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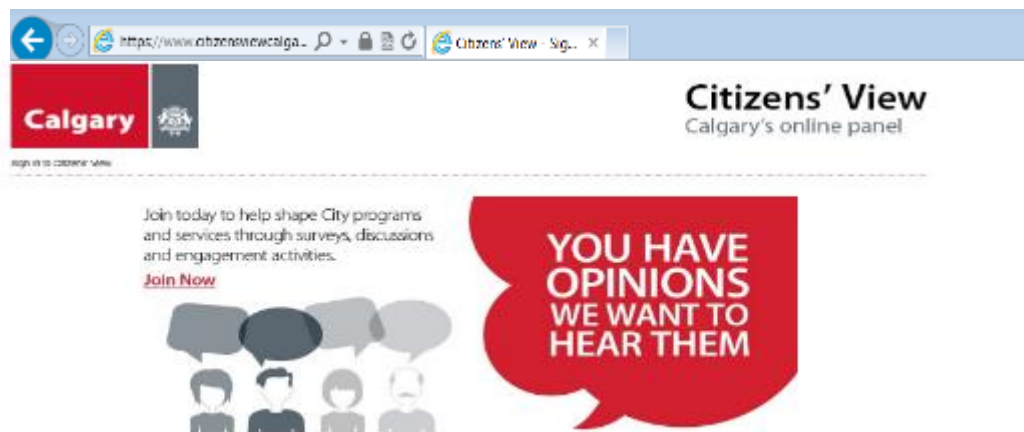
## Methodology

Ipsos conducted an online survey with Citizens' View panelists.

Citizens' View is an online panel that encourages citizens to participate in shaping City of Calgary programs and services through surveys, discussions and engagement activities.

The survey was launched on October 23, 2017 to 2,784 panelists and closed on October 30, 2017. 867 panelists completed the survey and an additional 153 panelists started the survey but did not complete it. Results in this report are based on all valid responses from participants who completed the entire survey.

**The following findings are qualitative in nature. The work is exploratory as a result of the make up of panelists currently on the Citizens' View panel. The results should be regarded as directional and should not be projected to the larger population without further quantitative research.**







