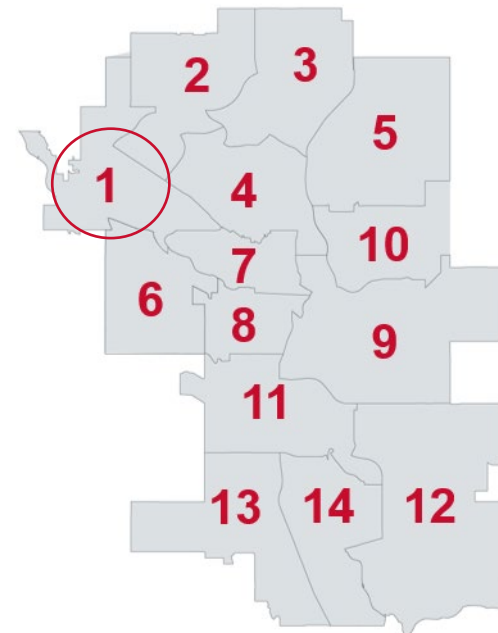
Methodology

- The survey was conducted by Ipsos Public Affairs from August 2, 2023 to September 4, 2023 with a randomly-selected sample of 2,500 Calgarians, via telephone survey. A total of 190 interviews were conducted with residents of Ward 1. The average time to complete the survey was 29 minutes.
- The survey was conducted using random digit dialing with numbers from both landlines (60%) and cell phones (40%) to obtain a random and statistically-representative sample of Calgarians.
- The margin of error for the total City Wide sample of $n=2,500$ is ± 2.0 percentage points, 19 times out of 20. The margin of error for Ward 1 is ± 7.11 percentage points.
- To ensure the data was gathered from a representative group of Calgarians, sample quotas were set by age, gender, and city ward of the general population aged 18 and older.
- Data were weighted based on the 2019 Municipal and 2021 Federal Census data for age, gender and city ward to ensure composition reflects that of the actual Calgary population aged 18 or older. Although the results are weighted, sample size for each question represents the number of actual respondents (i.e., unweighted n).

- Where possible, fall 2023 results for Ward 1 are compared to those from fall 2022 as indicated by a grey dotted box:
 - Ward 1 2022**
 - Only statistically significant differences are shown
- Some bar charts in this report do not add to 100% due to rounding.

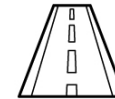

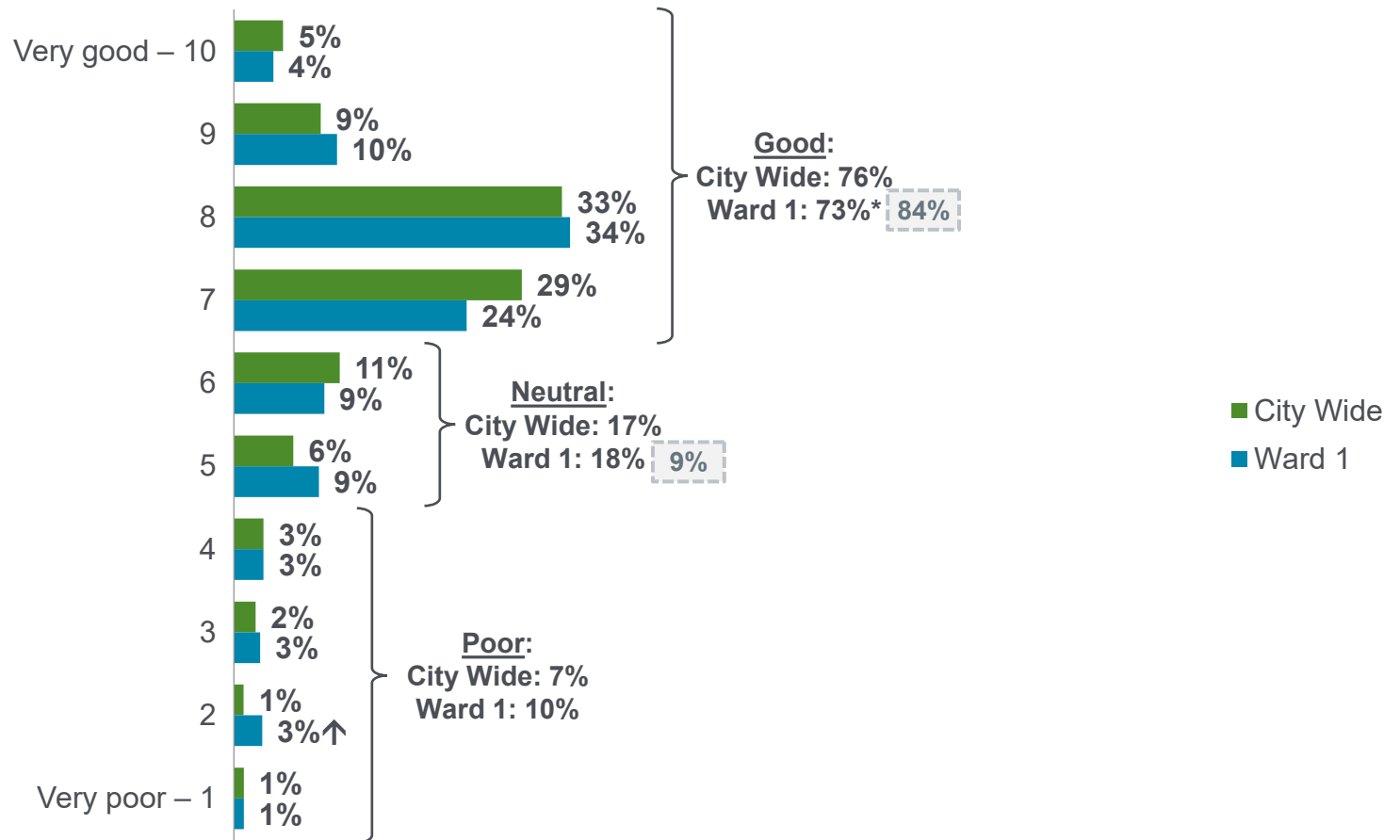

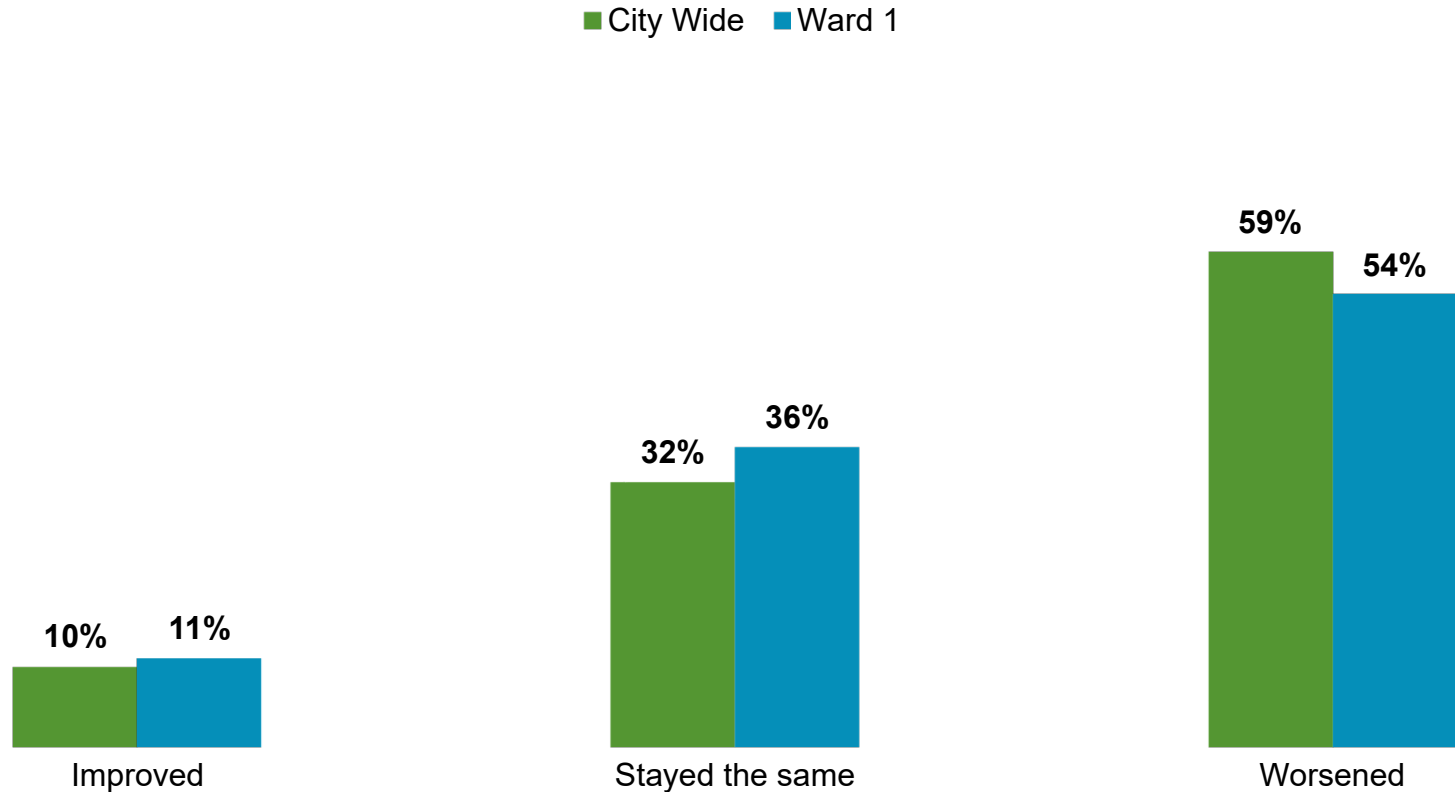

Perceived change in quality of life



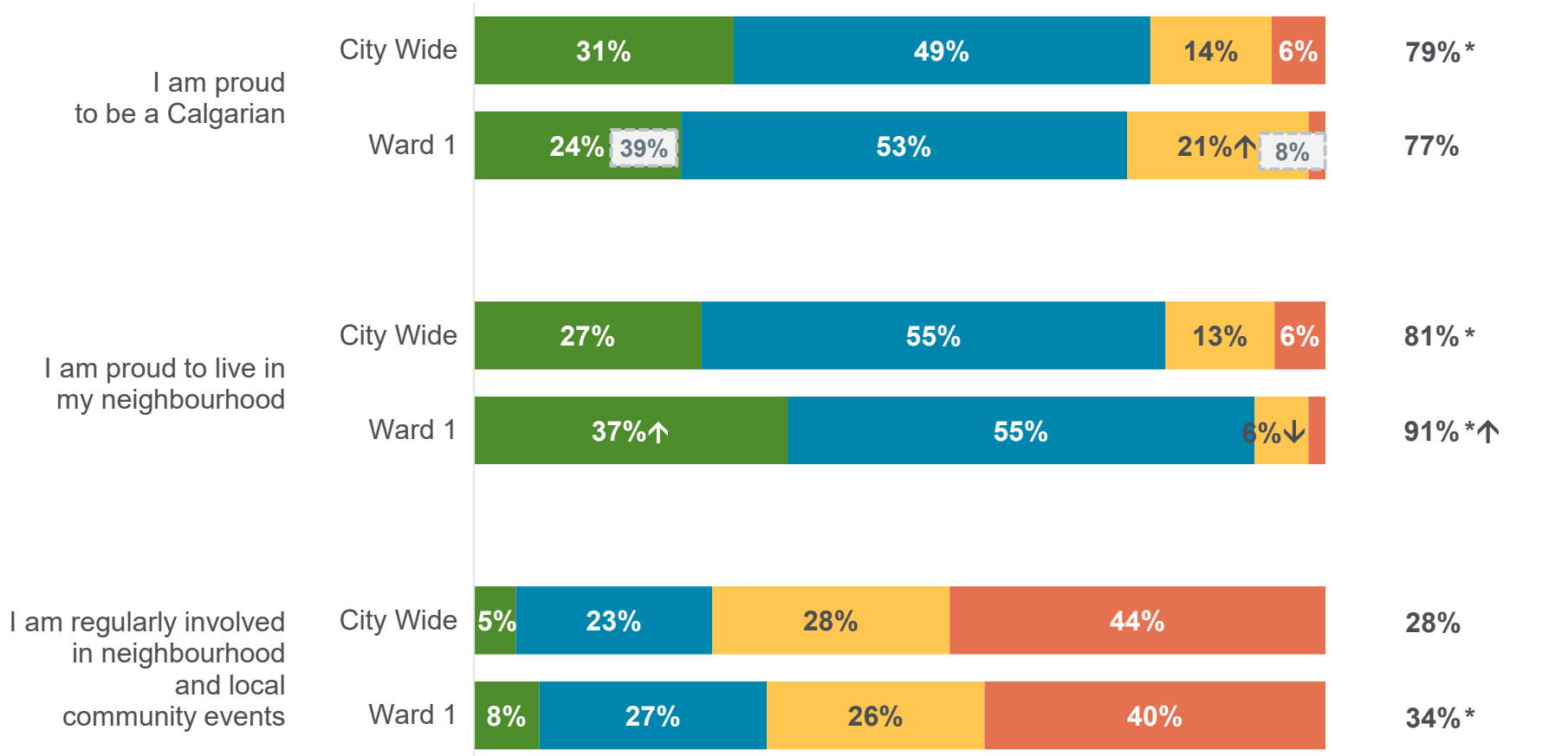
Q. Do you feel that the quality of life in the city of Calgary in the past three years has ...?

