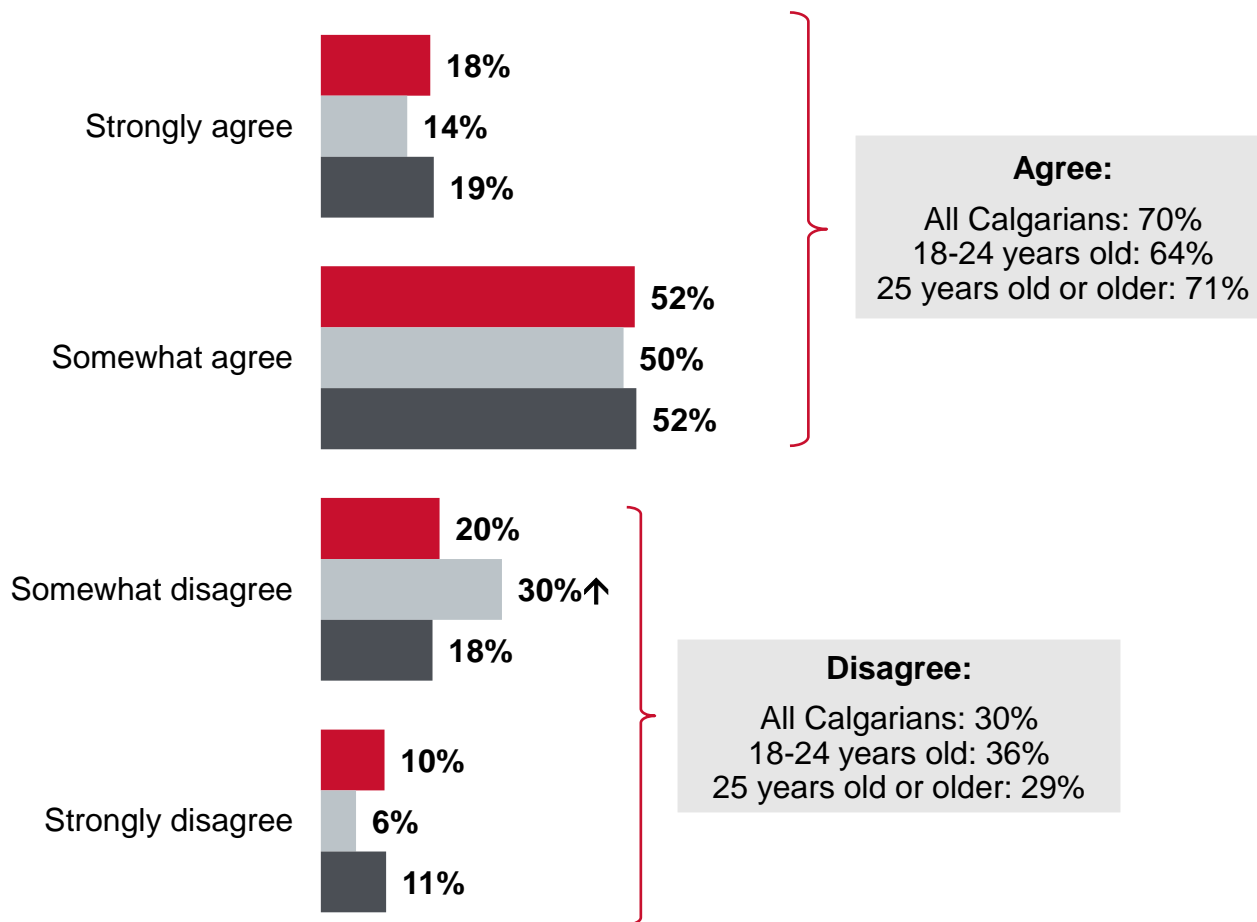

# The City Responds Quickly

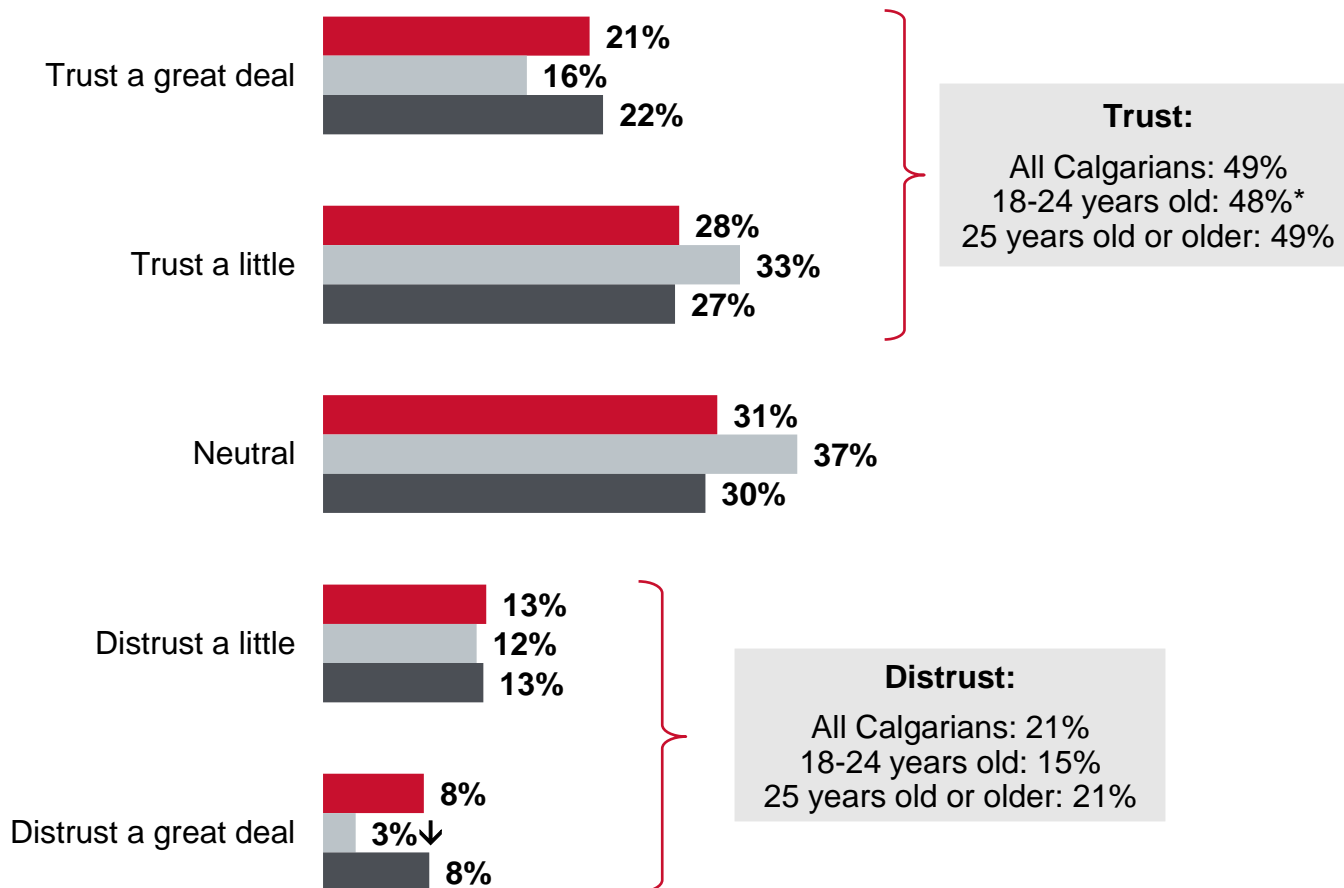
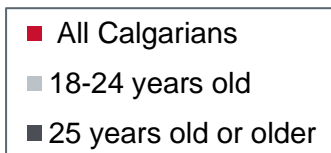

Taking into account all of the things which you think are important, how much do you trust or distrust The City of Calgary?