## Key Findings

# Key Findings

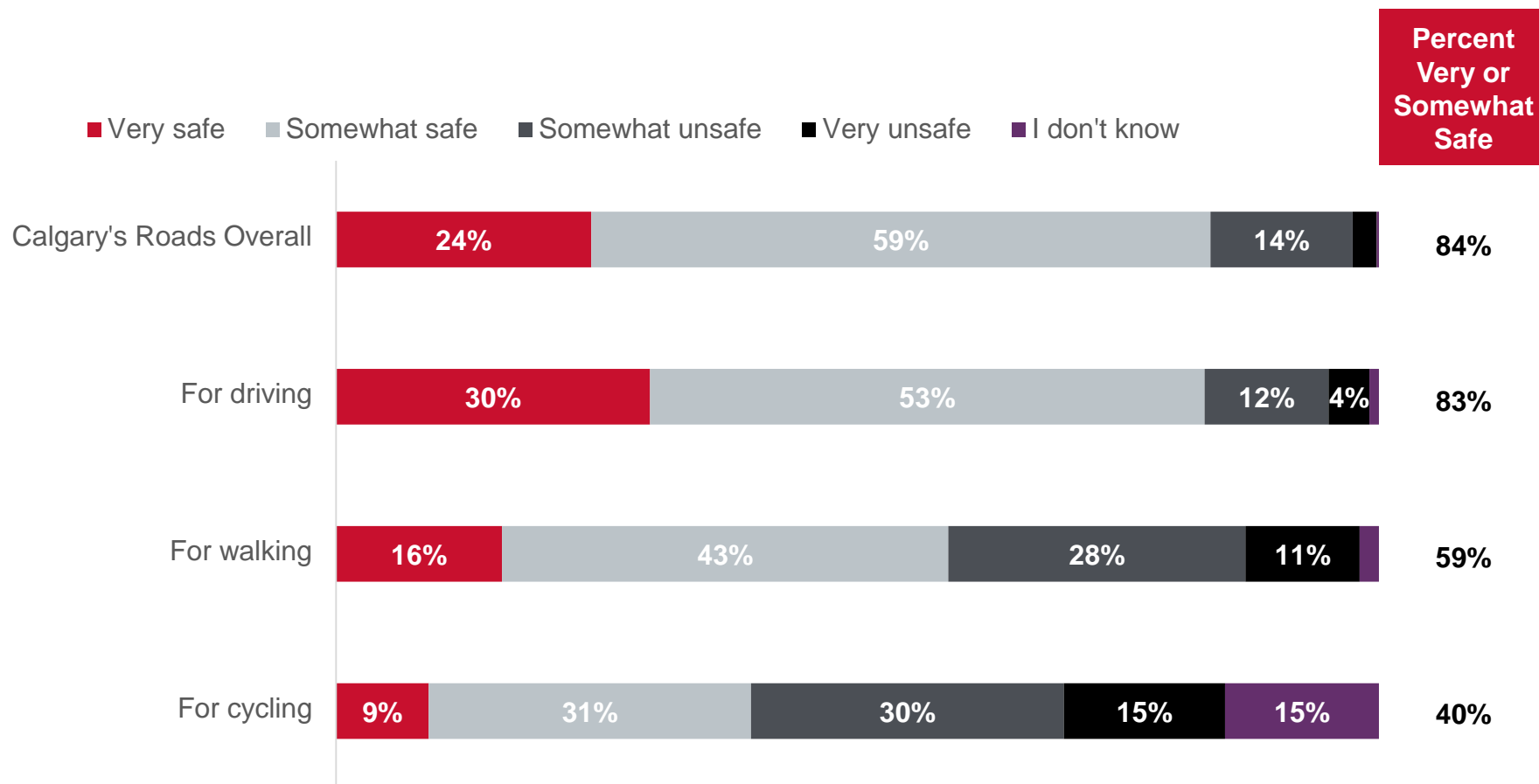
- ❖ Eighty-four percent of Citizens' View panelists regard Calgary's streets to be safe, with 24% stating they are very safe and 59% stating they are somewhat safe. However, panelists are much more likely to regard the streets as safe for driving (83%) than to regard them as safe for walking (59%), and fewer still for cycling, with only 40% of panelists stating that Calgary's streets are somewhat or very safe.
- ❖ Panelists generally agree with the value statements related to Livable Streets. Eighty percent or more agree that:
  - It is important for The City of Calgary to provide streets that meet the needs of residents of all ages and abilities.
  - The City of Calgary should design streets so that people feel safe when they are walking or riding a bike to and from destinations.
  - It is important for The City of Calgary to provide connections to key destinations in their communities that can be easily accessed by walking or cycling.
- ❖ While the majority of panelists feel safe using active modes of transportation in their communities, one-third disagree that they feel safe doing so. Aggressive or speeding drivers, poor road infrastructure and road conditions are all major factors for these citizens.
- ❖ When panelists compare pairs of photos of Livable Streets to similar areas that have not been improved, a clear majority pick the Livable Street option as the one that is most safe to travel by active modes. The key reasons for these attitudes are infrastructure to support users of active modes of transportation (crosswalks, sidewalks and bike lanes) together with having clear, well-defined areas for vehicles and people. Respondents also speak positively about wider streets and sidewalks, less traffic and good lighting and visibility.
- ❖ There is a segment of citizens who are not in favor of bike lanes, some of whom complained that they did not have an opportunity in the survey to support other aspects of Livable Streets while disapproving of bike lanes. It is recommended that this opportunity be provided in future surveys.