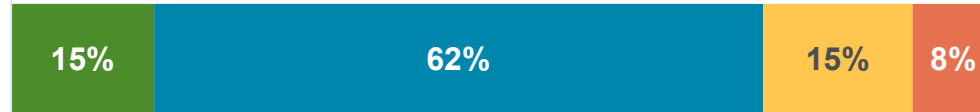

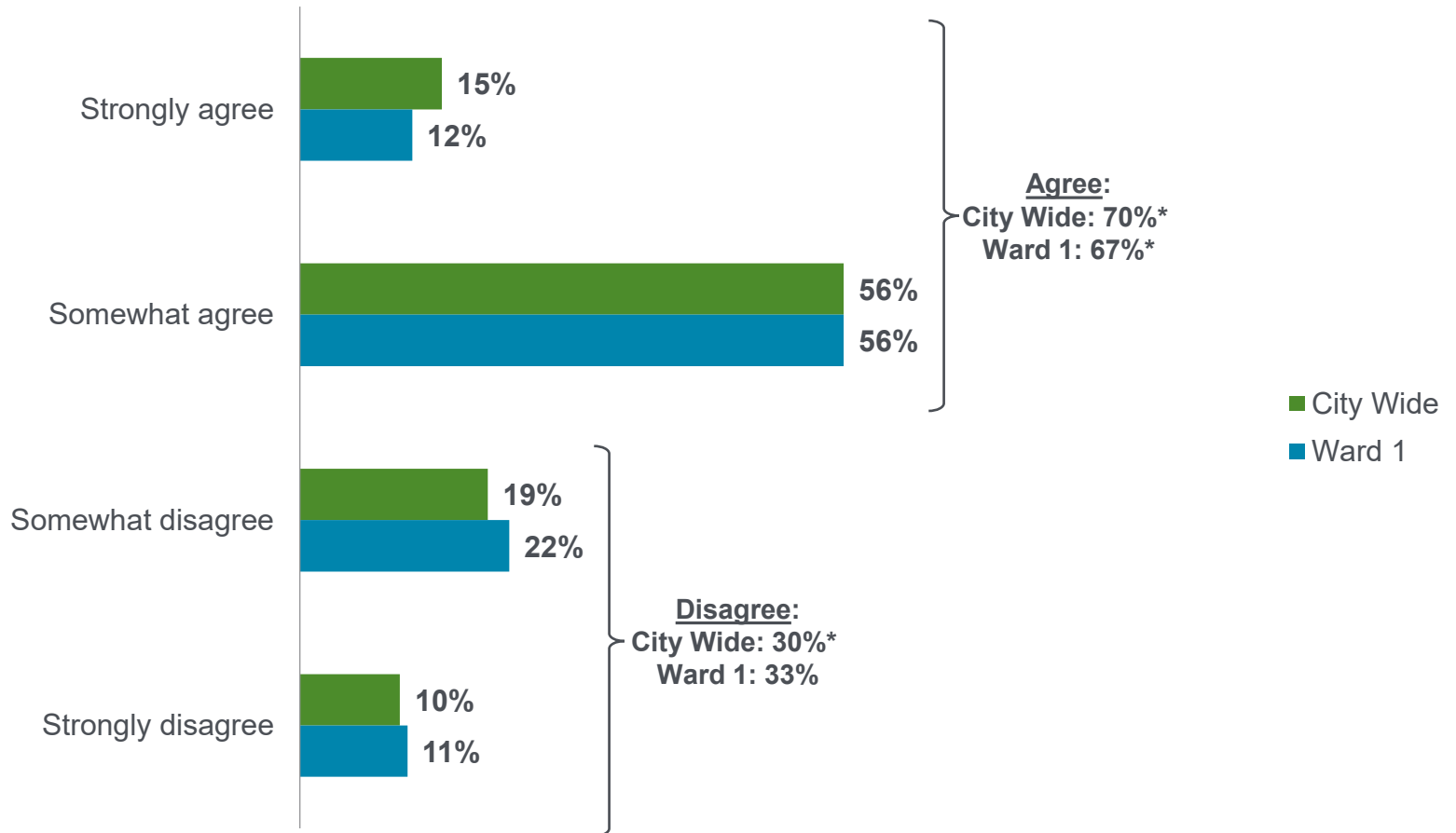

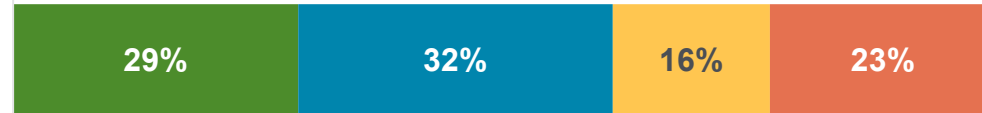

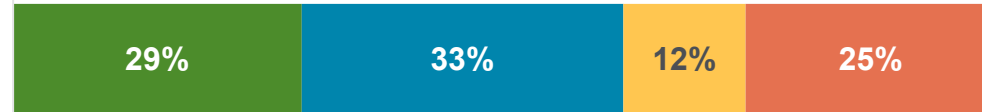

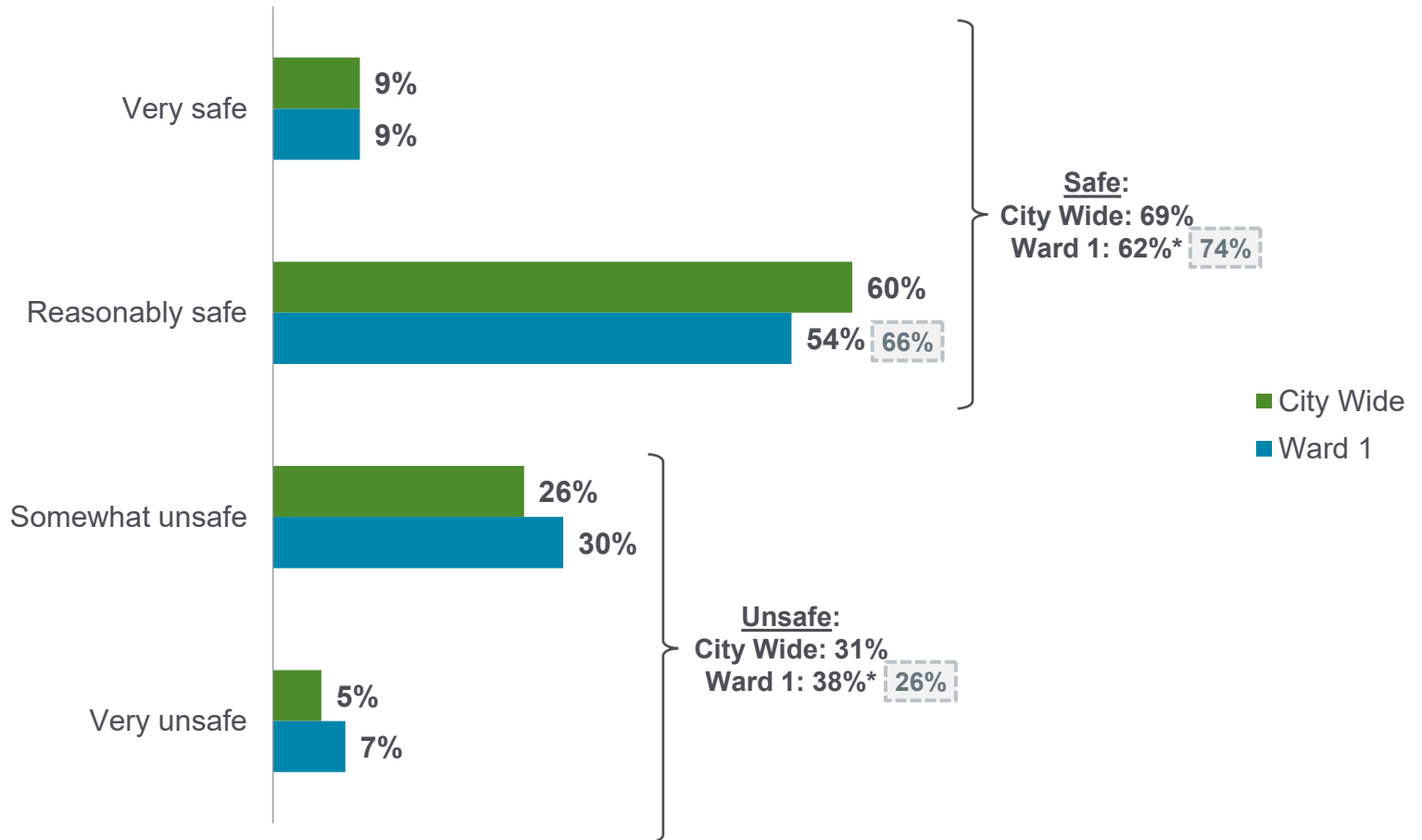