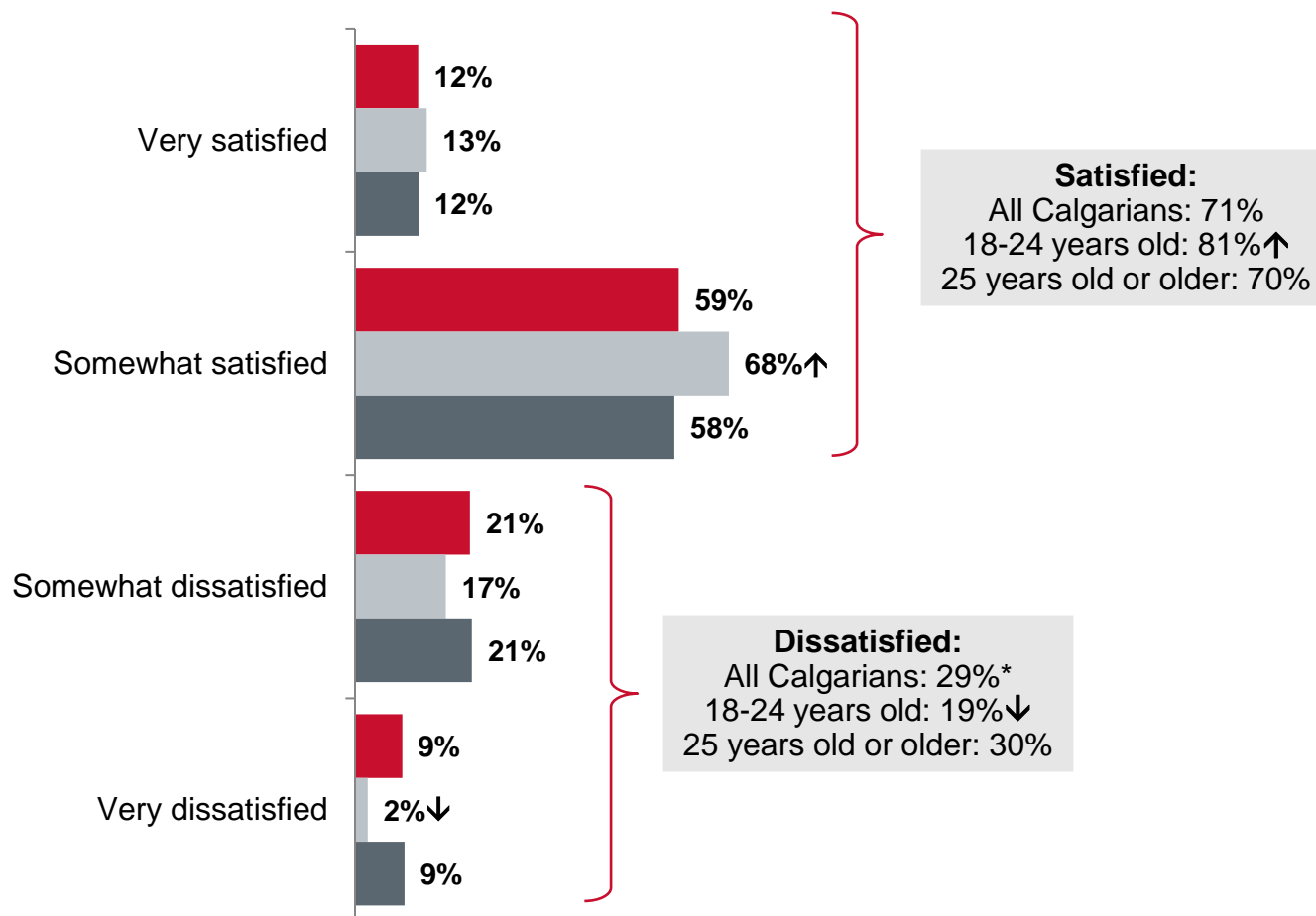
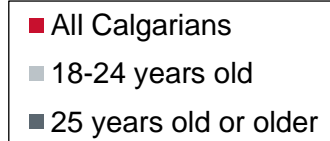

Taking everything into account, how satisfied or dissatisfied are you with the way The City of Calgary - including Council and City Administration as a whole - is going about running our City? Are you ...?