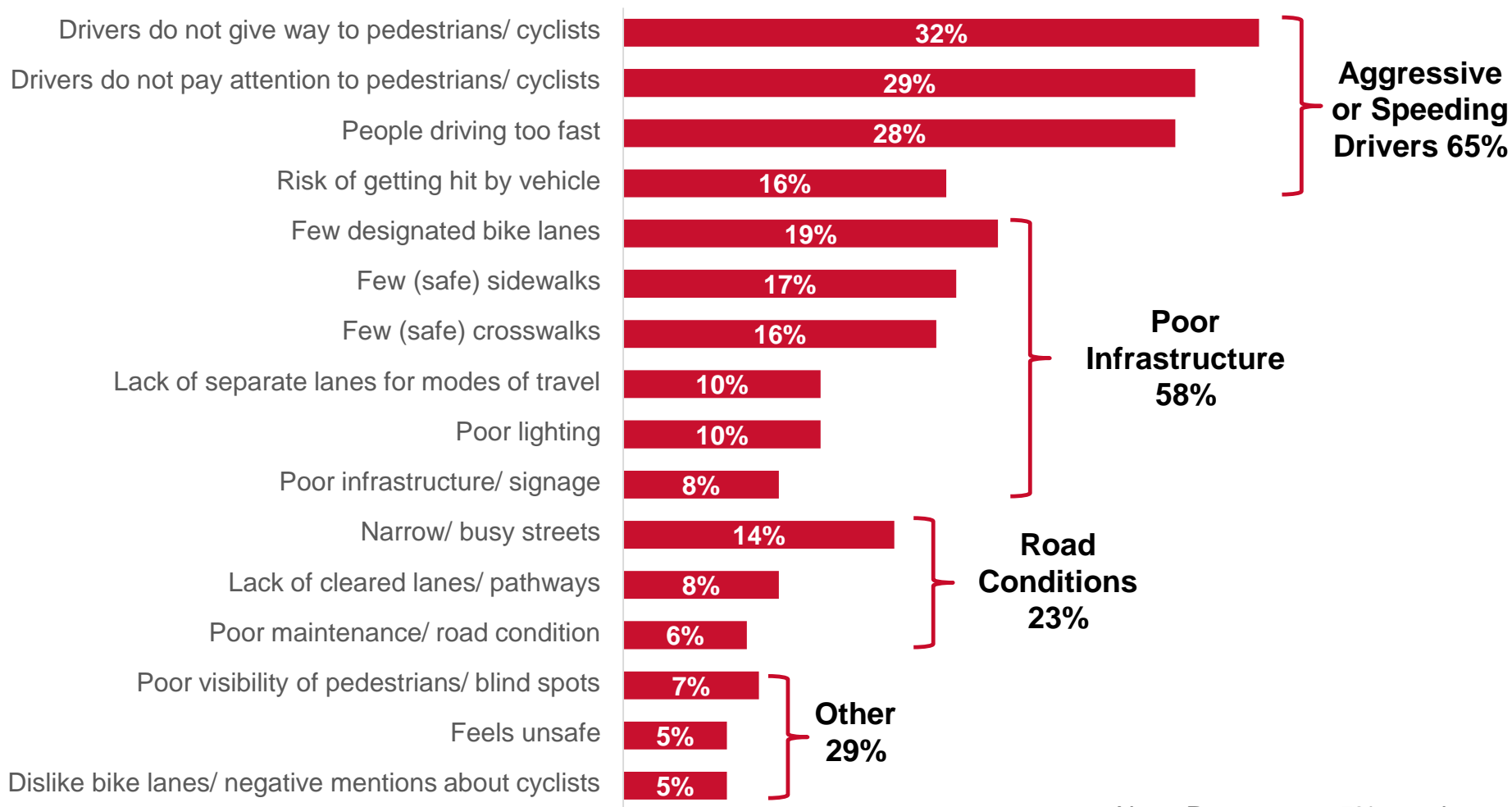

# Reasons Feel Unsafe Using Active Modes in Their Communities