Overall perceived safety of the city of Calgary

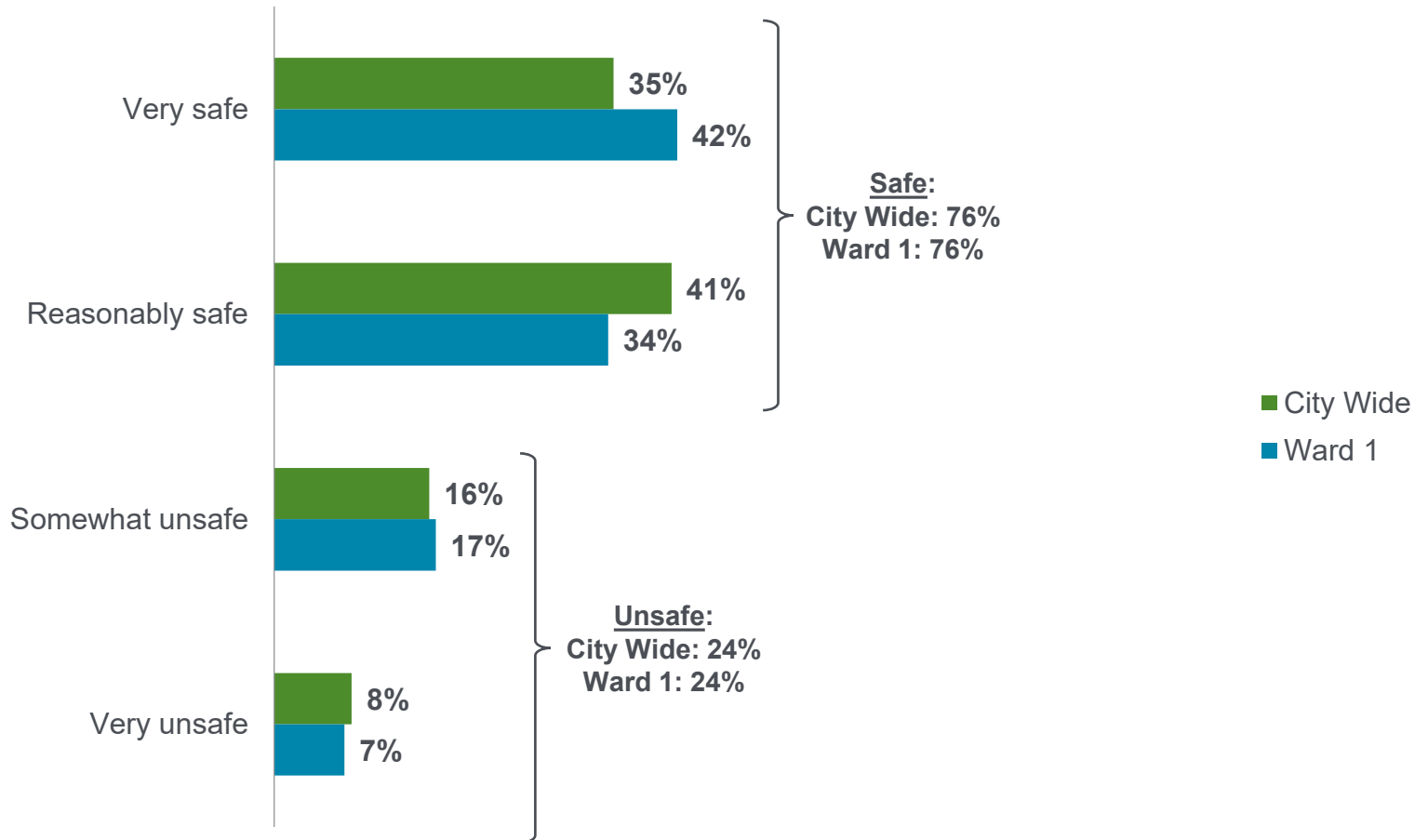


Q. How safe or unsafe do you think Calgary is overall?

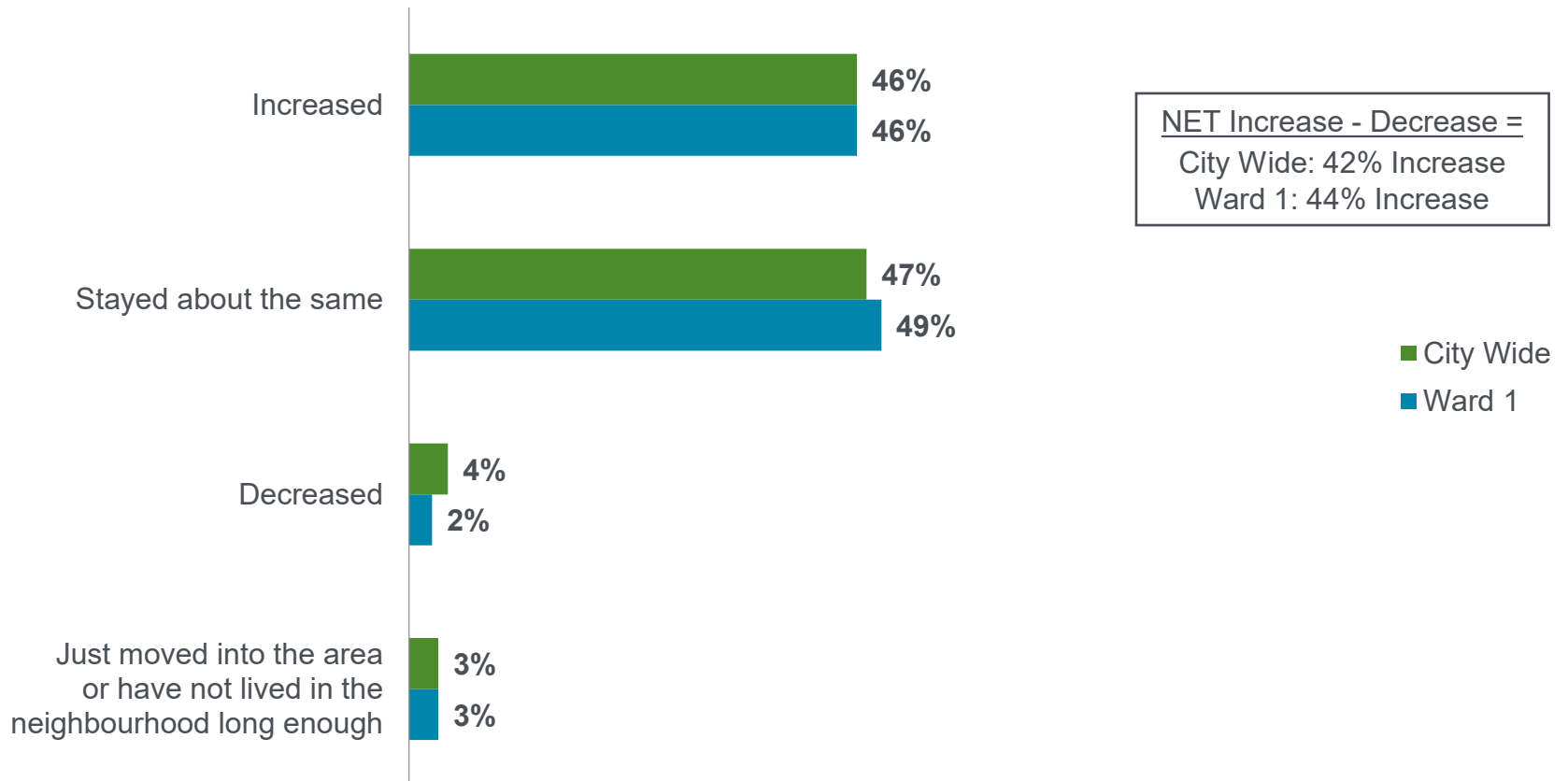

