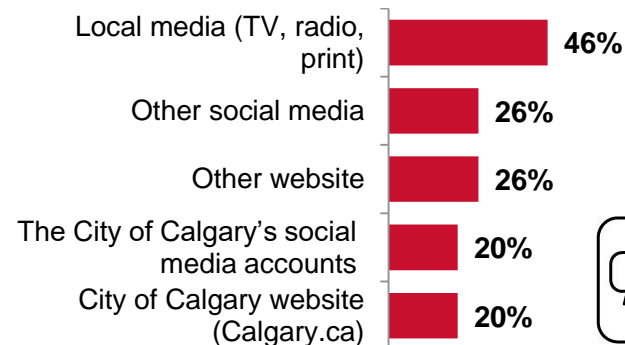

Background & Methodology

Background

To help support City decisions, The City of Calgary surveys citizens about their opinions, preferences and attitudes. To help in “making life better every day” for Calgarians, The City conducts the Citizen Perspectives Survey at various intervals through the year.

Calgary Recreation, Arts & Culture is creating a Winter City Strategy for The City. They identified a need to gather opinions from citizens to inform the development of the strategy and to gain insight regarding citizens’ behaviors, expectations, and preferences related to winter activities. In late 2020, The City’s Corporate Research Team conducted an online survey with Citizens’ View panelists. This survey is a reiteration and extension of the previously conducted survey with a statistically representative sample of Calgarians.

Methodology

The survey was conducted by Leger from March 3-12, 2021 with 500 Calgarians via telephone using random digit dialing (RDD). The survey was conducted using numbers from both landlines (35%) and cell phones (65%) to obtain a random and statistically representative sample of Calgarians. The survey averaged 15 minutes in duration. The margin of error (MOE) for the total sample of $n=500$ is ± 4.38 percentage points, 19 times out of 20.

To ensure the data was gathered from a representative group of Calgarians, sample quotas were set by age, gender, and city quadrant of the general population aged 18 and older. Data were then weighted to the 2016 Civic Census for age and gender.

Key Findings



Key Findings

A large majority of Calgarians participate in outdoor winter activities.

- Households with children are more likely to often participate in outdoor winter activities (45% among households with children vs. 29% among households without children). Females are more likely to indicate that they 'rarely' or 'never' participate in winter activities compared to males (30% vs. 21%).
- Walking or running, ice skating outdoors, and downhill skiing or snowboarding represent the most common types of outdoor winter activities.
- Slightly more than one half of survey respondents indicated that COVID-19 negatively impacted their participation in outdoor winter activities. This negative impact was higher among those who are not satisfied with outdoor winter amenities provided by The City as compared to those who are satisfied (69% vs. 53%).
- When asked about what would make Calgarians more likely to participate in outdoor winter activities, survey respondents' mentions include COVID-related measures, more advertising/awareness, and weather-related measures. Notably, a sizeable minority (18%) say that there is nothing that would make them more likely to participate in outdoor winter activities.
 - This percentage is higher among those who never participate in outdoor winter activities (37% vs. 20% who 'often' participate & 13% who 'sometimes' or 'rarely' participate).
- Suggestions for making Calgary a better winter city include more snow and ice clearing on sidewalks/pathways, more affordable or free activities, and more advertising.
 - Households with a senior as well as households with a person who has a disability are more likely to say that more affordable or free activities would make Calgary a better winter city (13% households with a senior vs. 5% households without a senior; 11% households with a person who has a disability vs. 4% households without a person who has a disability).

Key Findings – cont'd

A large majority are satisfied with The City's winter amenities.

- Calgarians who participate in winter activities 'often' or 'sometimes' are more likely to be satisfied with The City's outdoor winter amenities than Calgarians who participate less frequently in outdoor winter activities (86% participate 'often' & 83% participate 'sometimes' vs. 72% participate 'rarely' or 'never').

Most Calgarians think that it is important for The City to offer winter amenities and events or performances.

- Overall, a vast majority of Calgarians say that it is important for The City to offer sport, recreation, and leisure amenities that are free to use and events or performances that are free to attend.
 - More females than males say that it is important to offer free amenities (98% vs. 90%). Similarly, females are more likely than males to say that it is important to offer events and performances that are free to attend (96% vs. 82%).
 - Those who 'never' participate in outdoor winter activities are less likely to say that it is important to offer free amenities (79% 'never' participate vs. 94% participate 'often' & 97% participate 'sometimes' or 'rarely'). Similarly, survey participants who 'never' participate in winter activities are less likely to say that it is important for The City to offer events or performances that are free to attend (77% 'never' participate vs. 89% participate 'often' & 92% participate 'sometimes' or 'rarely').
- A large majority of Calgarians also say it is important for The City to offer amenities and events that have a cost, although fewer Calgarians say that it is important as compared to free amenities and events.

Key Findings – cont'd

When thinking about outdoor winter activities, most Calgarians think of ice skating followed by cross country skiing and downhill/Alpine skiing or snowboarding.

- When asked about recalling various outdoor winter activities, eight-in-ten recall outdoor skating rinks and the skating rink at Olympic plaza. Interestingly, households without children are more likely to recall the skating rink at Olympic Plaza than households with children (83% vs. 71%).
 - Recall for trails for cross-country skiing and snowshoeing, and winter firepits in City parks is also strong with more than one-half Calgarians recalling these two activities.
 - However, recall for Chinook Blast and ice bikes is modest with only one-in-three saying that they recall these activities.
 - Those who participate in outdoor winter activities generally have higher levels of recall as compared to those Calgarians who 'never' participate in outdoor winter activities.

Calgarians prefer to get information about events happening in Calgary via local media or social media/ online options.