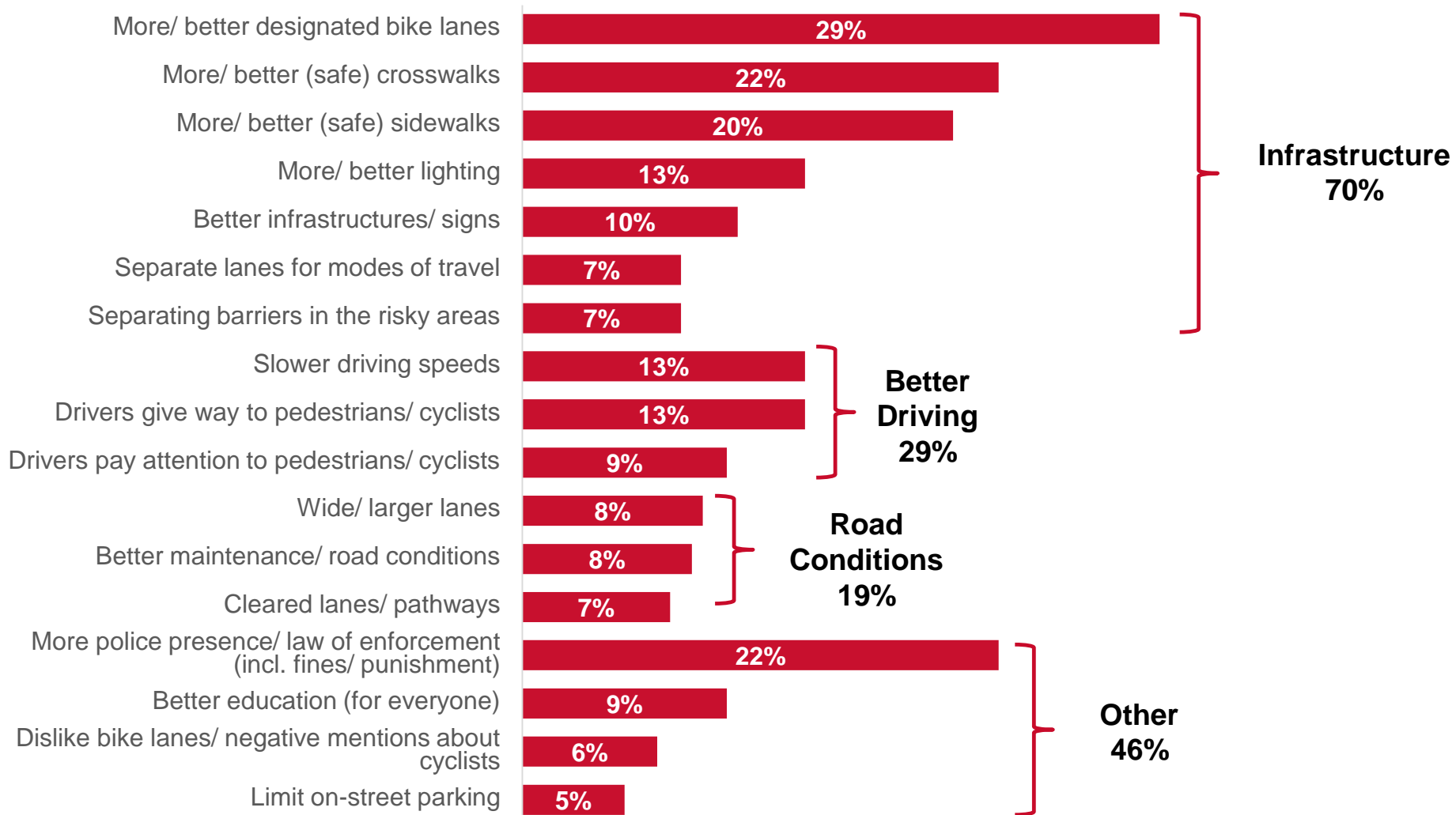

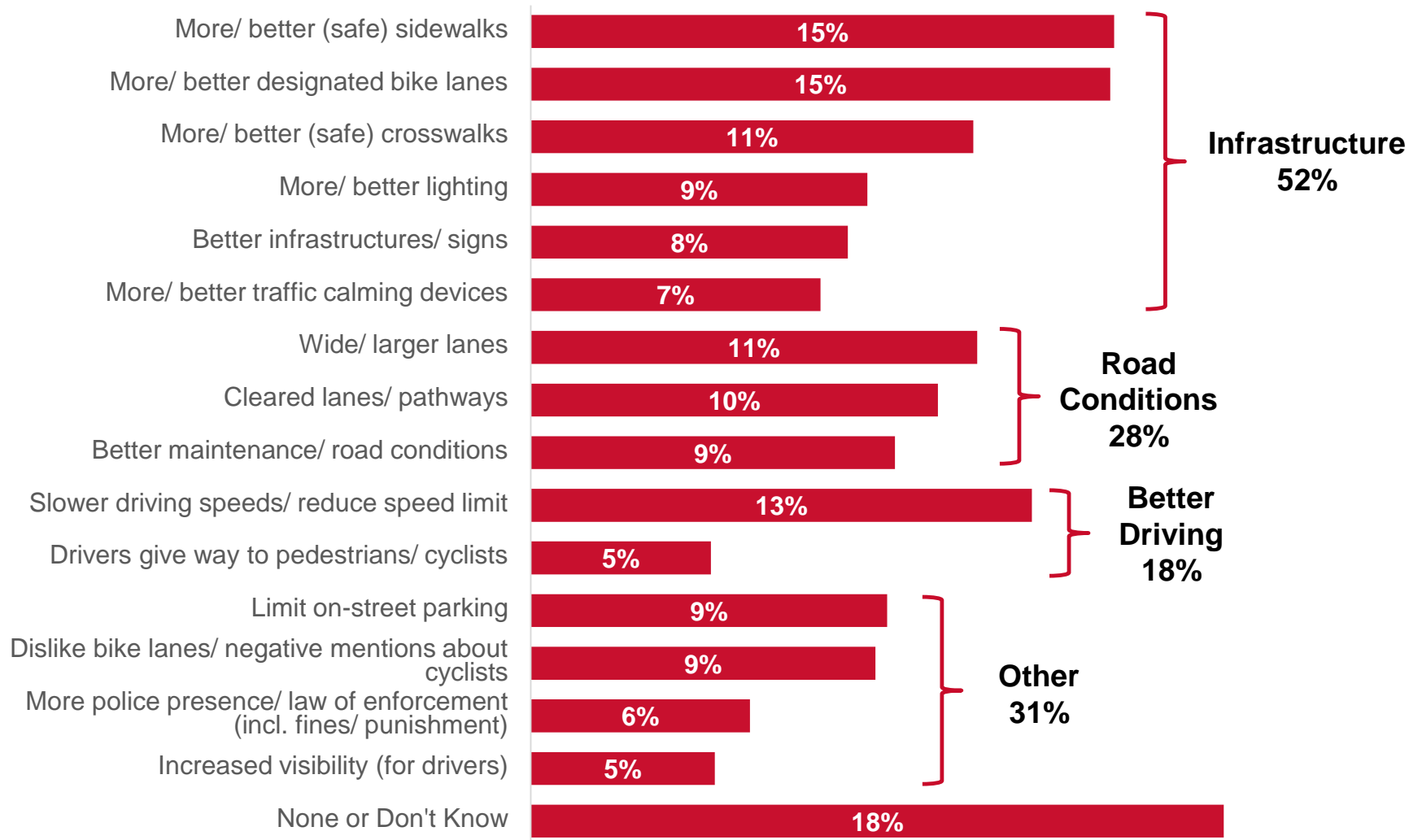
Q4. What would make you feel more comfortable when using an active mode (walking, cycling, etc.) of transportation in your community?

