Background & Methodology

Background

On behalf of Elections Calgary, a survey on the topic of the October 2021 election was fielded. The survey measured awareness of the upcoming election, eligibility to vote, and intention to vote and by which method.

Methodology

An online survey was conducted with Citizens' View panelists. Citizens' View is an online panel that encourages citizens to participate in shaping City of Calgary programs and services through surveys, discussions, and engagement activities.

The survey was conducted April 27 – May 6, 2021 and was sent to all 2,822 panelists, with 1,132 completing the survey (a 40% completion rate).

NOTE: These survey findings are not considered statistically representative of all Calgarians. Due to the composition of the group of panelists who completed the survey, results should be regarded as directional and should not be projected to the larger population without research with a representative sample of citizens.

Compared to the overall population of Calgary, respondents to this survey tend to be older and are not quite aligned with population quadrant of residence proportions.

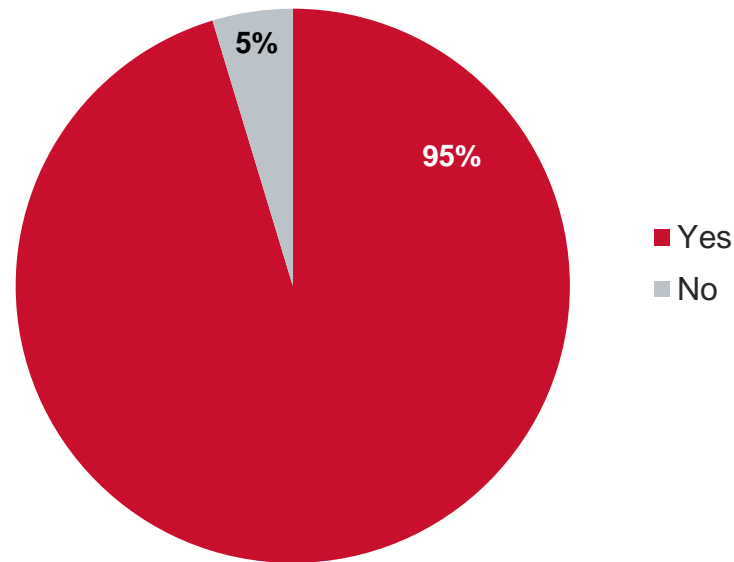
Detailed Results



Awareness of Upcoming Election

Awareness of the upcoming Calgary General Election is quite strong among respondents, with only 5% who were unaware.

As you may know, there will be a Calgary General Election on October 18, 2021. Calgary voters will vote to elect their Mayor, Councillors, and School Board Trustees.

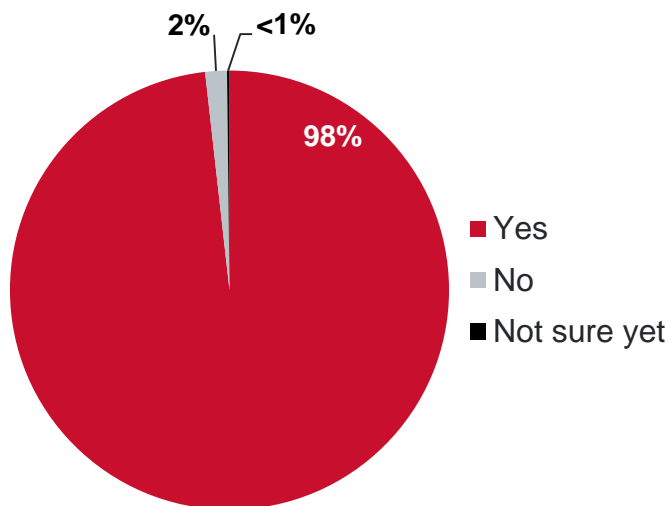
Before today, were you aware of the upcoming Calgary General Election?

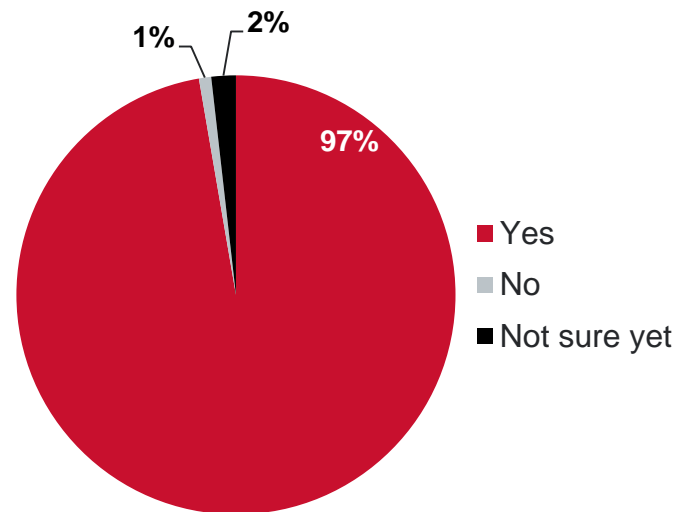
Eligibility and Intention to Vote

Nearly all respondents will be eligible to vote in the upcoming election, and almost as many expect that they will vote.