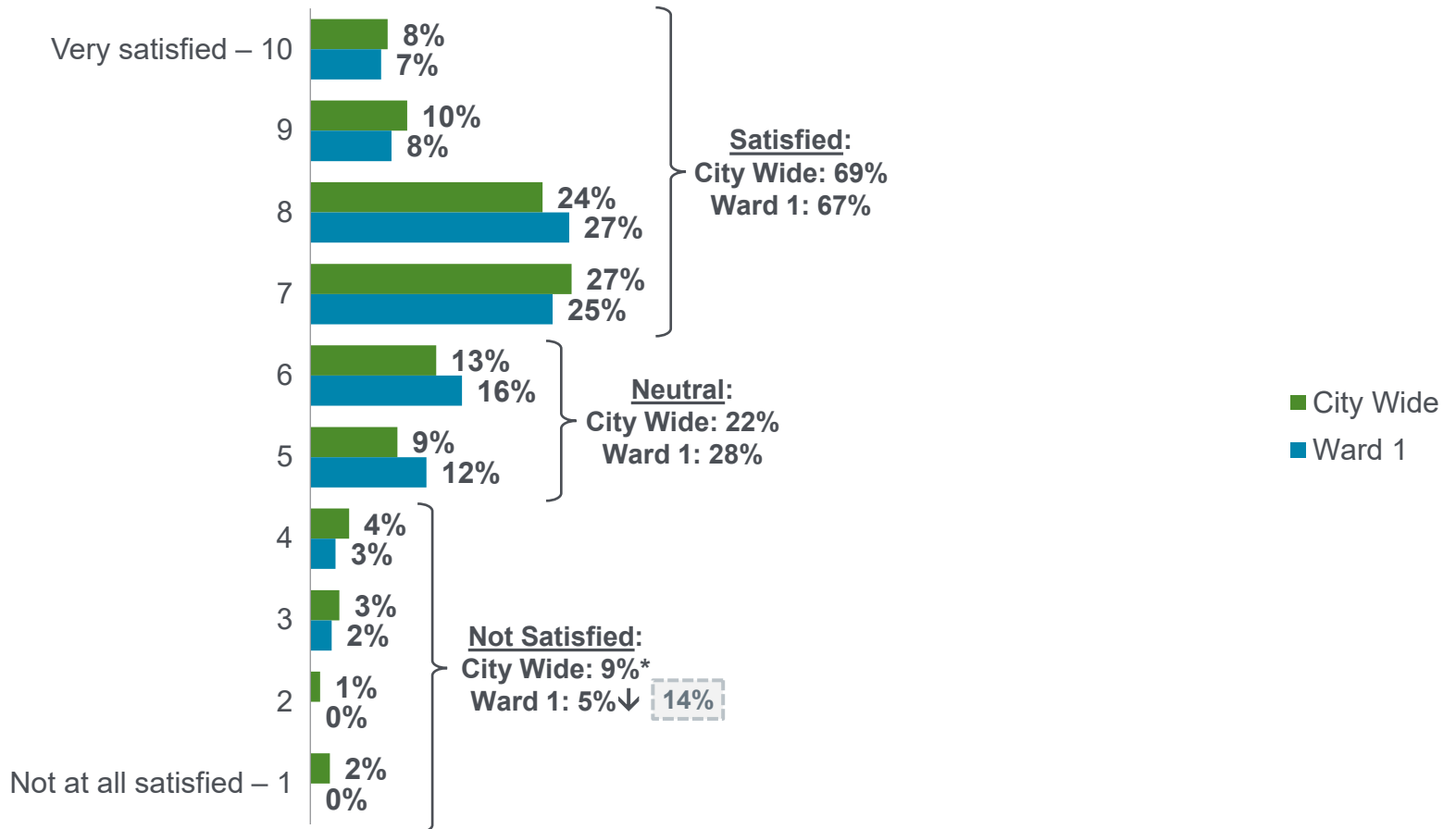

Satisfaction with the overall level and quality of City services and programs

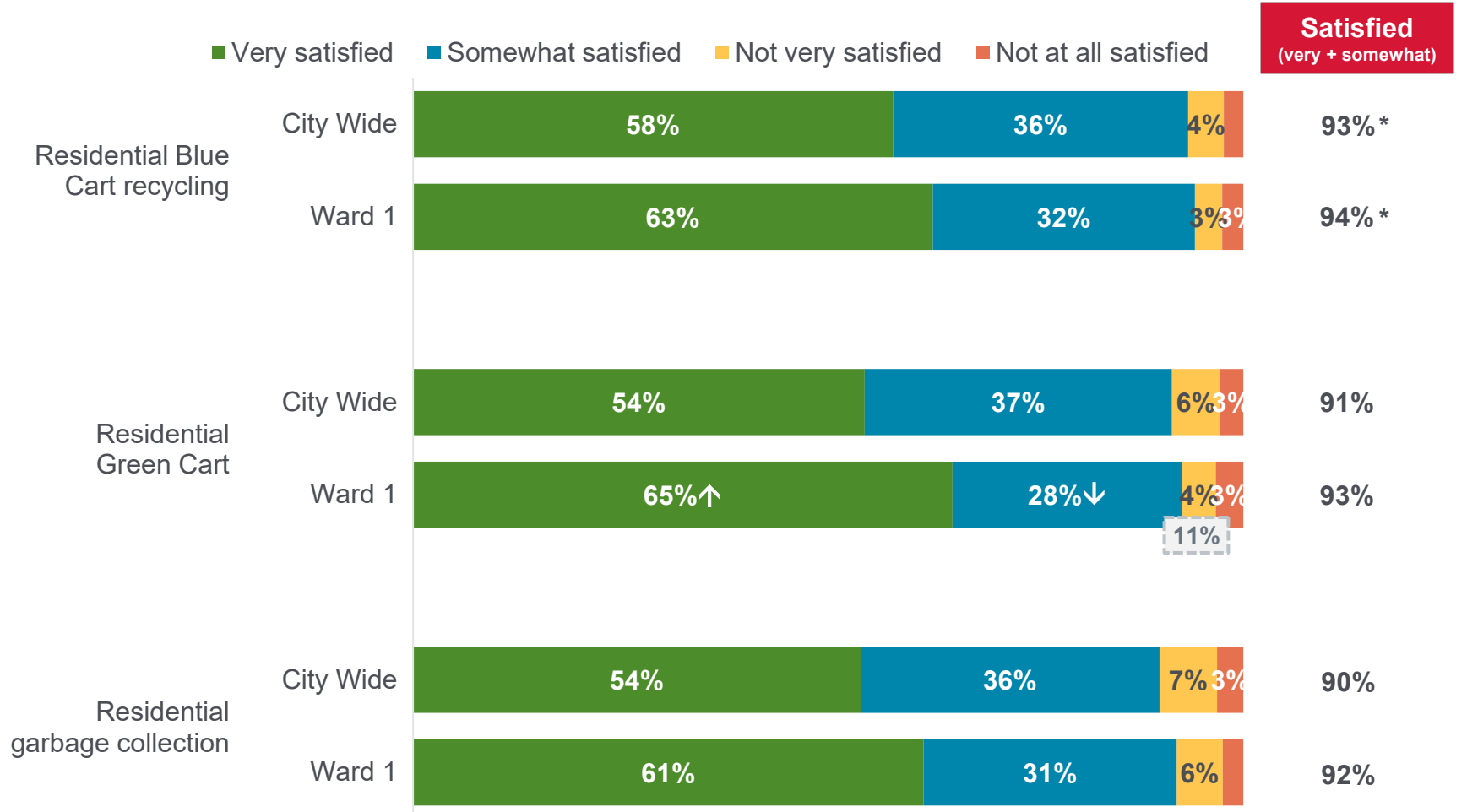

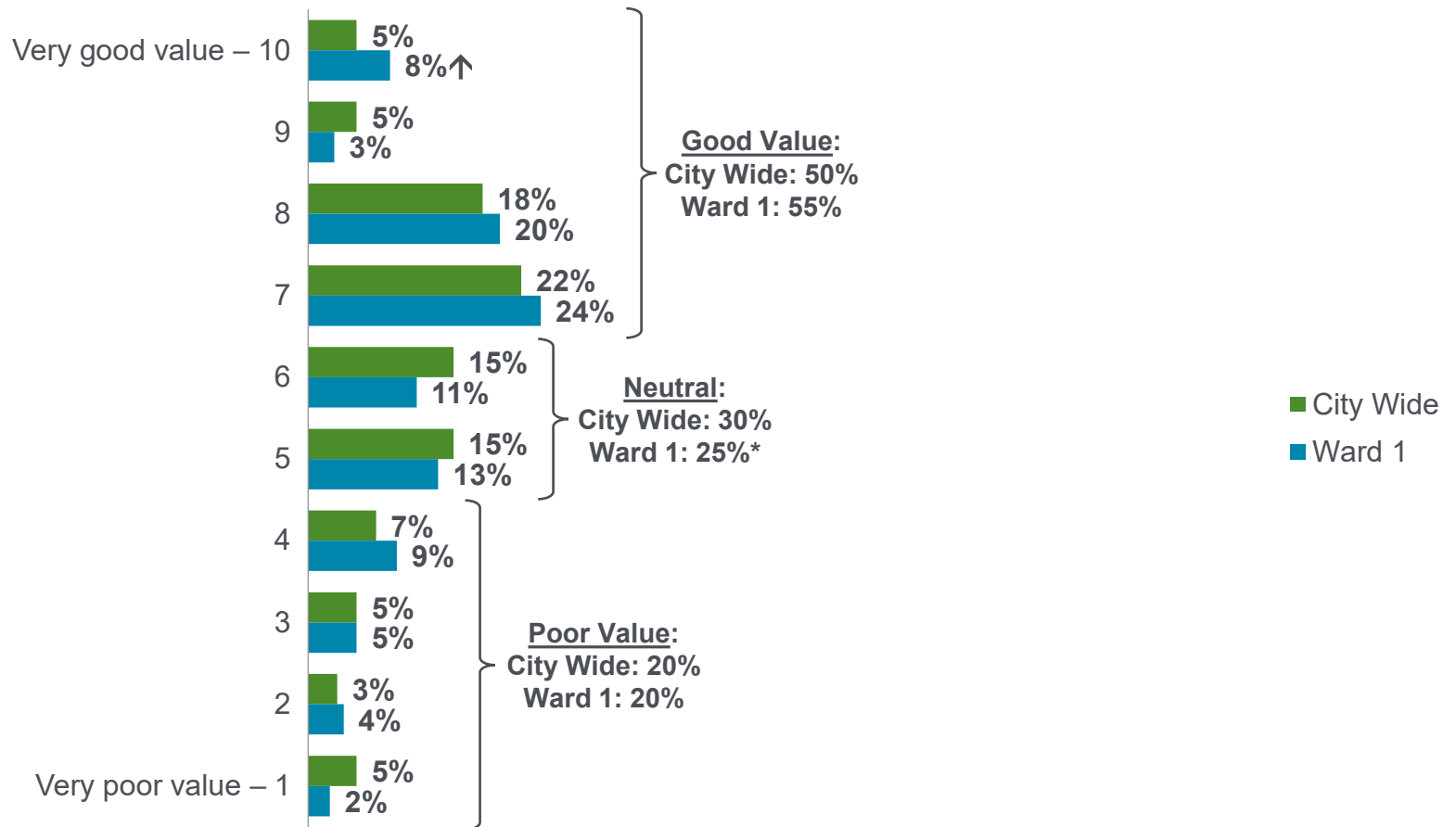