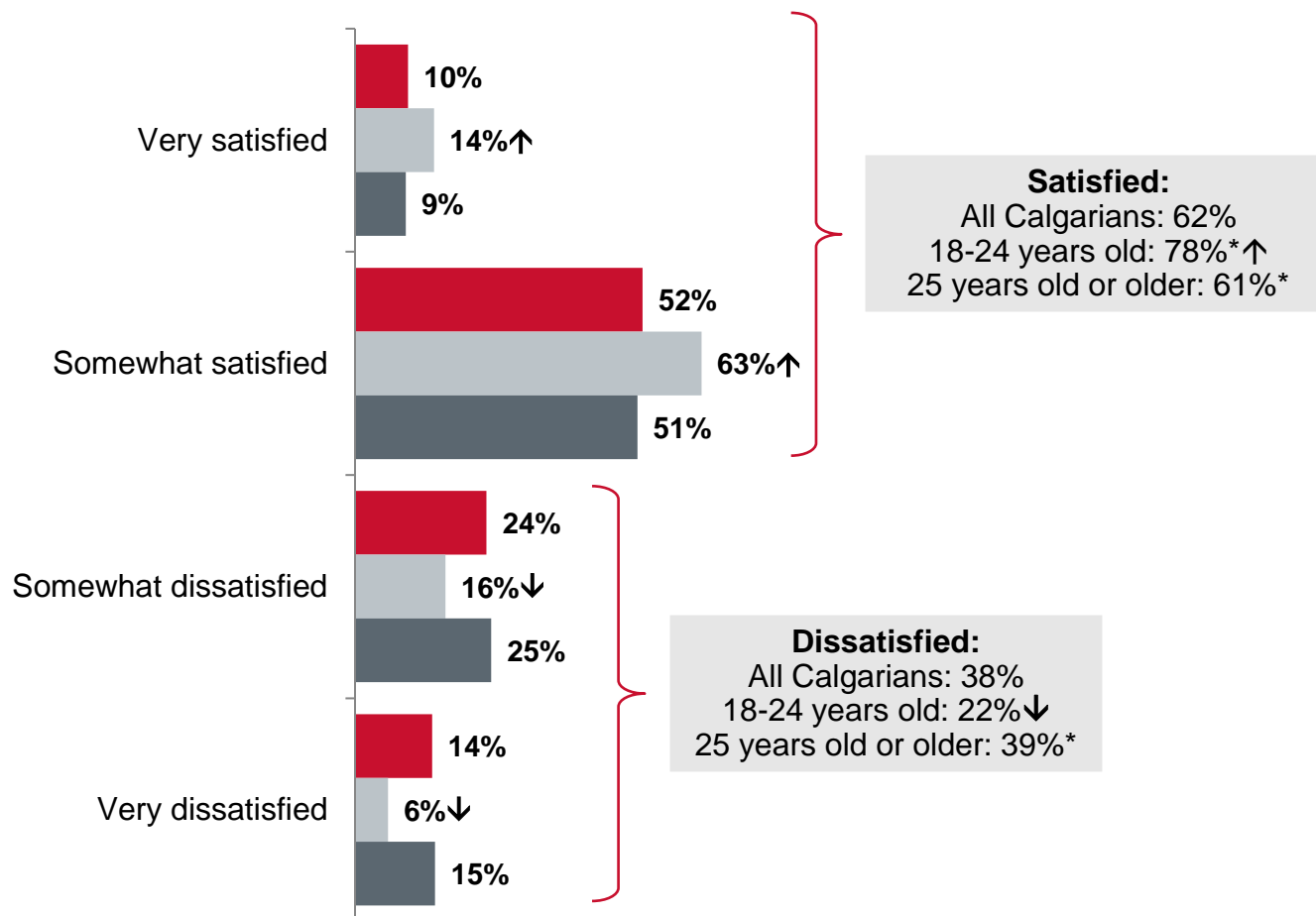
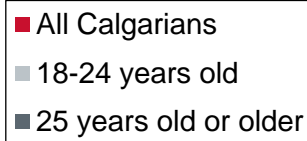

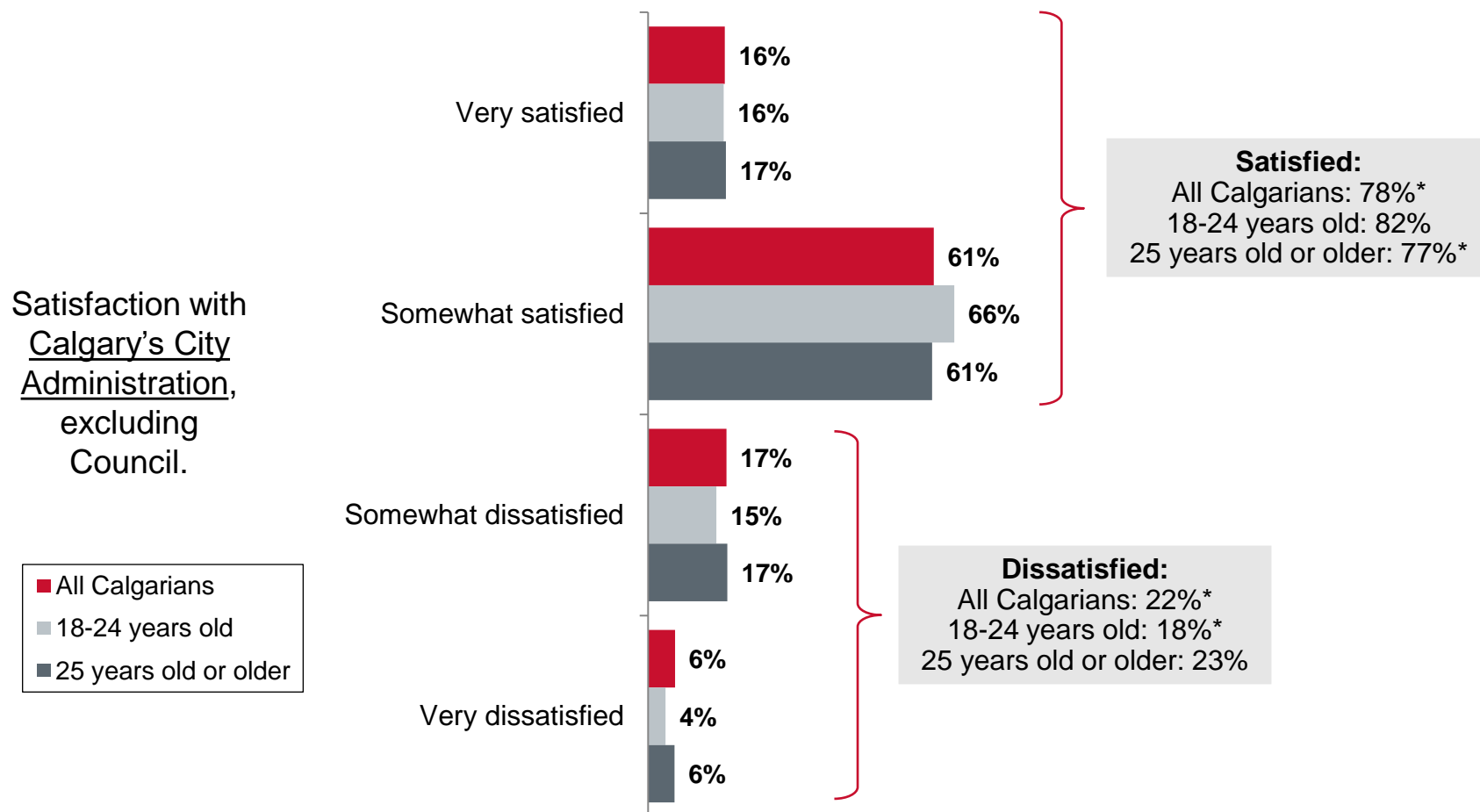
Thinking about Calgary's City