


Methodology

Overview Methodology

Ipsos conducted an online survey with Citizens' View panelists.

- [Citizens' View](#) is an online panel that encourages citizens to participate in shaping City of Calgary programs and services through surveys, discussions and engagement activities.
- The survey was launched on June 13th to 2322 panelists and closed on June 21st, 2016.
- 759 panelists completed the survey and an additional 145 panelists started the survey but did not complete it.
- Results in this report are based on all valid respondents of participants who completed the entire survey. Tracking from the 2015 ReTree YYC Survey is included where applicable. Please use caution when interpreting results, as the base sizes between the two waves have changed.
- **The following findings are qualitative in nature. The work is exploratory as a result of the make up of panelists currently on the Citizens' View panel. The results should be regarded as directional and should not be projected to the larger population without further quantitative research.**

Key Findings

The 2016 ReTree YYC survey contains questions that were asked in the 2015 ReTree YYC survey.

It should be noted that although some questions were asked in both surveys, the *base sizes vary significantly between the two surveys, and making comparisons between the results should be done with extreme caution.*

- ❖ 2015 ReTree YYC Survey: n=378 respondents
- ❖ 2016 ReTree YYC Survey: n=759 respondents

It should also be noted that 162 members of the Citizens’ View panel completed both the 2015 and 2016 surveys.

Of the respondents who completed both survey’s, responses remained consistent overall, with the exception of recall about the impact of the 2014 snowstorm.

Key Findings

Actions Taken To Address Damaged Trees

- ❖ The majority of respondents, in both 2015 and 2016 selected “someone in my household pruned the tree(s)” as the most popular action taken to address the issue of damaged tree(s) on their property.
- ❖ The second most popular action is “hired a private company to prune the tree(s).”

Key Findings

Knowledgeability

Of the respondents who completed the 2016 ReTree YYC survey, in addition to the 2015 ReTree YYC survey, the level of knowledge about how to properly care for trees remained steady.

❖ Of the 162 respondents who completed both surveys:

- In the 2015 survey 62% report feeling knowledgeable about how to properly care for trees.
- In the 2016 survey 60% report feeling knowledgeable about how to properly care for trees.

❖ In the 2016 ReTree YYC survey **66% of all respondents report feeling knowledgeable about how to properly care for trees.**

ReTree YYC Program Awareness

Of the respondents who completed the 2016 ReTree YYC survey, in addition to the 2015 ReTree YYC survey, the level of awareness about the ReTree YYC program increased.

❖ Of the 162 respondents who completed both surveys:

- In the 2015 survey 30% had heard of the ReTree YYC program by name.
- In the 2016 survey 52% had heard of the ReTree YYC program by name.

❖ In the 2016 ReTree YYC survey, **less than half (38%) of all respondents recall hearing of the program by name.**

- *When removing the respondents who previously completed this survey question in 2015 and report remembering the program name (84 respondents), **awareness of the program name for respondents who have not previously seen this survey is closer to one-quarter of respondents (27%).***



Key Findings

Types of Information

When selecting the type of information related to tree care and maintenance that would be most useful, respondents top choices are:

- ❖ (80%) Types of trees to plant/ that do well in Calgary
- ❖ (80%) Tips for identifying potential issues/ concerns with trees
- ❖ (68%) How to choose the right tree and right location on your property

Credible and Trusted Sources of Information About Tree Care and Maintenance

Respondents reported the Horticultural Society or other not for profit organization (99%) as the **most credible** source of information about tree care and maintenance, closely followed by a training institute (97%) and local nursery (97%).

When asked what respondents consider to be the **most trusted** source of information the results remained very closely tied to credibility:

Most trusted: Horticultural Society or other not for profit organization ranked first (25%)

Second most trusted: A local tree (pruning/planting services) company, staff/website and a training institute (22%)

Third most trusted: A training institute (Olds Colledge, the Zoo, SAIT, etc.) (20%)






Satisfaction with City's Overall Response to September Storm

















Where you heard about ReTree YYC






ReTree YYC Event Attendance



“I have never had issues with trees on my property.”





Credible Sources of Information on Tree Care and Maintenance



Trusted Sources of Information on Tree Care and Knowledge






Popular Methods of Gaining Tree Information and Knowledge






Likelihood of Using Discount




Tree Preferences