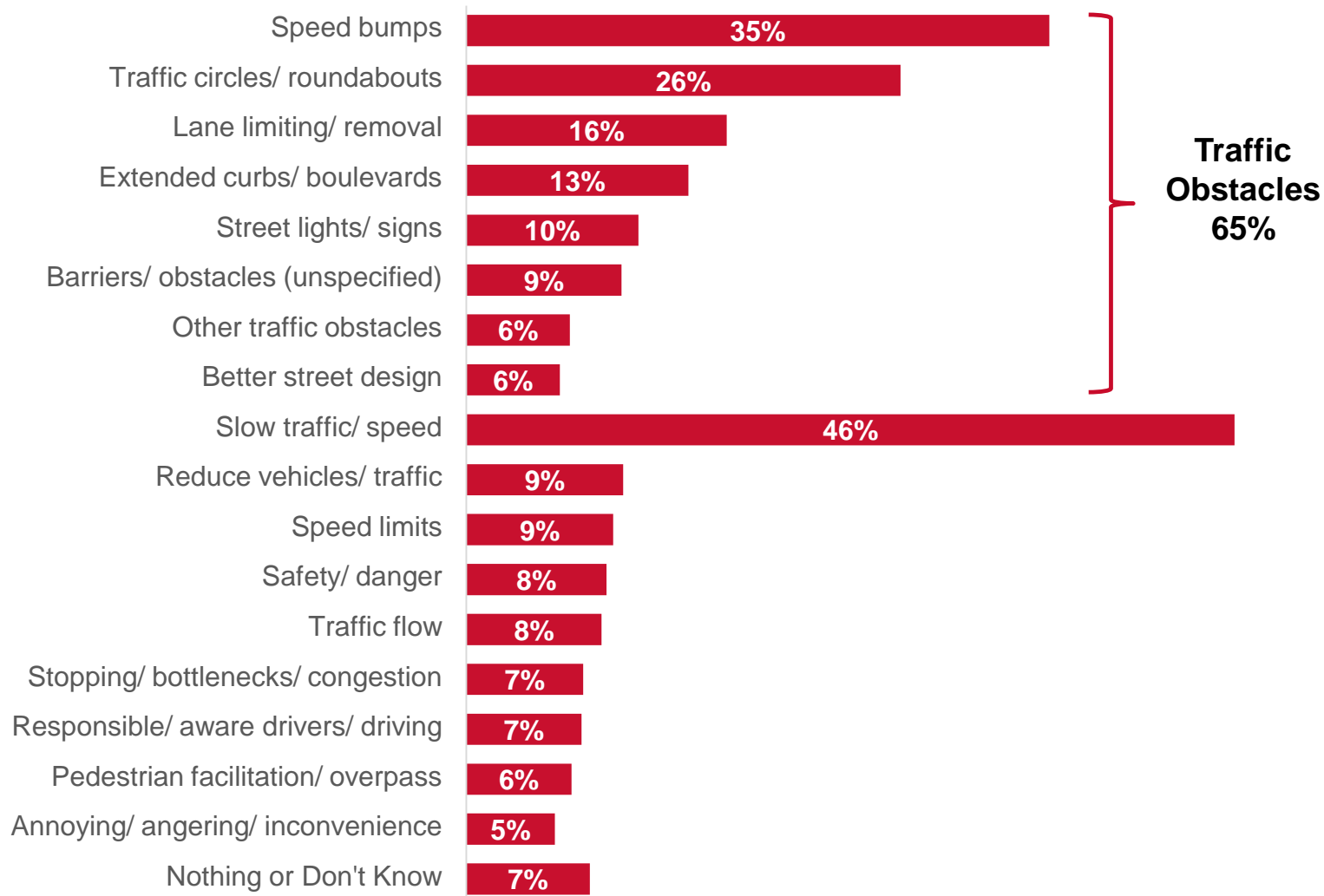

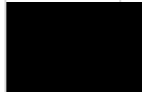