- There are generational differences in Calgarians' preferred information channels.
 - Those aged 55+ are more likely to prefer local media (e.g., TV, radio, print) to receive information about events happening in Calgary as compared to other age groups (64% 55+ years old vs. 28% 18-34 years old & 47% 35-54 years old).
 - Older Calgarians are less likely to prefer social media (11% 55+ vs. 39% 18-34 & 27% 35-54) or The City's social media (7% 55+ vs. 28% 18-34 & 24% 35-54) channels as sources of information about events happening in Calgary.

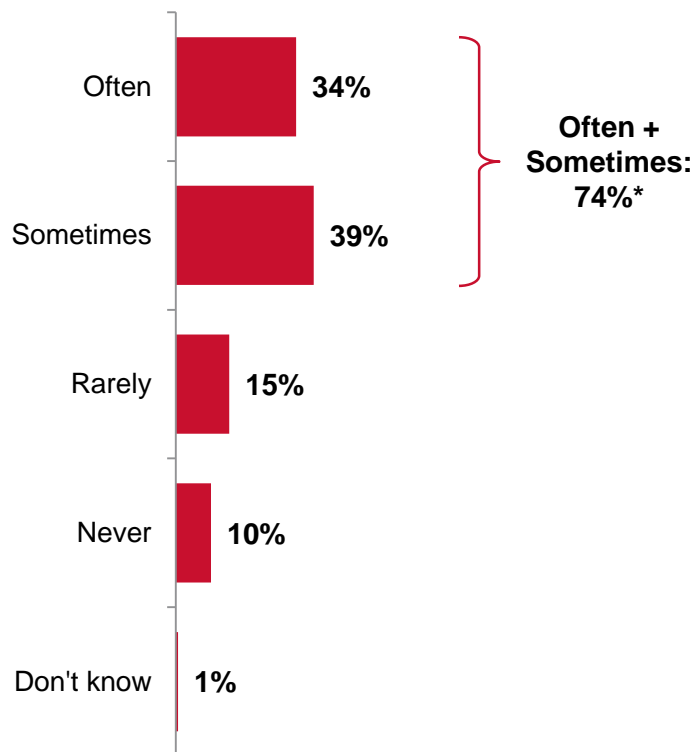
Participation in Winter Activities

Frequency of Participation in Outdoor Winter Activities



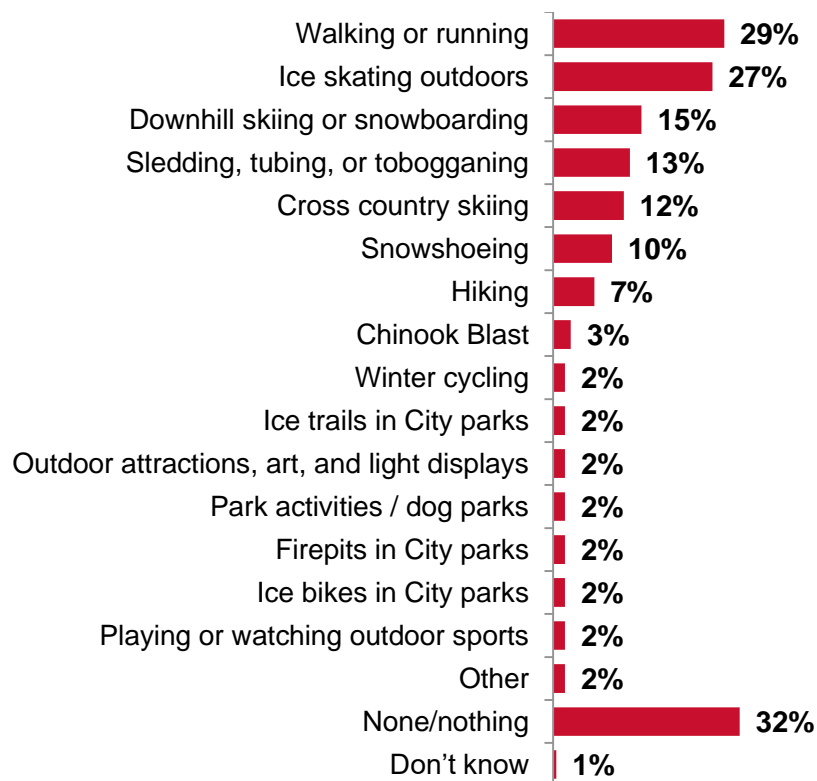

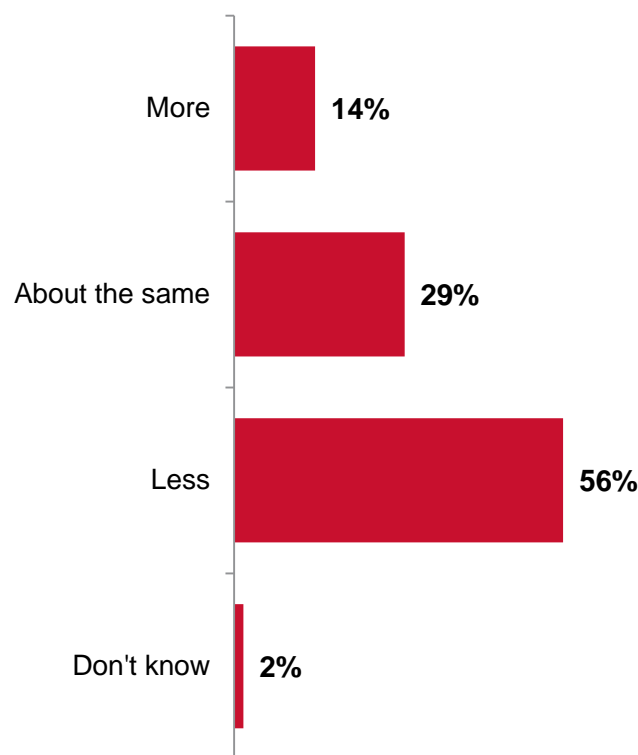

Impact of COVID-19 on Participation

When asked about the impact of COVID-19 on participation in outdoor winter activities, more than half indicated that they participate less in outdoor winter activities as compared to a typical winter. Only slightly more than one-in-ten participate more in outdoor winter activities.

