Equity-Deserving Communities Calgarians Born Outside Canada

Analysis of 2022 Fall Survey of Calgarians Data
January 2023

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Telephone survey conducted with a randomly-selected sample of 2,501 Calgarians aged 18 years and older between August 15th and September 2nd, 2022.

- Both cell phone (60%) and landline (40%) sample were used.
- The average interview length was 32 minutes.



Final data were weighted to ensure the overall sample's quadrant, ward, and age/gender composition reflects that of the actual Calgary population aged 18 or older according to 2019 Municipal and 2021 Federal Census data.



The margin of error (MOE) for the total sample of 2,501 is ± 2.0 percentage points, 19 times out of 20. The margin of error for the Born Outside Canada sub-group of 658 is ± 3.8 percentage points, 19 times out of 20, and the margin of error for the Born in Canada sub-group of 1,834 is ± 2.3 percentage points, 19 times out of 20. The margin of error of each question will vary slightly depending on the total number of respondents who answered the question.



Not all questions asked within the Fall Survey of Calgarians are represented within this report. Results are compared between Calgarians born outside Canada and Calgarians born in Canada. Statistically significant differences are noted throughout the report:

- \uparrow indicates number is significantly higher than the other group.
- \downarrow indicates number is significantly lower than the other group.
- Some results in this report are subject to rounding adjustments.

Significant differences are an indication that a difference is not due to chance. A mathematical formula is used to calculate each difference independently. Whether or not a difference is considered significant depends on a few factors including the total sample size and the variability of responses. Larger sample sizes mean that smaller differences are significant. Additionally, variability of responses means that the more alike the responses are the more significant a change will be.



Calgary’s Equity-Deserving Communities (EDCs) are defined as groups of people who generally have less access to opportunities, resources, and systems of power because of their actual or perceived identity or identities. EDCs often experience social and financial disadvantages because of systems of oppression, which takes many forms including, but not limited to, racism, sexism, and ableism. The City would like to better understand the perspective of equity-deserving communities through the lens of the annual Spring and Fall Surveys of Calgarians. The data in this report are from the most recent (2022) Fall Survey of Calgarians, focusing on demographics of interest, specifically those that differentiate equity-deserving communities. Both seasonal surveys are conducted in English to manage time and cost restraints. The City acknowledges the ability to speak English may be a barrier for potential participants. Inclusion in all EDC groups is based on self-reported demographic data captured within the general population survey.

This is one report in an overall set of eight reports on Equity-Deserving Communities. Each report focuses on a different EDC. The EDCs, and the demographic variables used to categorize EDCs, are as follows, with the EDC category noted in bold text:

Key Findings



Key Findings: Born Outside Canada

Overall, Calgarians who were born outside Canada have a more positive view on the quality of life in Calgary today and the direction the city is heading.

- Calgarians born outside Canada are more likely than Calgarians born in Canada to rate the overall quality of life in The City of Calgary today as 'good' (84% vs. 79%).
- Calgarians born outside Canada are also more likely than Calgarians born in Canada to report Calgary is on the right track to be a better city 10 years from now (85% vs. 73%).

Calgarians born outside Canada have a more positive perception of inclusivity in Calgary when compared to Calgarians born in Canada.

- Calgarians born outside Canada are more likely than Calgarians born in Canada to agree The City fosters a city that is inclusive and accepting of all (80% vs. 67%) and are also less likely to disagree (4% vs. 11%).
- Similarly, Calgarians born outside Canada are also more likely than Calgarians born in Canada to agree The City delivers programs and services that remove barriers to participation for Calgarians who need it the most (63% vs. 48%).

Calgarians born outside Canada also have a more positive perception of citizen input opportunities than their counterparts.

- When compared to Calgarians born in Canada, Calgarians born outside Canada are more likely to agree The City allows citizens to have meaningful input into decision-making (69% vs. 55%).
- Calgarians born outside Canada are also more likely than those born in Canada to agree The City is working to improve how it includes citizen input into important decisions (78% vs. 62%) or that The City uses input from Calgarians in decision-making about projects and services (70% vs. 59%).

In comparison with Calgarians who were born in Canada, Calgarians who were born outside Canada are more likely to trust The City.

- Calgarians born outside Canada are more likely than Calgarians born in Canada to indicate they trust The City (54% vs. 47%) and are also less likely to distrust The City (10% vs. 25%).



Key Findings: Born Outside Canada

Compared to Calgarians who were born in Canada, Calgarians who were born outside of Canada are more likely to view the performance of City Administration and City Council positively.