Perceived value of property taxes



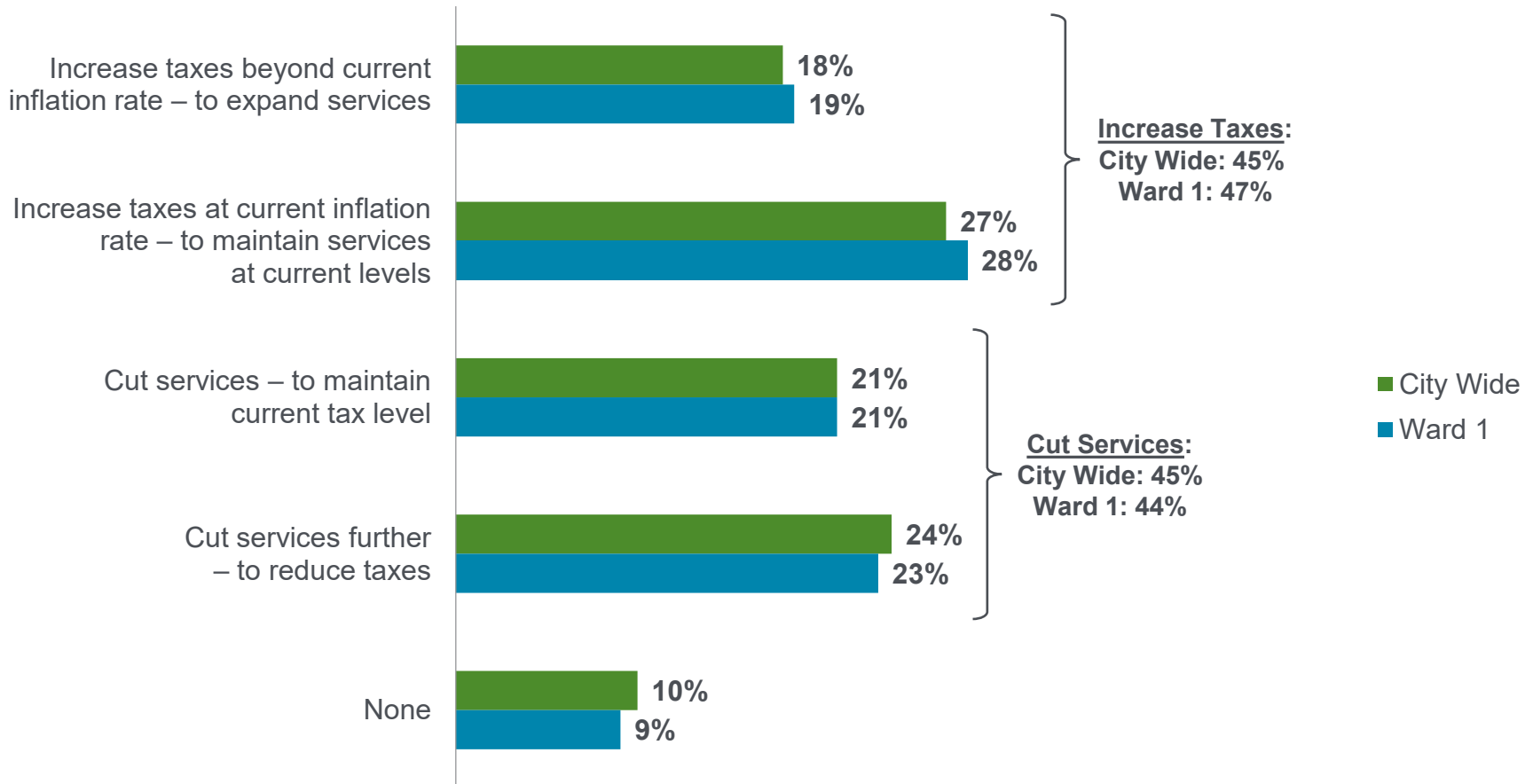

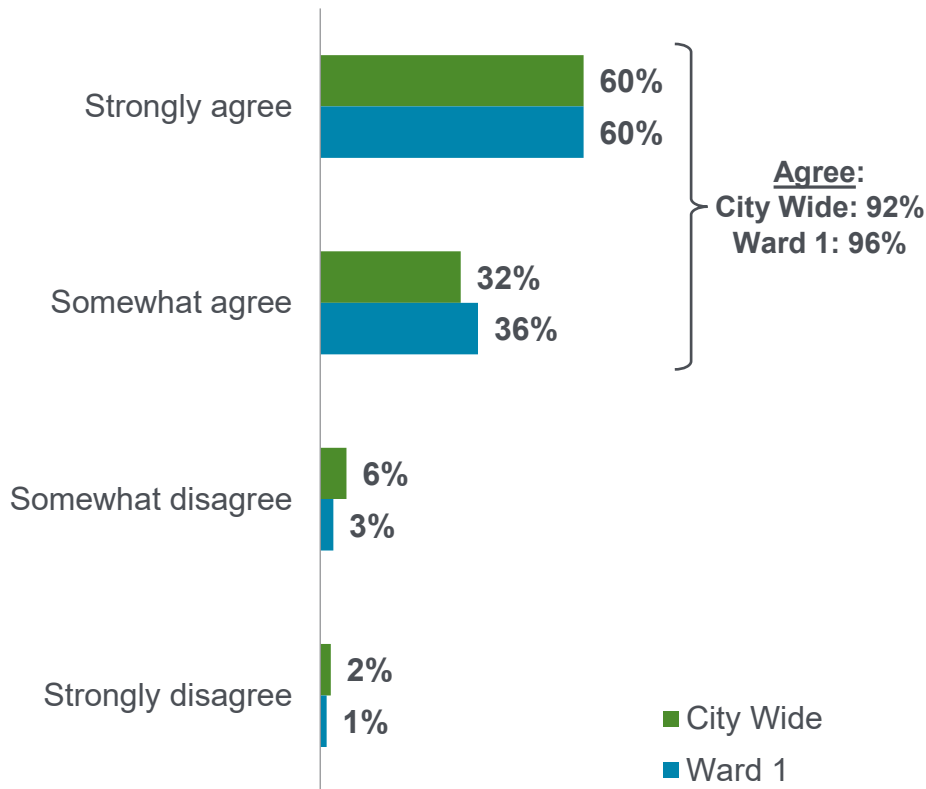

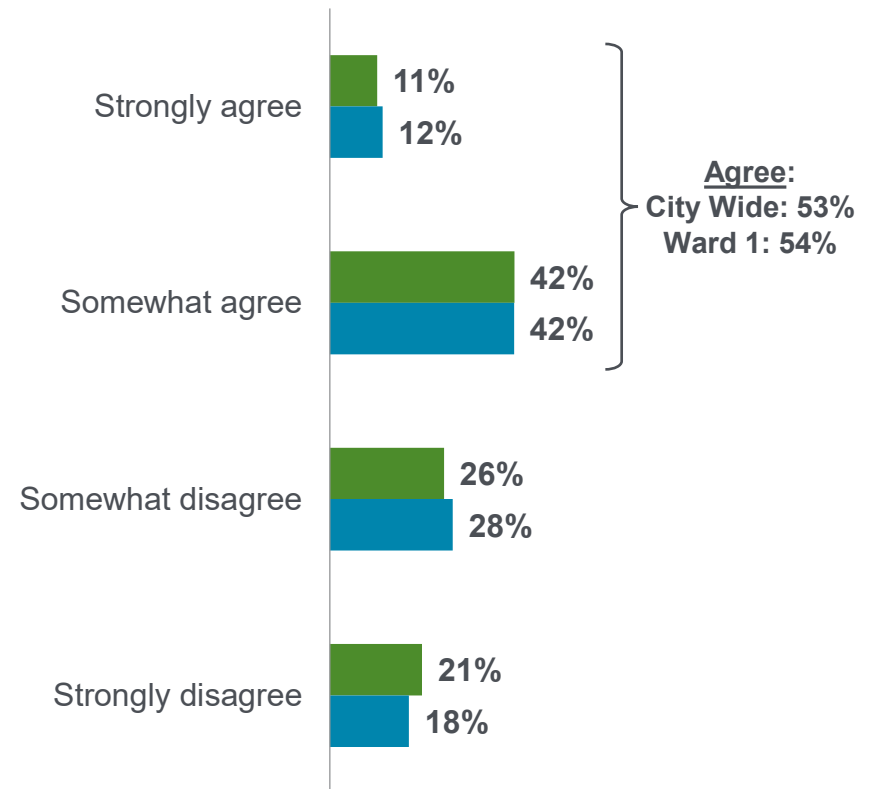

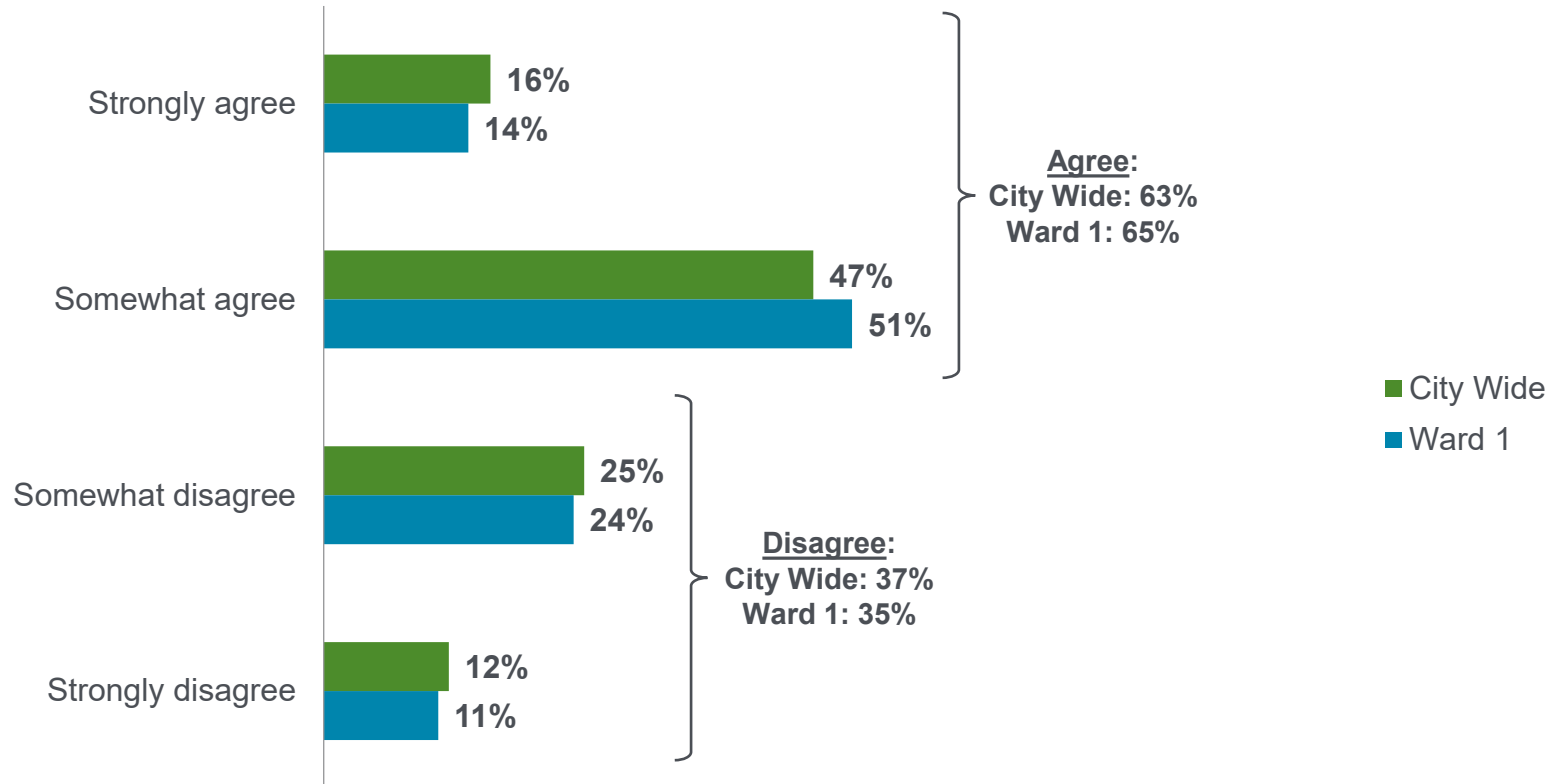