Impact of COVID-19 on Participation in Outdoor Winter Activities



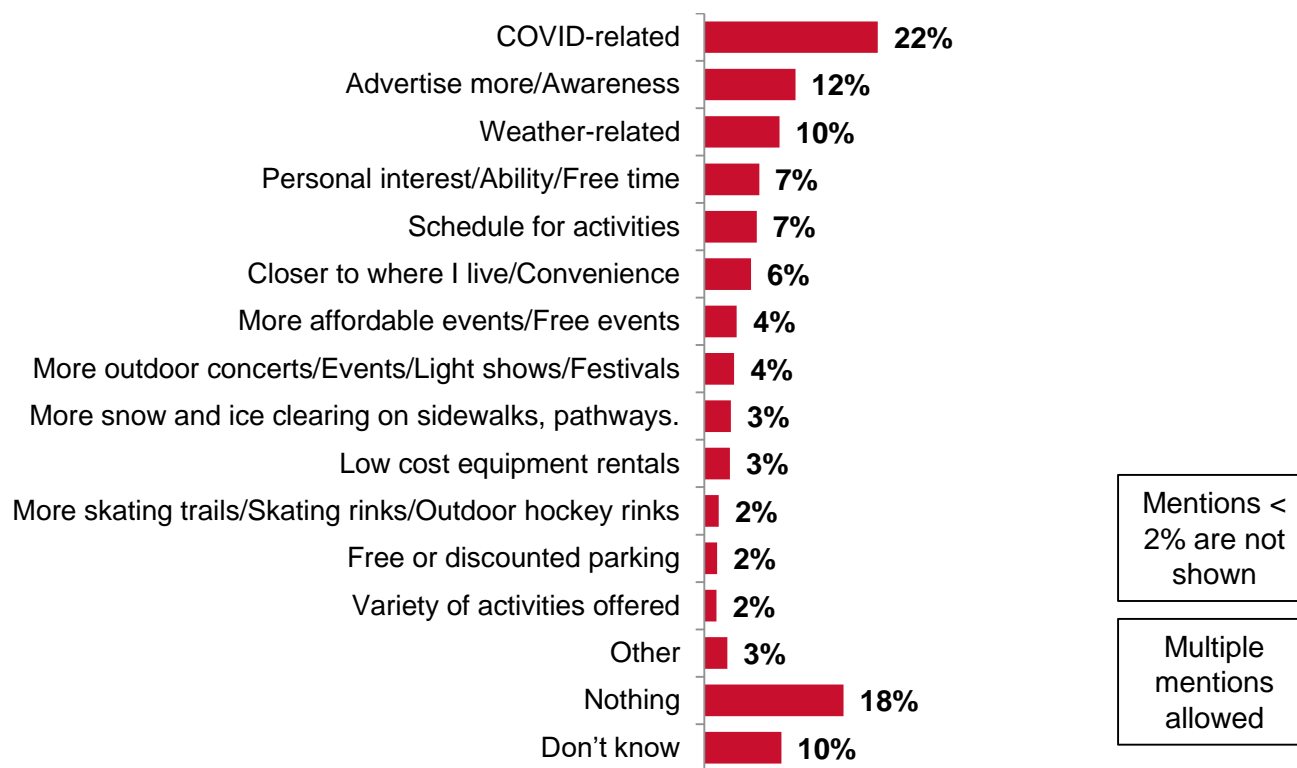

How to Encourage Participation

Primary motivators of participation in outdoor winter activities include COVID-related measures or the end of COVID, more advertising/awareness, and weather-related issues. Notably, a sizeable minority indicate that nothing would make them more likely to participate in more outdoor winter activities.