Reasons For Not Intending to Vote

Among the very small number of respondents who do not expect they will vote in the upcoming election, there were several reasons provided, which include some statements of apathy or negativity, but some that indicate that more information is needed to make this decision.

Reasons
I don't feel like my vote will make a difference
I'm not interested
I need more information
I have health or accessibility limitations
Don't care about the city enough to waste my time in voting.
All elections are irrelevant. Corruption and ignorance are rampant.

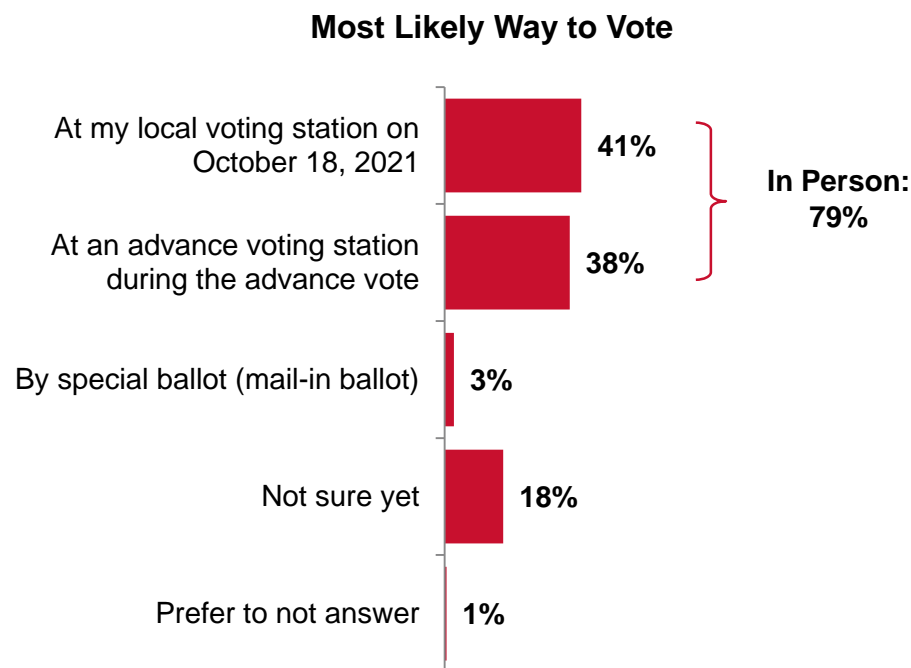

Most Likely Way to Vote

About two in five respondents expect they will vote in person at their local voting station on Election Day, and about as many expect to vote at an advance voting station during the advance vote, while one in five are waiting to decide. Very few expect to vote by special ballot.

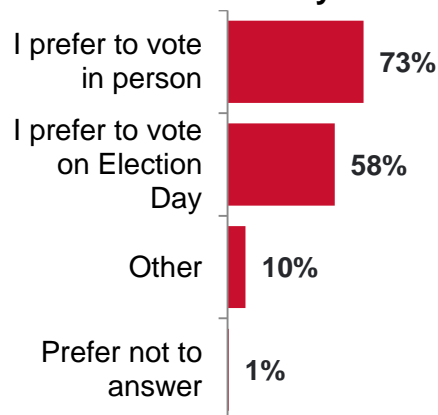
In which way are you most likely to vote?

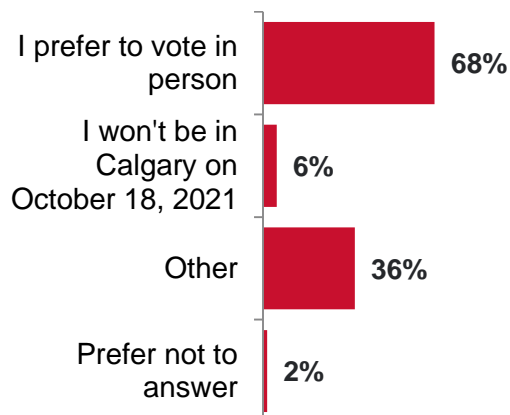
Reasons for Choosing Voting Method

Habits and personal preferences are a leading rationale for most respondents to choose a method of voting. For those who are likely to vote by special ballot, the leading reason is concern about COVID-19.