Council, EXCLUDING City Administration, how satisfied or dissatisfied are you with the way City Council is going about running our City?

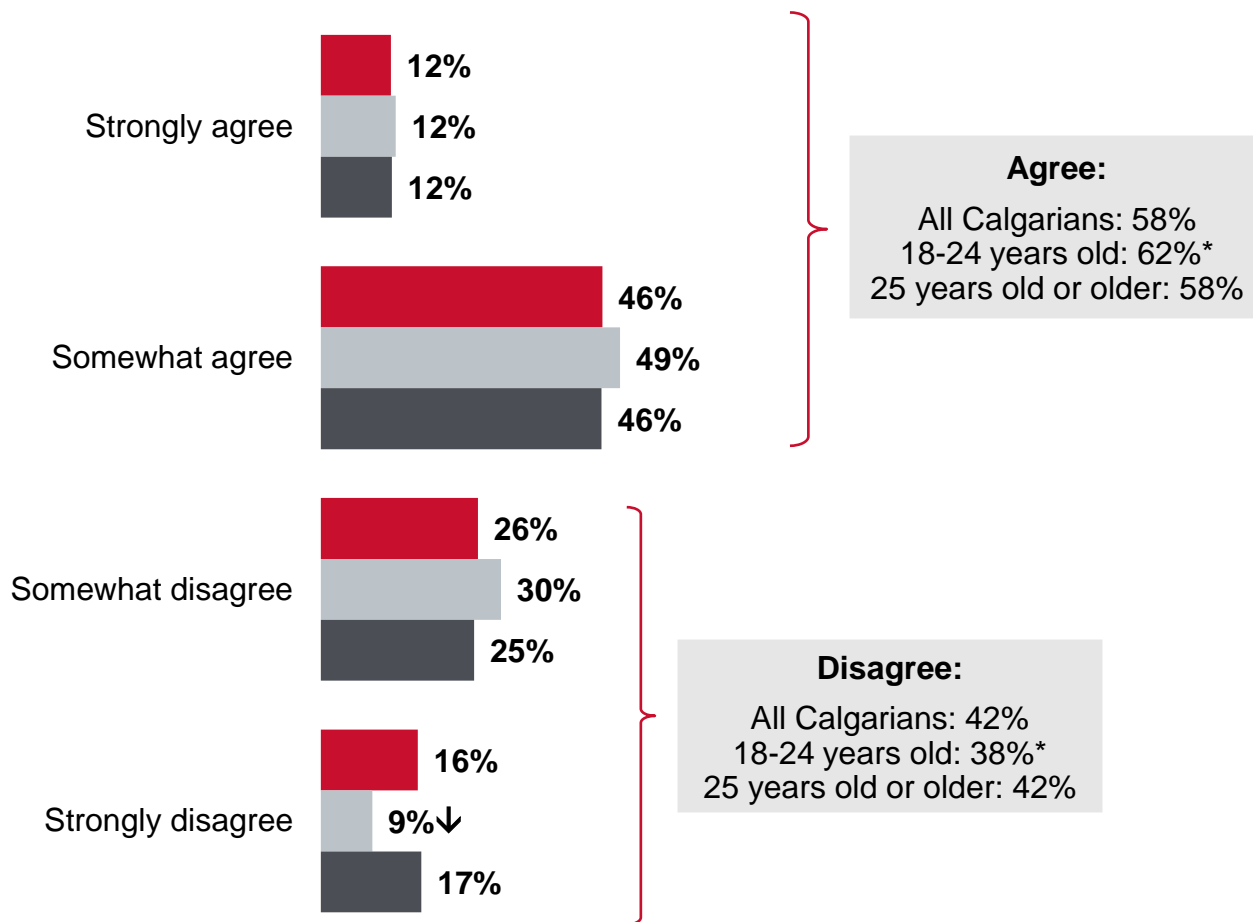