Motivators of Outdoor Winter Activities Participation



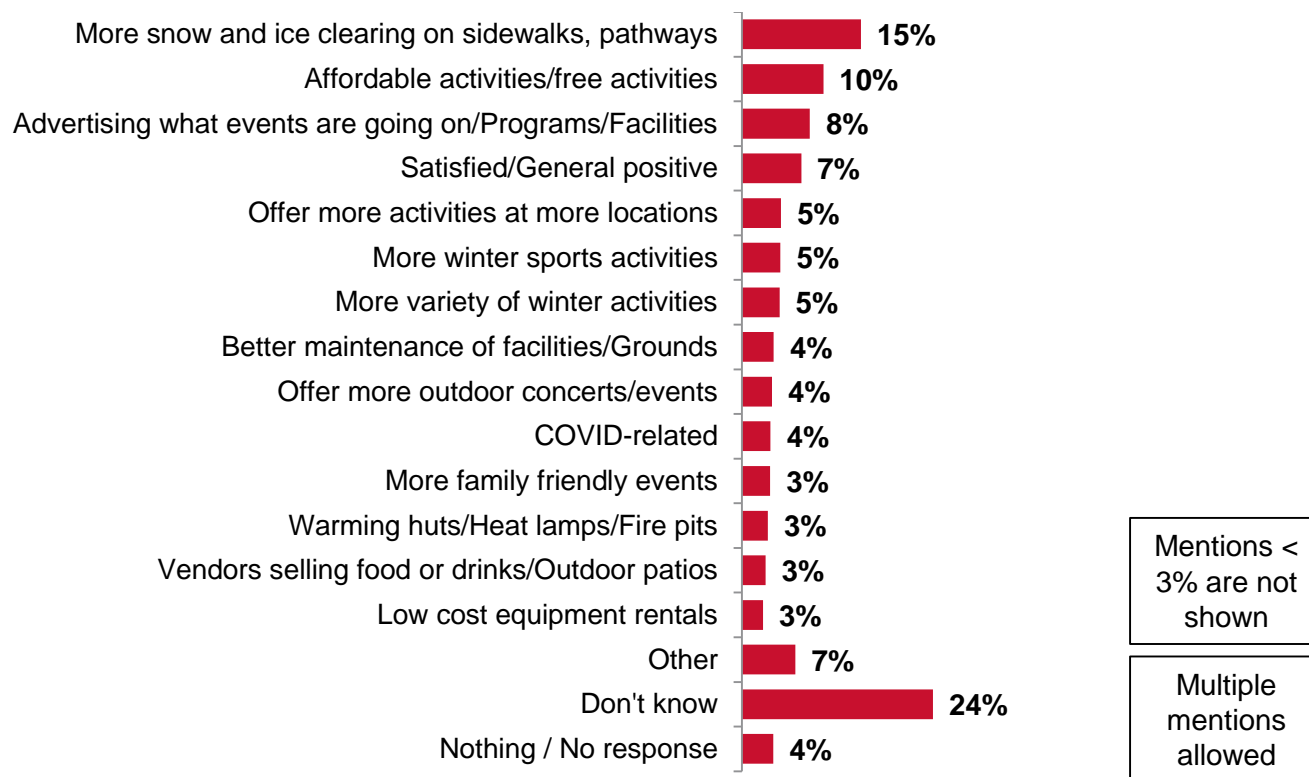

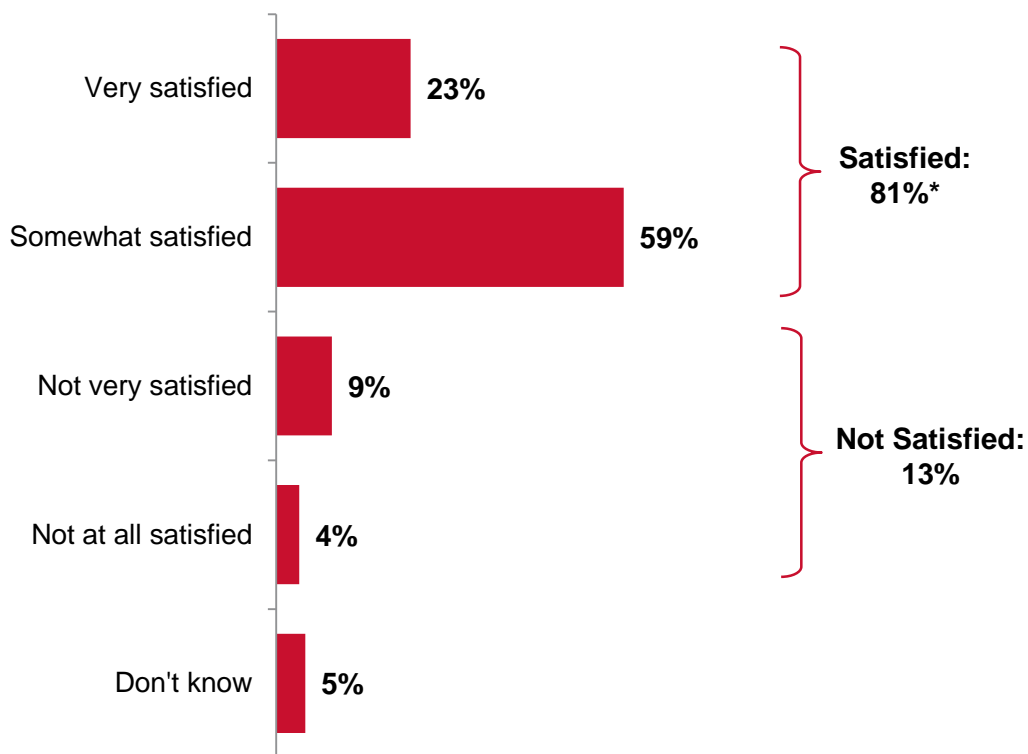
Importance and Satisfaction

Satisfaction With Outdoor Winter Amenities



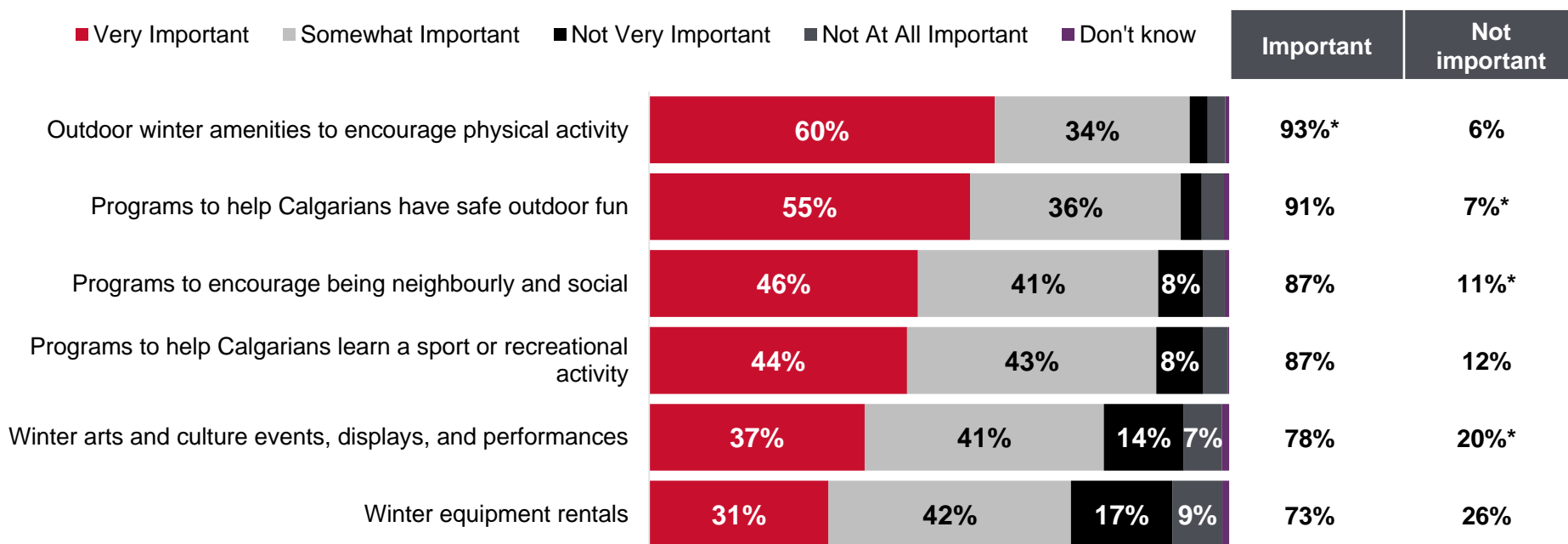

Importance of Offering Winter Activities & Events

Overall, survey respondents believe that it is important for The City to offer winter activities and events. A large majority say it is important for The City to offer outdoor winter amenities to encourage physical activity and programs to help Calgarians have safe outdoor fun. However, a relatively smaller proportion of survey respondents say that it is important for The City to offer winter equipment rentals.