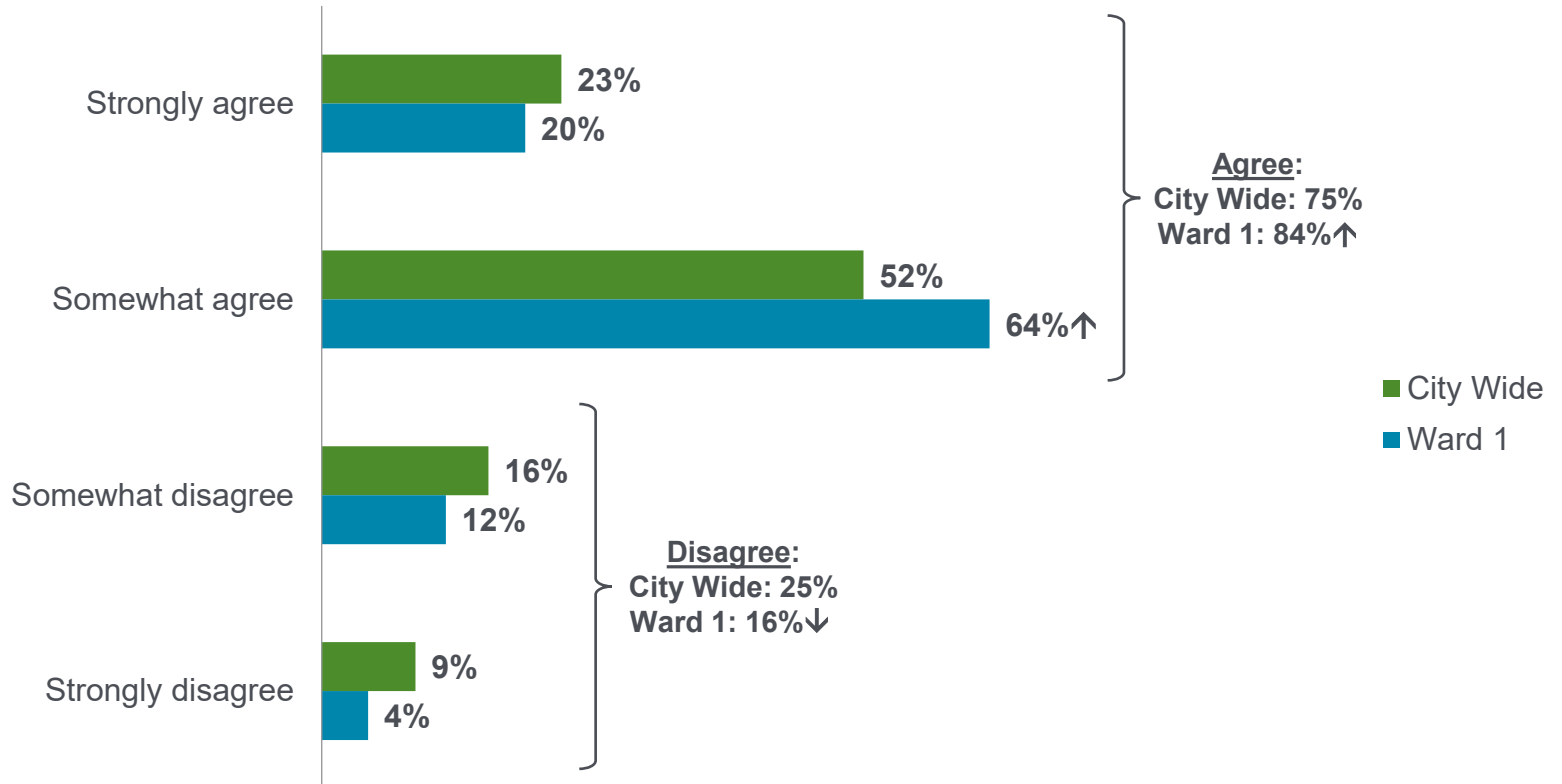

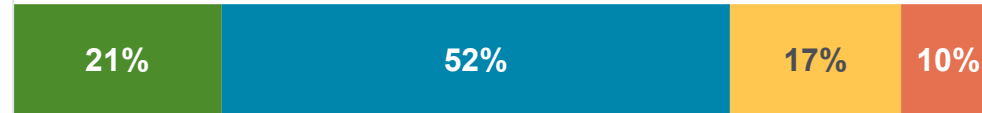

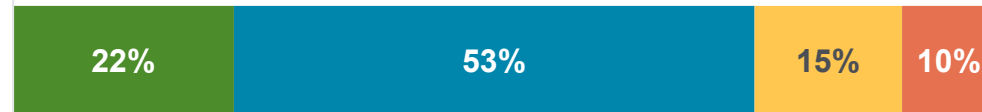

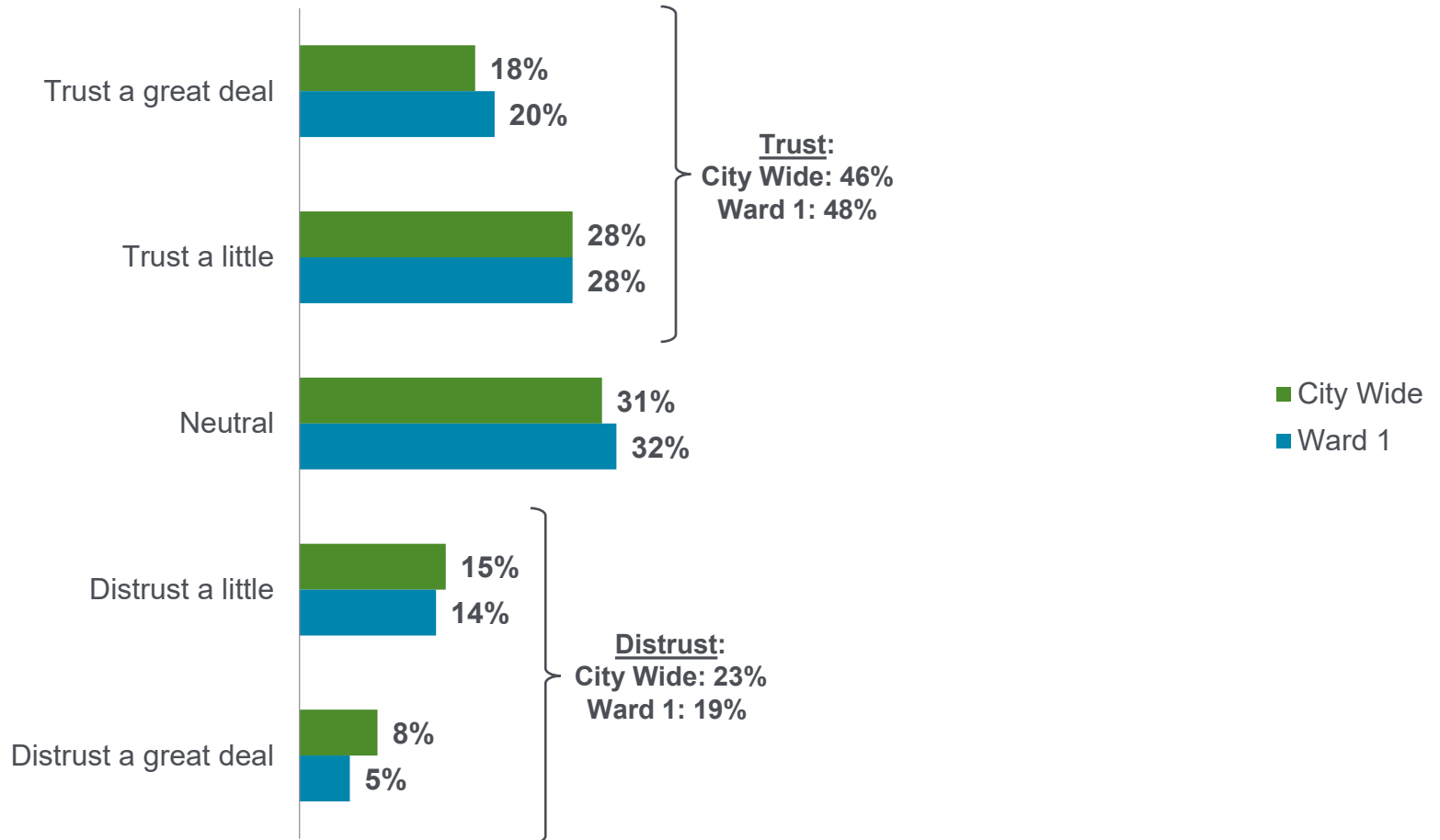

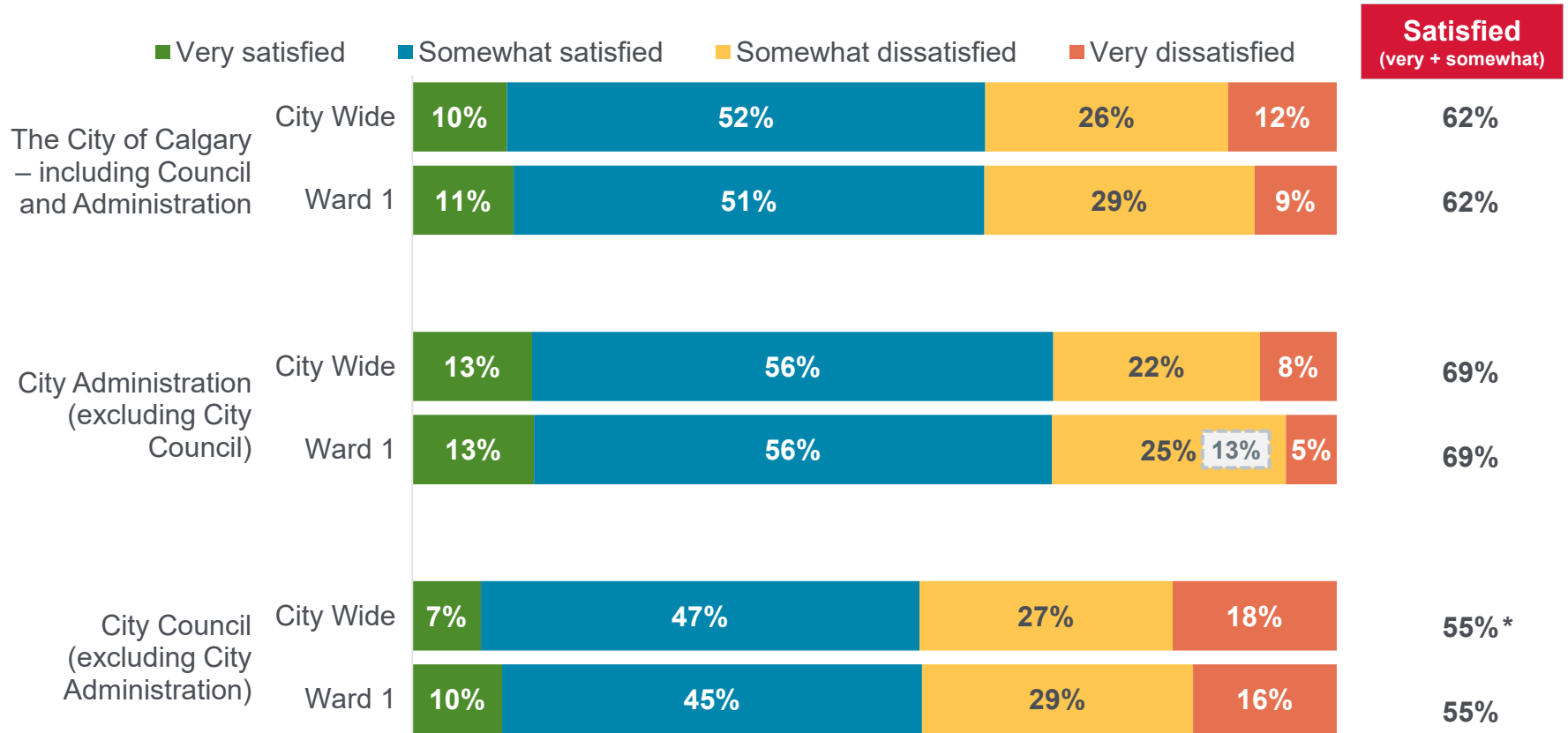