Reasons for Likely Voting At Local Voting Station on Election Day

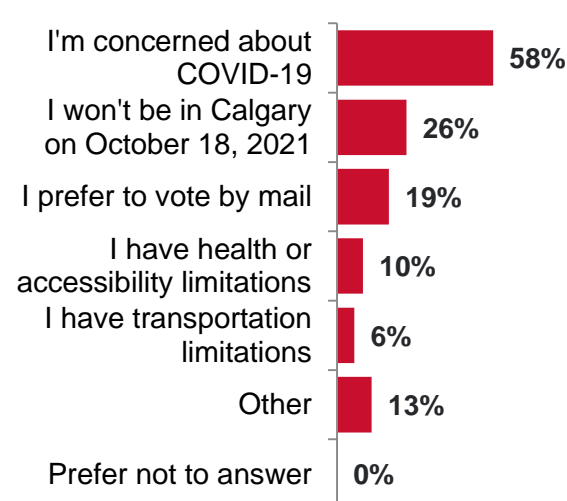


Reasons for Likely Voting At An Advance Voting Station

Flexible or convenient date or location

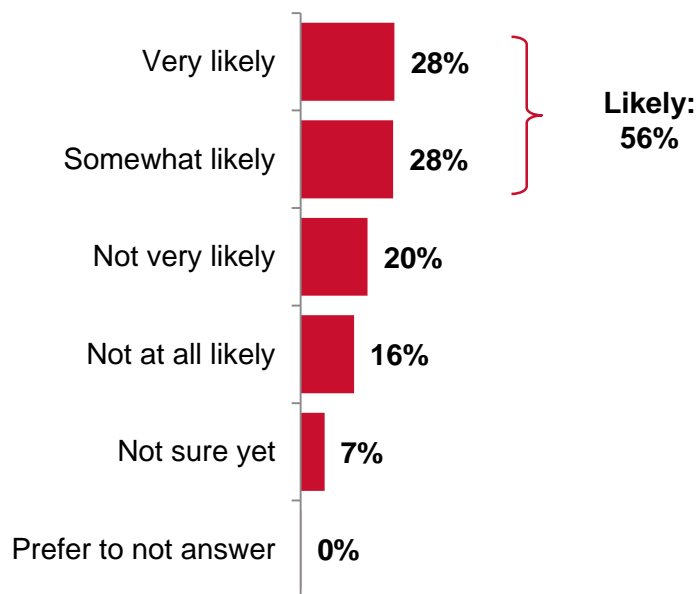

Likelihood To Request a Mail-in Ballot If Allowed

If there are legislation changes and voters are able to request a special ballot, about half would be likely to do so.

Likelihood To Request a Mail-in Ballot If Province Makes Changes

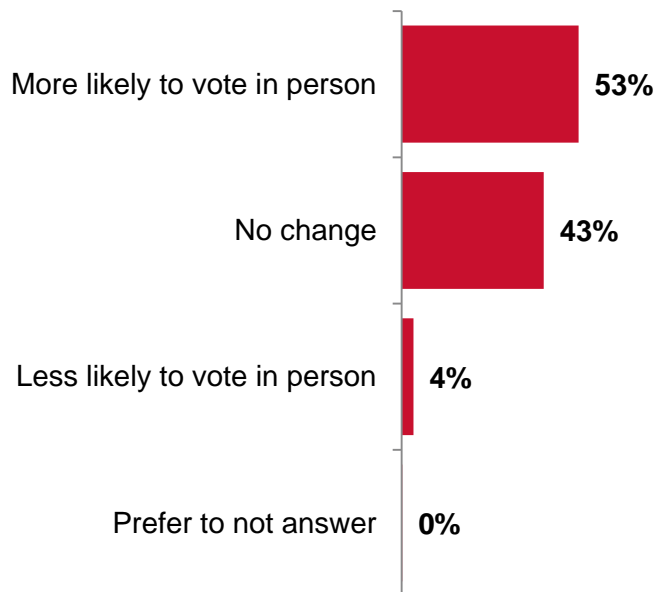


If the province changes the legislation to make mail-in ballots available for all Calgarians, how likely would you be to request a mail-in ballot?

Impact of Reduced Pandemic Concerns

If there are fewer concerns related to COVID-19, about half of respondents would be more likely to vote in person. However, it is important to note that most respondents (79%) already do intend to vote in person.