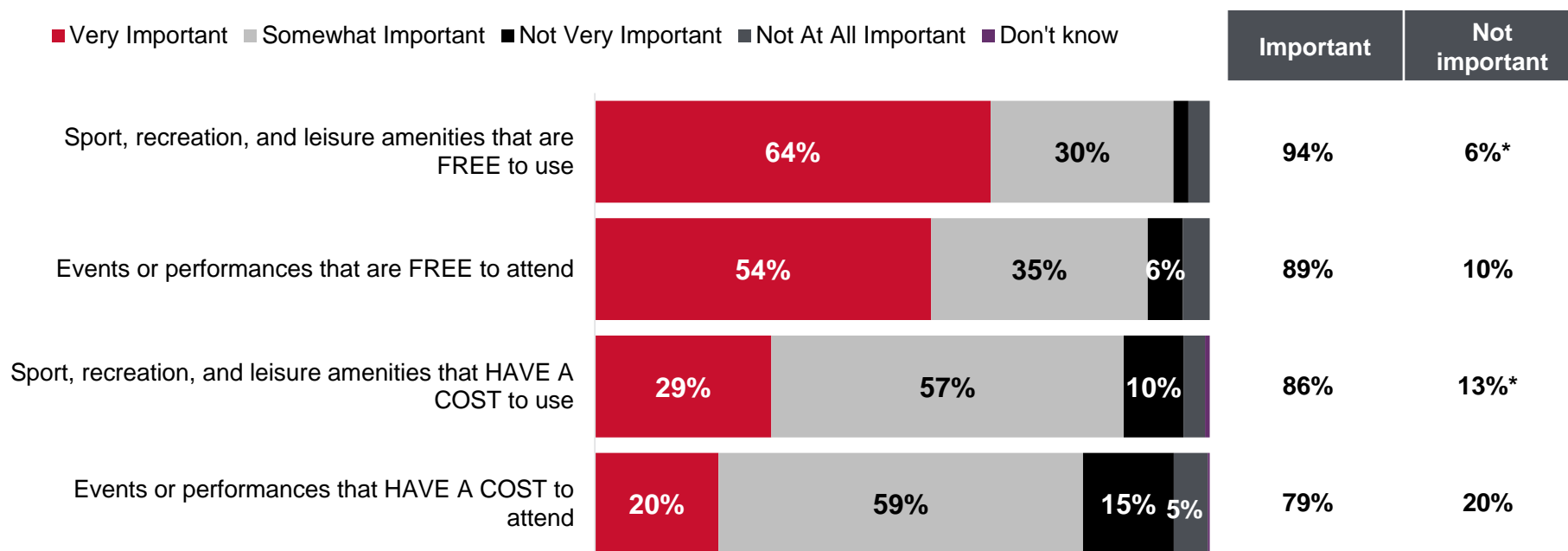

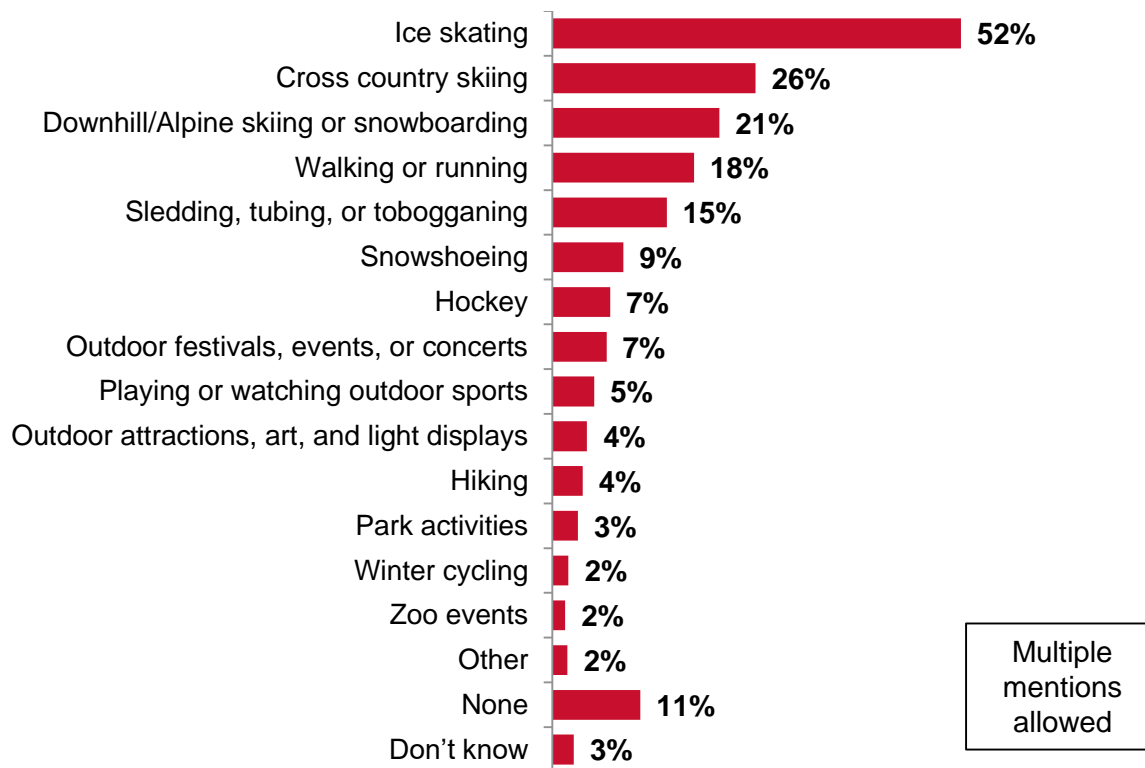

Recall of Winter Activities & Events

Recall for outdoor skating rinks and the skating rink at Olympic Plaza is strong. A majority also recall trails for cross-country skiing and snowshoeing, and winter fire pits. However, recall with City-maintained toboggan or sled hills, Chinook Blast, and ice bikes is lower with only one-in-three Calgarians recalling these activities.