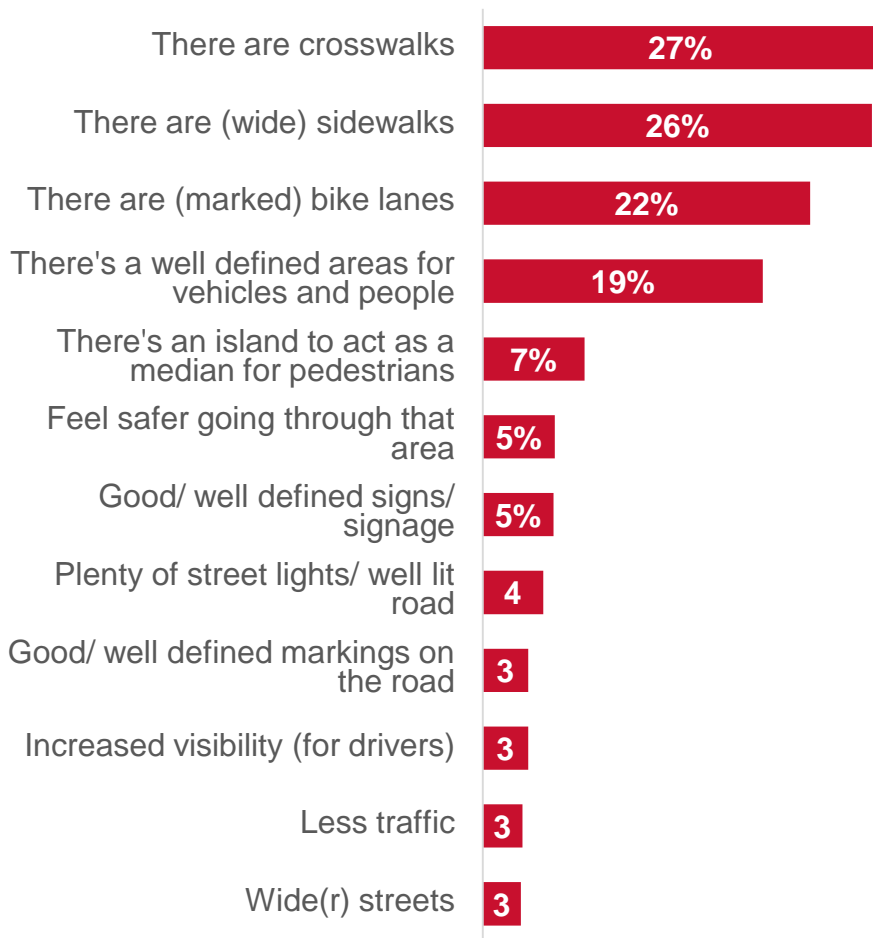

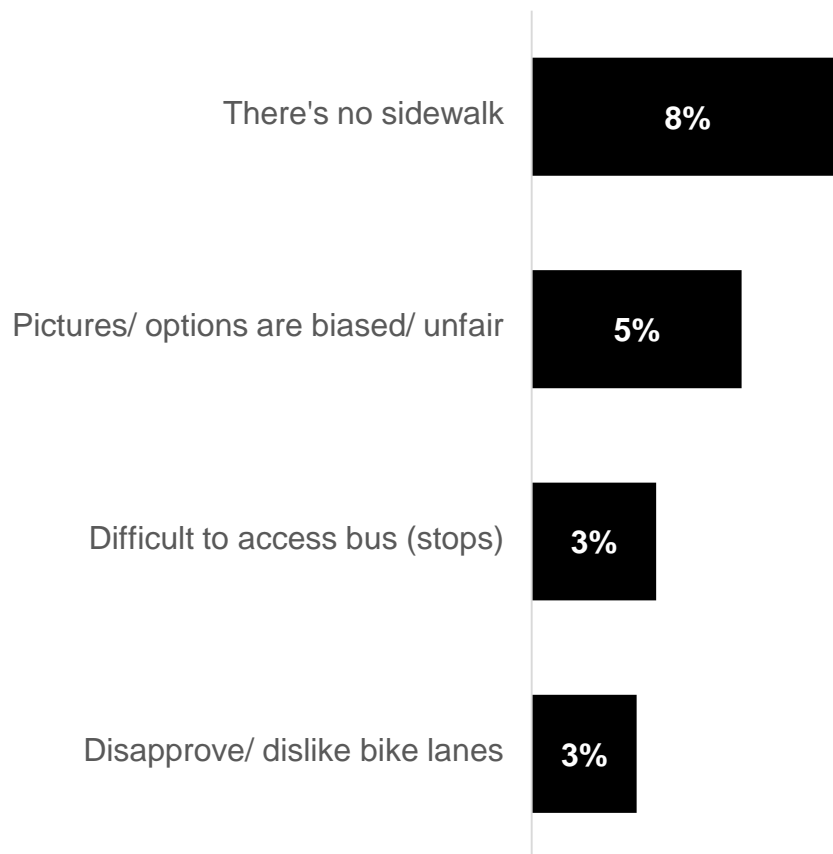

