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
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- ❖ Telephone survey conducted with a randomly selected sample of 2,500 Calgarians aged 18 years and older between August 18th and September 6th, 2016.
 - Both landline (70%) and cell phone (30%) sample were used.
 - The average interview length was 31 minutes.
- ❖ Final data were weighted to ensure the overall sample's quadrant, ward and age/gender composition reflects that of the actual Calgary population aged 18 or older according to 2011 Federal Census data.
- ❖ The margin of error (MOE) for the total sample of 2,500 is ± 2.0 percentage points, 19 times out of 20.
 - A total of 182 interviews were conducted with residents of Ward 9 (MOE ± 7.3).
- ❖ Research Note on significant differences:
 - Throughout, City Wide results are compared to results from Ward 9.
 - \uparrow indicates a number is significantly higher than City Wide.
 - \downarrow indicates a number is significantly lower than City Wide.
- ❖ Where possible, 2016 results for Ward 9 are compared to those from 2015.
 - Only significant differences are shown.





Summary of Key Findings





Calgary in 2016

- ❖ The last twelve months have proven to be difficult for our city, with the impacts of a slowed economy being felt more acutely than in 2015. With Calgary's unemployment rate climbing from 6.8% in 2015 to 8.6% in 2016, downtown office vacancy rates at near record levels, and the value of building permits forecasted to be significantly lower than 2015, speculation continues about whether we will see an upswing as we move into 2017.
- ❖ Despite facing challenging times, many Calgarians as a whole remain resilient. A number of surveys, including this one, report that people have a generally optimistic view about the future, and perceptions of their overall quality of life is still quite strong.
- ❖ Our research suggests that Calgarians are looking to government – Federal, Provincial, and Municipal – for leadership and sound investment to strengthen and diversify our economy moving forward. However, Calgarians are also looking to government to be more watchful and aware of how their tax dollars are being spent.
- ❖ This year's Citizen Satisfaction Survey presents a narrative that highlights some **shifts in perceptions that can likely be attributed to the economic downturn**. It is an important editorial note for those reviewing this year's survey.

Key Findings: Quality of Life

For Ward 9 residents, perceptions about the quality of life in Calgary are strong and for the most part on par with City Wide.

- ❖ Eight-in-ten (82%) Ward 9 residents say they quality of life in Calgary is ‘good,’ consistent with City Wide findings (83%).
 - However – though still very low – ratings of a ‘poor’ quality of life are significantly higher among Ward 9 residents compared to City Wide (8% vs. 3%).
- ❖ As with City Wide, in 2016 more Ward 9 residents say the quality of life in Calgary has ‘worsened’ in the past three years (41% in 2016 vs. 27% in 2015 and 24% in 2014) – perceptions of an ‘improved’ quality of life, however, have not seen a statistical decrease over the past year (16% vs. 25% in 2015, though down from 32% in 2014).
- ❖ Unlike City Wide (where there is a 15 point drop), agreement that ‘Calgary is a great place to make a living’ is statistically consistent with 2015 among Ward 9 residents (64% in 2016 vs. 71% in 2015) – that being said, there has been a 21 percentage point drop in agreement since 2014 (85%). Agreement in 2016 is on par with City Wide.
- ❖ One other notable difference is that 42% of Ward 9 residents ‘*completely agree*’ with the statement ‘I am proud to live in my neighborhood,’ statistically higher than 34% City Wide.



Key Findings: Issue Agenda

The Ward 9 issue agenda differs from City Wide on a number of points, with affordable housing increasing in prominence.

- ❖ “*Infrastructure, traffic and roads*” (32%) holds the top position on the Ward 9 issue agenda, consistent with 35% City Wide.
 - It is notable, that mentions of “*traffic congestion*” are statistically higher among Ward 9 residents (16% vs. 11% City Wide).
- ❖ Second on the Ward 9 issue agenda is “*crime, safety and policing*” (20%) – 5 percentage points higher than City Wide (15%).
 - While still very high, it is notable that satisfaction with the Calgary Police Service is statistically lower among Ward 9 residents (90% vs. 94% City Wide).
 - Though not directly related, satisfaction with 311 service is also lower than City Wide (89% vs. 94%).
- ❖ The top five issues are rounded out by “*transit*” at 18% (consistent with 21% City Wide), “*homelessness, poverty and affordable housing*” at 10% (up from 4% in 2015 and higher than 4% City Wide), and “*growth and planning*” at 8% (higher than 4% City Wide).
 - Further, satisfaction with affordable housing for low-income families (58%) has dropped 12 percentage points from 2015 (70%) and is also 12 points lower than City Wide (70%).