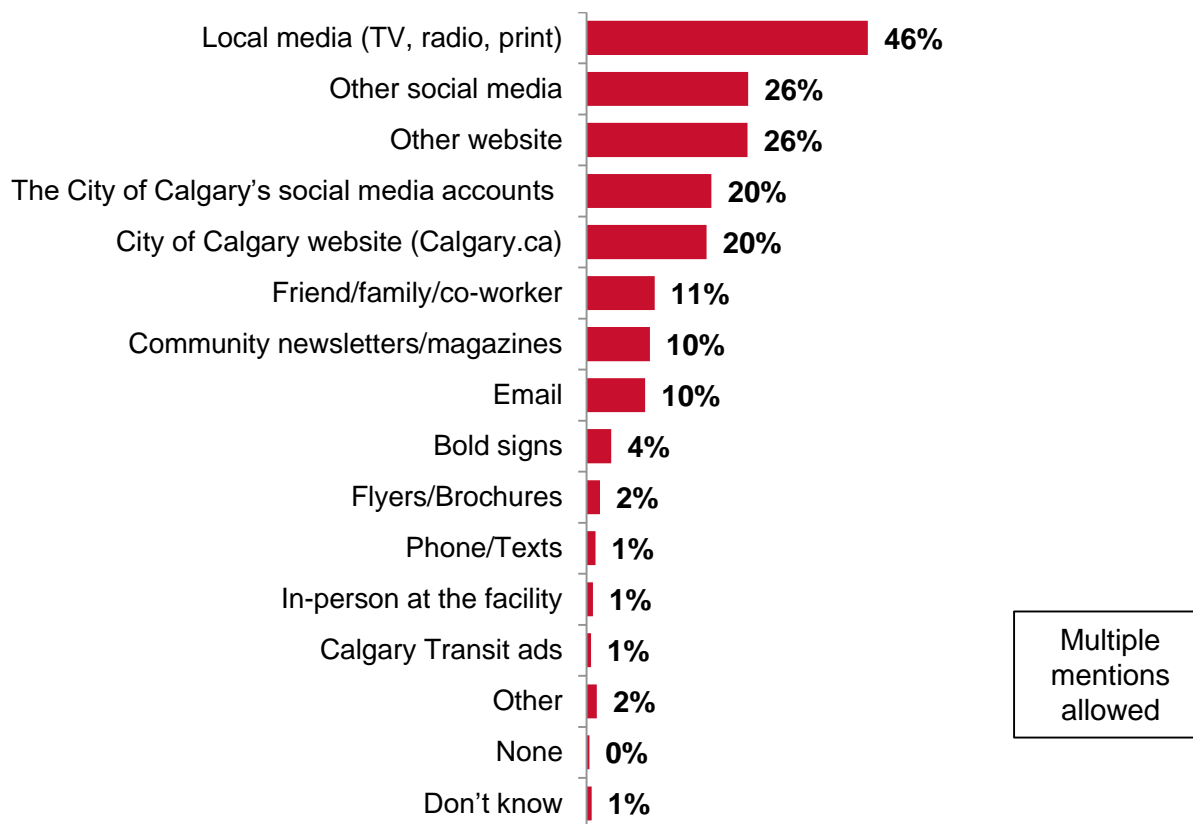

Preferred Ways to Get Information About Events Happening in Calgary



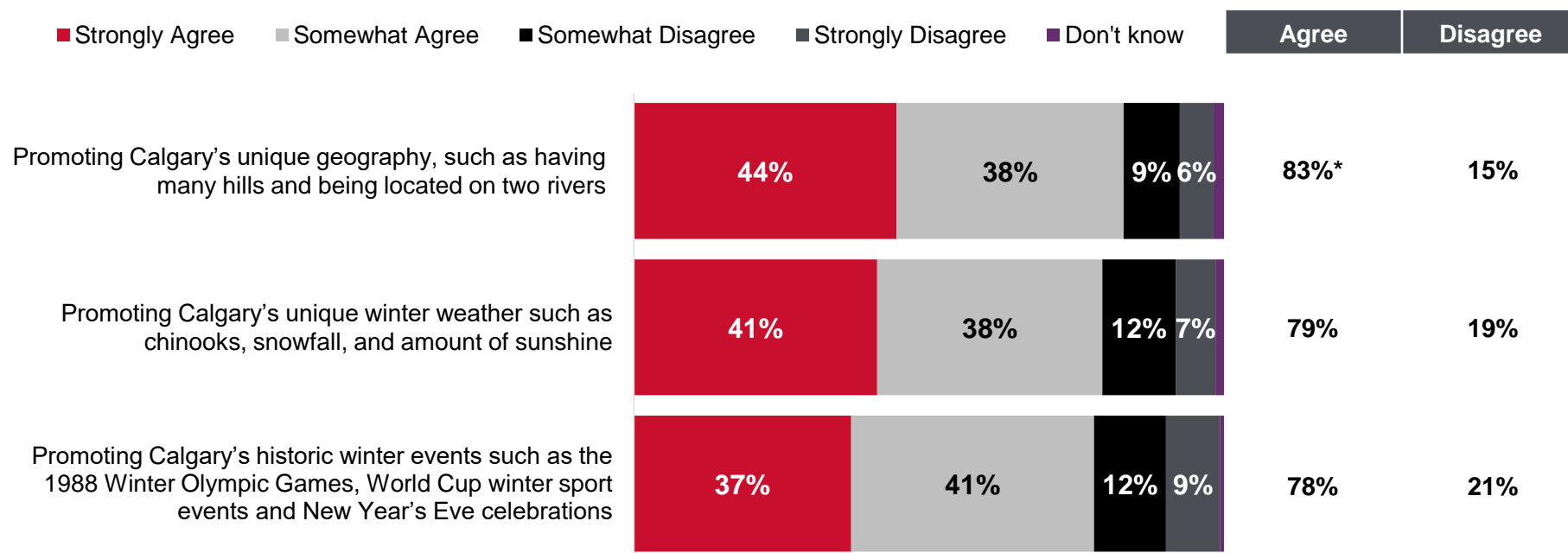

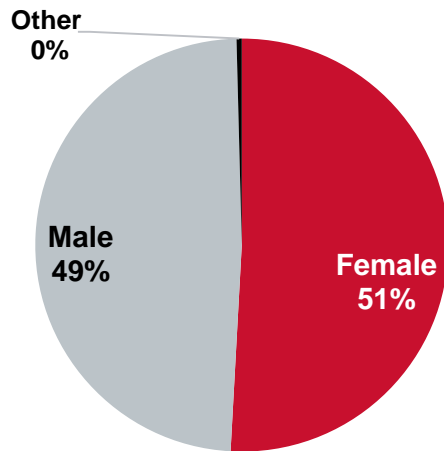

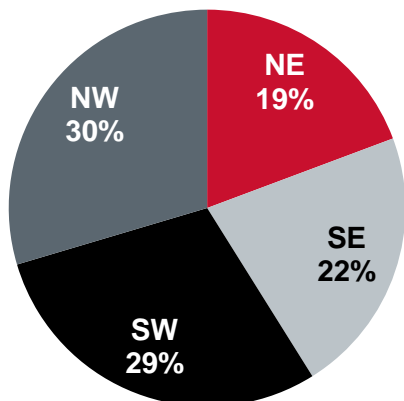