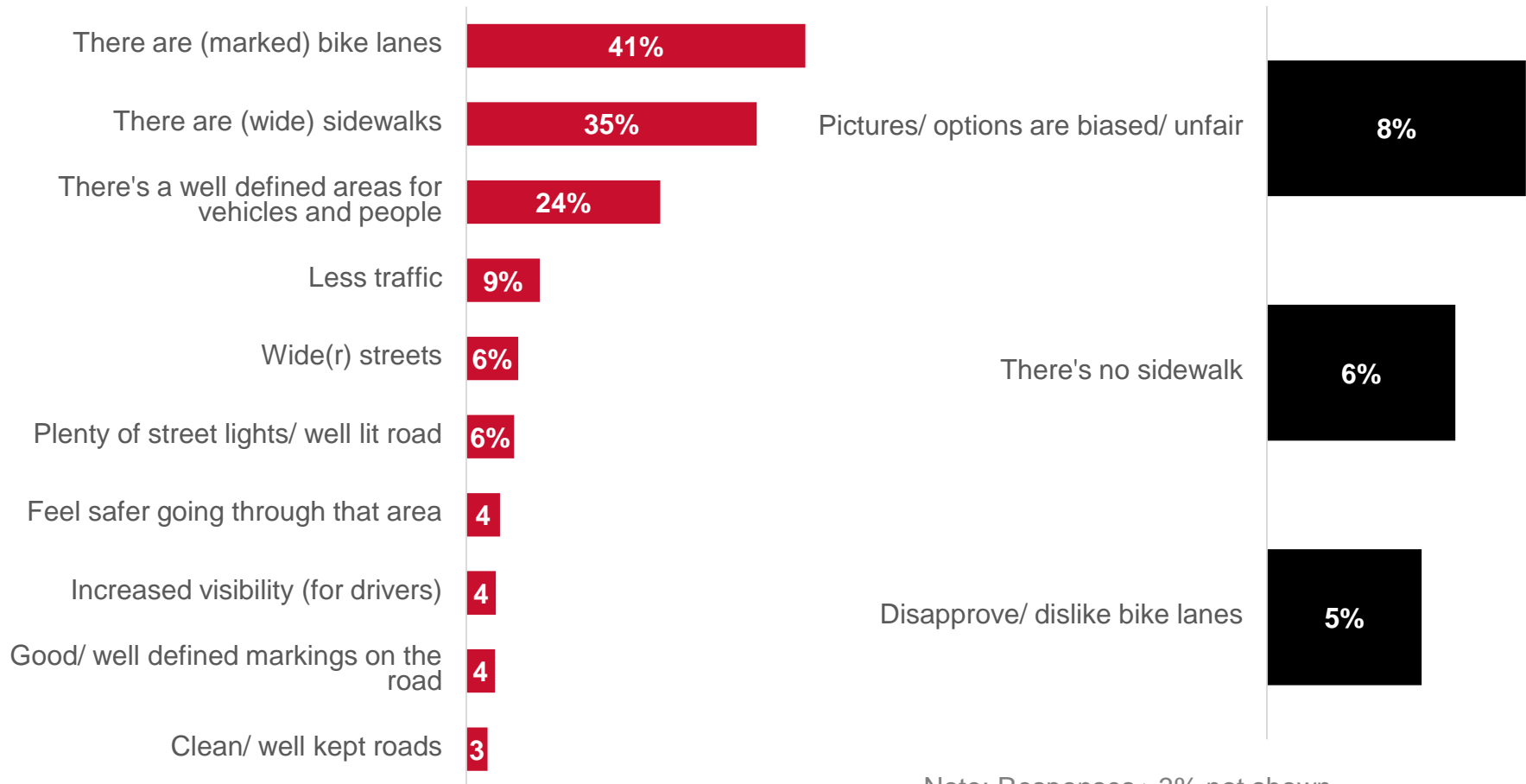

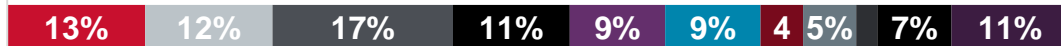