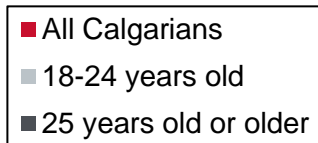
Thinking about Calgary's City Administration, EXCLUDING Council, how satisfied or dissatisfied are you with the way City Administration is going about running our City?

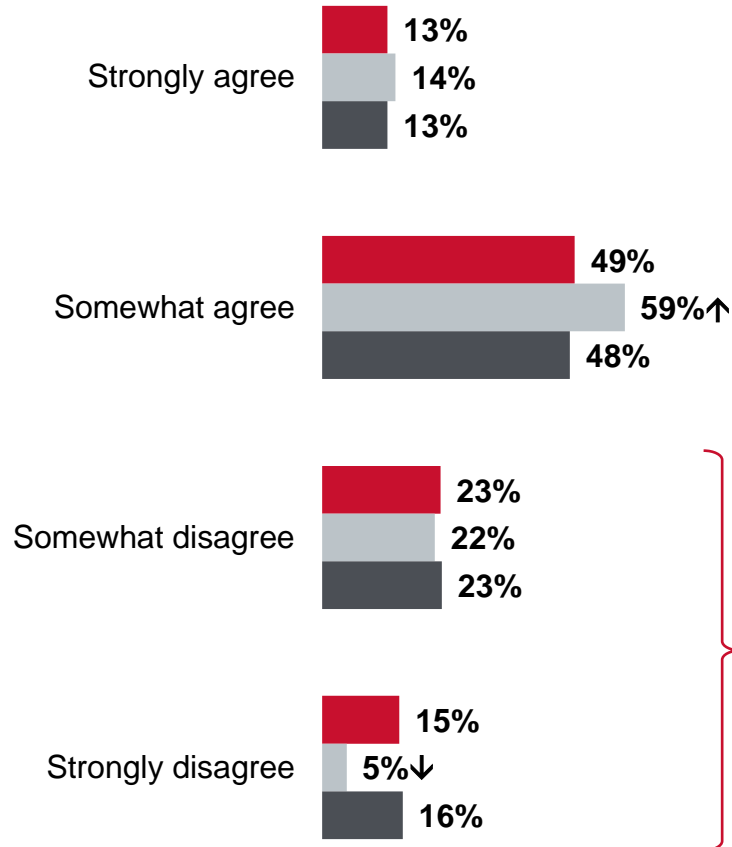

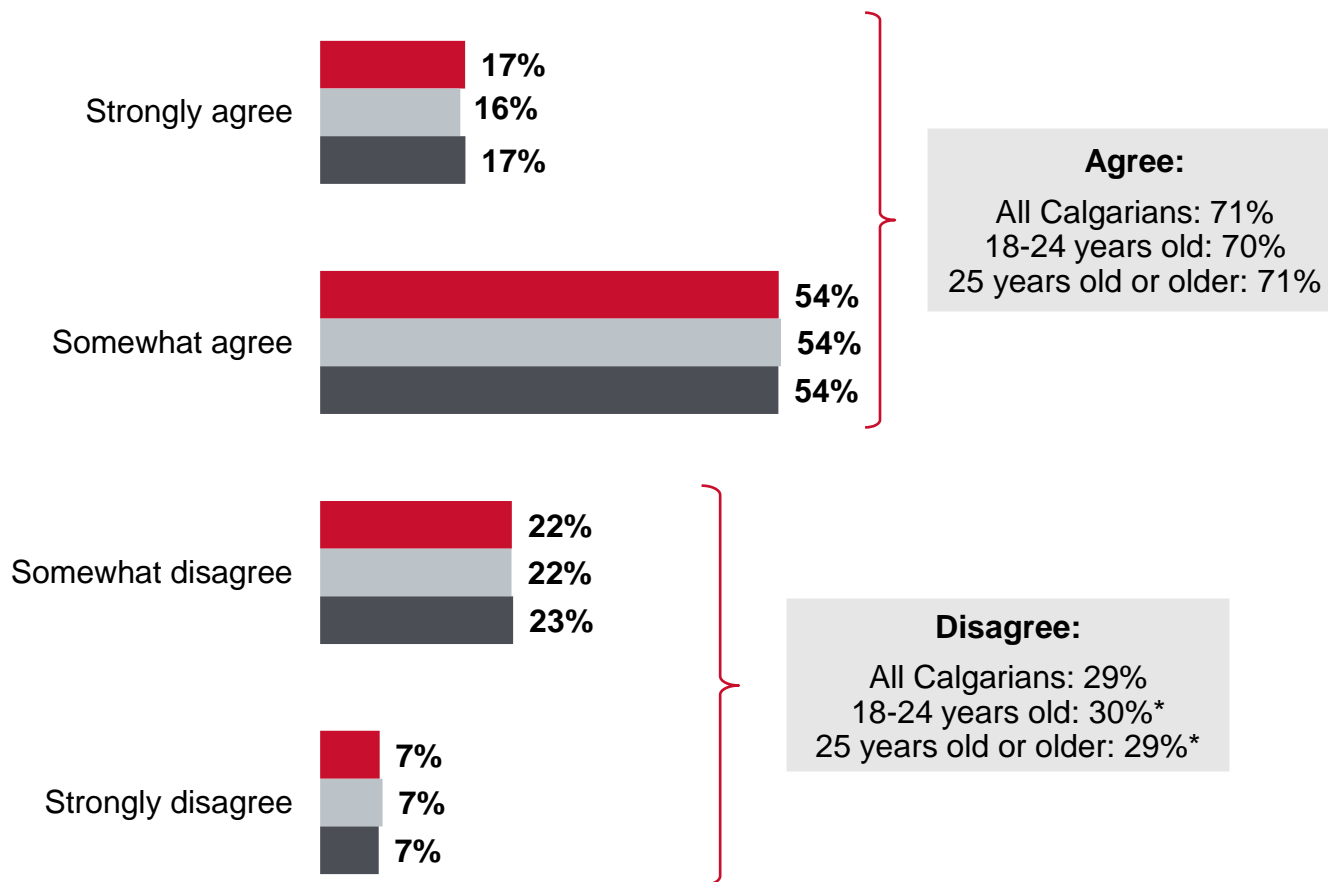