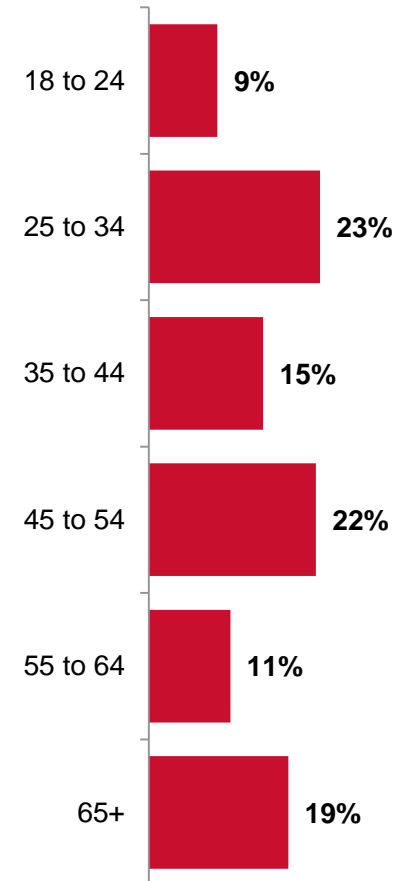


Quadrant of Residence

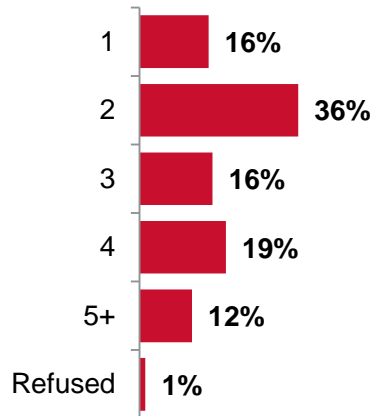

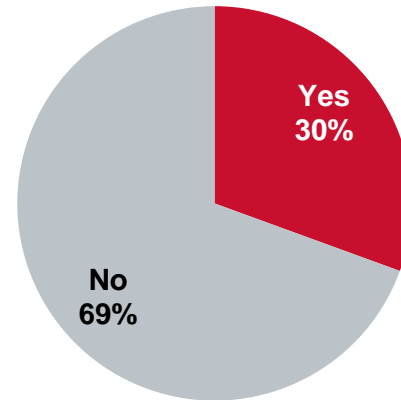

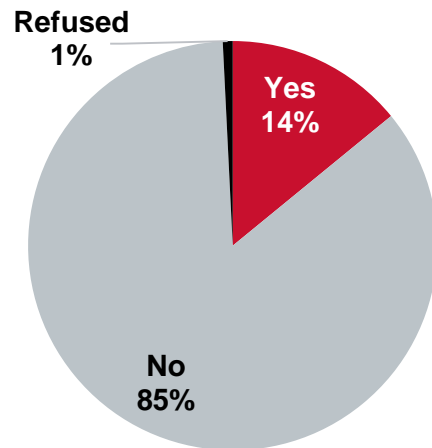
Household Size



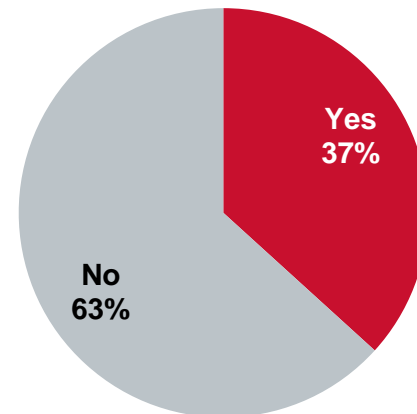