- Calgarians who were born outside Canada are more likely than those born in Canada to be satisfied with The City, including Council and Administration as a whole (79% vs. 67%).
- Calgarians born outside Canada are also more likely than Calgarians born in Canada to be satisfied with Council (75% vs. 57%) and with Administration (84% vs. 75%) individually.

Calgarians who were born outside Canada view The City's environmental action in a more positive light than Calgarians born in the country.

- In comparison with those born in Canada, Calgarians who were born outside Canada are more likely to agree we need to act now to address climate change (74% vs. 60%).
- Calgarians born outside Canada are also more likely than Calgarians born in Canada to be satisfied with The City's performance to protect the environment (83% vs. 76%) and more likely to agree The City has programs and services aimed at helping Calgarians reduce their environmental impact (61% vs. 48%).

Calgarians who were born outside Canada are more likely to agree The City is doing a good job on each of the Council focus areas reported on.

- Calgarians born outside Canada are more likely to agree The City is doing a good job working to build meaningful relationships with Indigenous partners when compared to Calgarians born in Canada (86% vs. 80%) and are significantly less likely to disagree (14% vs. 20%).
- In comparison with Calgarians born in Canada, Calgarians born outside Canada are more likely to agree The City is doing a good job working with local Indigenous communities when discussing downtown revitalization (77% vs. 68%).
- Calgarians born outside of Canada are also more likely to agree The City is doing a good job working with other levels of government to address social issues such as mental health (74% vs. 59%) and that The City is doing a good job working to ensure Calgary is seen as a city that celebrates culture, heritage, and diversity (92% vs. 88%).

Key Findings: Born Outside Canada

In general, Canadians who were born outside of Canada are more likely to be satisfied with City programs and services than those born in Canada.

- Calgarians born outside Canada are much more likely than Calgarians born in Canada to be satisfied with the overall level and quality of services and programs provided by The City (74% vs. 64%).
- The only service with lower satisfaction ratings among Calgarians born outside Canada than those born in Canada is the quality of drinking water (90% vs. 94%)
- Conversely, Calgarians who were born outside Canada are more likely than Calgarians born in Canada to be satisfied with almost all services surveyed, including residential Green Cart (95% vs. 90%), development and building inspections and permits (89% vs. 81%), Calgary Police Service (89% vs. 80%), 911 (88% vs. 80%), and the City of Calgary website (87% vs. 80%).
- Calgarians born outside Canada are also more likely to be satisfied with a large number of the services with the lowest satisfaction ratings among all Calgarians, including transportation planning (84% vs. 78%), traffic flow management (82% vs. 72%), city land use planning (79% vs. 72%), Calgary Transit (78% vs. 70%), city growth management (79% vs. 69%), downtown revitalization (74% vs. 65%), on-street bikeways (74% vs. 63%), and affordable housing (62% vs. 51%).

Overall, Calgarians who were born outside Canada want a higher level of investment in City programs and services than those born in the country.

- In comparison with Calgarians born in Canada, those born outside Canada are more likely to want The City to ‘invest more’ in almost all services, including Calgary Transit (72% vs. 56%), snow removal (67% vs. 50%), and road maintenance (61% vs. 52%), among many others.
- Calgarians born outside Canada are much less likely than Calgarians born in Canada to indicate The City should ‘invest less’ in a large number of services, including on-street bikeways (29% vs. 37%), and downtown revitalization (11% vs. 16%), among others.
- City operated recreation facilities are the lone service Calgarians born outside Canada are more likely than those born in the country to report The City should invest less in (9% vs. 5%).







Overall Quality of Life: Born Outside Canada




Calgary – Right Track to Being a Better City: Born Outside Canada







Perceptions of Inclusion: Born Outside Canada




Perceptions of Removing Barriers: Born Outside Canada







Perceptions of Citizen Input – Opportunities: Born Outside Canada













Trust in The City: Born Outside Canada















Perceptions About Environment: Born Outside Canada























Satisfaction with the Overall Level and Quality of City Services and Programs: Born Outside Canada

Invest More: Born Outside Canada

In general, Calgarians born outside Canada are more likely to indicate the city should invest more in a large number of services when compared to those born in Canada, including Calgary Transit (72% vs. 56%), snow removal (67% vs. 50%), and road maintenance (61% vs. 52%).

Invest More: Born Outside Canada

Calgarians who were born outside Canada are more likely to indicate The City should invest more in waste and recycling when compared to those who were born in Canada, including residential garbage collection (29% vs. 19%), residential Blue Cart recycling (26% vs. 16%), and residential Green Cart service (22% vs. 12%).