Key Findings: Satisfaction with City Services and Programs

Overall satisfaction with the level and quality of City services is strong but statistically lower than City Wide results.

- ❖ Just under three-quarters (73%) of Ward 9 residents say they are satisfied with the overall level and quality of services and programs provided by The City – 6 percentage points lower than City Wide (79%).
- ❖ Apart from the Calgary Police Service and affordable housing (previously discussed), specific services with lower satisfaction ratings are tied to waste and recycling.
 - ‘Very satisfied’ ratings are lower among Ward 9 residents for residential garbage collection (63% vs. 72% City Wide) and blue cart recycling (54% vs 63% City Wide). It should be noted, however, that overall satisfaction with these services is extremely high (98% garbage and 91% recycling) and consistent with City Wide results.
- ❖ A key area of improvement is snow removal.
 - Satisfaction is up 12 percentage points from 70% in 2015 to 82% in 2016 and ‘invest more’ ratings are down from 51% in 2015 to 39% in 2016 (which is also lower than 49% City Wide).
- ❖ As with City Wide results, satisfaction with property tax assessment sees a marked 14 point drop from 80% in 2015 to 66% in 2016.
 - Further, ‘very satisfied’ ratings have dropped 12 points from 26% in 2015 to 14% in 2016.

Key Findings: Taxation and Customer Service

As with City Wide, among Ward 9 residents the perceived value of property tax dollars remains steady though the tolerance for tax increases is down markedly.

- ❖ More than six-in-ten (64%) Ward 9 residents give The City a 'good value' rating for the value of their property tax dollars (on par with 63% City Wide).
- ❖ However, just one-half (49%) support tax increases to maintain or expand services – a 14 percentage point drop from 63% in 2015 – while 46% support cutting services to maintain or reduce taxes (a 13 point increase from 33% in 2015).
 - More specifically, up 12 percentage points is a preference for cutting services to maintain the current tax level (35% 2016 vs. 23% 2015).

Among Ward 9 residents, several metrics related to customer service are lower than City Wide or have declined from 2015.

- ❖ While 79% of Ward 9 residents who contacted or dealt with The City in the past 12 months are satisfied with the overall level and quality of customer service (on par with 80% City Wide), 14% say they are not satisfied – 5 percentage points higher than City Wide (9%).
- ❖ Further, among those who contacted The City, 76% are satisfied with their most recent contact – though solid, this is 10 percentage points lower than City Wide (86%).
 - Even larger is the gap in 'very satisfied' ratings with a 17 point difference (42% Ward 9 vs. 59% City Wide), and this also represents a 16 point drop from 2015 (58%) among Ward 9 residents. 'Not at all satisfied' ratings are also higher among Ward 9 residents (17% vs. 7% City Wide) and up 12 points from 2015 (5%).
- ❖ Also lower than City Wide is agreement that 'the quality of customer service from The City is consistently high' (80% Ward 9 vs. 87% City Wide) and 'The City responds quickly to requests and concerns' (72% Ward 9 vs. 79% City Wide).

There are no noteworthy differences between Ward 9 residents and the broader Calgary public – or notable changes from 2015 – with regard to the environment and City communications.