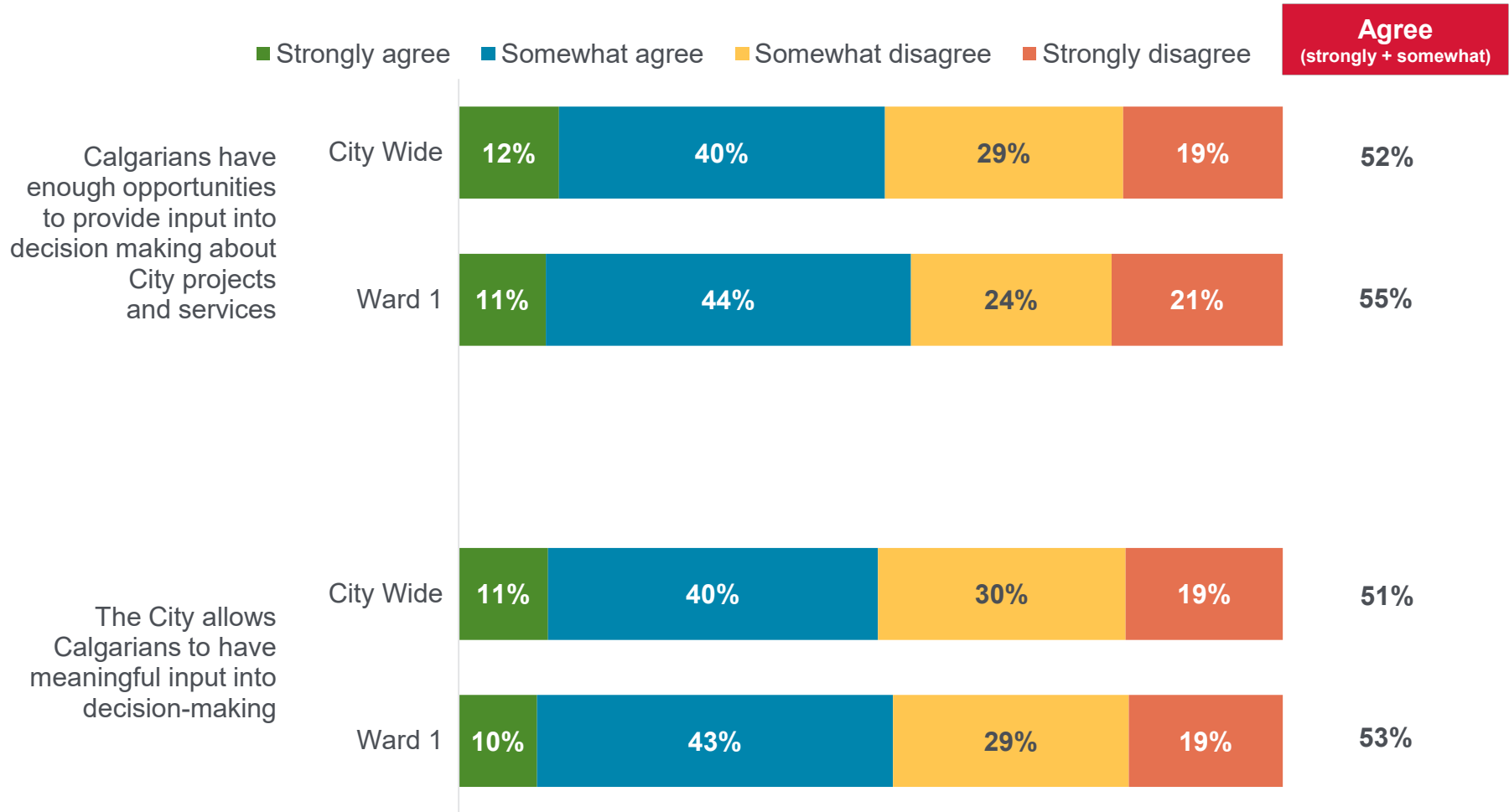

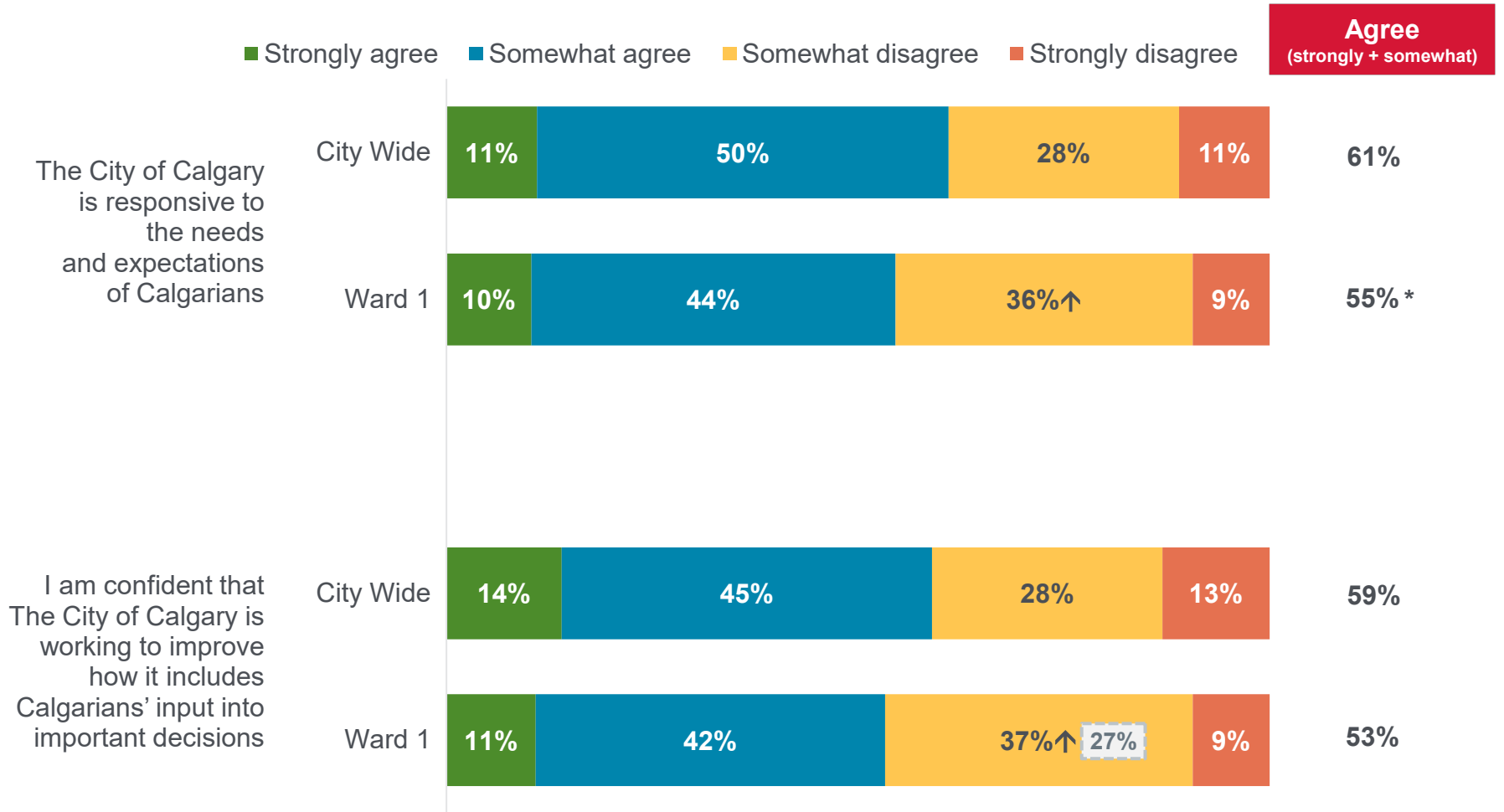

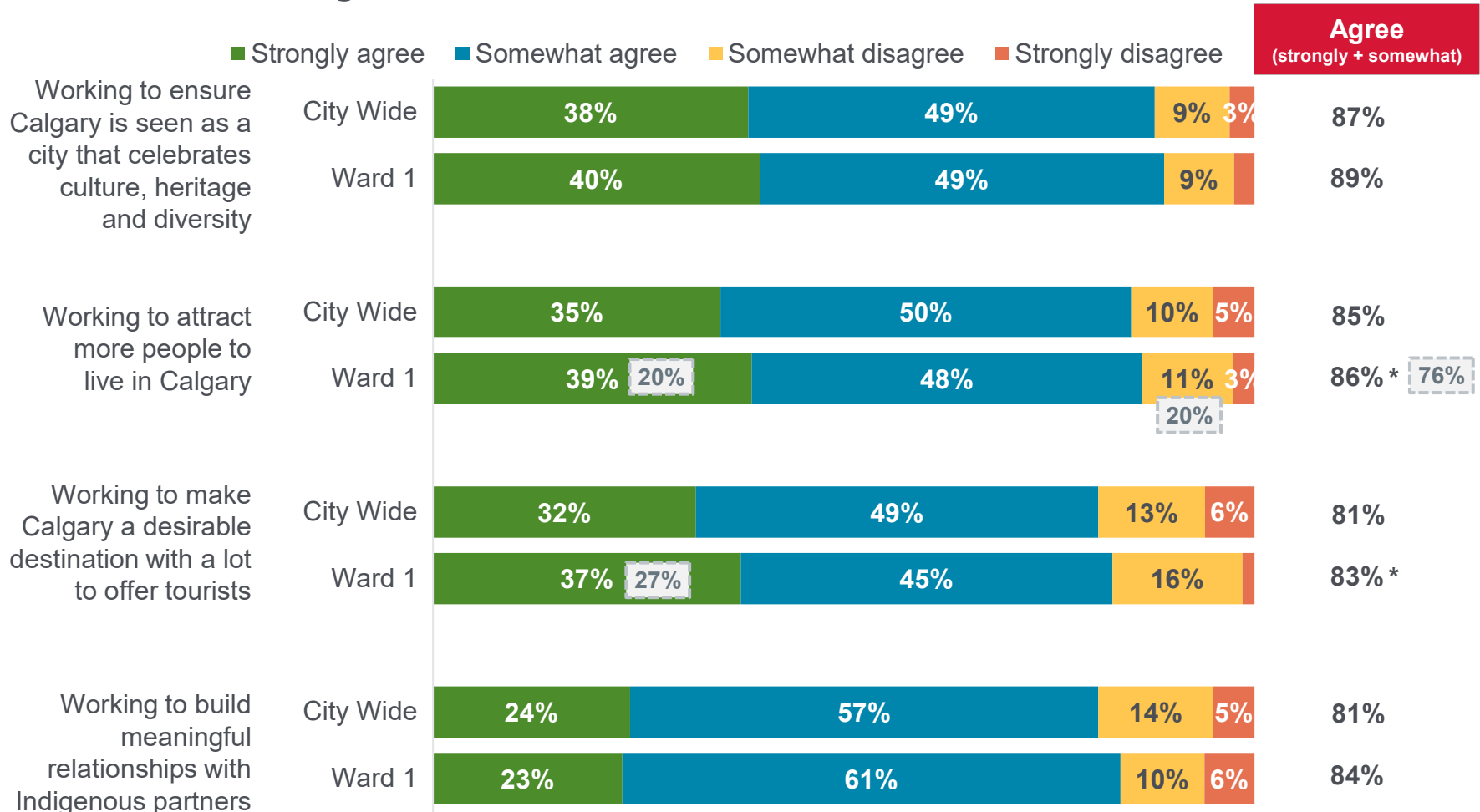

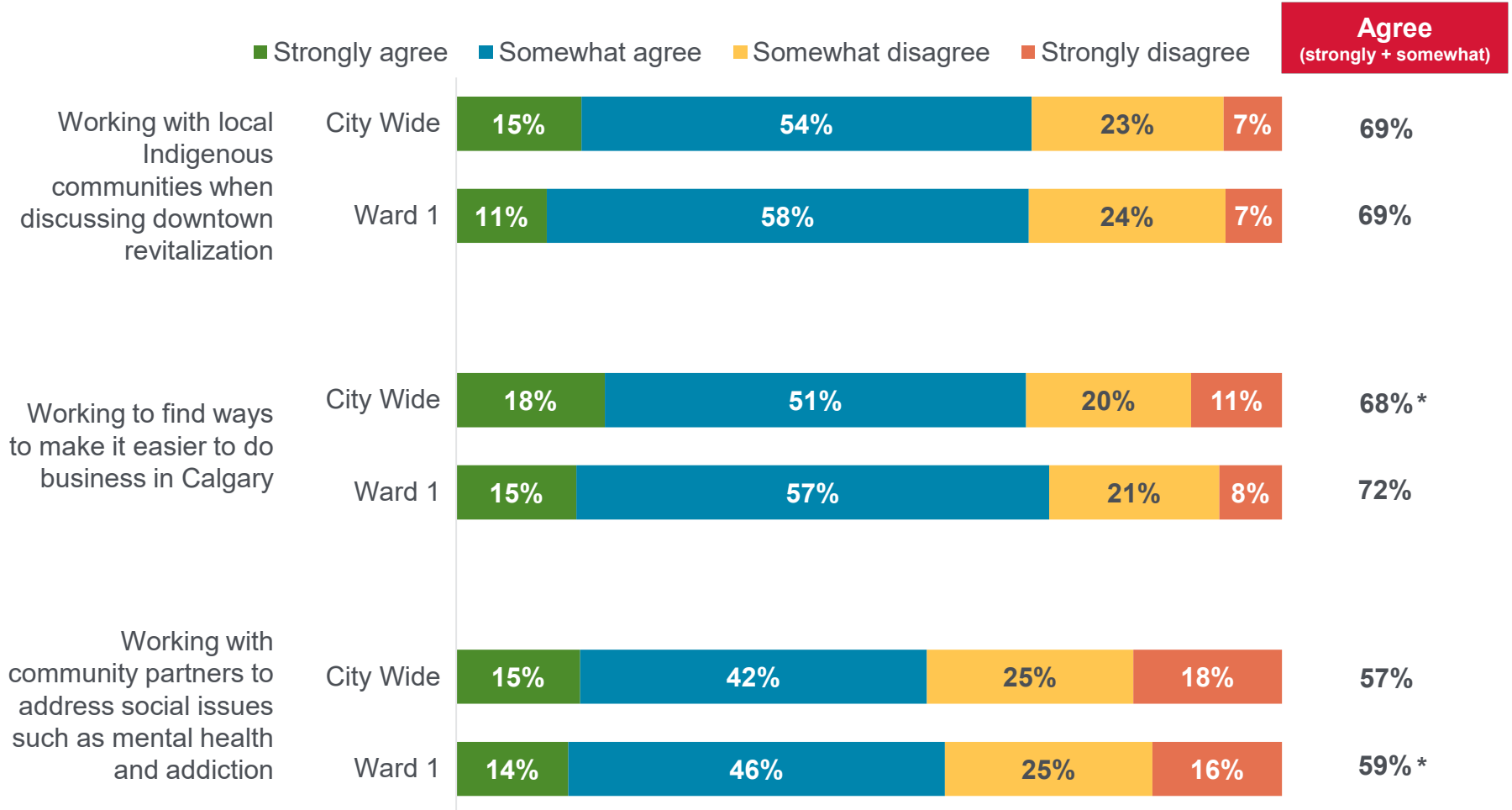

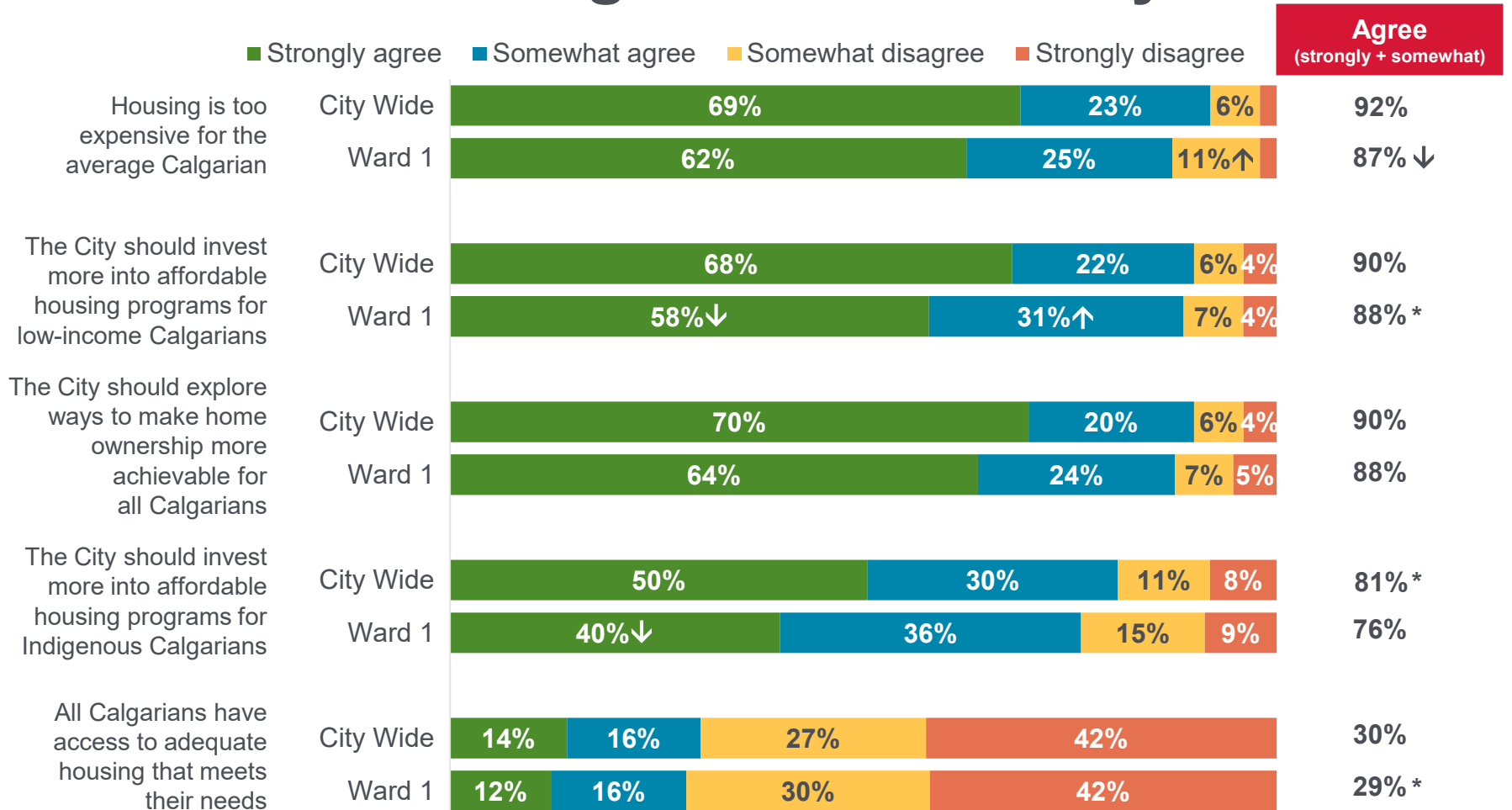