Children Under the Age of 18 in the Household

Senior (aged 65+ years) in the Household

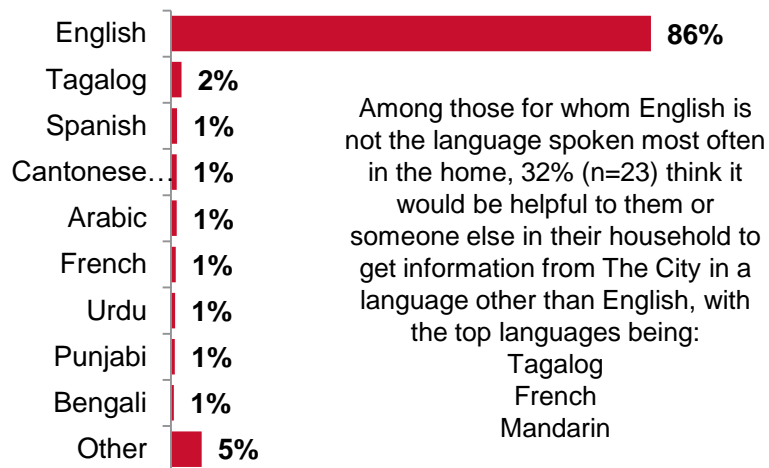

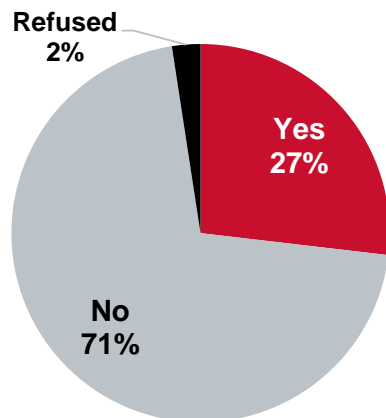

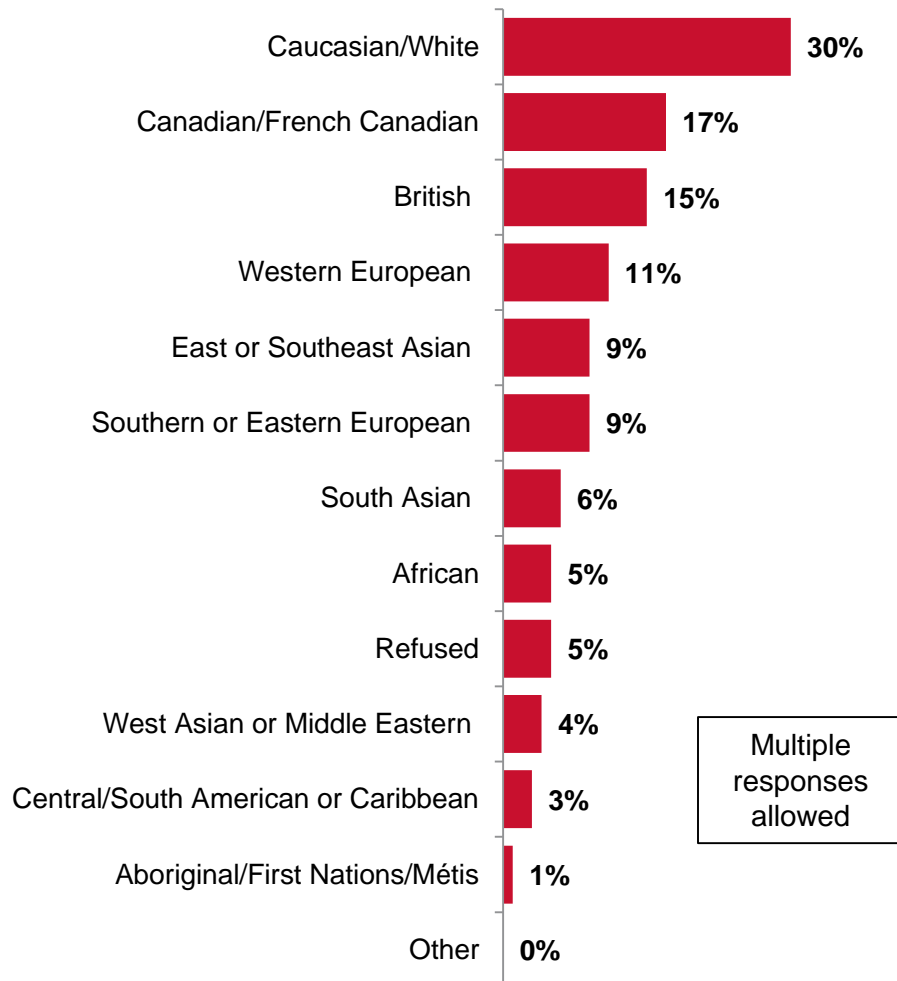
Language Spoken Most in the Home