Overall Quality of Life in Calgary





















Overall Satisfaction with the Level and Quality of City Services and Programs























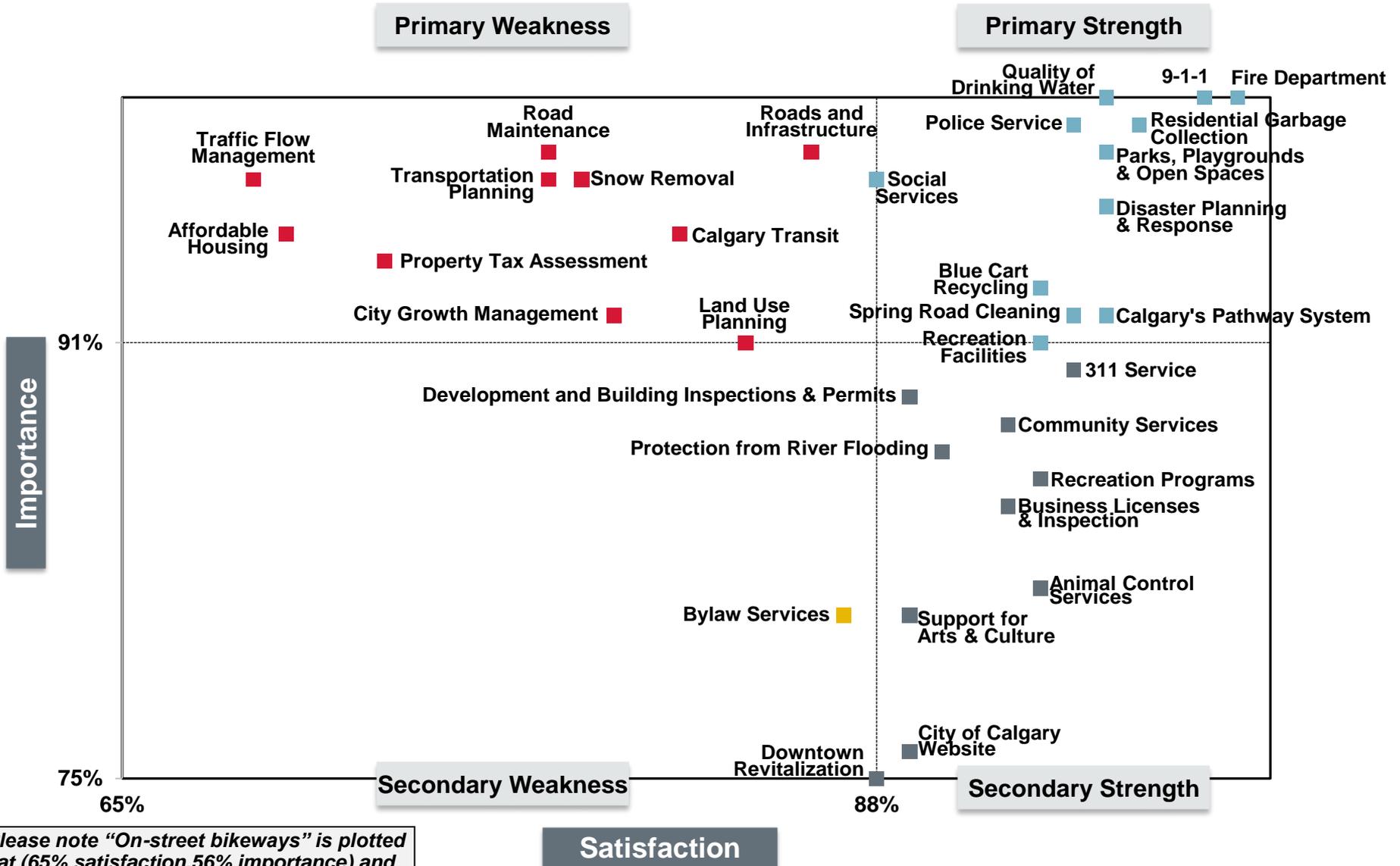


Importance vs. Satisfaction Grid: City Wide



Perceptions About Overall State of Calgary's Environment





Satisfaction with The City's Environmental Performance




How satisfied are you with the job The City of Calgary is currently doing to protect the environment?



Knowledge Levels of Tax Dollar Spending



Perceived Value of Property Taxes












Past 12 Months Contact with The City of Calgary




Have you contacted or dealt with The City of Calgary or dealt with The City or one of its employees in the last twelve months?

Satisfaction with the Overall Level and Quality of Customer Service








How satisfied were you with your most recent contact with The City?