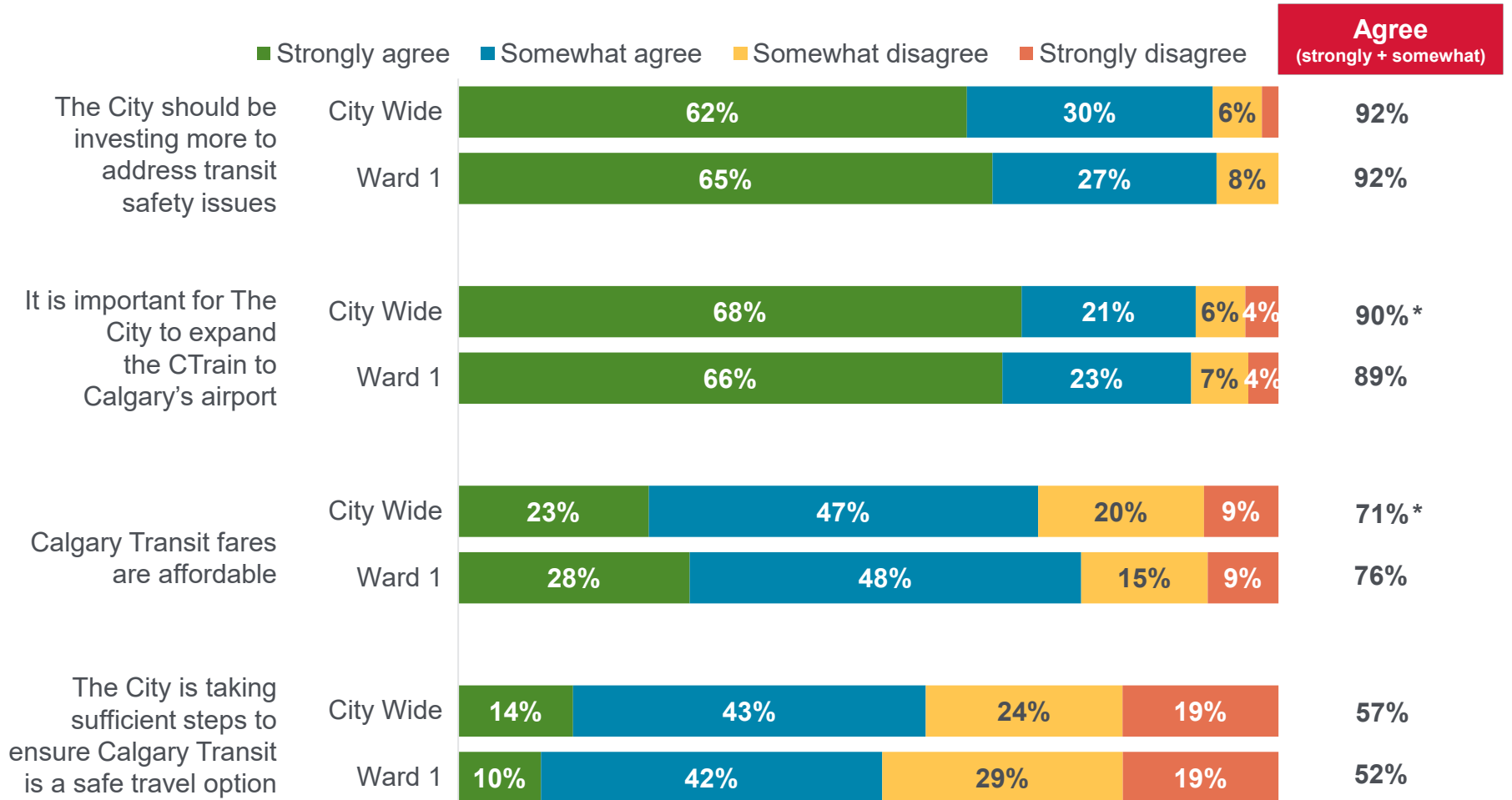

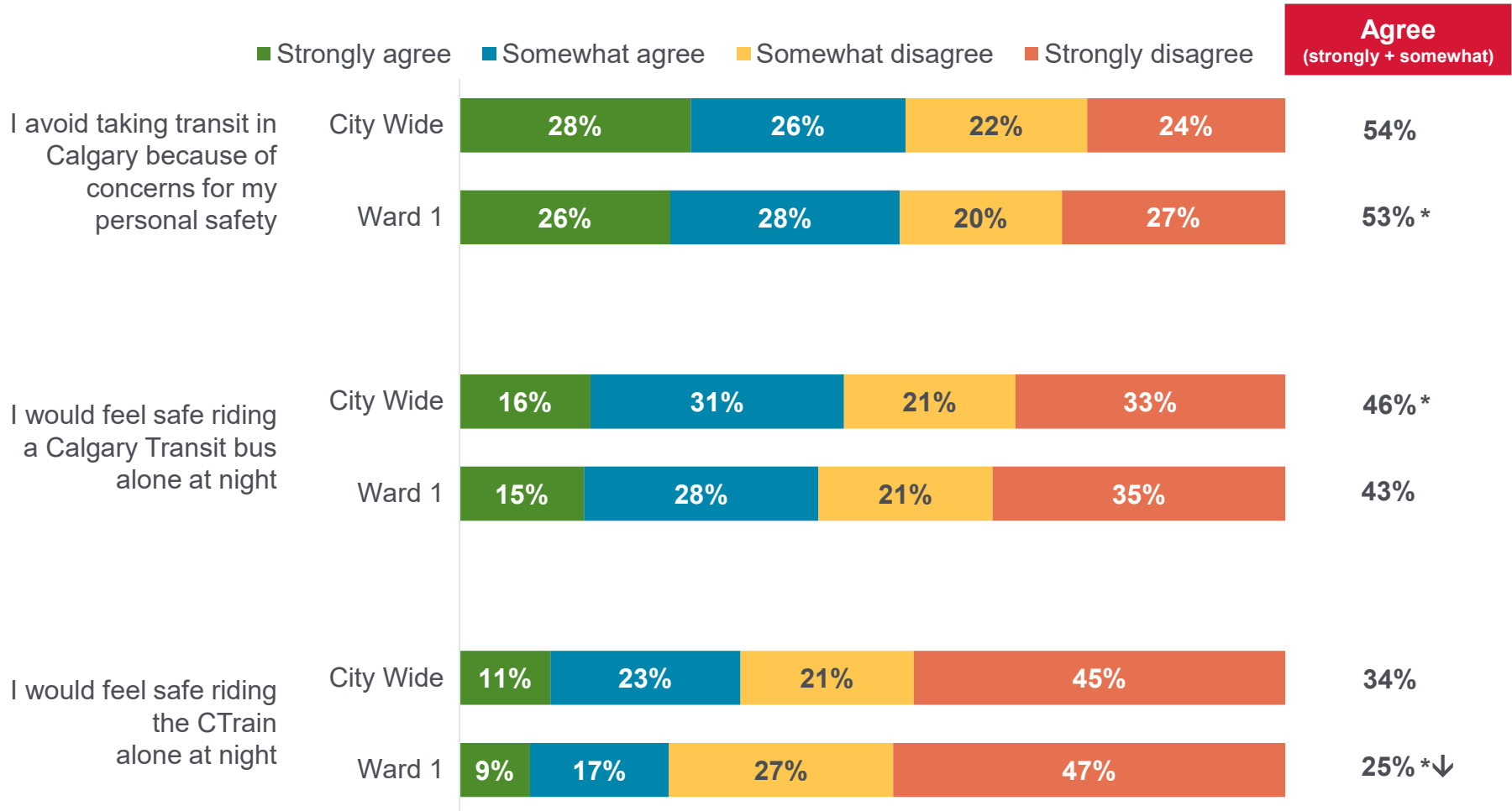

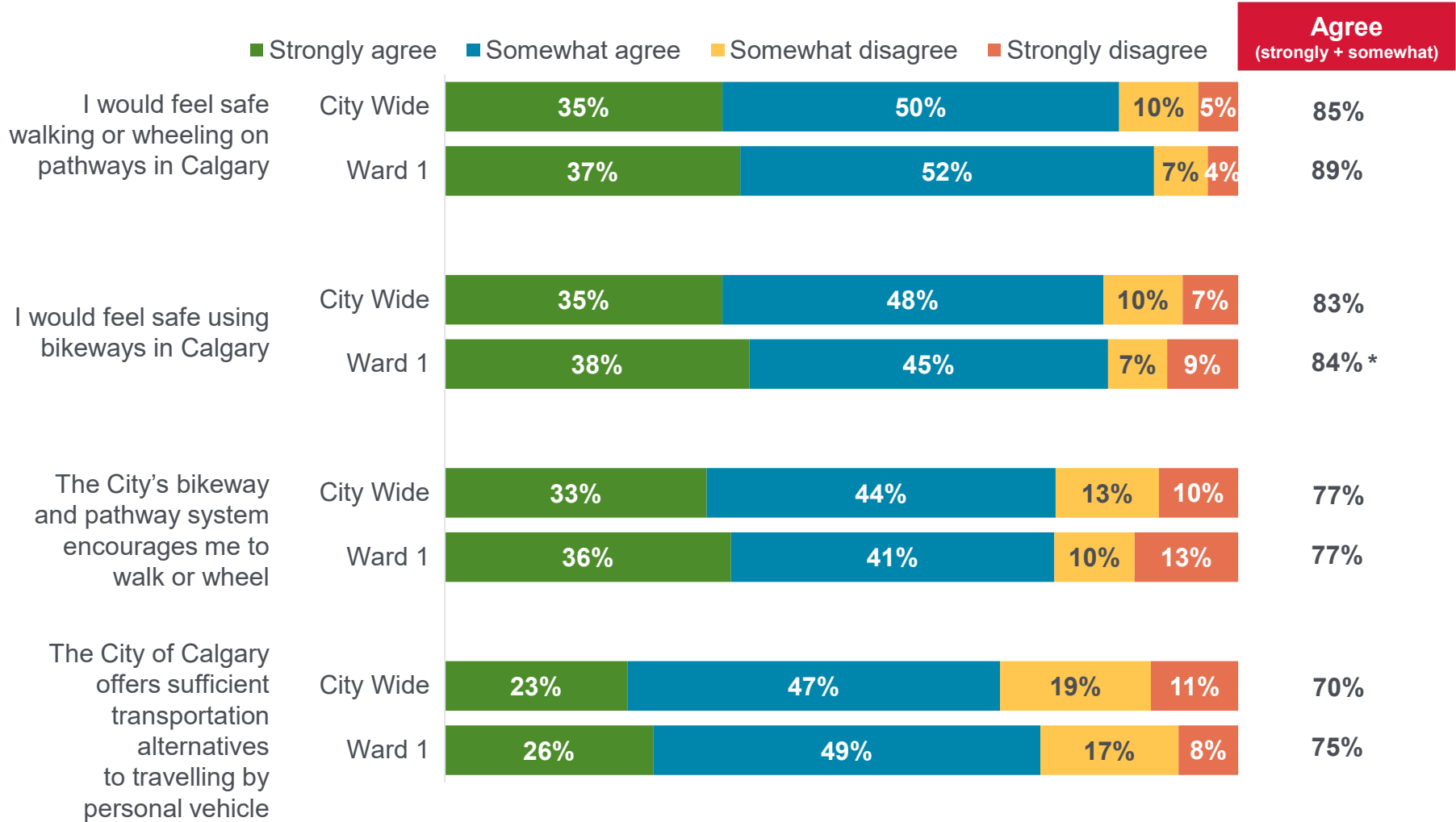

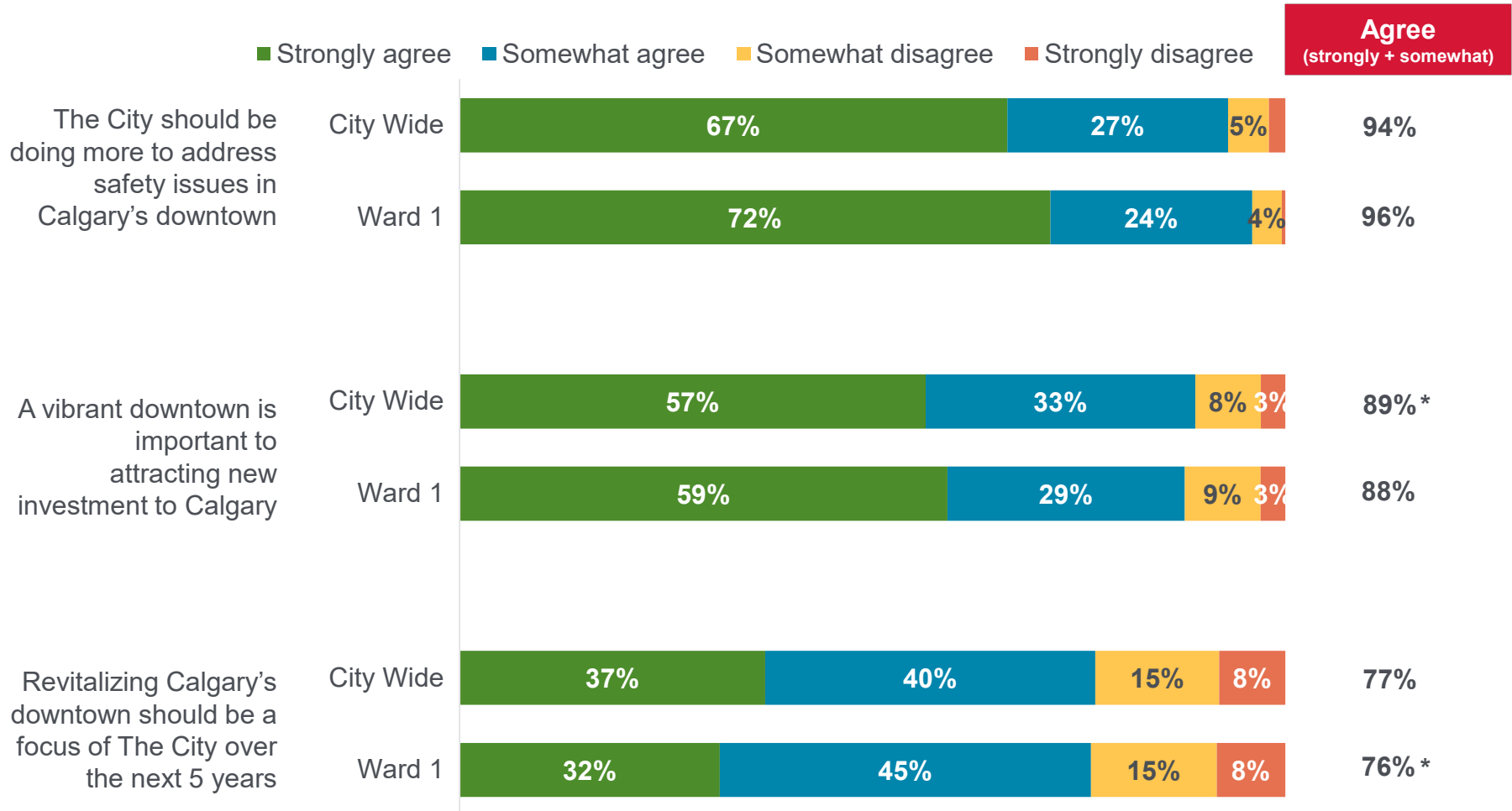

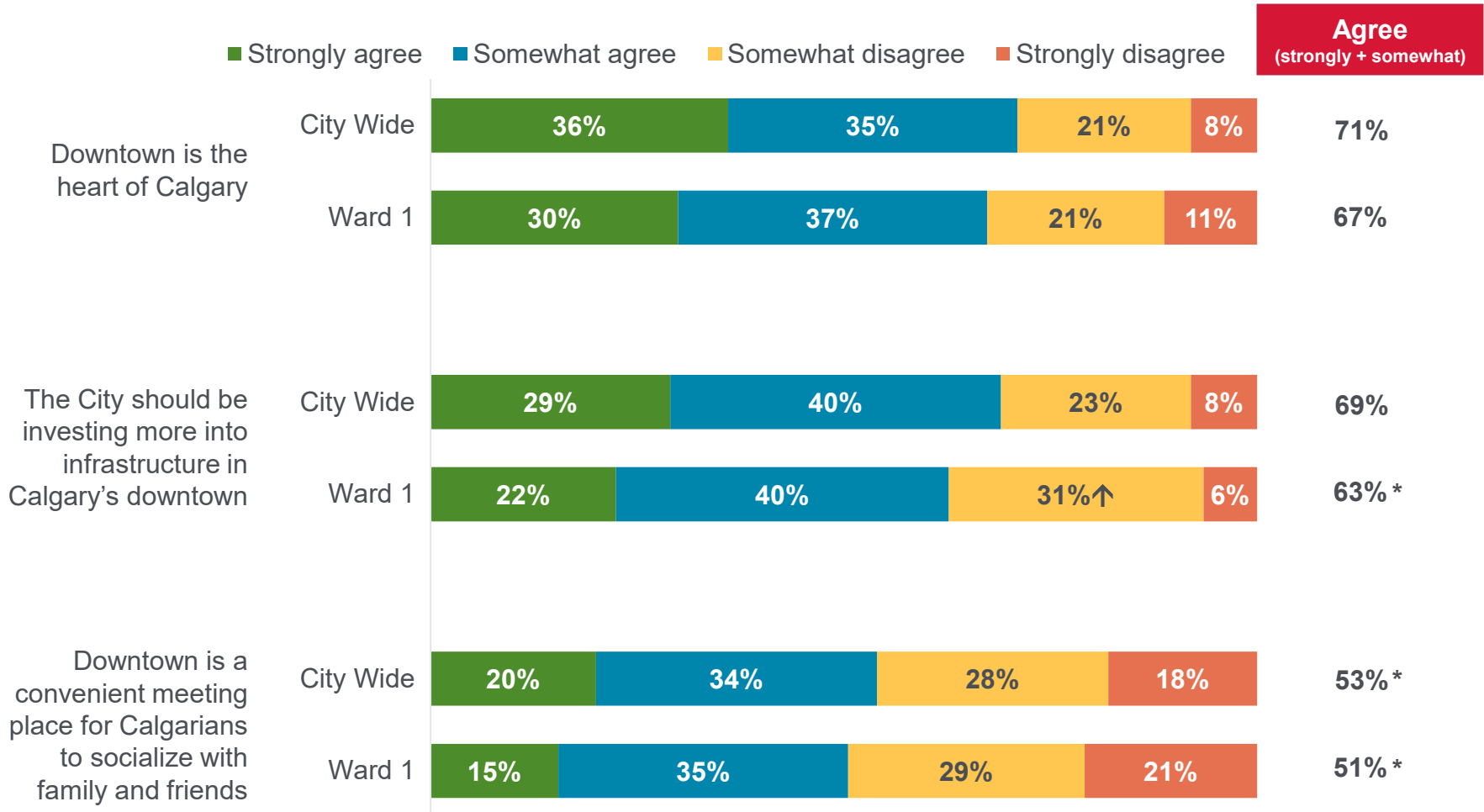
